PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

FLOATING BEACON AND PERCH BUOY OFF THE EAST BANKS AT THE ENTRANCE TO MORETON BAY.

NOTICE is hereby given that the temporary Perch Buoy off the North end of the East Banks has been replaced by the Floating Beacon, the Perch Buoy being placed as an additional buoy in 21 feet at low water half a cable northward from the extremity of the western Spit of the East Banks, and in line with that Spit and Cowan Cowan Point Lighthouse.

This Spit, extending from the northern part of the East Banks, has grown upwards of 1½ cables to the westward since the last corrections of the Admiralty Chart in 1880. The Floating Beacon carries a ball, 7 feet in diameter, 27 feet above the water.

Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge of police at any stations named, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent

to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Telegrams will not be entertained.

Tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed; the straw to be wheaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (Victorian grown) and bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oatens hay of the best quality.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be endorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

4. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own accounts in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

5. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

6. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

7. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 5.

8. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 5.

9. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of the delay in delivering or replacing it when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

10. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

11. It will be competent for the Secretary of the Tender Board, on behalf of the Government, or for the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving, in writing, a notice of three full calendar months to that effect, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the 1st day of a month, and provided that no such notice can be given before the 30th September 1884; and in the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

- Every tender must be accompanied by cash, bank draft, or a bank deposit-receipt to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the annual amount for which the tenderer is willing to undertake the service; and to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government within ten days of being notified that the documents are ready for execution. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient. **CHEQUES ON ACCOUNT OF DEPOSITS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.**

6. The money or other security deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being completed.

BY-LAWS OF THE MELBOURNE HOSPITAL.

INTRODUCTORY.

1. All by-laws made prior to the date of the making of these by-laws shall be, and the same are hereby repealed, saving all existing rights.

2. In these by-laws the word "Governor" shall mean and be equivalent to the word "Contributor" in the Act of the Parliament of Victoria, No. 220.

OBJECTS.

3. The objects of the Melbourne Hospital shall be to afford medical and surgical aid to the afflicted or distressed.

COMMON SEAL.

4. The common seal of the corporation shall be kept at the hospital in a box having two differing locks; one key shall be kept by the treasurer, and the other by some officer appointed by the committee for that purpose.

5. The common seal shall not be affixed to any deed, instrument or writing, except by order of the committee at a meeting at which seven members at least are present at the time of making such order, and for which meeting notice to make such order has been given.

GOVERNORS AND THEIR PRIVILEGES.

6. Any person who shall contribute the sum of £1 per annum, shall be an annual governor, or not less than £20 in one donation, shall be a life governor of the hospital, and shall be entitled to one vote at all general meetings, and to recommend four out-patients in every year. And any person who shall contribute the sum of £5 per annum shall be an annual governor, or not less than £100 in one donation, shall be a life governor, and shall be entitled to two votes at all general meetings, and to recommend two in-patients and twelve out-patients in every year. And any person who shall contribute the sum of £10 per annum shall be an annual governor, or not less than £200 in one donation, shall be a life governor, and shall be entitled to three votes at all general meetings, and to recommend four in-patients and twenty out-patients in every year.

7. Any person who shall pay to the hospital in one year in one sum, collections to the amount of £50 or upwards, shall be enrolled a life governor, and as such shall be entitled to one vote at all general meetings, and to recommend one in-patient and four out-patients in every year.

8. Any public or corporate body which shall contribute the sum of £5 annually, shall be authorized to nominate some one person to be enrolled an annual governor, who shall be entitled to one vote at all general meetings, and to recommend one in-patient and ten out-patients in every year; and if the contribution shall amount to £20 in one sum, such nominee shall be a life governor, and be entitled to one vote at all general meetings, and to recommend two in-patients and twenty out-patients in every year.

9. The executor first named in any will through which the hospital shall receive the sum of £100, shall be enrolled a life governor, and shall be entitled to one vote at all general meetings, and to recommend one in-patient and four out-patients in every year.

10. Any governor being absent from the colony of Victoria may, by power of attorney containing the necessary powers, exercise all the privileges to which he would be entitled if personally present; but such power of attorney shall be deposited with the committee for record at least seven days before the same can be used in exercise of such privileges.

