ARAFURA SEA, CLARENCE STRAIT, VERNON ISLAND, NORTH COAST OF AUSTRALIA.

REFERRING to Notice to Mariners, No. 3 of 1884, mariners are hereby informed that the red buoy which disappeared from the south-east spit of the East Vernon Island will not be replaced.

A conical buoy, painted black, with a ball on the top, 2 feet 6 inches in diameter, is now moored in about 7 fathoms of water, in latitude 12° 5' 15" south, and longitude 130° 57' 15" east (approximately), bearing S.W. by W. from the western part of the North-West Vernon Island; from Point Fright N.W. by W. three quarters W.; and from the black buoy on the Henry Ellis Reef W. half south, distance about four and a-half miles. All bearings magnetic.

Masters of large vessels are cautioned to keep to the westward of the buoy, as it is safe for only small craft to go to the eastward, where the soundings are very irregular. Two or three cables south-east from the buoy there will be found as little as 15 or 16 feet at low-water springs.

The conical buoy and the Henry Ellis Reef buoy can, in ordinary weather, plainly be seen from each other, thus rendering the passage through the Vernons safe and easy.

ROMSEY SHIRE.

PROPOSED SEVERANCE OF AREA AND CONSTITUTION OF NEW SHIRE.

IN pursuance of the provisions of *The Local Government Act 1874* (No. 506, sec. 46), the substance and prayer of a Petition, in accordance with the 44th section of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor, are published, viz.:—

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the ratepayers in the portion of the Shire of Romsey, which is described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the Shire of Romsey and constituted a new shire, under the name or title of "The Shire of Lancefield."

Area described in the petition:—The whole of the Lancefield Riding, and also all that portion of the Rochford Riding lying north of the Woodend road.

Petitioners state that, since the construction of the Lancefield railway, they have ceased to have any community of interest with that portion of the shire lying south of their residences; that, during the last few years, a large additional territory has been annexed to Romsey, rendering it, in the opinion of your

petitioners, too large and unwieldy; that the shire council passed a resolution debiting the Lancefield Riding with the amount of verdict and costs obtained by a man named Reardon against the said shire in the Supreme Court, which amount should have been paid by the council as a whole, and not by the Lancefield Riding alone; that there is a large area of country lying north and east of Lancefield, the ratepayers of which formerly petitioned for annexation to the Shire of Romsey, and are still desirous of being connected with Lancefield, as their interests are identical with those of your petitioners since the construction of the Lancefield railway.

They therefore pray that the area above described may be constituted a separate municipality, of two ridings, and that the number of the councillors be six (6).

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

SEA-SIDE EXCURSION TICKETS AND TOURISTS TICKETS.

The attention of passengers is requested to the notices posted at all the stations respecting the issue, until the 31st March, of sea-side excursion tickets and of tourists tickets until the 30th April.

CHRISTMAS AND NEW YEAR EXCURSIONS.

Holiday Excursion Tickets will be issued to and from all stations (Suburban lines excepted) from the 15th December 1884 to the 5th January 1885, both dates inclusive (Sundays excepted), available for return for one calendar month from date of issue. Example.—An excursion ticket issued on the 24th December will be available till the 24th January. When the last day falls on a Sunday, the ticket will be available till next day. The journey must be commenced on the day the ticket is issued, but after a distance of fifteen miles has been travelled, the journey may be broken at the discretion of the passenger.

Sydney Excursion Tickets.—From the 15th December to the 5th January, both dates inclusive, Excursion Tickets will be issued at Melbourne to Sydney at the following return fares:—1st Class, £5 6s. 6d.; 2nd Class, £4 1s. These tickets will be available for two calendar months from date of issue, but will not be available by the express trains on the New South Wales line. The second-class tickets will be available by the Victorian Railways express trains as far as Wodonga only.

