VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

The Public Works Statute 1865, section 128.—"It shall be lawful for any officer or agent of the board or company, and all persons called by him to his assistance, to seize and detain any person who shall have committed any offence against the provisions of this part of this Act or of the bye-laws made under the authority of this Act, and whose name and residence shall be unknown to such officer or agent, and give him in charge to a police constable who shall convey him with all convenient despatch before some justice without any warrant or other authority than this Act ; and such justice shall proceed with all convenient despatch to the hearing and determining of the complaint against such offender."

THE Board of Land and Works doth hereby authorize and appoint the persons named in the schedule hereto annexed as its agents and officers for the purpose of carrying into effect (so far as applicable to each respective case) the 128th section of *The Public Works Statute 1865*, and also at any time hereafter to lay any information or complaint before any justice against any person for any offence against the provisions of Part III. of *The Public Works Statute 1865*, or of any bye-law made or to be made under the authority of such Act ; and to summon such person before any justice or justices for such offence, or to charge him or her with such offence.

GREEN CAPE LIGHTHOUSE.

REFERRING to the Notice issued from this office on the 20th March 1882, it is hereby notified, for general information, that the light will be exhibited at Green Cape from sunset to sunrise on and after the night of Thursday the 1st of November next.

This light is situated in latitude 37° 15' 30" south, longitude 150° 4' east. It is elevated 144 feet, including tower 68 feet, above high-water mark. It is of the first order, dioptric, white, revolving, showing its greatest brilliancy every minute. It will be visible from an ordinary ship's deck at a distance of 19 miles in clear weather between the bearings of N. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. and S.S.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. magnetic.

HINDOSTAN—WEST COAST.—BOMBAY HARBOR.

[No. 48.]

NOTICE is hereby given that, with reference to the Notice to Mariners, No. 5, published in the *Bombay Government Gazette*, Part II., pages 261, 290, and 311, dated respectively the 9th, 16th, and 23rd March 1882, the Lighthouse which was in course of construction on the Sunkon Rock is now complete, and that, on and after the 1st of April 1884 a dioptric fixed occulting light of the 3rd order will be exhibited therefrom, and the inner Light-Vessel will be withdrawn.

The light will show through an arc of 244° or from S. 7° W. round eastward to N. 69° E., and is a red light with two white direction beams, one showing between S. 7° W. and S. 30° W., and the other between N. 15° E. and N. 31° E., and will be visible from a distance of 14 sea miles.

(These bearings are magnetic and from seaward.)
The occultations last for periods of 5 seconds, the duration of the light in each period being from 3 to 4 seconds, and the eclipse from 1 to 2 seconds.

The lighthouse is a circular tower of a dark-grey color approaching to black, and the height of the light is 71 feet above mean sea level.

The interchange of lights between the Prongs and Kennery Island, referred to in the Notice to Mariners (No. 5) above quoted, will not be made.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE PILOT BOARD OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave, of Mulgrave, all in the county of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

EDINBURGH GARDENS, FITZROY.

Regulations for the Care, Protection, and Management of Edinburgh Gardens, in the City of Fitzroy.

WHEREAS by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted that the Board of Land and Works shall have power, from time to time, to make and alter or rescind rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein: Now therefore the said Board of Land and Works, in exercise of the power conferred as aforesaid, and with the consent of the City Council of Fitzroy, doth hereby make the Regulations following for the care, protection, and management of the Edinburgh Gardens, in the City of Fitzroy.

REGULATIONS.

1. All persons visiting or walking through the gardens shall keep on the footpaths.
2. No person shall interfere with the seats, trees, shrubs, or birds in these gardens, or throw stones or other missiles, or beat carpets, or commit any nuisance, or light fires therein, or leave therein any bottles, orange-peel, paper, cast off clothing, or litter or refuse of any kind, or smoke when off the paths.
3. No person shall climb on or jump over the seats or fences in or around the gardens, or lie on the seats or on the grass, or stick bills on the fences or on the gates, or cut names, letters or marks on the trees, seats, gates, posts, or fences, or otherwise deface the same or write thereon.
4. No person, unless employed in the gardens under the direction of the curator thereof, shall bring into the gardens any horse or vehicle, or enter plots of ground enclosed for plantations or other purposes.
5. No person shall bring into the gardens any dog, unless the same shall be held by a chain or cord.
6. No children under seven years of age shall be allowed in the gardens unless in charge of adult friends or nurses.
7. Any person found in a state of intoxication or behaving in a disorderly manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or committing in the gardens any act of indecency, may be forthwith removed therefrom by any bailiff of Crown lands or police constable.
8. All goats and poultry found within the gardens may be destroyed by any bailiff of Crown lands or police constable.
9. The gardens shall be open from sunrise to sunset.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

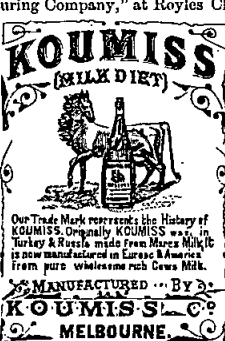


