NOTE.—The apparent increase of population in the first half of 1884 has been 14,013, and as the estimated population on the 30th June wanted 54,297 of a million, the latter number should be reached in rather less than two years, or a little before the middle of 1886. It will be observed that the male population already exceeds half a million.

The estimated population of New South Wales on the 30th June, recently published, was 895,533, the apparent increase

since the beginning of the year being 26,223. A similar increase should bring the population of that colony up to a million by the middle of 1886.

During the quarter ended 30th June the excess of registered births over registered deaths was 3892, viz., 1938 males and 1954 females; that by excess of recorded arrivals by sea over recorded departures by sea was 2874, viz., 2181 males and 693 females. The total increase of population was thus 6766, viz., 4119 males and 2647 females, as shown in the table. This increase exceeded by 1193 that recorded in the corresponding quarter of the previous year, viz., 5573. It should be stated that, whilst it is probable nearly all the deaths and arrivals by sea are noted, there is reason to believe that some births and departures by sea are not recorded; it should moreover be borne in mind that no attempt is made to take an account of persons who come and go overland.

REGULATIONS UNDER "THE FRIENDLY SOCIETIES ACT 1877."

IN pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred by *The Friendly Societies Act 1877*, and of every other power and authority enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind Clause 60 of the Regulations dated the 29th April 1878, and doth make the following Regulations in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS.

60. The fees payable to an actuary under the foregoing Regulations shall be for his own use, if he be not the Actuary attached to the Office of the Government Statist, but if he be such actuary, the fees shall be paid forthwith into the Treasury to the credit of the General Revenue.

60A. When a society or branch desires that a table of contributions, necessary to provide the payment of sick pay and funeral benefits, should be prepared by the Actuary attached to the Office of the Government Statist, the application to construct such table shall be accompanied with a fee of £10 10s.; provided always that if the benefits or contributions should be of an unusual character, of which the Government Statist shall be the sole judge, or if additional tables are required to be furnished, the fee shall be fixed by the Government Statist, with the approval of the Chief Secretary. All fees under this clause shall be paid forthwith into the Treasury to the credit of the General Revenue.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred by *The Victorian Railways Commissioners Act 1883*, do hereby make the following Bye-law, and all bye-laws of 31st January, 1884, conflicting therewith are hereby repealed:—

Fares for Conveyance by Passenger Trains are fixed as follow:—

1. 2nd Class Annual Ticket for all Lines, £50.
2. Persons in charge of Dogs may have a Second Class Compartment reserved for them, by Passenger Trains, provided there is sufficient accommodation in the train, on Payment of Five Second Class Fares (which will entitle any number of attendants up to five to travel), and the Ordinary Rates for the Dogs. Any attendants over five to pay Ordinary Fares.

Charges on Goods are fixed as follow:—

3. Canned Fruits or Jams direct from the factory, to be charged and carried under Special Class B Rates and Conditions.
4. Antimony Ore, partially Smelted, in Bags, to be charged and carried under Special Class B Rates and Conditions.
5. Fruit, Fresh, in Cases, under Special Class A in Goods Tariff. The minimum of 1 ton is abolished, and actual weight to be charged, subject to the minimum charges in Bye-law 8, of 20th June, 1884, clause 22.
6. Wine, Colonial, in Bulk, under Special Class A in Goods Tariff. The minimum is reduced from 5 to 2 tons.
7. Cheese, Colonial, Loose, under 2nd Class in Goods Tariff. The minimum of 1 ton is reduced to 10 cwt.

BYE-LAW No. 14.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred by *The Victorian Railways Commissioners Act 1883*, do hereby make the following Bye-law, and all bye-laws of 31st January, 1884, conflicting therewith are hereby repealed:—

Fares and Conditions for Conveyance by Passenger Trains are fixed as follow:—

1. First Class Annual Ticket between Melbourne and Geelong, £25.
2. Non-commissioned Officers and Men of the Naval and Military Forces travelling free to and from Musters, Drills, Parades, and Rifle Practices, under Section 12 of Act 777, shall travel 2nd Class, and any Non-commissioned Officer or Man of such Forces travelling in a Railway Carriage of a superior class shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

Charges on Goods are fixed as follow:—

3. Pigs, Sheep, or Calves (living), in Crates or Cases, charged and carried under 4th Class Rates, shall be subject to a minimum charge as for $2\frac{1}{2}$ cwt. per package.
4. Agricultural Produce and Special Class Goods, in quantities of less than 2 tons, to be charged actual weight at Miscellaneous Class Rates, subject to the minimum charges in Clause 22 of Bye-law 8.

