WHEREAS by The Electoral Act 1865 it was amongst other things enacted that where any accidental or unavoidable impediment, misfeasance, or omission should have happened in the preparation or transmission or printing of any general roll or supplementary roll or ordinary electoral roll or roll of ratepaying electors, the Governor in Council might take all such measures as might be necessary for removing such impediment or rectifying such misfeasance or omission, or might declare any such roll valid as to and notwithstanding such impediment, misfeasance, or omission, and every such Order in Council should state specifically the nature of the impediment, misfeasance, or omission, and should be forthwith published in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas in the preparation of the Roll of Ratepaying Electors, in November last, for the Casterton division of the Electoral District of Normanby, the Electoral Registrar for the said division did accidentally include therein the names of certain persons not entitled to be on the said roll: And whereas it is expedient to rectify the said Divisional Roll: Now therefore the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power in him vested by the 68th section of the said Act, doth by this present Order direct that the Roll of Ratepaying Electors for the Casterton division of the Electoral District of Normanby be rectified by expunging therefrom the names incorrectly included therein, as set forth in the subjoined Schedule, notwithstanding such misfeasance as aforesaid.

No. 219) it was amongst other things enacted, that all buildings, erections, houses, enclosed places, and premises thereafter to be erected, built, enclosed, purchased, enlarged, or maintained at the public expense, as and for public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments within Victoria, which were from time to time proclaimed by the Governor in Council, by

notice in the *Government Gazette*, as such public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, or penal establishments, should, from and after the publication of such notice, be severally deemed and taken to be the public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments (hereinafter called "gaols") respectively of the place or district where the same are situated, and should be subject to the several provisions made for the regulation, discipline, management, and care of the public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments already erected (also hereinafter called "gaols"), and of the prisoners confined within the same; and it was also enacted that, except where it was otherwise proclaimed by the Governor in Council, every gaol should be and be taken for all purposes as being equally a house of correction and a prison for debtors, and also every house of correction should be taken to be a prison: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, in exercise of the power and authority conferred by the said Act and all other powers enabling me in this behalf, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and notify that the buildings and premises hereinafter described are and shall be a public gaol, prison, and house of correction within the meaning and in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

SHEPPARTON GAOL.—Comprising all buildings, erections, houses, enclosed places, and premises erected, built, or enclosed on the following site, viz., allotment 1 of section B, township of Shepparton, containing two roods: Commencing at the north-western angle of said allotment at the intersection of Welsford and High streets; thence southerly two hundred links; thence easterly two hundred and fifty links; thence northerly two hundred links to High street; thence westerly two hundred and fifty links along High street to the point of commencement.

DEPARTMENT OF CROWN LANDS AND SURVEY.

REGULATIONS and Instructions for the Guidance of Surveyors licensed to act under the provisions of the 134th section of the Transfer of Land Statute.

1. Any plan purporting to be a survey, resurvey, or subdivision of any land shall be verified by statutory declaration of the licensed surveyor employed to make the survey, such declaration to be in one of the forms hereto appended appropriate to the case.

2. The surveyor will be expected to disclose all doubts, discrepancies, and difficulties, and to afford all other information obtainable by him relative to the property and the application for certificate of title or transfer as will aid in securing accuracy and completeness in the business of the transfer of land. In these matters he will consider himself rather an agent and adviser of the Government than of the person incidentally employing him, nor will a regard for the interests of such employer be considered as excusing in any degree the withholding of any information affecting the merits of the application, even though the description supplied be literally and technically correct.

3. If a resurvey or subdivision of the whole of any original allotment is made for the purposes of the Land Transfer Act, the boundaries must be taken as originally marked on the ground, and the lines re-marked where necessary, so that the boundaries may be easily traced and the several corners identified by the owner and adjoining proprietors. If only a portion of an allotment is being dealt with, this will not be required, but the new survey must be connected with at least two of the corners of the original allotment. If only part of an allotment on an already deposited plan is being dealt with, then such survey need only be connected with two or more points of that allotment; provided always that the allotment has been previously properly connected with two or more corners of the original Crown allotment in such a manner as to definitely fix the position thereof. In cities or towns where standard lines have been established, the survey must be connected both by angular and linear measurement with such lines.

