REGULATIONS FOR THE VICTORIAN MILITARY FORCES.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to cancel paragraphs 12 and 17 of section 2 of the "Regulations for the Victorian Military Forces," dated the 7th day of February 1884, and has made the following Regulations to be substituted in lieu thereof, that is to say :—

REGULATIONS.

Sec. 2—Para. 12.—All combatant ranks (commanding officers of corps and brigade and regimental staff excepted), in order to be classed as effective, must attend in each year three whole days, fifteen half-days, and twenty-four night drills, and undergo the prescribed course of musketry or gunnery instruction. One whole day will be considered equal to two half-days or four night drills; one half-day will be considered equal to two night drills; two half-days will count as one whole day; but no number of night drills will be allowed to count for daylight parades.

Para. 17.—Commanding officers of corps, brigade and regimental staff, and officers detached from their corps on special duty, shall be classed as effective on having performed the duties required of them by General Order.

BYE-LAW No. 3.

THE Victorian Railways Commissioners, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Act 47 Victoria, No. 767, section 44, sub-section 1, do hereby make the following bye-law:—
The Commissioners may, in cases where the distance between producing districts and markets is great, or where the railway route between these points is circuitous, make special rates for the carriage of goods in quantities.

BYE-LAW No. 4.

THE Victorian Railways Commissioners, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the 47th Vic. No. 767, section 44, sub-sections 12 and 29, do hereby make the following Bye-law:—
The wharfage rates or charges imposed by the Bye-laws of the 31st January 1884, in the words following, are hereby repealed, that is to say:—

“Wharfage—on cargo discharged into or taken from lighters as per Bye-law 11 (intercolonial cargo excepted)—

OPENING TO MELTON.

OPENING TO MELTON (SPECIAL TRAIN).

A special train will leave Melbourne for Melton at 11.5 a.m. to-day (2nd April) for the conveyance of Banquet Ticket Holders, who can return by the ordinary train leaving Melton at 5.35 p.m. the same day.

DISCONTINUANCE OF TRAINS.

Brighton Line.—On and after 2nd April the 5 a.m. up from Brighton and the 5.55 a.m. down from Melbourne to Brighton on week days, Saturdays included, will be discontinued.

Williamstown Line.—On and after the same date the 4.20 a.m. down from Melbourne and the 5 a.m. up from Williamstown week days, Saturdays included, will be discontinued.

ADDITIONAL TRAINS.

Berwick Mixed Train.—On and after 2nd April an additional mixed train will leave Berwick for Melbourne at 7.10 p.m.

Essendon Line, Sundays.—On and after Sunday, 6th April, additional trains will leave Melbourne at 4.45 and 6.45 p.m., and return from Essendon at 5.10 and 7.10 p.m. on Sundays.

St. Kilda Line.—Week days—On and after 2nd April trains will run to and from Melbourne and St. Kilda at 10 minutes intervals in the morning and evening. Saturdays—Trains will run to and from Melbourne and St. Kilda at 10 minutes intervals in the morning. For particulars see time-tables.

ALTERATION OF TRAIN.

Oakleigh Suburban Line.—On and after 2nd April the train now leaving Oakleigh for Melbourne at 9.11 a.m. will leave at 9.9 a.m.

EASTER EXCURSIONS.

Holiday excursion tickets will be issued to and from all stations (suburban lines excepted) from the 8th to the 16th April, both dates inclusive (Sunday excepted), available for return for one calendar month from date of issue. Example.—An excursion ticket issued on the 9th April will be available till the 9th May. When the last day falls on a Sunday the ticket will be available till next day. The journey may be broken on these tickets, but the first portion of the journey must be commenced on day of issue.

Luggage.—Excursion passengers will only be allowed to carry such luggage “free” as can be stowed under the seats without inconvenience to other passengers, and those who have luggage for the van must be at the station half-an-hour before the train starts and pay excess-luggage rate for it.

Horses and Vehicles.—From the 9th to the 23rd April, both dates inclusive, the Department cannot engage to forward horses and vehicles by any particular train.

Sydney Excursion Tickets.—From the 8th to the 16th April, both dates inclusive, excursion tickets will be issued at Melbourne to Sydney at the following return fares:—1st class, £5 6s. 6d.; 2nd class, £4 1s. These tickets will be available for two calendar months from date of issue, but will not be available by the “express” trains.

Commercial Travellers' Samples.—From the 10th to the 15th April commercial travellers' samples will not be taken to or from roadside stations except by mixed or goods trains.

