WATERFALL INLET, AUCKLAND ISLANDS.

This inlet lies five miles north-eastward from the entrance to Carnley Harbor. Its takes its name from, and may be known by a rapid stream of water, visible from the offing, on the high land at its head. The course in is about W.S.W., and the distance about three-quarters of a mile. It is about 3 cables wide at the entrance, and 1½ cables wide near to its head, at the outside of a low bluff point which runs out at right angles from the south shore, and gives shelter from the sea to a sheet of water inside. Viewed from the offing this point (which, for convenience sake, may be called Shelter Point) looks to be the head of the inlet, because a dense patch of kelp, extending from its northern extremity, appears to run right across to the north shore, and it is only when well inside that an opening between the kelp and the shore can be seen. On the outside of this passage the depth of water is 14 fathoms; along the middle of the passage from 7 to 11 fathoms. The north shore is clean and bold, 2 fathoms being within 18 feet of the rocks at the waterline. Along the margin of the kelp on the south side from 5 to 7 fathoms was found, the same depth extending a short distance in through the kelp. The bottom all over is mud or soft clay. No hidden danger was discovered.

Between Shelter Point and the north shore the width across is 79 fathoms. Of this, the space of 25 fathoms is occupied by kelp, the remaining 54 fathoms form a clear open channel, although perhaps single streamers of kelp may here and there show themselves. The narrow part of the channel extends about a cable's length, and having passed through it a basin of water nearly a quarter of a mile wide will open out. The anchorage is near to the south shore, in 3½ fathoms, well sheltered from all winds and sea. At the inner part of the kelp patch before mentioned several rocks, dry at low-water, show themselves among the kelp, but no danger was observed outside of it.

The shores on the south and west side of the basin are clean and bold all round, clay bottom shallowing inwards. Excellent wood and water are abundant.

A stranger coming in should keep along the north shore, which would lead him right into the basin, when he could then choose his anchorage.

GRAIN TO THE AUSTRALIAN WHARF.

Grain consigned direct from country stations to vessels alongside the wharf adjoining the new siding will be run down without extra charge. If consigned to Melbourne only, and then re-consigned to the wharf without being unloaded or entailing extra shunting, a charge of 1s. per truck will be made. If unloaded in the sheds and afterwards re-consigned, a charge of 2s. per ton will be made. Demurrage, as per Goods Tariff, will be enforced on all grain not taken on board within eight working hours after being placed on the wharf.

GRAIN TRAFFIC.

Wheat having been stacked in very large quantities at all the principal up-country grain stations, presumably in anticipation of a better market later on, this Department gives notice that it will be impossible to meet sudden and simultaneous demands for trucks at all, or even the principal grain depôts, should such a contingency arise. A large supply of trucks is now kept fairly distributed at the various stations, but they would of course prove inadequate in the event of the large accumulations of grain being rushed into the market at one time.

OPENING TO PYRAMID HILL.

On and after Tuesday, 12th February, Mologa and Pyramid Hill stations on the Kerang line will be open for passengers and light goods not requiring crane power or shed accommodation. No package must exceed 5 cwt., and consignees must take delivery immediately on arrival of trucks. All goods will be received and despatched at owner's risk. Trains will leave Pyramid Hill at 7.10 a.m. and 2.55 p.m. connecting with the present trains leaving Mitiamo for Sandhurst and Melbourne at 7.55 a.m. and 3.40 p.m. The 6.45 a.m. and 12.15 p.m. trains from Melbourne to Mitiamo will run to Pyramid Hill.

The births of 788 children, viz., 404 boys and 384 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of December. In the month of November 776 births were registered, or 12 fewer than in the month under review. The births were 128 above the average of the previous nine years, but only 54 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in December numbered 607, viz., 325 of males, and 282 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 181. The deaths outnumbered those in November by 156, and exceeded the average of December during the previous ten years by 81. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded the average of those ten years by 15 only.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was 2.70, and of deaths registered 2.08.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 92.3° on the 29th, and the lowest was 46.2° on the 4th. The mean temperature of the month (63.4°) was nearly half a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (40.4°) took place on the 28th, viz., from a maximum of 92.0° to a minimum of 51.6°. The least range (11.2°) occurred on the 13th and 26th, viz., in the first instance, from a maximum of 67.3° to a minimum of 56.1°, and in the second from a maximum of 67.2° to a minimum of 56.0°. The mean daily range was 20.7°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.759 inches) was slightly below the average.

Males contributed 54 per cent., and females 46 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 46 per cent. to that mortality as against 48 per cent. in December 1882; 51 per cent. in December 1881; 42 per cent. in December 1880; 46 per cent. in December 1879; 48 per cent. in December 1878; 50 per cent. in December 1877; 46 per cent. in December 1876; 45 per cent. in December 1875; 60 per cent. in December 1874; and 48 per cent. in December 1873.

