WHEREAS by The Statute of Gaols 1864 (27 Vict. No. 219) it was amongst other things enacted, that all buildings, erections, houses, enclosed places, and premises thereafter to be erected, built, enclosed, purchased, enlarged, or maintained at the public expense, as and for public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments within Victoria, which were from time to time proclaimed by the Governor in Council, by notice in the Government Gazette, as such public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, or penal establishments, should, from and after the publication of such notice, be severally deemed and taken to be the public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments (thereinafter called "gaols") respectively of the place or district where the same were situated, and should be subject to the several provisions made for the regulation, discipline, management, and care of the public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments already erected (also thereinafter called "gaols"), and of the prisoners confined within the same; and it was also enacted that, except where it was otherwise proclaimed by the Governor in Council, every gaol should be and be taken for all purposes as being equally a house of correction and a prison for debtors, and also every house of correction and a prison for debtors, and also every house of correction should be taken to be a prison: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the eighteenth day) of November A.D.

One thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, it was declared that the buildings and premises at Kyneton, used as a goal, prison, and house of correction should henceforth cease to be a gaol, prison, and house of correction: And whereas by another Proclamation under the hand and seal aforesaid, bearing date the ninth day of March A.D. One thousand eight hundred and eighty, the said buildings and premises were restored and declared to be a public gaol, prison, and house of correction: And whereas it is expedient to revoke the second proclamation hereinbefore referred to: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, in exercise of the power and authority conferred by the said Act and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the Proclamation bearing date the ninth day of March A.D. One thousand eight hundred and eighty, and I do hereby declare and notify that the buildings and premises at Kyneton hitherto used as a gaol shall henceforth cease to be a public gaol, prison, and house of correction.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the thirty-ninth year of Her Majesty's reign, called The Public Health Amendment Act 1876, it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might from time to time by proclamation in the Government Gazette extend the provisions of the twentieth section of the said Act to any part of Victoria, and from and after three months from the coming into operation of the said section in any part of Victoria, if the owner of land whereon there should be a cesspool for the reception of nightsoil, which cesspool in the opinion of the local Board should be in such a condition or position as to be calculated to generate disease or be a public nuisance, should be required by notice from the local Board to fill up the same within a time to be expressed in such notice, not being more than one month from the date thereof, such owner should be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every day from the expiration of the time mentioned in such notice that such cesspool should not be filled up as thereby required: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation extend the provisions of the twentieth section of the above-recited Act to that portion of the Shire of Bairnsdale, comprised in the following area, that is to say:

Commencing at the north-west angle of allotment A, Gippsland, known as the Bairnsdale pre-emptive Section; thence bounded by a line south 40° 50° east one thousand six hundred and eighty links; thence north 65° 42° east to Smith street; thence north 80° 25° east to the River Mitchell; thence northerly by that river to Main street, Bairnsdale; and thence by said Main street south-westerly to the point of commencement, and including the area known as Mitchelltown.

The births of 1,011 children, viz., 539 boys and 472 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of August. In the month of July 831 births were registered, or 130 fewer than in the month under review. The births were 229 above the average of the previous nine years, but 141 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in August numbered 467, viz., 265 of males, and 202 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 544. The deaths outnumbered those in July by 45, and exceeded the average of August during the previous ten years by 66. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been more numerous than the average of the month in those ten years by only 16.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was 3.47, and of deaths registered 1.60.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 67.2° on the 26th, and the lowest was 32.9° on the 22nd. The mean temperature of the month (50.4°) was one-tenth of a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (26.9°) took place on the 23rd, viz., from a maximum of 61.9° to a minimum of 35.0°. The least range (4.4°) was on the 18th, viz., from a maximum of 52.5°. The mean daily range was 16.4°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.962 inches) was a fraction below the average.

Males contributed 57 per cent., and females 43 per cent. to the total mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 30 per cent. to that mortality as against 31 per cent. in August 1882; 33 per cent. in August 1881; 43 per cent. in August 1880; 36 per cent. in August 1879; 31 per cent. in August 1878; 34 per cent. in August 1879; 32 per cent. in August 1876; 33 per cent. in August 1875; and 30 per cent. in August 1874 and 1873.