4. The surveyor must adhere to the principle of the unchangeableness of original lines and corners established by Government or other duly authorized surveyors done in good faith; in other words, where the lines and corners have originally been established on the ground by a proper officer in pursuance of the survey system authorized by the law of the time and can be identified, they must be regarded as the true lines and corners which they represent, even if subsequent surveys show that the posts, pegs, or marks are out of line, and that the corners are out of position according to the original description contained in the Crown grant or title.

5. The surveyor shall, if practicable, chain the actual boundaries of blocks under survey; but should insuperable difficulties render this impossible, the method observed in measuring and obtaining distances shall be clearly shown in the field notes, and all measured lines other than boundaries must be shown in red on the plan.

6. The bearing of one of the sides of the original allotment as given on the public maps is to be taken as the datum of the bearings for a resurvey or subdivision; and where discrepancies are found to exist in the original bearings, preference is to be given to the longest side abutting on a street or road. Tie lines in lieu of angles may be given in the subdivision of very small pieces of land; such tie lines must be sufficient to determine the exact form and area of the allotment.

7. When a survey under the Transfer of Land Statute differs materially from the Crown grant, the Commissioner of Titles may, if he deems it necessary, require a verifying survey to be made by another surveyor, to be nominated by him, to determine the correctness or otherwise of the survey made by the surveyor licensed under the Transfer of Land Statute; the cost of such survey to be borne by the applicant.

8. When natural features form the boundary, they must be traversed, unless they form the boundary of an original allotment and have been traversed by the Government surveyor. A traverse of such boundaries may, however, be required in cases where the original survey appears to be defective.

9. When an irregular boundary is defined by offsets measured thereto from traverse lines, such traverse lines must form part of the geometrical figure used in computing the area, and the areas of the portions lying between the traverse lines and the boundary are to be computed from offsets and insets properly measured.

10. Should a property be bounded on one or more sides by lines, natural features or boundaries, of which a resurvey is not required, the survey must be closed by traverse or tie lines in such a manner as will enable the field work to be checked by the draughtsman.

11. The widths of all streets, roads, or rights-of-way adjoining the block under survey must be measured and recorded in field notes and on plan, the greatest care being taken to ascertain correctly the actual lines of such streets, roads, &c.

12. The actual measurements made in the field must be given, notwithstanding that they may not agree with the Crown grant or public charts; and should the difference be greater than the maximum of error allowable under these regulations, in addition to a complete resurvey of the original allotment or parcel being dealt with, the entire measurements along the road or street frontage or frontages of the section, or any other measurements that may be deemed necessary by the department, must be furnished, in order to determine whether any encroachment exists or whether the differences arise from former defective surveys.

13. In the resurvey or subdivision of small areas in cities and towns, two links in the mile will be the maximum of error

allowed; and in the case of suburban or country lands, four to eight links in the mile, according to the character of the country. Bearings must close to two or three minutes.

14. All bearings must be observed with a serviceable theodolite in good adjustment, and all measurements must be made with a Chesterman's steel tape adjusted to the standard of the Survey Department.

15. All plans lodged or deposited at the Titles Office must be prepared on drawing paper of good quality, in no case cut to less than foolscap size; and the quality of the drawing must be equal to the standard of excellence required by the Department of Lands and Survey.

16. The scale for plans of allotments containing from 1 to 10 perches must be 20 feet to an inch; 10 to 20 perches—1 chain to 1 inch; 20 perches to 1 acre—2 chains to 1 inch; 1 acre to 10 acres—4 chains to 1 inch; 10 acres to 100 acres—8 chains to 1 inch; 100 acres to 640 acres—20 chains to 1 inch; above 640 acres—40 chains to an inch, when such scale is sufficient to admit of necessary details and dimensions being clearly inserted.

17. In cities and towns the dimensions are to be given in feet and inches. Suburban and country lands in links. The former to be recorded to the nearest inch, and the latter to the nearest link.

18. When the parcel of land forms part of two original allotments, the subdivisional boundaries of such allotments must be shown by a dotted line on the plan.]

19. Every plan must bear upon its face a full description of what it purports to represent, for example—Plan of survey of (part of) Crown allotment (section or portion, as the case may be), city or town of _____, parish of _____, at (as suburb or locality within the parish), and county _____, and be dated.