Parcels.—On the 10th and 12th April parcels must be at the Melbourne Parcels Office thirty minutes before starting time of the ordinary trains.

Goods Sheds Holidays.—The 11th and 14th April will be observed as holidays in the Goods Branch, and goods trains will not run. Perishable goods will, however, be delivered at all stations on application. Consignees of powder can ascertain from the stationmaster at Footscray when explosives will be received, in lieu of these dates.

North Melbourne and Newmarket Stations.—From the 10th to the 15th April, both dates inclusive, tickets will not be issued at North Melbourne or Newmarket stations for country stations, and down country trains will not stop there. The 5.5 p.m. “down” and 6.43 a.m. “up” North-Eastern trains are excepted from the foregoing arrangement.

EASTER EXCURSIONS.—TRAIN ARRANGEMENTS.

Special excursion trains will run from Melbourne, in addition to the ordinary trains, as under:—

Murray River Line.—For Sandhurst, stopping at Sunbury, Woodend, Kyneton, Castlemaine, and Sandhurst only:—On 10th April, at 12.10 p.m., 3.10 p.m., 3.25 p.m., and 7.10 p.m.; on 11th April, at 6.34 a.m., 12.10 p.m., 3.25 p.m., and 7.10 p.m.; on 12th, 14th, and 15th April, at 6.40 a.m., 12.10 p.m., 3.25 p.m., and 7.10 p.m.; from 16th to 23rd April, both dates inclusive, at 3.25 p.m.

Note.—An excursion special will also leave at 6.40 a.m. on 11th April, stopping at all stations.

The 3.10 p.m. and 3.25 p.m. down specials on 10th April will start from the Essendon platform.

Passengers for the Daylesford, Maryborough, St. Arnaud, Inglewood, and Echuca lines, may travel by any of the through trains which connect with the branches named.

Ballarat Line.—On 10th April a special train will leave Melbourne for Geelong and Ballarat only at 4 p.m.; on that date, and also on 12th April, passengers may book at all stations between Geelong and Ballarat by the 7 p.m. from Melbourne.

Special trains will leave Geelong for Ballarat, as under, stopping only at Ballarat East and Ballarat:—On 10th April, at 8.32 p.m.; on 11th and 14th April, at 8.23 a.m. and 1.7 p.m.

Roadside passengers are particularly requested not to seat themselves in the through carriages, which will be distinguished by placards.

From the 10th to 15th April, both dates inclusive, all Ballarat trains will start from Melbourne at the Essendon platform. Passengers will enter by the gate facing Collins street.

North-Eastern Line.—Special trains will leave Melbourne for Seymour, as under, stopping at all stations:—

On 10th and 12th April at 2.34 p.m.; on 11th and 14th April at 5.54 a.m.

REGULATION UNDER SEC. 110 OF "THE LAND ACT 1869."—DEPASTURING CATTLE IN STATE FORESTS.

At the Executive Council Chambers, Melbourne, the twenty-sixth day of March 1884.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein specified: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby rescind clause 19 of chapter 14 of the Land Regulations dated the 1st day of April One thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, and with the advice aforesaid doth make the following Regulation in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

REGULATION.

A place shall be set apart in each forest or district, as the necessities of the case may require, for branding all cattle prior to the same being depastured in any forest, and all persons shall bring their cattle to such place to be branded by the Crown Lands Bailiff or his assistant, on a day appointed by the Crown Lands Bailiff for the purpose of branding cattle. The days appointed for branding shall be notified by advertisement authorized by the Crown Lands Bailiff, in a newspaper circulating in the district.

The births of 751 children, viz., 391 boys and 360 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of February. In the month of January 899 births were registered, or 148 more than in the month under review. The births were 103 above the average of the previous nine years, but only 19 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in February numbered 483, viz., 245 of males, and 238 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 268. The deaths were fewer than those in January by 73, and below the average of January during the previous ten years by 14. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been lower than the average of those ten years by 85.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was 2·47, and of deaths registered 1·59.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 100·7° on the 13th, and the lowest was 45·0° on the 16th. The mean temperature of the month (63·9°) was nearly two and one-third degrees below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (40·3°) took place on the 12th, viz., from a maximum of 87·5° to a minimum of 47·2°. The least range (5·9°) was on the 22nd, viz., from a maximum of 61·9° to a minimum of 56·0°. The mean daily range was 18·6°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29·899 inches) was about the average.