The deaths of 25 persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years were recorded during the month, viz.:—Those of a famale, aged 75, who died of paralysis; a female, aged 77, of ascites; a female, aged 78, of rheumatism; a female, aged 77, and a laborer, aged 79, of gangrene; a laborer, aged 87, of abscess of the leg; a clerk, aged 75, a teacher, aged 75, a miner, aged 81, and a workenales, aged 82 and 84 respectively, of bronchitis; a gentleman, aged 81, and a pensioner, aged 83, of heart disease; a laborer, aged 75, and a female, aged 80, of pneumonia; a female, aged 75, and a laborer, aged 82, of congestion of the lungs; a clothes-cleaner and a sawyer, each aged 78, of Bright's disease; a watchman, aged 75, a laborer, aged 76, a plasterer, aged 82, a male cook, aged 83, and a female, aged 94, of old age.

Twenty six deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which 22 were set down to accident, 1 to homicide, and 3 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A male child was killed by a fall at birth; a laborer,

aged 37, died of injuries to the chest, his horse falling on him; a constable, aged, 42, of rupture of the bladder, the result of a fall from a window; a female, aged 43, of concussion of the brain, caused by a fall whilst intoxicated; a female, aged 69, of fracture of the skull, caused by a fall in the street; a laborer, aged 34, of internal injuries—cause not stated; a publican, aged 46, of pyæmia; resulting from a jar whilst chopping wood; a laborer, aged 46, was crushed to death between two trucks; a male infant, aged 10 months, a male child, aged 1 year, and a female child, aged 2 years, died of scalds, and two girls, aged 8 and 16 years respectively, of burns, the former through her nightdress catching fire; a female child, aged 1 year, a female, aged 40, and a furmer, aged 58, were drowned, and a laborer, aged 70, was found drowned; a newly-born female infant was suffocated at birth; two female infants, aged 1 month and 6 weeks respectively, and two male infants, aged 4 and 6 months respectively, were suffocated by overlying. The homicidal death was that of a newly-born female infant, who was murdered by exposure. Of the suicidal deaths, a lumper, aged 42, shot himself; a butcher, aged 22, cut his throat; and a female, aged 46, poisoned hereit or public institutions viz —58 in the Melbourne.

One hundred and fifteen deaths, or 25 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—58 in the Melbourne Hospital, 11 in the Alfred Hospital, 2 in the Childrens' Hospital, 6 in the Lying-in Hospital, 5 in the Immigrants' Home, 14 in the Benevolent Asylum, 5 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 10 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 1 in the Austin Hospital, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Industrial Schools, and 1 in the Protestant Refuge.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 141, of which 85, or 60 per cent., were of males, and 56, or 40 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 98 were under one year of age, 23 were between one and two, 10 were between two and three, 4 were between three and four, and 6 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 326. Of these, 180, or 55 per cent., were males, and 146, or 45 per cent., were females; 7 were between five and ten, 10 were between ten and fifteen, 5 were between fifteen and twenty, 22 were between twenty and twenty-five, 26 were between twenty-five and thirty, 21 were between thirty and thirty-five, and forty, 30 were between forty and forty-five, 26 were between forty and of try-five, 26 were between fifty and fifty-five, 26 were between fifty-five and sixty, 22 were between sixty and sixty-five, 18 were between sixty-five and seventy, 19 were between seventy and seventy-five, 14 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 11 were upwards of eighty.

Deaths from zymotic diseases decreased from 62 in July to 39 in the month under notice; the latter number being the lowest recorded since September 1872. Deaths were few from all complaints under this head except typhoid fever, and this caused only 10, or 5 less than in July. On the other hand, deaths from constitutional diseases increased from 73 to 100, the increase being in deaths from cancer, which rose from 11 to 17, in those from phthisis, which rose from 2 to 62, and in those from hydrocephalus, which rose from 3 to 7. Deaths from local diseases also increased from 216 to 245; the increase being chiefly in deaths from heart affections, which rose from 22 to 34, and in those from lung and chest complaints, which rose from 82 to 108.

THE following Notices, which have been received from the Hydrographic Office, London, are published for general information.

