## COLONIAL PRISONERS REMOVAL ACT 1884.— (47 AND 48 VICT. CH. 31.)

THE Governor has directed the subjoined Act, received from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State, to be published for general information.

### CHAPTER 31.

*An Act to make further provision respecting the removal of Prisoners and Criminal Lunatics from Her Majesty's possessions out of the United Kingdom. [28th July 1884.]*

WHEREAS it is expedient to provide for the removal of prisoners undergoing sentence, and of criminal lunatics from one British possession to another British possession, or to the United Kingdom:

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

#### PRELIMINARY.

1. *Short title.*—This Act may be cited as the Colonial Prisoners Removal Act, 1884.

#### PRISONERS REMOVAL.

2. *Removal of prisoners from British possessions in certain cases.*—Where as regards a prisoner undergoing sentence of imprisonment in any British possession for any offence it appears to the removing authority hereinafter mentioned either—

- (a.) that it is likely that the life of the prisoner will be endangered or his health permanently injured by further imprisonment in such British possession; or,
- (b.) that the prisoner belonged, at the time of committing the said offence, to the Royal Navy or to Her Majesty's regular military forces; or,
- (c.) that the offence was committed wholly or partly beyond the limits of said British possession; or,
- (d.) that by reason of there being no prison in the said British possession in which the prisoner can properly undergo his sentence or otherwise the removal of the prisoner is expedient for his safer custody or for more efficiently carrying his sentence into effect; or
- (e.) that the prisoner belongs to the class of persons who under the law of the said British possession are subject to removal under this Act;

in any such case the removing authority may, subject nevertheless to the regulations in force under this Act, order such prisoner to be removed to any British possession or to the United Kingdom to undergo his sentence or the residue thereof.

3. *Return of removed prisoner.*—(1.) Where a prisoner has been removed in pursuance of this act, a Secretary of State or the Government of a British possession to which the prisoner has been so removed, may order the prisoner, for the purpose of undergoing the residue of his sentence, to be returned to the British possession from which he was removed.

(2.) If a Secretary of State or the Government of a British possession to which a prisoner is removed under this Act, re-

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quires the prisoner to be returned for discharge to the British possession from which he was removed, the prisoner shall, in accordance with the regulations under this Act, be returned to the said British possession for the purpose of being there discharged at the expiration of his sentence. In any other case a prisoner when discharged at the expiration of his sentence shall be entitled to be sent free of cost to the British possession from which he was removed;

Provided that where a prisoner at the date of his sentence belonged to the Royal Navy or to Her Majesty's regular military forces, nothing in this section shall require such prisoner to be returned to the British possession from which he was removed, or entitle him to be sent there free of cost.

4. *Regulations as to removal.*—(1.) It shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council from time to time to make, and when made, revoke and vary regulations as to the removal, return, and discharge of prisoners under this Act.

(2.) The regulations may provide for varying the conditions of a sentence of imprisonment passed in a British possession, where they differ from the conditions of a sentence of imprisonment in the part of Her Majesty's dominions to which the prisoner is removed, with a view to bringing them into conformity with the latter conditions, but the prisoner shall not by reason of such variation undergo an imprisonment of any longer duration; and where the latter conditions appear to a Secretary of State to be more severe than the former conditions, the Secretary of State may remit a portion of the imprisonment, so that the punishment undergone by the prisoner shall not in the opinion of the Secretary of State be more severe than the punishment to which the prisoner was originally sentenced, and the sentence of imprisonment shall, so long as the prisoner remains in the part of Her Majesty's dominions to which he is removed, be carried into effect as if the conditions thereof as so varied were the conditions of the original sentence.

(3.) The regulations may also provide for the forms to be used under this Act and generally for the execution of this Act.

(4.) All regulations made under this section shall be duly observed by all persons, and shall be laid before both Houses of Parliament as soon as may be after they are made.

5. *Removing authority.*—The removing authority for the purposes of this Act shall be a Secretary of State acting with the concurrence of the Government of every British possession concerned.