11. Every yearly subscription shall be calculated from the date of such payment, but no such first yearly payment shall entitle to a vote at a general meeting within three months from the date of such payment.

12. The privileges of annual governors shall be suspended until the last year's subscription has been paid, as well as that of the current year if due.

13. Every firm or partnership subscribing may exercise their privilege through some one member of such firm.

14. Persons who shall have conferred any signal benefit on the hospital, irrespective of subscription, may be elected honorary life governors at any general meeting, on the recommendation of the committee, and shall be entitled to one vote at all general meetings, and to recommend one in-patient and five out-patients in every year.

OFFICERS AND COMMITTEE.

15. There shall be a president, two vice-presidents, a treasurer, and three auditors, who shall be elected by the governors as hereinafter provided.

16. The president, vice-presidents, treasurer, and auditors, respectively, shall hold office for one year and thereafter until the election of their successors, but shall be eligible for re-election.

17. The elective members of the committee of the hospital shall be eighteen in number.

18. Except as hereinafter provided all governors of the hospital shall be capable of being elected as officers of the corporation or as members of the committee.

19. No person, except he be a member of the medical staff, who shall hold any office or place of profit under the corporation, or be concerned or participate in anywise in any contract with the committee, or in the profit thereof, or of any work to be done under the authority of the same, shall be capable of being or continuing a member of such committee; Provided that such disability shall not apply to any member of any company, partnership, or association consisting of more than ten persons, when such contract shall be entered into for the general benefit of such company, partnership, or association. But no member of the committee shall vote or take part in the discussion of any matter in or before the committee in which he shall, directly or indirectly, by himself or his partners, have any pecuniary interest.

20. The committee shall direct all the business of the hospital; shall provide all requisites for its use; may appoint and discharge all paid officers and servants; may from time to time make rules not inconsistent with these by-laws for the regulation of the hospital and of such paid officers and servants, and for the admission and instruction of medical and surgical pupils, and for the fees to be paid by them; and generally for all matters, whether of the same kind as those hereinbefore mentioned or of a different kind, not provided for by law or by these by-laws that they think proper.

MEETINGS IN GENERAL.

21. At all meetings of governors or of committee the president, or in his absence one of the vice-presidents, or in their absence the treasurer, shall take the chair; but in the absence of all these officers the meeting shall choose its own chairman.

22. At all meetings of the governors or of the committee, the chairman shall have a deliberate vote, and also a casting vote whenever the numbers are equal.

23. All questions at meetings of the governors, other than questions under by-law 64, shall be decided by show of hands; or if involving an election, or the confirmation of by-laws, or of the suspension of any medical officer, and any seven members so demand, by ballot; or in any other case, if demanded by any member, by a division. When a ballot is duly demanded, the chairman shall adjourn the meeting, to admit of the ballot being taken, to a day to be fixed by him not more than ten days or less than four days after the day of the adjournment, notice of which shall be advertised twice at least in each of two daily Melbourne newspapers before the day so fixed.

24. All questions at meetings of the committee shall be decided by a show of hands, and if it be demanded by any member, by a division.

25. When any vacancy occurs, or is by effluxion of time about to occur, in any office of the corporation other than the committee, the committee shall give public notice by advertisement that such vacancy has occurred, or is about to occur, and shall fix therein a time, not less than seven days from the date of such notice, within which candidates for any such vacancy shall send to the committee their notice of candidature, and a day on which in the event of a contest the election shall be held.

26. No person shall be admitted as a candidate at any such election unless he have notified his candidature to the committee in writing under his hand, or by a paper signed by any three governors nominating him, and by himself or his agent assenting to such nomination, within the time so limited.

27. Where at the expiration of the time fixed for receiving notice of candidature there are not more candidates than there are vacancies in such office respectively, the committee shall declare such candidates duly elected.

28. Where at the expiration of the time so fixed there are more candidates than vacancies, the committee shall in some daily newspaper published in Melbourne give not less than three days' notice of the names of such candidates, and the governors shall upon the day appointed for the election elect by ballot some one or more of such candidates to fill the vacant office or offices as the case may be.

