PROPOSED SEVERANCE OF ARKA.

In pursuance of the provisions of *The Local Government Act* 1874 (No. 506, § 46), the substance and prayer of a Petition, in accordance with the 44th section of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor, are published,

The Petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the rate-payers in the portion of the Shire of Yea which is described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the Shire of Yea and annexed to the Shire of Alexandra.

Area described in the petition:—
Commencing at the boundary of the Acheron river at Buxton parish; thence northerly by the River Acheron to the south-east angle of allotment 54, parish of Glendale; thence west by the south boundaries of allotments 54, 56, 23, 27, 16, 15, and 1, parish of Glendale; thence north by the west boundaries of allotments 1 and 2 to centre of Government road; thence westerly by said road to top of range forming the watershed between the Acheron and Murindindi rivers; thence northerly by road along top of range to south-west corner of present shire.

Patitionary state that their interests are wholly with Alexandra.

Petitioners state that their interests are wholly with Alexandra, which is their nearest market town, that they are separated from Yea district by mountain ranges and inaccessible roads.

The births of 899 children, viz., 445 boys and 454 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of January. In the month of December 788 births were registered, or 111 fewer than in the month under review. The births were 182 above the average of the previous nine years, but 88 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in January numbered 556, viz., 306 of males, and 250 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 343. The deaths were fewer than those in December by 51, and below the average of January during the previous ten years 15. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been below the average of those ten years by 97.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was 2.95, and of deaths registered 1.83.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 97.8° on the 19th, and the lowest was 45.1° on the 18th. The mean temperature of the month (62.8°) was three degrees below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (41.5°) took place on the 19th, viz., from a maximum of 97.8° to a minimum of 59.3°. The least range (7.6°) was on the 20th, from a maximum of 66.8° to a minimum of 59.2°. The mean daily range was 19.0°. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.189 inches) was a third of an inch above the average.

spheric pressure (30:189 inches) was a third of an inch above the average.

Males contributed 55 per cent., and females 45 per cent., to the total mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 44 per cent. to that mortality as against 48 per cent in January 1883; 49 per cent. in January 1882; 45 per cent. in January 1881; 43 per cent. in January 1876; 66 per cent. in January 1879; 47 per cent. in January 1878; 49 per cent. in January 1877; 52 per cent. in January 1876; 66 per cent. in January 1875; and 57½ per cent. in January 1878.

Twenty-nine deaths of persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years were recorded during the month, viz.:—Those of a male teacher, aged 75, a gentleman, aged 76, a female, aged 78, a surveyor, aged 80, and a gentleman, aged 84, all of whom died of diarrhea; a female, aged 75, who died of "Bright's disease;" a female, aged 76, of phthisis; a female, aged 78, of dropsy; a laborer, aged 75, a female, aged 87, and a gardener, aged 84, of poplexy; a male patient of the Yarra Bend Asylum, aged 84, of brain disease; a female, aged 80, of aneurism of the aorta; a female, aged 87, of congestion of the lungs; a male, of occupation unstated, aged 77, 2 gardeners and a drover, each aged 75, a female servant, aged 78, a seaman, aged 80, a laborer, aged 82, a laborer and a female, cach aged 89, and a gentleman, aged 91, of old age.

The homicidal deaths were those of a female infant, who was suffocated at birth, and a female, aged 57, who died of fracture of the skull—verdict of wiful nurder against her husband being brought in. The suicidal deaths were those of a city missionary, aged 42, who shot himself with a revolver, whilst of unsound mind, and a woolsorter, aged 40, who poisoned himself.

Eighty-six deaths, or 16 per cent of the whole, took place in public institutions with the Malabanane Hamilet.

Eighty-six deaths, or 16 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—45 in the Melbourne Hospital, 11 in the Alfred Hospital, 1 in the Homocopathic Hospital, 2 in the Children's Hospital, 5 in the Lying-in Hospital, 5 in the Immigrants' Home, 6 in the Benevolent Asylum, 2 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 4 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Austin Hospital, 2 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 1 in the Protestant Refuge.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 246, of which 132, or 54 per cent., were of males, and 114, or 46 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 192 were under one year of age, 37 were between one and two, 8 were between two and three, 8 were between three and four, and 1 was between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 310. Of these, 174, or 56 per cent., were males, and 136, or 44 per cent., were females; 7 were between five and ten, 10 were between ten and fifteen, 17 were between fifteen and twenty, 18 were between twenty and twenty-five, 27 were between twenty-five and thirty, 21 were between thirty and thirty-five, 26 were between thirty-five and forty-five, 19 were between forty and fifty-five and fifty-five and sixty, 31 were between sixty and sixty-five, 18 were between sixty and sixty-five, 18 were between sixty and sixty-five and seventy, 18 were between seventy and seventy, 18 were between seventy-five and eighty, 14 were upwards of eighty, and one ago was unspecified.