The information contained in these Notices is to be carefully considered, to be noted in the Sailing Directions, and compared with the chart when the ship is navigating the parts to which . it refers.

HYDROGRAPHIC NOTICE .- [No. 24.]

PACIFIC OCEAN.—SOUTH-WESTERN PART.—[Notice No. 63.] The following information, relating to the Solomon Islands, New Britain, New Ireland, New Hanover, and the Admiralty Islands; also to the reefs in their neighborhood, is derived from reports received from the officers of Her Majesty's surveying vessels Renard and Lark, those of Her Majesty's ships employed upon the Australian station, and from other sources, 1879-1882.

[All bearings are magnetic. Variation in 1883.] Solomon Islands, 8° 6' easterly. New Ireland, 6° easterly. 80LOMON ISLANDS. 1

Santa Anna Island is of volcanic origin. The inhabitants are well disposed, and of a superior class to those of the neighbouring islands. Port Mary, upon the west side of the island, is much visited by schooners trading in this locality. The port affords a limited supply of fresh water.

LARK SHOAL, upon which a depth of 7 fathoms least water was found, extends 14 miles north and south, is one mile in width, and lies N. by E. 4 E. distant 10 miles from the summit of the northernment of the Three Sisters islands, or in lat. 10° 0′ S., long. 161° 54′ E.

long. 161° 54′ E.

SAN CHRISTOVAL ISLAND.—Makira Harbor.—This harbor is probably one of the best and safest in the group. Is is, however, somewhat difficult for a stranger to recognize, especially if coming from the westward.

After passing Point Achard, which can be distinguished by the white sand beach to the eastward of it, a high double peak will be seen, which should be steered for, bearing S.E. by E. J.E., and the entrance to the harbor will be seen, having two small islets lying off the north-west point.

The wind is generally light and baffling under the high land, but a light land breeze in the early morning enables a vessel to get out of the port before the sea breeze sets in.

Good water can be procured from a stream opposite the entrance, and native provisions can be obtained in small quantities.

INDISPENSABLE STRAIT.—A bank having a depth of 11 fathoms, sand and coral bottom (apparently extending to the westward), was passed over by the Imperial German vessel Ariadne, with Ramos Island bearing east, distant 6 miles. In the vicinity of Savo Island, in the month of December, the current was observed to be setting to the north-east 12 miles an hour, and off Cape Prieto, setting northward 2 miles an hour, and off this island has been ascertained to be 1,100 feet above high-water.

Bougaintle Manya—Capa North is stead to be of moderate

RENDOVA ISLAND.—This island, of coral formation, and densely wooded to the water's edge, is 18 miles long in a north and south direction, and 8 miles broad. The east coast is steep-to. No bottom at 20 fathoms could be obtained close to the shore in most places, including the three small islands lying off the centre part of the eastern shore.

Renard and Blanche islands are 14 miles long, and respectively 220 feet and 280 feet in height. Observatory Island is about 100 yards in diameter, 180 high, and is the western of the three islands, all of which are thickly wooded.

RENARD COVE is situated north of the point on Bendova Island.

RENARD COVE is situated north of the point on Rendova Island, immediately west of Observatory Island; it is stated to be a small and apparently secure anchorage. From the eastern side of the cove a reef extends 200 yards, and runs parallel to the shore, partly drying at low-water, and having two or three large stones upon it that are always uncovered. At the head of the cove are several lagoons, communicating with each other by boat channels.

channels.

The Renard being unable to work up into shoaler water at the head of the cove (where there is 15 fathoms at less than half-acable from the shore) in consequence of light winds, and an outset from the lagoons before mentioned, anchored in 42 fathoms, black mud, in the centre of the cove.

Tippinge Creck.—From Cape Richards (the north-east point of Rendova Island) the coast trends N.N.W., and is broken by many small creeks and inlets. At 23 miles northward of the cape is Tippinge Creck, formed by a small creal islet and Rendova Island.

This creek, which may be recognized by the cocoanut trees and

This creek, which may be recognized by the cocoanut trees and some conspicuous dead trees beyond them upon the main land, is small, but secure from all winds except those from the north, and affords anchorage in 15 fathoms, black sand.

