**PASSAGE THROUGH THE BARRIER REEF AHEAD OF THE FRANKLAND ISLANDS.**

NOTICE is hereby given that a clear passage through the Barrier Reef, from 5 to 6 miles in width, and lying N.E. from Mount Bartle Frere, has been reported by Mr. J. B. Robertson, Master of the schooner *Flora*.

*Directions.*—To enter from seaward, bring Mount Bartle Frere to bear S.W., and steer with it on that bearing until the Southern Frankland Island is sighted. Bring that island to bear S.W. & S. and steer, keeping it on that bearing, which will lead in mid-channel between the reefs.

The outer edge of the Barrier Reef appears to be distant about 20 miles from the Frankland Islands.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Licensing Act 1876* (No. 566, section 44) it was amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding the provisions thereinbefore contained, it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim any place or district a place or district where, owing to a sudden increase of population or otherwise, the necessity for the immediate grant of publicans' licenses exists, to be a place or district wherein publicans' licenses might be specially granted, and from time to time to revoke any such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the township hereinafter mentioned to be a district where publicans' licenses may be specially granted under the provisions of the 44th section of the said Act, that is to say:—

By His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

THE UNITED TOWN AND FARMERS' COMMON OF MANSFIELD AND GREENFIELDS, proclaimed by Order of the 5th February 1868, and extended by Order of the 11th November 1868, is hereby diminished, by deducting therefrom thirty-two acres thirty-nine perches of land, being the portion of original allotment seventeen, parish of Loyola, temporarily reserved as a site for Quarrying purposes by Order of the 22nd October 1877.—(83.B.30067.)

DISPOSITION OF CHURCH LAND ALLOWED.

A STATEMENT of Trusts having been submitted by the head or authorized representative of the denomination of the Church of England, in the diocese of Melbourne, in Victoria, under the provisions of *The Act to provide for the Abolition of State Aid to Religion*, for allowance by the Governor, the same was allowed by him on the tenth day of December 1883, and the following is the form in which such statement of trusts has been allowed :-

*Description of Land.*—Two acres, county of Tanjil, municipal district of Sale, being allotments 14, 15, 16, and 17 of section 1; Commencing at the south-west angle of allotment 13; bounded thence by that allotment bearing N. 78° E. five chains; thence by allotments 5, 4, 3, and 2 bearing S. 12° E. four chains; thence by allotments 19 and 18 bearing S. 78° W. five chains; and thence by Raywood street bearing N. 12° W. four chains to the point of commencement.

*Names of Trustees.*—The Right Reverend James Moorhouse, Doctor of Divinity, Bishop of Melbourne; the Honorable William Edward Hearn, M.L.C., Chancellor of the Diocese of Melbourne; and the Honorable Thomas Turner a'Beckett, Registrar of the Diocese of Melbourne.

*Powers of Disposition.*—Power to sell, lease, mortgage, or exchange, subject to the approval of the Bishop of the Diocese of Melbourne, or during the absence of the Bishop from the diocese or the vacancy of the see, to the approval of the person for the time being administering the affairs of the diocese; the Bishop or such person as aforesaid to have power to remove trustees and to appoint new trustees, and to fill up all vacancies occurring in trusteeship; and to register these trusts under the provisions of the Successory Trusts Act 1878. The land, until otherwise disposed of, to be held for the purposes for which it was granted or reserved by the Crown.

*Purposes to which Proceeds of Disposition are to be Applied.*—To such purposes of the Church of England in the diocese of Melbourne as may be agreed upon by (1) the Bishop, or during his absence from his see, or during the vacancy thereof, by the person for the time being administering the affairs of the diocese; (2) the trustees; and (3) the minister entitled to officiate in or occupy any building upon the land.

RECREATION RESERVES, WYNDHAM AND ROTHWELL.

*Regulations for the care, protection, and management of the Reserve for public recreation, in the town of Wyndham, and of the Reserve for public recreation in the town of Rothwell.*

THE Council of the Shire of Wyndham having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management of the reserve for public recreation in the town of Wyndham, and of the reserve for public recreation in the town of Rothwell, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*.

Regulations.

1. The reserves shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
2. No person shall enter or remain in either of the reserves who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in either of the reserves; nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in either of the reserves.
5. No person shall put in either of the reserves any cattle, goats, or pigs.
6. No person shall bring into either of the reserves any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Council first obtained.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling in either of the reserves, nor any booth or other structure, for any purpose whatever, without the consent, in writing, of the Council first obtained.
8. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in either of the reserves, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
9. No person shall cart any material through or within either of the reserves, nor disturb the surface soil thereof, nor remove therefrom any turf or other material.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

*N.B.—The Trustees meet at the Cemetery on the second Tuesday of every month, September to April at half-past five p.m., in other months at Five p.m.*

**RULES AND REGULATIONS.**

In pursuance of the powers vested in them, the Trustees of the Boroondara General Cemetery rescind the Rules and Regulations published previously in the *Government Gazette*, and make the following Rules and Regulations, that is to say:—