6. *Evidence of act of government of British possession or Secretary of State.*—(1.) The concurrence of the Government of a British possession, and any requisition by the Government of a British possession, may be given or made by the Governor in Council or such other authority as may be from time to time provided by the law of that possession, but shall be signified by writing under the hand of the Governor or of the Colonial Secretary or of any other officer appointed in this behalf by the law of that possession.

(2.) Any writing purporting to give such concurrence or make such requisition, and to be signed by the Governor or Colonial Secretary or other officer for the time being, shall be conclusive evidence that the concurrence of or requisition by the Government of the British possession has been duly given or made according to law; and any writing purporting to be under the hand of a Secretary of State, and to order the removal of a prisoner from a British possession, shall be conclusive evidence that such order has been duly given by the Secretary of State, and every such writing as above in this section mentioned shall be admissible in evidence in any court in Her Majesty's dominions without further proof.

7. *Warrant for removal of prisoner.*—(1.) Where the removal of a prisoner from a British possession is ordered in pursuance of

this Act, a Secretary of State or the Governor of the British possession may by warrant under his hand direct the prisoner to be removed to the part of Her Majesty's dominions mentioned in the said order, and for that purpose to be delivered into the custody of the persons named or described in the warrant or some one or more of them, and to be held in custody and conveyed by sea or otherwise to the said part of Her Majesty's dominions, there to undergo his sentence, or the residue thereof, until returned in pursuance of this Act or discharged, and such warrant shall be forthwith executed according to the tenor thereof.

(2.) Where a prisoner is to be returned to a British possession, a Secretary of State or the Governor of the possession in which he has been undergoing his sentence, shall issue a like warrant, which shall be duly executed according to the tenor thereof.

(3.) Every warrant purporting to be issued in pursuance of this Act, and to be under the hand of a Secretary of State or Governor of a British possession, shall be received in evidence in every court of justice in Her Majesty's dominions without further proof, and shall be evidence of the facts therein stated, and all acts done in pursuance of such warrant shall be deemed to have been authorized by law.

8. *Dealing with removed prisoner.*—(1.) Every prisoner removed in pursuance of this Act shall, until he is returned in pursuance of this Act, be dealt with in the part of Her Majesty's dominions to which he is removed, in like manner as if his sentence (with such variation, if any, of the conditions thereof as may have been duly made in pursuance of regulations under this Act) had been duly awarded in that part, and shall be subject accordingly to all laws and regulations in force in that part, with the following qualifications, that his conviction judgment and sentence may be questioned in the part of Her Majesty's dominions from which he has been removed in the same manner as if he had not been removed, and that his sentence may be remitted and his discharge ordered in the same manner and by the same authority as if he had not been removed.

(2.) The officer in charge of any prison, on request by any person having the custody of a prisoner under a warrant issued in pursuance of this Act, and on payment or tender of a reasonable amount for expenses, shall receive such prisoner and detain him for such reasonable time as may be requested by the said person for the purpose of the proper execution of the warrant.

9. *Escape of prisoner from custody.* 37 & 38 Vict. c. 27.—(1.) If a prisoner while in custody in pursuance of this Act, or under a warrant issued in pursuance of this Act escapes, by breach of prison or otherwise, out of custody, he may be retaken in the same manner as a person convicted of a crime against the law of the place to which he escapes may be retaken upon an escape.

(2.) A person guilty of the offence of so escaping or of attempting so to escape, or of aiding or attempting to aid any such prisoner so to escape, may be tried in any of the following parts of Her Majesty's dominions, namely, the part to which and the part from which the prisoner is being removed or returned, and the part in which the prisoner escapes, and the part in which the offender is found, and such offence shall be deemed to be an offence against the law of the part of Her Majesty's dominions in which he may be so tried, and for all purposes of and incidental to the apprehension, trial, and punishment of the person accused of such offence, and of and incidental to any proceedings and matters preliminary, incidental to or consequential thereon, and of and incidental to the jurisdiction of any court constable or officer with reference to such offence, and to the person accused thereof, such offence shall be deemed to have been committed in the said part, and such person may be punished in accordance with the Courts (Colonial) Jurisdiction Act 1874.

