No. 506, § 19, 38, 39, and 49), it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, amongst other things, to sever any portion of Victoria forming part of a municipal district from such municipal district, and annex the same to any other municipal district with which the portion so severed forms one continuous area, and from time to time make any apportionment of property rights and liabilities, and give any directions as to any matters and things that might be necessary to do justice as between the municipalities concerned; and every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor in the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition signed by the requisite number of the ratepayers of the Shire of Wimmera therein described (notices of which said petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the same Act): Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order sever from the North Riding of the Shire of Wimmera the portion of the shire described in such petition, and doth direct that the portion so severed from such shire shall be annexed to the East Riding of the Shire of Lowan; and, with the advice aforesaid, doth hereby re-define the boundaries of the said shires and ridings thereof, in manner following, that is to say:—

**THE SHIRE OF WIMMERA REDUCED AND RE-DEFINED.**

Bounded by a line commencing at the most northern bend of the River Glenelg, county boundary of Lowan; thence north-westerly towards the western boundary of the colony, three miles northward of Lake Cadmita, as far as the intersection of the north-west boundary of Maryvale run; around Maryvale run to Mica Lake run; north-eastward along the boundaries of Mica Lake, St. Mary's Lake, and Wyn Wyn runs to the Wimmera River; northerly by that river to the south boundary of the parish of Dimboola; east by the boundary of that parish and of the parish of Kewell West to the south-east angle of the latter parish; north by the east boundary of the parishes of Kewell West, Wallup, and Cannum to the north-west angle of the parish of Werrigar; thence east by the north boundary of that parish to the Yarriambiack Creek; thence southerly up that creek to the Wimmera River; thence continuing southerly up that river to a point bearing north-east from Brigg's Bluff, Grampian Range; thence in a direct line to said bluff, and southward along the watershed of the Grampians to the head of the Glenelg River; and thence north-westerly by that river to the commencing point.

1. 3. *Every tender will be taken to include the entire service as called for. The amount of the tender must be stated AT RATE PER ANNUM in words as well as figures.*

4. Every tender must bear the *bona fide* signatures and addresses of the tenderer, and of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the same in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by cash, bank draft, or a bank-deposit receipt to the credit of the Deputy-Postmaster General for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the annual amount for which the tenderer is willing to undertake the service; and to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government within ten days of being notified that the documents are ready for execution. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender shall be deemed sufficient. CHEQUES ON ACCOUNT OF DEPOSITS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.

6. The money or other security deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them on application, on the bond and contract being completed.

7. The money or other security deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts, but not otherwise.

8. In the event of a new line of railway, or a new railway station on an existing line being opened for traffic, and it being decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the Postmaster-General shall have the power of cancelling the contract for any mail service running in the vicinity of the railway, or shall have power to alter the points of arrival and departure of the mails; and in the event of the travelling distance on any mail line being in such manner increased or diminished, all payments for the service subsequent to the alteration shall be computed on the basis of the average mileage-rate of the contract.

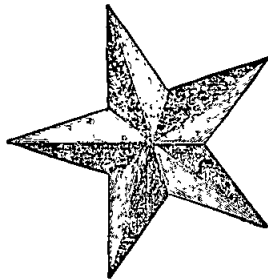