A small reef awash extends from the north shore of the coral

islet about 30 yards distant.

Fresh water of good quality can be obtained from a stream near the cocoanut trees, and fish are abundant in the creek.

Rendova Harbor.—This harbor, situated upon the north coast of Rendova Island, is the only one in the locality adapted to vessels of considerable size, but must be used with caution, in consequence of the many shoals which exist in it. It is advisable to enter the harbor by Renard entrance in lat. S 23 23 S., long. 157 15 25 E. the passage is one-eighth of a mile wide, having a slight fringe reef, and carries an average depth of 8 fathoms, sand and coral. The Renard anchored in 14 fathoms, just north of the Observatory Islet.

14 tathoms, just north of the Observatory Islet.

Coust.—From Rendova Harbor the coast trends S.W. by S. about 13 miles to Banyetta Point, a barrier reef extends from the western islet in Rendova Harbor, and many dangers exist off this part of the coast, which vessels should pass outside of. A reef extends 3 cables from Cape Pleasant (the south-east point of the island), upon which the sea breaks heavily. A depth of 21 fathoms was found in Blanche Cove, which is exposed to the eastward, and there is room only for a small vessel to anchor.

NEW GEORGIA.—Moonda Harbor.—About 5 miles W. by N. from Renard Entrance to Rendova Harbor is the entrance to Moonda Harbor, across which there is a bar of 12 feet at highwater, and heavy breakers with southerly winds. The passage to the eastward into the harbor after the bar is crossed is intricate, full of shoals, and should not be attempted by a stranger where it of the passage. unless in a steam-vessel.

Montgomery Island.—This island, about 15 miles long in an E. by S. and W. by N. direction, is not inhabited. Some fringing reef extends from the western extremity, but the eastern end seemed steep-to. The Renard passed within half a mile of it.

of it.

RUSSELL ISLANDS.—This group, extending 20 miles in an east and west direction and 12 miles north and south, consists of two principal islands and a number of small islets scattered around them, having, as a rule, deep water close-to.

The largest island is elevated 1,600 feet, and there is a deep channel between it and the island eastward of it. The northern part of the group is bordered by a barrier reef, having numerous small islets from 10 to 50 feet high upon it, nearly all of which are covered with vegetation. In the centre of the barrier reef there is a deep passage between the islets It-a-matic and Ellavaline, the latter islet being recognized by a tufted bush upon its centre. Inside the barrier there are several coral patches, some of considerable extent, all of which, however, can be discerned from aloft. from aloft.

Anchorage.-The Renard anchored in 15 fathoms in a confined position for a small vessel, at the entrance to Renard Sound, and obtained good fresh water from a stream 14 miles up the

The trading vessels usually anchor off Moco Island, or in the bight south-eastward of No-no Island. In the inlet running to the south-east, at the head of West Bay, there is anchorage for a large ship with room to swing.

Natives.—The group appeared to be thinly inhabited by a peaceable and keen trading people, most of whom speak a little English and are well provided with european goods.

Supplies.—Pigs, yams, pineapples, limes, mangoes, bananas, eccoanuts, and spinach can be obtained.

Murray Island (Buraqoi).—This island is sometimes visited by the natives of Russell islands, when on their trading voyages to New Georgia. The only landing-place is on a small beach upon the north-west side, where the natives haul up their cances.

Princess Island and Bridgewater Reef.—H.M.S. Lark sounded upon the assigned position of Princess Island in 1882, and obtained no bottom at 250 fathoms; the Renard also passed near the same spot in 1881 without seeing any island. Bridgewater Reef was searched for without success by the above-mentioned vessels. Both Princess Island and Bridgewater Reef have been expunged from the charts.

Pocklington Recf.—This coral reef is 18 miles long in a N.E. by E. \(\frac{1}{2} \) E. and S.W. by W. \(\frac{1}{2} \) W. direction, its greatest breadth is 3 miles, and in some places it is not more than one mile across. The east extreme is in lat. 10° 45′ 25° S., long. 155° 51′ 40″ E. There are several large boulders upon the northern side of the reef, and about the middle of the south side there was the wreck of a large iron ship (in 1880). There is no anchorage around this reef.

wind and Weather.—The south-east trade wind prevails from April to December, or the latter end of November, most frequently from E.S.E.; but from local information the wind has not been so steady latterly, either in force or direction, as in former years. To the southward of San Christoval Island, in the early part of this season, light airs and calms prevail sometimes for many days. Towards the end of the season there is occasionally much rain and squally weather, the barometer being but little affected.