29. If any vacancy occur in any office of the corporation other than the committee, from any other cause than effluxion of time, the person chosen to fill such vacancy shall hold office only until the expiration of the term for which the original holder of such office was elected.

30. All vacancies in the committee caused by the annual retirement of members thereof, in pursuance of the provisions of the Act of the Parliament of Victoria numbered 220, shall be filled in the same manner as is hereinbefore provided in the case of officers of the corporation other than the committee.

MEETINGS OF GOVERNORS.

31. In the month of January in every year, on some day other than the day, if any, fixed for the polling at any election under these by-laws, a meeting of the governors shall be held for the reception and the adoption of the annual report and balance-sheet, as hereinafter mentioned, and for the transaction of any other business of which notice has been given in the advertisement convening such meeting.

32. At all general meetings of the governors, except at meetings for balloting, twelve shall constitute a quorum; but if no quorum be present within half-an-hour of the time named, such meeting shall stand adjourned for the following week, at the same day and hour.

33. The committee, at their discretion, may, and, upon the written request of twenty or more governors under their hands, stating the purpose of such meeting, shall, summon a special meeting; and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting except that for which it shall have been summoned.

34. Every meeting of governors shall be called by advertisement, in two at least of the public newspapers published in Melbourne, at least one week before the day of meeting.

35. The committee shall present a general report of the affairs of the hospital at the meeting of governors in the month of January in each year, together with a full statement, duly audited, of the accounts of the corporation for the preceding year, from 1st January to 31st December inclusive.

36. When a ballot is held in pursuance of any of these by-laws, all governors in Victoria who desire to vote shall attend in their proper persons, and the poll shall be kept open from nine a.m. to four p.m., and the committee shall make provision for the orderly conduct of such ballot and for the proper counting of the votes and the publication of the result.

MEETINGS OF COMMITTEE.

37. The committee shall meet at the hospital at half-past three o'clock p.m. on Tuesday in every alternate week.

38. Special meetings of the committee may be convened on the requisition of the president or one of the vice-presidents,

or of any four members of the committee; and notice shall be given of the business to be transacted at such meeting, at which no other business shall be considered.

39. The committee shall, at its first meeting in each year after the annual general meeting, appoint a finance committee, and may from time to time appoint such sub-committees as it thinks fit, and may appoint any members of the medical staff, although not members of the committee, to act on any such sub-committee.

40. The president, vice-president, and treasurer shall be *ex officio* members of all sub-committees, but it shall not be necessary to send to any such members notice of the meetings of such sub-committees.

41. The committee shall commence business as soon after the time notified as there is a sufficient number of members present to constitute a quorum; but if, at the expiry of ten minutes from the time specified, there is not a quorum present, the meeting shall stand adjourned to the following Tuesday.

42. No business shall be entered upon until the minutes of the previous meeting have been confirmed or otherwise disposed of, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy.

43. No proposition to enact or amend a by-law or make or vary any rule shall be entertained unless one month's previous notice has been given; and no resolution of the committee shall be varied or rescinded for one month after such resolution has been passed except at a special meeting of the committee or by an absolute majority of the whole committee.

44. No motion, except on current business, shall be entertained unless three days' notice of the same shall have been given and shall have been notified in the summons to each member of the committee.

45. When any election is disputed, if the person aggrieved complain in writing to the committee within seven days after such election, the committee may either itself or by a sub-committee appointed for the purpose hear and determine such complaint, and its decision therein shall be final.

THE MEDICAL STAFF.

46. The medical staff of the hospital shall consist of two parts—

- (1.) The consulting physicians and the consulting surgeons.
- (2.) The physicians and surgeons.

47. There shall be nine physicians and nine surgeons, four of whom respectively shall have charge of the in-patients; and five physicians and five surgeons, who shall have charge of the out-patients.