The deaths of 25 persons who had attained the age of 75 years or upwards were recorded during the month, viz.:—Those of a bricklayer and a clergyman, each aged 75, who died of dysentery; a female, aged 75, of hepatitis; a gentleman, aged 75, of "Bright's Disease;" a laborer and a female, each aged 76, of paralysis; a female nurse, aged 78, of gangrene; a female, aged 78, of enteritis; a female, aged 78, and a cabinet-maker, aged 79, of drowning (the latter suicidal); a female, aged 75, a farmer, aged 79, and a bookkeeper, aged 84, of congestion of the lungs; a dairyman, aged 80, of bronchitis; a male servant, aged 77, and 2 females,

aged 81 and 87 respectively, of heart disease; a male patient in the Kew Lunatic Asylum, and a dyer, an inmate of the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, aged 82, of brain disease; a laborer, aged 77, a female, aged 78, a gentleman, aged 79, a female, aged 79, a farmer, aged 83, and a female, aged 92, of old age.

Thirty-three deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which 28 were set down to accident, 1 to homicide, and 4 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A railway shunter, aged 19, was crushed to death between two buffers; a quarryman, aged 40, died of fracture of the pelvis, caused by being crushed between stones; a bookmaker, aged 24, of fracture of the skull, and a shire secretary, aged 36, of fracture of the leg, both the result of falls from horses; a laborer, aged 37, of fracture of the skull, caused by a fall from a ladder whilst drunk; a blacksmith, aged 40, of internal injuries, caused by falling on a truck; a carrier, aged 50, of the effects of a fall down a cutting; a cabman, aged 62, of compound fracture of the leg, occasioned by a kick from a horse; a carpenter, aged 60, was passed over by a railway train, and a laborer, aged 67, was driven over in the street; a laborer, aged 23, died of a gunshot wound in the head; a female child, aged 4, of burns, her clothes catching fire; two girls, aged 6 and 7 respectively, of scalds, and a baker, aged 31, was poisoned; a schoolboy, aged 9, a pawnbroker's assistant, aged 25, a laborer, aged 31, a blindmaker, aged 48, a seaman, aged 48, a lamplighter, aged 53, a platelayer, aged 56, and a female, aged 78, were drowned; a male and female infant were suffocated at birth; a male infant, aged 3 days, and a female child, aged 2 years, were suffocated in bed, and a laborer, aged 55, died of suffocation. The homicidal death was that of a marine engineer, aged 53, who died of the effects of a blow on the head—verdict "Manslaughter." Of the suicidal deaths, a mason, aged 34, cut his throat; a chemist, aged 37, poisoned himself; a cabinetmaker, aged 79, drowned himself; and a sawyer, aged 21, hanged himself.

Ninety-nine deaths, or 16 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—55 in the Melbourne Hospital, 9 in the Alfred Hospital, 1 in the Homoeopathic Hospital, 3 in the Children's Hospital, 4 in the Lying-in Hospital, 2 in the Immigrants' Home, 10 in the Benevolent Asylum, 5 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 3 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 5 in the Austin Hospital, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 1 in the Infant Asylum.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 274, of which 147, or 54 per cent., were of males, and 127, or 46 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 231 were under one year of age, 30 were between one and two, 8 were between two and three, 2 were between three and four, and 3 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 333. Of these, 178, or 53 per cent., were males, and 155, or 47 per cent., were females; 8 were between five and ten, 8 were between ten and fifteen, 12 were between fifteen and twenty, 27 were between twenty and twenty-five, 22 were between twenty-five and thirty, 14 were between thirty and thirty-five, 30 were between thirty-five and forty, 27 were between forty and forty-five, 30 were between forty-five and fifty, 36 were between fifty and fifty-five, 30 were between fifty-five and sixty, 24 were between sixty and sixty-five, 24 were between sixty-five and seventy, 16 were between seventy and seventy-five, 18 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 7 were upwards of eighty.

An increase took place in all the classes of diseases during the month under notice. The principal increases, however, occurred in deaths from dysentery and diarrhoea, which rose from 53 to 90; in those from phthisis, which rose from 43 to 70; and in those from atrophy and debility, which rose from 25 to 49. Four deaths took place in childbed, or 1 death of a mother to every 197 children born alive.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Licensing Act 1876* (No. 566, section 44) it was amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding the provisions thereinbefore contained, it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim any place or district a place or district where, owing to a sudden increase of population or otherwise, the necessity for the immediate grant of publicans' licenses exists, to be a place or district wherein publicans' licenses might be specially granted, and from time to time to revoke any such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the following Proclamations issued under the authority of the said Act, that is to say:—

The Proclamation bearing date the twenty-eighth day of December, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, relating to the township of Elmore;

The Proclamation bearing date the thirtieth day of November, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, relating to the township of Kiata;

The Proclamation bearing date the thirtieth day of July, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, relating to the township of Tallangatta and the Dark River Gold Field;

and, with the advice aforesaid, do proclaim the area hereinafter mentioned to be a district where publicans' licenses may be specially granted, under the provisions of the 44th section of the said Act, viz:—

An area of half-a-mile radius around the Railway Station at Glenloth.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this thirtieth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, and in the forty-seventh year of Her Majesty's reign.
