SHIRES OF YEA AND ALEXANDRA.

PROPOSED SEVERANCE OF ARKA.

IN pursuance of the provisions of *The Local Government Act 1874* (No. 506, § 46), the substance and prayer of a Petition, in accordance with the 44th section of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor, are published, viz. :—

The Petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the rate-payers in the portion of the Shire of Yea which is described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the Shire of Yea and annexed to the Shire of Alexandra.

Area described in the petition :—

Commencing at the boundary of the Acheron river at Buxton parish; thence northerly by the River Acheron to the south-east angle of allotment 54, parish of Glendale; thence west by the south boundaries of allotments 54, 56, 23, 27, 16, 15, and 1, parish of Glendale; thence north by the west boundaries of allotments 1 and 2 to centre of Government road; thence westerly by said road to top of range forming the watershed between the Acheron and Murrumbidgee rivers; thence northerly by road along top of range to south-west corner of present shire.

Petitioners state that their interests are wholly with Alexandra, which is their nearest market town, that they are separated from Yea district by mountain ranges and inaccessible roads.

That Yea Shire has never spent any money or done any work in the area, notwithstanding the urgent need of same. Petitioners therefore pray that said area may be severed from the Shire of Yea and annexed to the Shire of Alexandra.

The births of 899 children, viz., 445 boys and 454 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of January. In the month of December 788 births were registered, or 111 fewer than in the month under review. The births were 182 above the average of the previous nine years, but 88 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in January numbered 556, viz., 306 of males, and 250 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 343. The deaths were fewer than those in December by 51, and below the average of January during the previous ten years by 15. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been below the average of those ten years by 97.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was 2.95, and of deaths registered 1.83.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 97.8° on the 19th, and the lowest was 45.1° on the 18th. The mean temperature of the month (62.8°) was three degrees below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (41.5°) took place on the 19th, viz., from a maximum of 97.8° to a minimum of 56.3°. The least range (7.6°) was on the 20th, from a maximum of 66.8° to a minimum of 59.2°. The mean daily range was 19.9°. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.189 inches) was a third of an inch above the average.

Males contributed 55 per cent., and females 45 per cent., to the total mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 44 per cent. to that mortality as against 48 per cent. in January 1883; 49 per cent. in January 1882; 45 per cent. in January 1881; 43 per cent. in January 1880; 44 per cent. in January 1879; 47 per cent. in January 1878; 49 per cent. in January 1877; 52 per cent. in January 1876; 66 per cent. in January 1875; and 57½ per cent. in January 1874.

Twenty-nine deaths of persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years were recorded during the month, viz.:—Those of a male teacher, aged 75, a gentleman, aged 76, a female, aged 78, a surveyor, aged 80, and a gentleman, aged 84, all of whom died of diarrhoea; a female, aged 75, who died of "Bright's disease;" a female, aged 76, of phthisis; a female, aged 78, of dropsy; a laborer, aged 73, a female, aged 75, and a gardener, aged 84, of apoplexy; a male patient of the Yarra Bend Asylum, aged 76, and a male patient of the Kew Lunatic Asylum, aged 84, of brain disease; a female, aged 80, of aneurism of the aorta; a female, aged 80, of fracture of the femur; a female, aged 84, of heart disease; a butcher, aged 80, and a female, aged 87, of pneumonia; a female, aged 77, of congestion of the lungs; a male, of occupation unstated, aged 75, 2 gardeners and a trower, each aged 75, a female servant, aged 78, a seaman, aged 80, a laborer, aged 82, a laborer and a female, each aged 89, and a gentleman, aged 94, of old age.

Of the deaths registered during the month, 19 resulted from external causes, of which 15 were ascribed to accident, 2 to homicide, and 2 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A boy, aged 11, died of injuries to the head

caused by falling from a cart; a boy, aged 13, and a female, aged 36, of fracture of the skull, both the result of falls, the latter being down stairs; a calman, aged 62, of fracture of the thigh, caused by a fall in the street; a carter, aged 54, of injury to the spine, caused by an engine knocking him down; a carpenter, aged 57, of injury to the head, caused by a mortar-board falling on him; a mason, aged 71, of fracture of the arms and ribs, caused by a dray-wheel passing over him; a female, aged 80, of fracture of femur (cause not stated); a girl, aged 12, was burnt to death; a female aboriginal, aged 26, died of burns caused by falling into a fire whilst in a fit of epilepsy; a boy, aged 7, and a youth, aged 13, were drowned, the latter while endeavoring to save a younger brother; a girl, aged 16, was drowned whilst bathing in the Brighton Baths; a laborer, aged 26, was drowned (particulars not stated); a blacksmith, aged 27, was found drowned in Port Phillip Bay off Brighton Beach. The homicidal deaths were those of a female infant, who was suffocated at birth, and a female, aged 57, who died of fracture of the skull—verdict of wilful murder against her husband being brought in. The suicidal deaths were those of a city missionary, aged 42, who shot himself with a revolver, whilst of unsound mind, and a wool-sorter, aged 40, who poisoned himself.

Eighty-six deaths, or 16 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.—45 in the Melbourne Hospital, 11 in the Alfred Hospital, 1 in the Homœopathic Hospital, 2 in the Children's Hospital, 5 in the Lying-in Hospital, 5 in the Immigrants' Home, 6 in the Benevolent Asylum, 2 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 4 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Austin Hospital, 2 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 1 in the Protestant Refuge.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 246, of which 132, or 54 per cent., were of males, and 114, or 46 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 192 were under one year of age, 37 were between one and two, 8 were between two and three, 8 were between three and four, and 1 was between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 310. Of these, 174, or 56 per cent., were males, and 136, or 44 per cent., were females; 7 were between five and ten, 10 were between ten and fifteen, 17 were between fifteen and twenty, 18 were between twenty and twenty-five, 27 were between twenty-five and thirty, 21 were between thirty and thirty-five, 26 were between thirty-five and forty, 22 were between forty and forty-five, 19 were between forty-five and fifty, 23 were between fifty and fifty-five, 23 were between fifty-five and sixty, 31 were between sixty and sixty-five, 18 were between sixty-five and seventy, 18 were between seventy and seventy-five, 15 were between seventy-five and eighty, 14 were upwards of eighty, and one age was unspecified.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

4. Every tender must bear the *bona fide* signatures and addresses of the tenderer, and of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the same in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by cash, bank draft, or a bank deposit-receipt to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the annual amount for which the tenderer is willing to undertake the service; and to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government within ten days of being notified that the documents are ready for execution. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient. **CHEQUES ON ACCOUNT OF DEPOSITS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.**

6. The money or other security deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being completed.
