By His Excellency Sir Henry Brougham Loch, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander in-Chief, in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Licensing Act 1876 (No. 566, section 44) it was amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding the provisions thereinbefore contained, it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim any place or district a place or district where, owing to a sudden increase of population or otherwise, the necessity for the immediate grant of publicans' licenses exists, to be a place or district wherein publicans' licenses exists, to be a place or district wherein publicans' licenses may be appeared, and from time to Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the locality hereinafter mentioned to be a district where publicans' licenses may be specially granted under the provisions of the 44th section of the said Act, that is to say:—

An area of a quarter of a mile radius around the Railway Station at Baddagiunie.

REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE INVERLEIGH AND TERSDALE UNITED TOWN AND FARMERS' COMMON.

In pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons, made by the Governor in Council on the 1st April 1879, the Managers of the Inverleigh and Teesdule United Town and Farmers' Com-mon, having drafted the following Regulations for the manage-ment thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the Regulations heretofore in force in respect of such Common.

Regulations.

- 1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers residing within a distance of five (5) miles from the common, may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one (1) head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three (3) head of small cattle. A farmer, having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him, may depasture on such common one (1) additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten (10) acres of such land cultivated by him. cultivated by him.
- 2 The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follow, and shall be payable in advance, on the first day of January, the first day of April, the first day of July, and the first day of October in every year:—

For overy horse or mare, 8s. per annum.
For overy head of other large cattle, 8s. per annum.
For overy head of small cattle, 2s. per annum.
Progeny under nine (9) months old of stock legally depasturing on the common, free.

- 3. The managers may grant to butchers or to slaughtermen special licenses to depasture on the common, for such periods of time as may be agreed on, stock intended for slaughter, subject to the condition that the fees shall not be at a proportionately less rate than those hereinbefore specified.
- 4. No bull or entire horse over the age of nine (9) months shall be allowed on the common without the sanction in writing of the managers, who may refuse to allow thereon any beast or animal which, in their opinion, would be dangerous to stock on the common.
- the common.

 5. The herdsman shall, with the assistance of the owners, muster during the last week of every quarter all stock on the common, and shall also during the same week take delivery of stock that may then be put on the common, and on all such stock, whether newly put on or previously depasturing on the common, being paid for for the ensuing quarter, and the number and brands of such stock given in writing, the managers shall give a receipt for the same, and the herdsman shall forthwith, with the assistance of the owner or person in charge, brand such stock in a conspicuous place with the common brand, which shall be of pitch or tar or a mixture of both.

 6. Any stock on which the prescribed fees shall not be wiid.
- 6. Any stock on which the prescribed fees shall not be paid within ten (10) after the beginning of each quarter shall be deemed to be trespassing on the common, and liable to be impounded.
- 7. No person shall depasture on the common stock of which he is not the $bond\ fide$ owner.
- 8. No stock registered in the books of the managers shall be removed from the common, unless notice of intention to do so be first given to the herdsman, who shall obtain a receipt from the owner for the stock removed.
- The managers or herdsman shall not be responsible for the loss of or injury to any stock depasturing on the common, save as provided in clause ten (10).
- as provided in clause ton (40).

 10. The herdsman shall, on any stock straying from the common or on being removed therefrom without the consent of the owner, notify him within three (3) days thereof, and if the herdsman fail or neglect to give the owner notice in writing within that time, the former shall, should such stock be lost, he held responsible for the loss, which shall not exceed Five pounds (£5) for every horse, and Three pounds (£3) for every head of other large cattle.
- 11. No animal affected with any contagious disease shall be allowed to depasture on the common, and as soon as the herdsman shall discover that any stock legally depasturing thereon is infected with any such disease, he shall forthwith give notice

thereof in writing to the owner or owners of such stock and to the managers of the common, and shall at once take steps to remove such stock therefrom, and shall not be responsible for any loss the owner or owners thereof may suffer.

- 12. The herdsman shall assist the owners of stock legally depasturing on the common to separate any that they may require to remove.
- 13. All carcasses found on the common, which the owner or owners may refuse or neglect to remove after receiving twenty-four (24) hours' notice in writing from the managers or herdsmen, may be removed or destroyed, by burning or otherwise, at the expense of such owner or owners.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) for each offence.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred by The Victorian Railways Commissioners Act 1883, do hereby make the following Bye-law for fixing Passenger Fares:—
