VICTORIAN MILITARY FORCES.—REGULATIONS.

THE Governor in Council has made the following additions and alterations to the above Regulations, viz. :—

Paragraph 10, Section II.

The following words in the above paragraph are cancelled, viz. :—

“One fourth of the amount due on the 31st December will be retained as deferred pay until the 30th June in each year, when it will be paid less any deduction for fines, &c.”

and the following words are hereby substituted in lieu thereof :—

“The Commanding Officer may deduct from such payments any fines which have been inflicted and are in arrear.”

Paragraph 23, Section III.

This paragraph is cancelled, and the following is hereby substituted in lieu thereof :—

Section III., para. 23.—“The Commandant may summarily reduce in rank any non-commissioned officer, or may fine and dismiss any warrant officer, non-commissioned officer, or private for misconduct, or may discharge any warrant officer, non-commissioned officer, or private.”

Addition to Paragraph 24, Section III.

(j.) Being absent without leave within the meaning of these Regulations, 10s.

Additional Regulation.

Every member of the force shall attend at least two parades or drills in each month. Any member of the force failing to attend the required number of parades or drills in any month, unless on leave, shall be at the end of each month deemed to have been absent without leave within the meaning of these Regulations.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE USE OF THE 50-TON CRANE.

RATES FOR THE USE OF CRANE.

HIS Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has approved of the undermentioned portion of the Rules and Regulations for the use of the 50-ton crane (Rates for the Use of Crane), viz. :—

“When a lift is made from one vessel afloat and deposited into another, half-rates in addition to be charged.”

“And the second vessel is not in position to receive such lift within fifteen minutes,”

after the word “another.”

The portion of the Rules and Regulations referred to will then read as follows :—

“When a lift is made from one vessel afloat and deposited into another, and the second vessel is not in position to receive such lift within fifteen minutes, half-rates in addition to be charged.”

This alteration to date from the 22nd October 1884.

DREDGING OPERATIONS, BULLER RIVER.

THE Harbour-master at Westport notifies that whilst dredging operations are proceeding between the coal staiths and Railway Wharf, or at the Railway Wharf, or other part of Westport Harbour, a red light will be shown all night on the dredge.

When steamers are coming up the river, a green light will also be shown on one side of the red light. On whatever side of the red light the green is shown is the side on which such incoming steamers or other vessels are to pass the dredge.

The dredge is moored head and stern with four moorings, which will be sunk sufficiently to allow vessels to pass, and a watchman is kept on board.

During the day a red flag will be waved to indicate on which side of the dredge to pass.

EXHIBITION OF LIGHT ON KAIPARA NORTH HEAD, WEST COAST OF NORTH ISLAND, NEW ZEALAND.

WITH reference to the preliminary notice issued by this department, dated the 26th August last, it is hereby notified that, on and after Monday the 1st December next, a light will be exhibited

from the lighthouse which has been built at the North Head, Kaipara Harbour, the position and characteristics of which are as follow :—

The lighthouse is situated on the North Head of Kaipara Harbour, on the west coast of the North Island, in lat. 36° 21' S. and long. 174° 7' 45" E. The tower is 44 feet in height from base to vane, and is painted red. The light will be a second-order flashing white light, visible all round seaward as far as the land will allow, or between the bearings from seaward of N. 35° W. round to S. 73° E., and will show a flash every 10 seconds. The light will also show up harbour as far as the sandhills will allow.

The light is elevated 278 feet above the level of the sea, and, allowing 15 feet for the height of the eye, will be seen at a distance of 23 miles in clear weather, and at lesser distances according to the state of the atmosphere.

SPECIAL LICENSING DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Licensing Act 1876* (No. 566, section 44) it was amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding the provisions thereinbefore contained, it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim any place or district a place or district where, owing to a sudden increase of population or otherwise, the necessity for the immediate grant of publicans' licenses exists, to be a place or district wherein publicans' licenses might be specially granted, and from time to time to revoke any such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the locality hereinafter mentioned to be a district where publicans' licenses may be specially granted under the provisions of the 44th section of the said Act, that is to say :—

THE COROP AGRICULTURAL AREA TEMPORARY COMMON, Proclaimed by Order of the 5th November 1866, and increased by Orders dated respectively the 6th July and the 28th September 1868, is hereby diminished by deducting therefrom the portions outside the village reserve of Corop.

SHIRE OF LILLYDALE.

A By-law of the Shire of Lillydale, made under section 213 of "The Local Government Act 1874" and section 50 of "The Local Government Act Amendment Act 1883," and numbered 5, for the adoption of the undermentioned provisions of the 13th schedule of the said Act.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Local Government Act 1874," the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Lillydale order as follows:—

That By-law numbered 4 is hereby repealed, and that Sub-division 9 of Part I of the 13th Schedule of "The Local Government Act 1874" is hereby adopted in and for the Shire of Lillydale.