Charges for Warehousing Goods, to the extent to which the Department has storage accommodation, are fixed as follow:—

5. All Goods of the First, Second, Third, and Fourth Classes, Grain, and other produce from up-country stations discharged into the Melbourne Goods Sheds, will be allowed three days free storage. For instance, Grain unloaded on a Monday if removed on or before the following Thursday will not be subject to any charge for storage. If not removed within the prescribed time, storage at the rate of 6d. per ton per week will be charged. Part of a ton to be charged as a ton, and part of a week as a week.
6. At Country Stations, Goods of the First, Second, Third, and Fourth, and of the Special, Agricultural, and Miscellaneous Classes, must be removed within three days, as above, after unloading. If not so removed, storage will be charged as follows, viz.:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE AND MANAGEMENT OF THE NUMURKAH RESERVE.

No person shall permit, allow, or cause to enter within the fence enclosing the Numurkah Reserve any cattle, goats, pigs, geese, or any other animals without the written authority of the Committee of Management or their officer duly appointed.

No person shall allow any foul or deleterious matter injurious to health to run into or be placed in the said reserve, nor shall any person bathe or wash in or otherwise pollute the water therein.

No person shall climb or jump over, or break or otherwise damage the fence or gates of the said reserve, or break or otherwise damage the pumps, troughs, platform, or other appliances attached thereto.

Boating will not be allowed except under special regulations, and then only by persons duly licensed.

Subject to the foregoing regulations the water in the said reserve shall be for the free use of the public for domestic purposes and watering stock.

Every person committing a breach of any of the foregoing regulations shall upon conviction before any justice forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence.

REGULATION No. 5.

A Regulation of the Romsey Shire Waterworks Trust, made under the 44th section of "The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881," for the purpose of imposing, levying, and receiving of a rate.

In pursuance of the powers granted or conferred by section 44 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881*, the Commissioners of the Romsey Shire Waterworks Trust make the following Regulation:—

A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all the rateable property in the Waterworks District of the Romsey Shire Waterworks Trust, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipal district in which such lands and tenements are situate, for one year commencing on the first day of September One thousand eight hundred and eighty-four and ending on the thirty-first day of August One thousand eight hundred and eighty-five. Such rate shall be payable and be collected in two equal portions or instalments of One shilling each, and the first portion or instalment shall be due and payable on the second day of September One thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, and the second portion or instalment shall be due and payable on the second day of March One thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.

Such person as the Commissioners of the Romsey Shire Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose, shall be authorized to demand and receive, collect and recover, the said rate.

CUTTING, DIGGING, OR REMOVING TIMBER FROM CERTAIN CROWN LANDS PROHIBITED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding anything therein before contained, the Governor might by proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, should cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber or particular description of timber or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth, from such portions of Crown lands as were named in such proclamation, or should exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of Part III. of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do revoke the Proclamation bearing date the seventh day of July One thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, prohibiting the cutting, digging, or removing of live trees which, at a height of two feet from the surface of the ground, are of less diameter than fifteen inches on or from the unappropriated Crown lands situate in the parishes of Amherst, Bung Bong, Carisbrook, Craigie, Eglinton, Lilliecr, Maryborough, and Warek, in the counties of Talbot and Kara Kara: And, with the advice aforesaid, do hereby declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live timber, which at a height of three feet from the surface of the ground is of less diameter than fifteen inches, on or from the unappropriated Crown lands situate in the parishes of Amherst, Bet Bet, Bung Bong, Carisbrook, Craigie, Eglinton, Lilliecr, Maryborough, and Warek, counties of Talbot and Kara Kara.—(84.B.33337.)

VICTORIA PARK, BOROUGH OF KOROIT.

Regulations for the Care, Protection, and Management of that portion of the Koroit Public Gardens now used for Recreation Purposes.

WHEREAS by the 108th section of *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management of that portion of the Koroit Public Gardens now used for recreation purposes:—

REGULATIONS.

1. Such portion, hereinafter designated "Victoria Park," of the Koroit Public Gardens shall be open free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on days set apart for shows, sports, fêtes, and holiday amusements, on which occasions a charge for admission of every adult may be made, as under, viz.:—For every adult person such a sum as the Koroit Borough Council may determine, not exceeding 2s. 6d.

2. The Koroit Borough Council may allow any duly recognised committee of any shows, sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements to use Victoria Park, and such committee shall abide by any order given by such council in reference thereto, or to the buildings or other erections for the time being thereon.

