The following words in the above paragraph are cancelled,

"One fourth of the amount due on the 31st December will be retained as deferred pay until the 30th June in each year, when it will be paid less any deduction for fines, &c.,"

and the following words are hereby substituted in lieu thereof:-"The Commanding Officer may deduct from such payments any fines which have been inflicted and are in arrear."

DREDGING OPERATIONS, BULLER RIVER.

DREDGING OPERATIONS, BULLER RIVER.

THE Harbour-master at Westport notifies that whilst dredging operations are proceeding between the coal staiths and Railway Wharf, or other part of Westport Harbour, a red light will be shown all night on the dredge.

When steamers are coming up the river, a green light will also be shown on one side of the red light. On whatever side of the red light the green is shown is the side on which such incoming steamers or other vessels are to pass the dredge.

The dredge is moored head and stern with four moorings, which will be sunk sufficiently to allow vessels to pass, and a watchman is kept on board.

During the day a red flag will be waved to indicate on which side of the dredge to pass.

EXHIBITION OF LIGHT ON KAIRARA NORTH HEAD, WEST COAST OF NORTH ISLAND, New ZEALAND.

WITH reference to the preliminary notice issued by this department, dated the 26th August last, it is hereby notified that, on and after Monday the 1st December next, a light will be exhibited

from the lighthouse which has been built at the North Head, Kaipara Harbour, the position and characteristics of which are as follow:

The lighthouse is situated on the North Head of Kaipara Harbour, on the west coast of the North Island, in lat. 35° 21° S. and long. 174° 7′ 45° E. The tower is 44 feet in height from base to vane, and is painted red. The light will be a second-order flashing white light, visible all round seaward as far as the land will allow, or between the bearings from seaward of N. 35° W. round to S. 73° E., and will show a fash every 10 seconds. The light will also show up harbour as far as the sandhills will allow.

The light is elevated 278 feet above the level of the sea, and, allowing 15 feet for the height of the eye, will be seen at a distance of 23 miles in clear weather, and at lesser distances according to the state of the atmosphere.

By His Excellency Sir Henry Brougham Loch, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Licensing Act 1876 (No. 566, section 44) it was amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding the provisions thereinbefore contained, it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim any place or district a place or district where, owing to a sudden increase of population or otherwise, the necessity for the immediate grant of publicans' licenses exists, to be a place or district wherein publicans' licenses exists, to be a place or district wherein publicans' licenses might be specially granted, and from time to fine to revoke any such proclaimation: Now therefore 1, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Exentive Council, do hereby proclaim the locality hereinafter mentioned to be a district where publicans' licenses may be specially granted under the provisions of the 44th section of the said Act, that is to say:—