#### CRIMINAL LUNATICS.

10. *Application of Act to removal of criminal lunatics.*—(1.) The provisions of this Act shall apply to a person in custody as a criminal lunatic in like manner, so far as consistent with the tenor thereof, as they apply to a prisoner undergoing sentence of imprisonment; and separate regulations may be made by Her Majesty in Council under this Act in relation to criminal lunatics and (subject to those regulations) all laws and regulations in force in the part of Her Majesty's dominions in which a criminal lunatic removed or returned is for the time being in custody under a warrant issued in pursuance of this Act, shall apply to such criminal lunatic as if he had become a criminal lunatic in that part.

(2.) Where a person, who is a criminal lunatic by reason of being unfit to be tried for an offence, is removed in pursuance of this Act, and a Secretary of State or the Government of the British possession to or from which such person was removed considers that such person has become sufficiently sane to be tried for the said offence, and requires him to be returned for trial to the British possession from which he was removed, he shall, in accordance with the regulations under this Act be returned as a prisoner to the said British possession for the purpose of being there tried for the said offence, and shall be removed thither in custody in like manner as if he had been arrested under a warrant on a charge for the said offence.

#### MISCELLANEOUS.

11. *Cost of removal.*—(1.) The cost of the removal of any prisoner or criminal lunatic under this Act and of his maintenance while in confinement, and of his return, and of his being sent after discharge to any place, shall be paid in such manner as may be arranged between the Governments of the British possessions concerned and the Secretary of State, subject, as regards any cost to be paid out of moneys provided by Parliament, to the consent of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury.

(2.) Nothing in this Act shall affect any power to recover the expenses of removing or returning any prisoner or criminal lunatic from the property of such prisoner or criminal lunatic or otherwise.

12. *Power of legislature of British possession to pass laws for carrying Act into effect.*—If the legislature of a British possession pass any law:—

(a.) for determining the authority by whom and the manner in which any jurisdiction, power, or concurrence under this Act is to be exercised or given; or

(b.) for payment of the costs incurred in the removal, maintenance, return, or sending back after discharge of a prisoner or criminal lunatic; or

(c.) for dealing in such possession with prisoners or criminal lunatics removed thereto in pursuance of this Act; or

(d.) for making any class of prisoners subject to removal under this Act; or,

(e.) otherwise in any manner for the carrying of this Act or any part thereof into effect as regards the said possession,

it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to direct that such law or any part thereof shall with or without modification or alteration be recognized and given effect to throughout Her Majesty's dominions and on the high seas as if it were part of this Act.

13. *Power as to making and revocation of Orders in Council.*—(1.) It shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council from time to time to make Orders for the purposes of this Act, and to revoke and vary any Order so made, and every Order so made shall while it is in force have the same effect as if it were enacted in this Act.

(2.) An Order in Council made for the purposes of this Act shall be laid before Parliament as soon as may be after it is made if Parliament is then in session, or, if not, as soon as may be after the commencement of the then next session of Parliament.

14. *Application of Act to Channel Islands and Isle of Man.*—This Act shall extend to the Channel Islands and Isle of Man as if they were part of England and the United Kingdom.

15. *Application of Act to place under foreign jurisdiction Acts.*—See 41 & 42 Vict. c. 67.—It shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council from time to time to direct that this Act shall apply, as if, subject to the conditions, exceptions, and qualifications (if any) contained in the Order, any place out of Her Majesty's dominions in which Her Majesty has jurisdiction, and which is named in the Order, were a British possession and part of Her Majesty's dominions, and to provide for carrying into effect such application.

