But non-commissioned officers, trumpeters, and gunners dismissed or dis- charged for misconduct, or on account of bad character, to forfeit all claim to deferred pay if so directed by the Military Commandant."

The births of 950 children, viz., 494 boys and 456 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of July. In the month of June 939 births were registered, or 11 fewer than in the month under review. The births were 198 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but only 91 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in July numbered 582, viz., 309 of males, and 273 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 368. The deaths outnumbered those in June by 71, and exceeded the average of July during the previous ten years by 155. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded the average of the month during those ten years by 94 only.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was 3.12, and of deaths registered 1.91.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 64.9° on the 9th, and the lowest was 29.9° on the 24th. The mean temperature of the month (46.5°) was nearly a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (27.9°) took place on the 6th, viz., from a maximum of 61.0° to a minimum of 33.1°. The least range (8.2°) was on the 22nd, viz., from a maximum of 51.4° to a minimum of 43.2°. The mean daily range was 15.7°. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.166 inches) was slightly above the average. Rain fell on 12 days; the amount of rainfall being .78 inch.

Males contributed 53 per cent., and females 47, to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 39 per cent. to that mortality as against 32 per cent. in July 1883; 34 per cent. in July 1882; 33 per cent. in July 1881; 36 per cent. in July 1880; 29 per cent. in July 1879 and July 1878; 33 per cent. in July 1877; 30 per cent. in July 1876; 29 per cent. in July 1875; and 38 per cent. in July 1874.

Twenty-one deaths of persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these, a female, aged 75, and a dealer, aged 79, died of dropsy; 2 females, each aged 75, of cancer of stomach and heart disease respectively; a female, aged 75, of plicurisy; a female, aged 76, and a builder, aged 83, of apoplexy; a gardener, aged 78, of kidney disease; a female, aged 76, a female, aged 77, and a female, aged 86, of bronchitis; a laborer and a female, each aged 81, and a fisherman, aged 87, of pneumonia; a gentleman, a male school-teacher, and a female, each aged 77, two females and a minister, each aged 79, and a widow, aged 87, of old age.

Of the deaths registered during the month, 28 were from external causes, 21 of which were set down to accident, 1 to homicide, and 6 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A boy, aged 14, was killed by getting entangled in the machinery of an engine; a female servant, aged 16, by the wheel of a jinker passing over her head; a carter, aged 21, died of injuries resulting from a fall whilst getting into a cart he was driving; a bootmaker, aged 54, of injuries caused by falling into a drain; a building contractor, aged 63, of injuries resulting from a fall, and a cab-driver, aged 62, of injuries received through being thrown from a cab; a laborer, aged 28, was killed whilst unloading a vessel, a rope breaking and causing 5 bags of wheat to fall on him; an actor, aged 33, by the wheel of a lorry passing over him; and a laborer, aged 41, by being crushed between a truck in motion and the door of a shed; a pensioner, aged 50, died of compound fracture of the leg, caused by being run over by an omnibus, whilst intoxicated; a schoolboy, aged 13, of tetanus; a female child, aged 1 year and 9 months, of scalds, caused by stumbling over a pot of boiling water whilst playing; a female child, aged 3, and a woman, aged 56, of burns, the former through her night-clothes catching fire, and the latter through falling into the fire; a barmaid, aged 23, was poisoned with morphia administered negligently; and a gatekeeper, aged 46, with spirit of salt (hydrochloric acid) taken internally, in mistake for brandy; a seaman, aged 21, a laborer, aged 28, and a contractor, aged 36, were found drowned in the River Yarra; two female infants, aged 1 and 2 months respectively, were suffocated, the former by overlying. The homicidal death was that of a publican, aged 58, who died of injuries to the head, inflicted by his wife (verdict manslaughter). The suicidal deaths were those of two clerks, aged 28 and 29 respectively, a cook, aged 29, and a storeman, aged 34, who shot themselves; also those of an accountant, aged 46, and a cab-driver, aged 45, who poisoned themselves, the former with some irritant poison, and the latter with arsenic.

One hundred and fourteen deaths, or 20 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—53 in the Melbourne Hospital, 12 in the Alfred Hospital, 2 in the Children's Hospital, 9 in the Lying-in Hospital, 6 in the Immigrants' Home, 10 in the Benevolent Asylum, 9 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 10 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 1 in the Pentridge Stockade.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 228, of which 117, or 51 per cent., were of males, and 111, or 49 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 139 were under one year of age, 53 were between one and two, 16 were between two and three, 11 were between three and four, and 9 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 354. Of these, 192, or 54 per cent., were males, and 162, or 46 per cent., were females; 15 were between five and ten, 7 were between ten and fifteen, 12 were between fifteen and twenty, 31 were between twenty and twenty-five, 29 were between twenty-five and thirty, 22 were between thirty and thirty-five, 17 were between thirty-five and forty, 21 were between forty and forty-five, 41 were between forty-five and fifty, 43 were between fifty and fifty-five, 27 were between fifty-five and sixty, 28 were between sixty and sixty-five, 18 were between sixty-five and seventy, 22 were between seventy and seventy-five, 15 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 6 were upwards of eighty.

As compared with the previous month, deaths from zymotic diseases decreased from 93 to 89; under this head deaths from typhoid fever fell from 28 to 15, those from metria from 3 to 1, and those from dysentery and diarrhoea from 11 to 9. On the other hand, deaths from measles increased from 4 to 6, those from croup from 5 to 13, and those from whooping-cough from 17 to 27. Under the head of local diseases, the deaths increased from 256 to 308, the increase being in deaths from lung and chest affections, which rose from 78 to 141; whereas those from bowel and stomach complaints decreased from 40 to 32. Eight deaths were set down to circumstances attendant on childbirth, which on being compared with the births, gives an average of 1 death of a mother to every 119 children born alive. In the previous month there were as many as 12 deaths in childbed, or an average of 1 death of a mother to every 78 children born alive.

**PROCLAMATION OF A SPECIAL LICENSING DISTRICT REVOKED.**

**PROCLAMATION**

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Licensing Act 1876* (No. 566, section 44) it was amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding the provisions thereinbefore contained, it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim any place or district a place or district where, owing to a sudden increase of population or otherwise, the necessity for the immediate grant of publicans' licenses exists, to be a place or district wherein publicans' licenses might be specially granted, and from time to time to revoke any such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the proclamation, bearing date the seventh day of July One thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, proclaiming

SLOCOMBS DIGGINGS, near Emu,

a District where publicans' licenses may be specially granted under the provisions of the said Act.