48. Except as hereinafter provided no person shall be capable of being elected a Physician unless in addition to the requirements of the "Medical Practitioners Statute, 1865," he possess the degree of doctor of medicine from some university in the United Kingdom, or in the Australian colonies, or from some foreign university recognised by the University of Melbourne, or the diploma of fellow from some college of physicians in the United Kingdom, or, in the case of a person who has been engaged in the actual practice of his profession for not less than five years, the degree of bachelor of Medicine from some such university, or the Diploma of member from some such college.

49. Except as hereinafter provided, no person shall be capable of being elected a surgeon unless in addition to the requirements of the "Medical Practitioners Statute, 1865," he possess the degree of master of surgery from some university in the United Kingdom, or in the Australian colonies, or from some foreign university recognised by the University of Melbourne, or the diploma of fellow from some college of surgeons in the United Kingdom, or, in the case of a person who has been engaged in the actual practice of his profession for not less than five years, the degree of bachelor of surgery from some such university, or the diploma of member from some such college.

50. Every person who, prior to the first of January 1884, has been elected as an honorary physician or an honorary surgeon, or as honorary assistant-physician or an honorary assistant-surgeon of this hospital, shall without further or other qualification be capable of being elected as a physician or as a surgeon.

51. Every physician and surgeon, now in office or hereafter elected by the governors, shall, subject to the by-laws and rules of the hospital now or hereafter in force, hold office for the period of four years from the date of his election, and no longer, but shall be eligible for re-election.

52. When any office of physician or surgeon becomes vacant by effluxion of time, the committee shall give public notice by advertisement in some daily newspaper published in Melbourne, that such vacancy has occurred, and shall fix therein a time, not less than fourteen clear days from the date of such notice, within which candidates shall send to the committee their notice of candidature and the evidence of their qualifications.

53. Where, at the expiration of the time so fixed, there is only one duly-qualified candidate, the committee may declare him to be duly elected; or, in their discretion, may from time to time postpone the election, and advertise anew as hereinbefore directed. Provided that no vacancy shall remain unfilled for more than six weeks.

54. Where, at the expiration of the time so fixed, there is more than one duly-qualified candidate, the committee shall convene a general meeting of governors, for the election by such meeting by ballot of some one or more of such candidates to fill the vacant office or offices, as the case may be, and shall give not less than seven days' notice in some daily newspaper published in Melbourne of such meeting, and of the names of such candidates.

55. If any vacancy occur in the office of physician to in-patients, or of surgeon to in-patients, from any other cause than effluxion of time, the senior physician to out-patients, or

the senior surgeon to out-patients, as the case may be, shall according to the order of his length of service in the hospital, or in the case of equal lengths of service, then as the committee may determine, succeed to such vacancy for the remainder of the term thereof, and shall thereby vacate his former office.

56. If any vacancy occur in the office of physician to out-patients or of surgeon to out-patients, from any other cause than the effluxion of time, the committee shall within one month give public notice by advertisement in some daily newspaper published in Melbourne that such vacancy has occurred, and shall fix therein a time not less than fourteen clear days from the date of such notice within which candidates shall send to the committee their notice of candidature and the evidence of their qualifications. At the expiration of the time so fixed the committee may elect some duly-qualified candidate who has sent such notice as aforesaid to fill the vacant office for the remainder of the term thereof, or in their discretion may from time to time postpone the election, and advertise anew as hereinbefore directed, provided that no vacancy shall remain unfilled for more than six weeks.

57. The committee shall determine all questions as to the sufficiency of the qualifications of any candidates, and its decision thereon shall be conclusive.

58. Every person elected or succeeding to any office on the medical staff shall, before he enters upon the duties of his office, make and subscribe the following declaration:

I do solemnly promise that while I hold the office of _____ in the Melbourne Hospital, I will faithfully obey the by-laws and rules of the said hospital now or hereafter in force, so far as they apply to me, and I acknowledge that I hold my said office subject to the condition of such obedience.

59. No physician or surgeon shall be absent from the hospital for more than seven consecutive days without the leave of the committee.

60. The committee may, by an absolute majority of the whole committee, suspend any member of the medical staff, and shall, within two weeks after the order of suspension, convene a special meeting of the governors, and shall report to such meeting such suspension and the reason thereof. If the governors at such special meeting confirm the order of suspension by the committee, the office of the officer so suspended shall thenceforth become vacant; and if the governors refuse to confirm such order, the suspension shall thenceforth cease.