16. *Savings.*—44 & 45 Vict. c. 58. 32 & 33 Vict. c. 30.—(1.) Nothing in this Act shall affect the provisions of the Army Act, 1881.

(2.) This Act shall not affect any agreement made either before or after the passing of this Act under the Colonial Prisoners Removal Act 1869, nor any provisions contained in the Act of the session of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, chapter eighty-one, intituled *An Act to authorize the removal from India of insane persons charged with offences, and to give better effect to inquiries of lunacy taken in India.*

17. *Application of Act to existing prisoners and criminal lunatics.*—This Act shall apply to a prisoner who has been convicted, and to a criminal lunatic who has become a criminal lunatic, before the passing of this Act, in like manner as if he had been convicted and become a criminal lunatic after the commencement of this Act.

18. *Definitions.*—In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the following meanings; that is to say,

The expression "British possession" does not include any place within the United Kingdom, the Isle of Man, or the Channel Islands, but includes all other territories and places being part of Her Majesty's dominions, and all territories and places within Her Majesty's dominions which are not part of India and are under one legislature shall be deemed to be one British possession, and any part of India under a Governor or Lieutenant Governor shall be deemed to be one British possession.

The expression "India" means all territories and places within Her Majesty's dominions which are subject to the Governor General of India in Council.

The expression "legislature," where there are local legislatures, as well as a central legislature, means the central legislature only, and in every part of India means the Governor General in Council.

The expression "Secretary of State" means one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.

The expression "Governor" means any person or persons administering the government of a British possession, and includes the Governor General of India and also the Governor and Lieutenant Governor of any part of India.

The expression "Colonial Secretary" includes a person performing the like duties as a Colonial Secretary, whether known as Government Secretary, Chief Secretary to the Government, or by any other title.

The expression "prison" includes any place for the confinement or detention of prisoners whether convicted or unconvicted.

The expression "sentence of imprisonment" means any sentence involving confinement in a prison, whether combined or not with labour, and whether known as penal servitude, imprisonment with hard labour, rigorous imprisonment, imprisonment, or otherwise, and includes a sentence awarded by way of commutation as well as an original sentence passed by the court.

The expression "criminal lunatic" means a person detained in custody by reason of his having been charged with an offence, and either found to have been insane at the time of such offence, or found or certified or otherwise lawfully proved to be unfit on the ground of his insanity to be tried for the same, and includes a person convicted of an offence and afterwards certified or otherwise lawfully proved to be insane.

## SPECIAL NOTICE TO HOLDERS OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

**I**T is hereby notified that holders of electors' rights issued on or before the 1st December 1883 must obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names placed upon the General Lists to be made up from and after the 1st December next.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from the new Lists to be made up as aforesaid.

The old right must in every case be delivered up to the Registrar, but the renewed right will be equally available for any election that may take place before the completion of the new Rolls in January next.

Intending applicants for electors' rights are cautioned to carefully ascertain whether they are fully qualified under the law; inasmuch as a penalty on conviction is imposed upon persons knowingly and wilfully obtaining electors' rights when not qualified.

No elector whose name is on, or entitled to be on, any Roll of Ratepaying Electors for any division of a Province is entitled to an elector's right for such province, and no elector whose name is already on any Roll of Ratepaying Electors for any division of an ELECTORAL DISTRICT is entitled to an elector's right for such District.

## VICTORIAN NAVAL FORCES—DRESS REGULATIONS.

THE Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of the following Dress Regulations for the Victorian Permanent Naval Forces, viz. :—

UNIFORM TO BE WORN BY THE OFFICERS OF THE VICTORIAN NAVAL FORCES.

Officers and men belonging to the Victorian Naval Forces shall wear the uniform prescribed in the Queen's Regulations for the officers and men of the Imperial Service with the following modifications :—

In the Executive Branch, instead of the loop worn on the upper stripe, a diamond is to be substituted of  $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch inside diameter.

Warrant Officers to wear  $\frac{1}{4}$ -inch lace with same device.