Luggage.—Excursion Passengers will only be allowed to carry such luggage free as can be stowed under the seats without inconvenience to other passengers, and those who have luggage for the van must be at the station half an hour before the train starts, and pay excess luggage-rate for it.

Horses and Vehicles.—From the 22nd December to the 8th January, both dates inclusive, the Department cannot engage to forward horses and vehicles by any particular train.

Commercial Travellers' Samples.—From the 22nd December to the 5th January, commercial travellers' samples will not be taken to or from roadside stations, except by mixed or goods trains.

Parcels.—On the 24th and 31st December parcels must be at the Melbourne Parcels Office thirty minutes before starting time of ordinary trains.

"The Council may from time to time license to ply for hire, to hire, to let or to use for any purpose, such steamers, steamboats, sailing boats, rowing boats, punts, or vessels upon the water and premises within the said Municipal District of the City of Ballarat, and known as Lake Wendouree, as after inspection had as provided by Bye-law number 63, shall have been found fit for the conveyance of passengers or for public or private use, and for every such license there shall be paid to the council the fees as provided by sections 23 and 24 of the said Bye-law number 63, and the owner of any steamer, steamboat, sailing boat, rowing boat, punt, or vessel kept or being upon the said water and premises known as Lake Wendouree, for public or private use and not so licensed shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds."

2. "If any steamer, steamboat, sailing boat, rowing boat, punt, or vessel be let for any purpose, or ply for hire for the conveyance of passengers without having a license in force, or with-

out having its name, or without having the number of its license, or without having the number of passengers licensed to be carried, painted or marked in legible letters and figures at least one inch in length and proportionate breadth upon some conspicuous part thereof, the owner (whether licensed or not) shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds."

3. "This bye-law shall be read and construed as part of the hereinbefore mentioned Bye-law No. 63 which, save as herein provided, shall not be repealed or altered hereby."

BYE-LAW No. 32.—MAKING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES.

THE Council of the Borough of Creswick, as the local governing body, doth hereby, pursuant to, and in exercise and execution of, the powers and authorities conferred on it by "The Local Governing Bodies Loan Act 1872," make the following rate from the first day of January 1885, upon all lands and tenements within the Water Supply District of Creswick, that is to say:—

The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes:—

2. On every house or tenement of the annual value of £10, and not exceeding £12, the annual sum of £1.

5. On every house or tenement of the annual value of £31, and not exceeding £50, the annual sum of £2.

6. On every house or tenement of the annual value of £51, and not exceeding £75, the annual sum of £2 10s.

7. On every house or tenement of the annual value of £75, and not exceeding £100, the annual sum of £3.

8. On every house or tenement of the annual value of £101, and not exceeding £150, the annual sum of £3 10s.

9. On every house or tenement of the annual value of £151, and not exceeding £200, the annual sum of £4.

10. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £200 the annual sum of £5.

Hotels.

11. On every hotel of the annual value of £50, and under, the annual sum of £2 10s.

12. On every hotel of the annual value of £51, and not exceeding £100, the annual sum of £3 10s.

13. On every hotel of the annual value of £101, and not exceeding £150, the annual sum of £4 15s.

14. On every hotel of the annual value of £151, and not exceeding £200, the annual sum of £6.

15. On every hotel above the annual value of £200 the annual sum of £7.

16. Livery and coach-house stables and other premises where horses are constantly kept (in addition to the above) to be charged at the rate of 6s. per stall per annum.

17. In hotels, one stall allowed for every £50 annual value, every additional stall to be charged at the rate of 6s. per annum.

18. Charge for water troughs, £1 per annum.

19. Charge for water supplied by meter, 2s. per 1000 gallons.

20. Charge for water at standpipes, 6d. per load of 180 gallons.

21. The above rates and charges shall be paid in advance, by equal payments on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in each year, in accordance with section 246, Part 5, of "The Public Works Statute 1865," incorporated with the above mentioned Act.

22. Bye-law No. 31 is hereby repealed on and after the 1st January 1885.