Westerly winds commence in December and continue until March, blowing strong in January and February, and much rain falls; during this season violent squalls from W.S.W. are frequent, which would do much damage to a vessel taken unprepared for them.

Barometer.—From July to December the average height of the

Barometer.—From July to December the average height of the barometer was 29.85 inches, and the greatest range from 29.70 to 29.98 inches.

Currents.—During the season of south-easterly winds the current generally sets to the south-west, but it is irregular. The Renard being becalmed, for 9 days, to the southward of San Christoval Island in the month of May, was set to the eastward when 10 miles off shore, while within that distance from the coast

REEFS.—A coral reef, having a depth of 8 feet over it, upon which the barque Alice Mary struck, is stated to be about half a mile in extent; it lies 7 miles from the coast, with Tupinier Island in line with the low promontory of Cape St. Ann bearing N.W. 4 W., or in lat. 5° 55′ S., long. 148° 35′ E.

water and breakers were seen, is said to lie with Lottin Island

an islet lying north-west, distant 1½ miles from Tupinier Island;
also, that a small island lying W.N.W., distant half a mile from
Lottin Island, forms a good harbor.

BLANCHE BAY.—Greet Harbor.—Consequent upon the continued volcanic action upon the crater peninsula, the depths in the harbor are constantly undergoing changes, and vessels should not approach the shore too closely, especially in the vicinity of Praed Foint. The dirty-green color of the water is caused by the numerous sulphur springs along the shore. There is a German trading establishment upon Matupi Island, where coal and ship's provisions can generally be obtained. There is communication with Sydney by sailing vessels, about once a month, and Messrs. Hernsheim's steamers run between Matupi and Cooktown more frequently.*

Matupi is stated to be healthy and free from fevers.

Wind and weather.—From March to November south-east and

Wind and weather.—From March to November south-east and easterly winds blow with tolerable regularity, generally fresh, moderating during March to June. The rainfall is small while these winds last, and fresh water is frequently scarce. The north-westerly winds commence in November blowing strong until February, and are accompanied by much rain. The wind in the port is influenced by the surrounding high land. Kabakadai Bay.—When bound for this anchorage, a berth of half a mile should be given to Cape Stephens, to avoid the fringing reef. A course should then be shaped for the mission house upon the bluff above Kabakadai Point, which should be seen about 5 miles distant.
The anchorage is in 13 fathoms, with the white cliff bearing S.W. by W., but the bank is steep, and the hay is not recommended, except as a stopping place for the night.

Matara Bay, situated between Materbert Island and the shore,

Matava Bay, situated between Materbert Island and the shore, is a small but well sheltered anchorage, having depths of 10 to 13 fathoms. Good water may be obtained.

Tides.—There is only one tide in the 24 hours in the bays upon the north coast of New Britain, and that is irregular.

DUKE OF YORK ISLANDS.

MAKADA HABBOR.—A rock, upon which H.M.S. Beagle struck, lies in the western entrance to Makada Harbor, with West Point, on Makada Island, bearing N. 14° W. Pinnacle Rock (Duke of York Island) bearing S. 61 E.

It is stated that several sunken patches, having from 3 to 4 fathours water over them, lie westward of the above danger, Great Credner Island bearing south leads westward of them.

NEW IRELAND.

GERRIT DENYS ISLAND.—Luise Harbor.—On the north-east coast of Gerrit Denys Island, is the only harbor, and affords safe anchorage with all winds, except those from between north-east and east.

It is stated that another island, named St. Bruno, and for which no definite position is given, exists with the group of islands situated north of Gerrit Denys Island.

Steffen Strait is said to be clear of reefs with the exception of that lying in the southern entrance, upon which a depth of 4 fathoms least water was found.