In the Civil Branches the uniform is to be as follows :—

Surgeons.—To wear  $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch stripes, half an inch apart, on scarlet velvet.Assistant-Surgeons.—To wear two  $\frac{1}{4}$ -inch stripes, half an inch apart, on scarlet velvet.

Paymaster.—Same as Surgeons, but on white velvet.

Assistant Paymaster.—Same as Assistant-Surgeon, but on white velvet.

Clerk.—To wear one  $\frac{1}{4}$ -inch stripe on white velvet.

Chief Engineer.—Same as Paymaster, but on purple velvet.

Engineer.—Same as Assistant Paymaster, but on purple velvet.

Assistant-Engineer.—Same as Clerk, but on purple velvet.

OFFICERS AND MEN OF THE VICTORIAN NAVAL RESERVE.

The men of the Naval Reserve will wear the same uniform as men of the Permanent Force, with the following exceptions :—

Cap.—In place of ship's name on ribbon, the words "Naval Reserve" are to be substituted.

Trousers.—A white stripe,  $\frac{1}{4}$ -inch broad, to be worn down outside seam.

SERVANTS—COOK AND STEWARDS.

Jacket.—Blue cloth, brass buttons, six in number, crown and anchor.

Waistcoat.—Blue cloth, five brass buttons.

Trousers.—Blue cloth.

Cap.—Blue cloth with peak and two brass buttons for chin-straps.

They can be permitted to wear also a serge suit, with tunic and brass buttons.

## SHIRES OF BUNINYONG AND GRENVILLE.

## PROPOSED SEVERANCE OF AREA.

IN pursuance of the provisions of *The Local Government Act 1874* (No. 506, sec. 46), the substance and prayer of a Petition, in accordance with the 44th section of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor, are published, viz. :—

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the rate-payers in the portion of the Shire of Buninyong, which is described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the said Shire of Buninyong and annexed to the north riding of the Shire of Grenville.

Area described in the petition: Commencing at a point due south of the west boundary of section VIII., parish of Cardigan, and due west of the south boundary of John Winter's pre-emptive right, in the parish of Yarrowee, county of Grenville; thence east to a road forming the east boundary of section XIII., parish of Yarrowee; thence south by that road to the south-east angle of allotment 148A; thence west by a road 3.43 chains; thence south by the east boundaries of allotments 66B1, 66A1, 59, and 50; thence west by a road to the north-east angle of allotment 73A; thence south by a road to the south-east angle of allotment 83C; thence west by a road to the south-west angle of allotment 131C; thence south-west by a line to the south-east angle of allotment 110D; all in the parish of Yarrowee; thence west to a point on the south boundary of that allotment due south of the commencing point; thence by a line bearing north to the commencing point.

Petitioners say that the position of this area, with regard to Ballarat and Sebastopol, and their commerce therewith makes their interests identical, that they have no common interest in the roads of the west riding of Buninyong. That the Cherrytree main road and the area described should be the property of Grenville Shire, as the interests of persons within same and those of the north riding of Grenville Shire are united; that, although petitioners have paid rates to Buninyong Shire for a number of years, their roads are in such a state that great and extra expense is entailed on conveying their farm produce to market and their timber and firewood to Ballarat and Sebastopol, that if annexed to Grenville the roads would be quickly constructed and the prosperity and welfare thereby promoted.

THE following Notice to Mariners, received from the Oamaru Harbor Board, is published for general information.

ON and after the 25th September 1884, there will be exhibited at the port of Oamaru two leading lights on beacons erected above the cliff to the south-westward to the harbor. From the upper or south beacon, a fixed green light, 120 feet above sea-level; from the lower beacon, a fixed white light, 104 feet above sea-level.

The beacons are white, with a black vertical stripe in the centre of each; the north beacon a circular disc, the south or upper beacon the gable of a small hut. They are 180 feet apart, bearing from each other N.N.E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E., and S.S.W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W. (magnetic).