1. That all fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders given.
2. That any person desiring ground for a private grave or a vault, tomb, monument, cenotaph, tombstone, or for any other purpose in the cemetery under the above Act, shall apply to the trustees therefor. If approved, the trustees, on the payment of the required fees, shall issue to such person so applying a certificate of right of burial in the form specified in schedule A.
3. That any person desiring to construct a brick grave, vault, or tomb, or to erect a monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other erection in any part of the cemetery shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit a plan, design, or drawing of such with full particulars for approval.
4. That any order for interment shall be given at the cemetery at least eight working hours prior to the time fixed for the burial, otherwise an extra charge shall be made. No free interment shall be allowed without said notice.
5. That the name, age, late place of residence, probable cause of death of the deceased, and other particulars mentioned in schedule C, shall be furnished at the time of giving the order.
6. That the trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person wanting a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same, under directions of the manager, on payment of the required fees, and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate or iron. (See Act No. 677, clause 2, sec. 1.)
7. That every coffin shall have on the lid a lead or copper plate with the name of the deceased stamped thereon.
8. That every grave shall be at least seven feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than three feet from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the ground after such interment.
9. That no interment shall be permitted in any private grave or vault without the production of the certificate of right of burial or other satisfactory evidence that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so, except as provided for in the next rule.
10. That in the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault, to which during life the deceased person had no claim, the written consent of the owner shall be given in with the order.
11. That no burial shall be permitted to take place in said cemetery without a certificate from a deputy registrar of deaths, or a coroner. Such certificate shall be delivered at the lodge before the funeral enters the cemetery.
12. That the hours fixed for burials shall be as follows:—  
On week days—September to April inclusive, from Eight a.m. to Five p.m.; May to August inclusive, from Eight a.m. to Four p.m. On Sundays, throughout the year, from Two to Five p.m.
13. That no burials shall be allowed to take place between the hours of Seven p.m. and Seven a.m., except by special permission of the trustees.
14. That the time fixed for any burial shall be the time when the funeral is to be at the cemetery, and the same shall be punctually observed.
15. That every funeral shall enter by the principal entrance of the cemetery, and no vehicle, except the hearse and mourning coaches, shall be permitted to enter or to stand opposite the entrance gates. Breaking out of the procession after passing the gates is forbidden. Horses shall not be allowed to proceed faster than at a walking pace within the cemetery.

16. That every grave, vault, tomb, monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other erection, shall be maintained and kept in thorough repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owner.

17. That any person desiring to place any inscription or epitaph in any part of the cemetery shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit a copy thereof.

18. That any person putting up any erection or placing any inscription or epitaph in any part of the cemetery without the permission of the trustees shall be liable to the penalties imposed by the above Act for so doing, and to be further dealt with as a trespasser.

19. That every erection shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations (extending to the bottom of the grave when ordered). No Bath, Caen, or other soft stone, shall be allowed to be used in any work. All stones, refuse, and rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be removed at once. Copper cramps only shall be allowed in the erection of tablets or other exposed stonework.

20. That all materials required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the cemetery, and shall be admitted only at the principal entrance, and no vehicle conveying any such materials with wheels less than four inches broad shall be permitted to enter.

21. That no catacomb shall be allowed.

22. That no wooden erection shall be allowed.

23. That the trustees shall not (unless in very exceptional cases) permit the removal of any corpse from any grave for reinterment either in said or any other cemetery.

24. That before any such exceptional case can be dealt with by the trustees, a written application, setting forth the reasons for the proposed removal, and verified by a statutory declaration, shall be produced by the nearest available representative of the deceased, and in the event of said application being granted, the permission of the Minister administering the "Coroner's Statute 1865" and the Act numbered CCCXXXVIII, in addition to that of the trustees, shall be obtained. If found necessary, the coffin shall be enclosed in a second and airtight coffin prior to removal.

25. That any workman not employed by the trustees shall be under the supervision and control of the manager, who shall have power to regulate his hours of labour, to see that his work is completed satisfactorily and with despatch, and to remove him summarily from the cemetery upon any cause of offence.

26. That, unless otherwise ordered, the principal entrance shall be open daily from Six a.m. to Six p.m. from 1st September to 30th April, and from Seven a.m. to Six p.m. during the other months of the year.

27. That no child under ten years shall be admitted into the cemetery, except in charge of a responsible person.

28. That no smoking shall be allowed within the cemetery nor any fireworks discharged therein.

29. That no dogs shall be admitted into the cemetery.

30. That any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, road, path, or any erection, or otherwise infringing the above Act, or any rule, regulation, or bye-law made for protecting the cemetery, shall be prosecuted as the law directs.

31. That no person shall be allowed to take any flower or plant out of the cemetery.

32. That the manager shall exercise a general supervision and control, under the trustees, over all matters pertaining to the cemetery.

33. That no person employed under the trustees shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of duty, nor shall be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment from the trustees.

34. That any person so employed accepting any such gratuity, or being pecuniarily interested in any such work, shall be liable to be summarily dismissed.

35. That licenses to grave dressers may be issued by the trustees in the form set out in schedule B.

36. That a plan of the cemetery, showing the distribution of the land, compartments, situations and numbers of the graves, and a registry of all certificates of right of burial, shall be kept at the office.