20. Every plan of subdivision must exhibit, distinctly delineated, all roads, streets, passages, thoroughfares, easements, squares or reserves set apart for public use, and also show all allotments with measurements into which the land may be divided. The nature of the boundaries, viz., roads, reserves, sections, natural features, &c., must be shown. If the boundary is a wall, it must be shown whether it is a party wall and whether the line runs through the centre or otherwise. The true position of all boundary fences must also be shown.




21. An accurate description of the boundaries of the piece or parcel being dealt with must be furnished with the plan, and the nature of the boundary, whether wall, house, fence, ditch, hedge, stream, road, or line, should be stated.

22. The parcel being dealt with is to be coloured pink; roads and rights-of-way, brown; drains and water, blue.

23. The area of every allotment must be calculated by the surveyor, and inserted distinctly on the face of the plan.

24. Proper field notes of all surveys are to be kept in books of convenient form, and any corrections in the entries made for practical errors are to be shown in red, with an explanatory note on the page in which they occur. Such field books shall be given up for inspection when asked for. With the plan must be sent in a certified copy of the field notes, including corrections, if any, together with a copy of the computations of the figure and its area in the usual form adopted for computation by reduction of traverse and double areas. The above instructions will be most stringently enforced, affording as they do the only assurance to the department of probable accuracy.

25. All surveys under the Transfer Act are, where practicable, to be marked on the ground in the same manner as the original surveys of Crown lands by the Department of Lands and Survey, by substantial pegs and trenches; such pegs to be not less than 2 by 2 inches scantling of sound seasoned hardwood, not less than 14 inches long, driven 12 inches into the ground. At frontage pegs, where practicable, trenches at least 3 feet long, 9 inches deep, and 9 inches wide, commencing 1 foot from the pegs, are to be cut in the direction of the boundary lines.

26. The position of pegs to be shown on plan by a small black circle; old pegs, when found, by a red circle; the position of old trenches or other original marks to be shown on the plan by red lines, thus  or  or 

27. The boundaries of subdivisions in cities or towns, where the ordinary method of marking by pegs and trenches is impracticable, must be marked by iron spikes, or in such other manner as may be ordered by the Commissioner of Titles.

28. When the boundaries on the ground differ materially from the Crown grant boundaries, the Crown grant boundaries are to be shown on the plan by dotted black lines.

29. The necessity for the greatest possible accuracy in surveys and plans cannot be too strongly impressed upon surveyors, as in many cases no means will exist by which errors can be detected. If it is found, therefore, that the work of any surveyor is not up to the standard of accuracy required, or that he has in other respects neglected to comply with the foregoing Regulations, his plans will be rejected.

30. Surveyors will be afforded every facility for obtaining access to the plan records of both the Lands and Titles Offices, so far as may be necessary to enable them to acquire information as to the original surveys of any land on the resurvey or subdivision of which they may be employed for the purposes of the Transfer of Land Statute, and they shall be required and expected to make themselves acquainted with such records.

31. Declarations are to be made on the margin of the larger, and on the margin or back of the smaller plans. The following are the forms of declaration to be endorsed on the plans; the

first to be used for transfer plans, the second for plans of lands resurveyed before being brought under the Statute.

Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge of police at any stations named, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must

be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed; the straw to be wheaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (Victorian grown) and bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oat straw of the best quality.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. 4. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own accounts in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

5. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

6. PORT AND HARBOR REGULATIONS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Passengers, Harbors, and Navigation Statute 1865* it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might, by proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time define the limits and boundaries of ports in Victoria, and frame rules and regulations for the governance and preservation of the said ports respectively, and for the regulation of shipping in the same, and also for the due protection and preservation and the good government and management of all public wharfs, and might appoint officers to carry out and enforce such rules and regulations, and from time to time in like manner might alter, amend, or repeal any such limits, boundaries, rules, and regulations, and substitute others in their stead: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby amend the Port and Harbor Regulation hereunder set forth in manner following, that is to say:—

Number 68 is hereby amended by the omission of the words "for ballasting vessels." The Regulation, as amended, will read:—"No sand ballast or other material shall be raised from below high-water mark, except under conditions approved, and at places appointed by Port Officer."