NORTH CAPE, the name given to the northernmost point of New Ireland, is a low promontory, covered with cocoanut trees. South-west of the cape is the island of Nusa, between which and the coast of New Ireland is formed a nearly land-locked harbor of about one mile in diameter, having good anchorage in 7 fathoms, the eastern part of the harbor being the deepest. The entrance to the harbor from the northward has a bar, upon which 18 feet was obtained, but the southern entrance is stated to be deep enough to admit large ships.

Tide.—The tidal streams run strongly between the islands and the coast in this neighborhood, the ebb tide running to the southward 2 knots per hour.

Kapsu.—Anchorage may be obtained off Kapsu in 13 fathoms.

in which depths of 10 to 18 fathoms were found. H.M.S. Conflict anchored in 18 fathoms, with the north extreme of the large East island bearing N.E. by E., distant 2 miles.

PORTLAND ISLANDS.—These four islands are upon a crescent-shaped reef, concave to the northward, the reef extends 3 miles westward of the westernmost island, and from one to two cables in other places; no anchorage was found by H.M.S. Conflict.

ADMIRALTY ISLANDS.11

LA VANDOLA ISLAND is about 600 feet in height, nearly circular in shape, with a cliffy coastline upon the north side. There is a narrow fringing reef upon the southern side only, and no anchorage could be found. The natives came out in great numbers in their canoes, and were eager for barter.

Heavy rains and squals were experienced during the months of July and August.

of July and August.

East Coast.—Vessels entering the harbor situated south-west of Bird Island should do so before noon, when the reefs are more easily discerned than when the sun is in the west. The fringing reef of Bird Island should be kept aboard until the reef in the centre of the entrance is made out, the passage northward of which is to be preferred.\(^{12}\)

The anchorage is in the southern part of the port, in from 15 to 20 fathoms, where there is room for several vessels. In the south-west part of the anchorage the fringe reef extends 2 cables distant from the shore, where a small river emptice itself, giving a muddy appearance to the water. The Imperial German vessel Habicht anchored in 17 fathoms, and was sheltered from wind and swell with Bird Island bearing E. \(\frac{1}{2}\) N., and the south-entrance point S.E.

The anchorage in the northern part of the harbor inside Bird Island is not recommended, the water being deep, and there is not sufficient swinging room.

Between the two promontories upon the north-east extreme of Admiralty Island there is another harbor, rather larger than that above-mentioned, the entrance to which is close to the shore upon the northern side; it has, however, only 18 feet water in the passage in.

NORTH COAST.—Nares Harbor.—A shoal having 2½ fathoms over it has been found upon the banks lying N.W. by N., distant half a mile from Failure Rocks.

A considerable tidal stream was observed to set, both east and west, without any perceptible rise or fall of water.

H.M.S. Conflict found anchorage in 3 fathoms in a bay three-quarters of a mile wide, with Observatory Island in Nares Harbor bearing N.W. by N., distant about 5 miles, no considerable indentation in the coast was seen from thence to the Barrier Reef. A flat rock occupies a central position in the bay, and two-thirds of a mile out there is a dangerous patch awash, with 8 fathoms close around, except upon the north-west side, where 2 and 3 fathoms were found.

During the season of north-westerly winds there is no protection from the wind and sea, which would render anchoring at that time impracticable.

A small river running into the bay round a remarkable black rock, about 100 feet high, affords a supply of good water, easily obtained.

Balscot Bay is reported to be a good and well sheltered

Balsect Bay is reported to be a good and well sneitered anchorage.

From a position 9 miles eastward of Observatory Islet to Los Negros islands the coast is fronted by a barrier reef, upon which are several islands having passages to sea between them, from a half to two miles wide. H.M.S. Conflict, in working to windward between the barrier and the coast, found the channel two miles wide, and the dangers distinguishable. Reefs were observed to extend from all the points of the Admiralty Island shore, and good anchorage was obtained between them in from 5 to 11 fathoms; the vessel passed out to sea between the Los Negros islands.

WHEREAS by The Land Act 1869 it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of the Colony of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby abolish the Turrumberry Common Proclaimed by Order of the twenty-seventh day of March One thousand eight hundred and seventy-six.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-fourth day of September, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, and in the forty-seventh year of Her Majesty's reign.