If any cattle shall be found upon any land not being a common and such that there is no fence, whether upon the same land or any other dividing such first-mentioned land from any street or road, whether public or private, without any person having charge of such cattle, the owner of such cattle shall forfeit a sum not exceeding twenty shillings for every head of such cattle, and

the proper officer of the council may seize such cattle and place the same at some neighbouring place of safe custody; and any justice, if such owner be not known, upon proof of the issue of a summons in the usual form addressed to such owner as "owner," only, without otherwise naming or describing him, such cattle and the place of seizure being duly described therein, and of the publication of such summons in some newspaper commonly circulating in the neighbourhood, may after the expiration of twenty-four hours from such publication proceed with respect to such owner not appearing as if personal service of a summons stating his name had been effected, or if such owner appear then as in other cases; and the justice may order the cattle to be sold and the money arising from the sale, after deducting the said penalty and the costs awarded and the reasonable expenses, to be estimated and assessed by the justice, of seizing keeping and selling the said cattle, shall be paid if demanded within one month to the owner of the cattle, and if not so demanded then to the municipal fund; and if the said money shall not be sufficient for all the purposes aforesaid the amount whereby the same falls short, or if no such sale be ordered the whole of the said amount may be recovered from the said owner if and when known in like manner as other penalties and sums adjudged or ordered to be paid by justices are to be recovered.

If any cattle be at any time found in any street without any person having the charge thereof the owner of such cattle shall forfeit for every head of such cattle a sum not exceeding twenty shillings, and if such cattle shall by reason of having been so found at large have been impounded by the council the amount of such penalty and costs if adjudged respectively before the release or sale of such cattle shall be added to the pound fees and charges payable in respect of such cattle and the amount thereof or such lesser amount (if any) as after the sale of the cattle may remain in the hands of the poundkeeper shall be paid over by him accordingly; and if the proceeds of any sale of such cattle shall not be sufficient after paying the lawful fees and charges aforesaid to satisfy such penalty and costs, or if such penalty and costs shall have been adjudged after the release or sale of the cattle the same or so much thereof as remains unpaid shall and may be recovered from the owner of the cattle in like manner as other penalties and costs adjudged by justices are by law to be recovered; and if in the case of any information under this section the owner be not known then the provisions of the last preceding section so far as necessary to give the adjudicating justices jurisdiction shall apply.

If any goat shall have been impounded under the provisions of either of the two last preceding sections or under the provisions of this bye-law relating to the impounding of cattle for trespass in the streets, and shall not after the expiration of twenty-four hours be released and the penalty, costs, fees, and charges be paid by the owner thereof, any justice may by warrant under his hand directed to any constable authorize the destruction of such goat, and the same may be destroyed accordingly.

It shall be lawful for the council to make regulations from time to time for appointing the hours during which it shall not be lawful to drive into or through the municipal district or such parts thereof as shall by boundaries be set forth in such regulation any cattle intended for sale slaughter or shipment or travelling from one part of Victoria or of any other colony to any other part, and to provide if they shall see fit in such regulations separately with respect to Sundays and week days; and if any person shall drive any such cattle contrary to such regulation he shall forfeit for every head of cattle so driven a sum not exceeding twenty shillings: Provided that nothing herein contained shall apply to horses driven in harness or to oxen in the yoke.

It shall not be lawful to break in any horse or other animal in any street whether public or private or in any public place save such public places as from time to time may be appointed by some regulation of the council in that behalf, which regulation the council are hereby authorised to make, or by locking the wheels of any cart or other vehicle or otherwise to test or try any horse or other animal so as to obstruct or injure any street or public place; and any person offending against this section shall forfeit a sum not exceeding five pounds.

SHIRE OF WARRAGUL.

BYE-LAW NO. 4.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1874, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Warragul order as follows:—

That the following be a bye-law of the Shire of Warragul, made under section 213 of the Local Government Act 1874, and numbered 4, for regulating the traffic through and over the streets and roads in the central riding of the said shire for preserving order therein as follows, viz.:

1. All persons standing or loitering upon any of the carriage-ways, footways, or other public places of the town of Warragul being the central riding of the shire aforesaid, shall discontinue to do so on requirement by any member of the police force of Victoria.

2. 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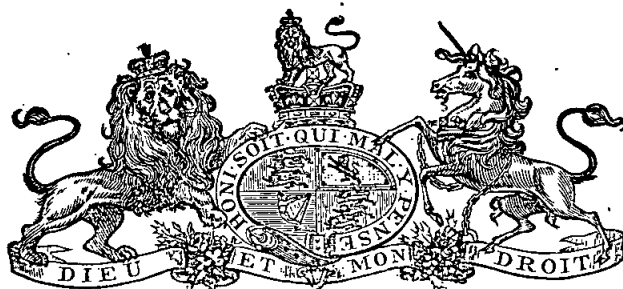