The beacons in line lead in, clearing the spit at the breakwater end about 80 feet, and the mole end about 85 feet, with 18 feet water at two cables' length off breakwater, 17 feet abreast of the spit, and 16 feet abreast of the mole end, low-water springs.

Vessels making for the harbor should get the lights or beacons in one when about two cables' length off the breakwater, keeping them in line till the end of the breakwater bears S.E. by E.; then starboard the helm, passing the mole (on which is a fixed red light) about 120 feet off, and steer for wharf, if directed, or anchor where convenient, out of the fairway, if possible.

*Signals to Steamers.*—Steamers arriving at night and sounding whistle on approaching the breakwater will be signalled to wharf as follows :—

Macandrew Wharf.—A red light on west or outer corner of wharf.

Normanby and Sumpter Wharves.—East side, a green light on east corner of wharf; west side, a red light on west corner of wharf.

If wharf berth is not clear, the above lights will not be shown; then anchor or make fast to mooring buoys.

Strangers should not attempt to take the port at night, but keep five miles to windward till daylight, more especially in heavy southerly weather, as then the wind draws directly out of the entrance, and, if much sea on, vessels would be liable to get dangerously near to the north beach.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Licensing Act 1876 (No. 506, section 14) it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time upon the application in writing of the council of any municipality to proclaim any part of the municipal district of such municipality, to be defined by such Council, not being a borough having a population of five hundred persons liable to be rated, as shown by the rate-book, a special area; and it was further enacted that the fee which should be paid for a publican's license in respect of premises situated within a special area should be Ten pounds only; and the Governor in Council might from time to time revoke any proclamation made under the authority of the above

recited section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim as a special area under the provisions of the fourteenth section of the above in part recited Act the locality hereinafter mentioned, within which the fee to be paid for a publican's license shall be Ten pounds only, that is to say:—

The Hawkesdale Village Reserve, in the parish of Kangatong, within the Shire of Minhamite.

The Archbishop, or such person as aforesaid, to have power to remove trustees, and to appoint new trustees, and to fill up all vacancies occurring in trusteeship.

*Purposes to which proceeds of disposition are to be applied.*—To such purposes of the Roman Catholic Church as may from time to time be agreed upon by the Roman Catholic Archbishop of Melbourne and a majority of the trustees.

## REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE NARRAWONG COMMON.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons, made by the Governor in Council on 1st April 1873, the Council of the Shire of Portland, having drafted the following Regulations for management of the Narrawong Common, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council.

## Regulations.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers residing within a distance of five (5) miles from the common, may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one (1) head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three (3) head of small cattle. A farmer, having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him, may depasture on such common one (1) additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten (10) acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follow, and shall be payable quarterly in advance, on the first day of January, the first day of April, the first day of July, and the first day of October in every year:—

For every horse, 12*s.* per annum.For every head of horned cattle, 8*s.* per annum.For every head of small cattle, 2*s.* 8*d.* per annum.

Progeny, under six months old, of stock legally depasturing on the common, free.

3. No person shall depasture on the common stock of which he is not the *bona fide* owner.

4. No bull over six (6) months old or entire horse over nine (9) months old shall be allowed to depasture on the common without the written permission of the managers.

5. All persons desirous of depasturing stock on the common shall deliver them into the charge of the herdsman, and shall furnish him, at the same time, with a written statement of the number and brands of such stock, which, on payment of the prescribed fees thereon, shall, except in the case of horses, be branded with the common brand.

6. No stock registered in the books of the managers shall be removed from the common, unless notice of intention so to do be first given to the herdsman, who shall obtain a receipt from the owner for the stock removed.

7. No person shall be allowed to interfere with stock not his own property, unless he shall have previously delivered to the herdsman the written permission of the owner of such stock so to do.

8. All registered stock on which the prescribed fees shall not have been paid within ten (10) days after the date on which such fees may become due shall be deemed to be trespassing on the common, and may be impounded.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) for each offence.