3. No person shall remain in Victoria Park who shall offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

4. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in Victoria Park, or light fires therein.

5. No person shall climb upon or jump over the fences or gates, or stick bills or cut names thereon, or in any way damage the trees, seats, or any buildings whatsoever, or roll or throw stones in Victoria Park.

6. No person shall put any horses, cattle, or sheep in Victoria Park, or take horses therein, without first obtaining the written permission of the Koroit Borough Council.

7. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in Victoria Park, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantation of young trees or shrubs.

8. No person shall erect any dwelling in Victoria Park, nor any booth or other structure for the sale or exhibition of any article or animal, without the consent, in writing, of the Koroit Borough Council first obtained.

8. Any person committing in Victoria Park, or in any of the buildings or other structures for the time being thereon, any of the following offences shall be liable to be removed from the park, notwithstanding such person may have purchased and shall or may be in possession of a ticket of admission to the park:—

- (1.) Assaulting any person.
- (2.) Being drunk.
- (3.) Using profane or obscene language.
- (4.) Using abusive or insulting words.
- (5.) Behaving improperly or riotously.
- (6.) Obtaining admission to the park or any buildings thereon when not entitled to such admission, or refusing to surrender (if required) to any gatekeeper or other person having authority from the Koroit Borough Council to demand production of the same any ticket duly authorizing admission to the park.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

1. The whole of the articles in the foregoing Schedules, required for the service of the Victorian Railways, are to be strictly in accordance with the samples and specifications, and in every respect to be of the very best description, quality, and manufacture—subject to the approval of the Secretary, the Engineer-in-Chief, the Engineer for Existing Lines, General Traffic Manager, Locomotive Superintendent, Accountant, Telegraph Engineer, and the Railway Storekeeper. The goods will be subject to the examination and test of an inspecting officer appointed by any of the above. The Victorian Railways Commissioners will not be bound to issue orders upon the contractor for all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only for such articles and such quantities of those articles as the Victorian Railways Commissioners may order from the contractor from time to time; neither will the Victorian Railways Commissioners be bound to take from the contractor any larger supply of any of the articles than the orders which have been issued during the period of the contract, viz., from 1st January 1885 to 30th June 1887; nor will they be bound to take any of the articles enumerated

2. 5. 6. 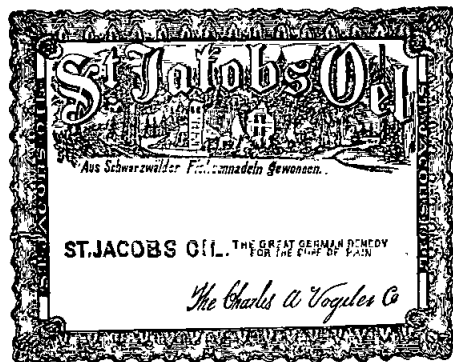

"THE PUBLIC HEALTH AMENDMENT STATUTE 1883."—SMALL-POX IN THE SHIRE OF ST. ARNAUD.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the fifth day of September 1884.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor.

WHEREAS by *The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883* it was amongst other things enacted that, upon proof by the certificate in writing of the Officer of Health of the district and of two other duly qualified medical practitioners that small-pox, cholera, or any other malignant, infectious, or contagious disease exists within a district, that there is danger that the same might spread, and that to prevent the spreading thereof it was necessary to the public safety that power should be given to isolate any tenements, it should be lawful for the Governor in Council to make an order empowering and directing such persons as the Central Board should for that purpose appoint to stop the traffic into or through any streets, thoroughfares, or places, whether public or private, which the Central Board should specify, and to limit or prevent ingress, egress, or regress of any persons to or from any house or premises within the streets, thoroughfares, or places so specified for so long as should seem to the Central Board necessary for the public safety: And whereas the Officer of Health for the Shire of St. Arnaud and two other duly qualified medical practitioners have certified in writing that small-pox exists in the said Shire and that there is danger that the same may spread: Now therefore I, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this Order empower and direct such persons as the Central Board shall for that purpose appoint to stop the traffic into or through any streets, thoroughfares, or places, whether public or private, within the Shire of St. Arnaud which the Central Board shall specify, and to limit or prevent ingress, egress, or regress of any persons to or from any house or premises within the streets, thoroughfares, or places so specified within the said Shire for so long as shall seem to the said Board necessary for the public safety.

And the Honorable Graham Berry, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

ROLL OF RATEPAYING ELECTORS RECTIFIED.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the fifth day of September 1884.