61. When any physician or surgeon has served as such for twelve years, and has ceased to hold such office, the committee may declare him to be consulting physician or a consulting surgeon, as the case may be. But in case of his subsequent election as physician or surgeon, his office of consulting physician or of consulting surgeon shall, during his continuance in such former office, be suspended.

ACCOUNTS.

62. All sums received on account of the hospital shall be paid into the Bank of New South Wales, or such other bank as the committee may appoint, to one or other of the following accounts, as the case may be, viz.:

Melbourne Hospital Maintenance Fund.
" " Building "
" " Convalescent "
" " Endowment "

63. All bequests made to the institution shall, subject to any conditions under which such bequests are made, be in the first instance paid to a separate fund, to be called the "Endowment Fund," and all or any monies for the time being in such fund may be from time to time invested or re-invested in such manner as the committee shall direct, and the income arising from such investments shall be available for the maintenance of the institution.

64. All or any principal monies hereafter bequeathed to the institution, shall, unless otherwise directed by the testator, and whether invested under the last preceding by-law or not, be at any time available for the purposes of purchasing lands, buildings, and premises for the institution for hospital purposes, or for erecting new buildings, or in pulling down, altering, adding to, or improving the premises for the time being used by the institution for hospital purposes. Provided always that no such monies shall be expended in the purchase of land or premises unless and until such expenditure, both as to general object and aggregate amount, shall have been approved of by the resolution of a majority of the governors present, and voting by ballot, at a general or special meeting of governors, such ballot to be conducted in manner prescribed by by-law 23. But, subject to the foregoing provision, the monies hereby or by such resolution as aforesaid authorized to be expended for any such purposes as aforesaid may be applied by the committee to the purposes so authorized in such particular manner and amounts, and at such time or times as a majority of the whole committee, at a meeting or meetings specially convened for that purpose, of which not less than fourteen days' notice shall be given to the members, shall in its discretion direct.

65. An account shall be kept in the books of the institution, entitled "Land and Premises Account," which shall disclose the amounts from time to time expended under by-law 64.

66. All accounts, before they are discharged, shall be submitted to the Finance Committee, who shall certify as to their correctness.

67. On the first Tuesday of each month, or such other times as the committee may appoint, the finance committee shall examine all accounts for disbursements, and certify as to their correctness, and also see that the money received by the collectors, as checked by some officer appointed by the committee for that purpose, has been paid into bank to the credit of the hospital.

68. All payments shall be made by order of the committee.

69. All cheques shall be signed by the chairman of the committee, countersigned by the treasurer, or in his absence

by the chairman of the finance committee for the time being, and two members of the finance committee.

70. The accounts of the hospital shall be audited prior to the annual meeting in the month of January in every year, by two at least of the auditors, who shall sign a statement of accounts exhibiting a summary of receipts and expenditure.

ADMISSION OF IN-PATIENTS AND OUT-PATIENTS.

71. Any sick person may be admitted as in-patient or as out-patient, if he be recommended by a governor, and if he appear to the committee to be a proper object of charity, and if the physician or the surgeon of the week report that such person is likely to receive benefit by treatment in the hospital, or if the committee think fit.

72. Accidents and cases of emergency are at all times admissible without letters of recommendation; but no person who, in the opinion of the committee, is able to pay for aid shall, without payment, receive further than temporary assistance.

73. The committee may admit article seamen on payment of 25s. per week, or in that proportion, on the order of the shipping master of the port, countersigned by the captain or agent of the vessel, in accordance with an agreement made with the Government.

74. Whenever the applications for admission are more than can be accommodated in the house, those cases only will be admitted which in the opinion of the committee, upon the recommendation of some medical officer, are the most urgent.

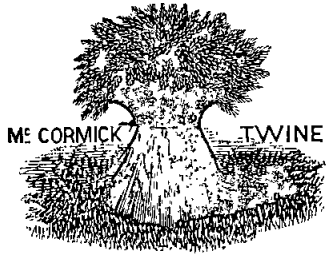