WHEREAS by *The Legislative Council Act 1881*, it was amongst other things enacted, that where any accidental or unavoidable impediment, misfeasance, or omission should have happened in the preparation or transmission or printing of any roll of ratepaying electors, the Governor in Council might, by Order in Council, take all such measures as might be necessary for removing such impediment or rectifying such misfeasance or omission, or might declare any such roll valid as to and notwithstanding such impediment, misfeasance, or omission, and every such Order in Council should state specifically the nature of the impediment, misfeasance, or omission, and should be forthwith published in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas in the preparation of the Roll of Ratepaying Electors for the Ballarat City division of the Wellington Province in November last, the Electoral Registrar for the said division did accidentally omit therefrom the names of certain electors, and it is expedient to rectify the said Roll: Now therefore the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power in him vested by the 31st section of the Act No. 702, doth by this present Order direct that the Roll of Ratepaying Electors for the Ballarat City division of the Wellington Province be rectified, by inserting therein the names of the Ratepaying Electors as set forth in the subjoined Schedule, notwithstanding such accidental omission as aforesaid, that is to say:—

TENDERS FOR GRAZING LAND.

NOTE.—The fee for the period from 22nd September to 31st December 1884 must accompany each tender.

TENDERS will be received by the Board of Land and Works up to Noon of Monday, 22nd September 1884, for the occupation for Grazing purposes only of the following unappropriated portions of land, subject to the Regulations approved by the Governor in Council, and published in the *Government Gazette* of 11th February 1876, as under, and also the subjoined special conditions.

Every license granted under subdivision VII. of section 47 of *The Land Act 1869* shall be subject to the conditions set forth in the schedule hereto, and to such special conditions and payment in advance of such fee as the Minister may determine, and shall

be issued by an officer of the Department of Lands and Survey duly authorized in that behalf.

Schedule.

1. This license shall not be deemed to prevent the land comprised therein or any part or parts thereof from being sold, leased, or licensed under any of the provisions of parts I., II., or III. of *The Land Act 1869*, except subdivision VII. of the 47th section thereof, or proclaimed a common, or occupied by virtue of any miner's right or business license, or alienated or dealt with under the authority of *The Land Act 1869*, or any other Act now or hereafter to be in force, otherwise than for pastoral or depasturing purposes, or resumed by order of the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, for railways, roads, telegraph lines, dams, reservoirs, races, catchwater drains, pipe-

tracks, quarries, or other public purposes; and no licensee shall in any such case be entitled to compensation other than the return of such portion of the fee paid by him as the Minister may think fit.

2. If the licensee, or any person claiming an interest through or under the licensee in the land comprised in this license, shall at any time during the period for which the license has been issued employ any person to apply for a license of an allotment under *The Land Act 1869*, contrary to the true intent of the provisions thereof, or shall make or cause to be made any agreement or contract, or shall give or take, or cause to be given or taken, any negotiable security for the purpose of defeating or evading the provisions of, or shall in any way whatsoever, directly or indirectly, commit or be privy to a fraud upon the said Act, this license shall be void.

3. No land comprised in roads from time to time surveyed and marked out within the boundaries of the land comprised in this license shall be deemed within the operations of this license.

4. This license entitles the holder thereof, during the period therein specified, to use the land in respect of which the same is granted for depasturing purposes only, and does not confer any right to build thereon or to cultivate or fence any portion thereof; but if the holder thereof desire such use of the land beyond such period, notice to that effect must be given by him to the Minister one month prior to expiry thereof.

5. The interest in this license may not be transferred without the consent of the Minister and payment of a fee of One pound (£1), and upon sanction of transfer thereof a new license will issue to the transferee.

6. No claim whatsoever shall be made or entertained by reason of this license not being renewed or transferred.

Special Conditions.

1. The period of occupation will be from 22nd September 1884 to 31st December 1884.

2. The license fee must be paid in advance. The fee for the period from 22nd September 1884 to 31st December 1884—for which the license will be issued—must accompany the tender, or be paid by the successful tenderer or his agent immediately on the declaration of the acceptance of the tender, otherwise the offer of the next highest tenderer who may be prepared to comply with this condition may be accepted.

3. Tenders to be for so much per block per annum.

4. Tenders to be endorsed "Tender for Block 2022."

5. The highest or any tender not necessarily accepted.

6. Tenderers must give their full name and ordinary postal address.

7. The area is given as more or less, and all appropriated, alienated, or licensed land (if any) within the boundaries is excluded.

8. The licensee shall keep the land free from vermin. Plans can be seen and information may be obtained in this office.