Males contributed 51 per cent., and females 49 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 40 per cent. to that mortality as against 42 per cent. in February 1883; 46 per cent. in February 1882; 45 per cent. in February 1881; 52 per cent. in February 1880; 45 per cent. in February 1879; 52 per cent. in February 1878; 51 per cent. in February 1877; 53 per cent. in February 1876; 63 per cent. in February 1875; and 54 per cent. in February 1874.

Seventeen deaths of persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years were recorded during the month, viz.:—Those of a female, aged 75, who died of hepatic disease; a female, aged 75, of injury to her leg, caused by the bite of a dog; a baker, aged 76 and a female aged 77, of bronchitis; a female, aged 76, of cancer of the right breast; a female, aged 76, of apoplexy; a female, aged 77, of pneumonia; a gentleman, aged 79, of ascites; a station overseer, aged 79, of stomach disease; a cook, aged 79, of fracture of the leg; a male, of occupation unknown, aged 80, of brain disease; a female, aged 84, of diarrhoea; a female, aged 89, of apoplexy; and 4 females, aged 75, 79, 80, and 85 respectively of old age.

Twenty-one deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which 18 were set down to accident, and 3 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A female child, aged 1 year and 10 months, died of fracture of the skull, caused by being run over by a vehicle; a boy, aged 6, and a laborer, aged 45, of peritonitis, the result of kicks from horses; a market-gardener, aged 29, of fracture of the spleen and intestines through a cart-wheel passing over him; and a cook, aged 79, of compound fracture of the leg, caused by being run over by a cab. A carpenter, aged 40, died of tetanus, consequent on a nail

running into his foot; a male and female child, each aged 4, of scalds (the former through spilling a cup of boiling water over himself), and a female, aged 75, of exhaustion from injury to the leg, caused by the bite of a dog. A boy, aged 14, was drowned; a dressmaker, aged 18, a seaman, aged 27, a traveller, aged 30, a female, aged 55, and a male, of occupation unstatd, aged 73, were drowned in the River Yarra. A dressmaker, aged 20, was found drowned in the Saltwater River, a seaman, aged 22, was drowned through falling off the Port Melbourne pier, and a female, aged 8 months, died of suffocation. Of the suicidal deaths, a painter, aged 32, shot himself; a laborer, aged 41, cut his throat, whilst suffering from delirium tremens; and a male, of occupation unstatd, aged 17, drowned himself.

Ninety-two deaths, or 19 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—38 in the Melbourne Hospital, 14 in the Alfred Hospital, 1 in the Homœopathic Hospital, 2 in the Children's Hospital, 8 in the Lying-in Hospital, 8 in the Immigrants' Home, 9 in the Benevolent Asylum, 4 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 5 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Austin Hospital, and 1 in the Pentridge Stockade.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 191, of which 100, or 52 per cent., were of males, and 91, or 48 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 139 were under one year of age, 33 were between one and two, 7 were between two and three, 3 were between three and four, and 9 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 292. Of these, 145 were males, and 147 were females; 10 were between five and ten, 13 were between ten and fifteen, 17 were between fifteen and twenty, 24 were between twenty and twenty-five, 22 were between twenty-five and thirty, 16 were between thirty and thirty-five, 20 were between thirty-five and forty, 28 were between forty and forty-five, 28 were between forty-five and fifty, 20 were between fifty and fifty-five, 30 were between fifty-five and sixty, 16 were between sixty and sixty-five, 16 were between sixty-five and seventy, 15 were between seventy and seventy-five, 12 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 5 were upwards of eighty.

As compared with the experience of the previous month, a decrease of 31 took place in deaths from zymotic diseases. Under this head, deaths from dysentery and diarrhoea fell from 74 to 38, and those from cholera from 6 to nil. On the other hand, deaths from typhoid fever increased from 15 to 24. Phthisis, which has proved very fatal during the past three months, caused 68 deaths in the month under notice, as against 64 in January, and 70 in December.

PROCLAMATIONS OF SPECIAL LICENSING DISTRICTS REVOKED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Licensing Act 1876* (No. 566, section 44) it was amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding the provisions thereinbefore contained, it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim any place or district a place or district where, owing to a sudden increase of population or otherwise, the necessity for the immediate grant of publicans' licenses exist, to be a place or district wherein publicans' licenses might be specially granted, and from time to time to revoke any such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor

of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the following Proclamations appointing the undermentioned places to be districts where publicans' licenses may be specially granted under the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

The Proclamation bearing date the twenty-second day of May One thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, relating to Eaglehawk, in the Shire of Rosedale;

The Proclamations bearing date respectively the fourth and twenty-sixth days of September One thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, relating to Cowwar.

Regulations for the care, protection, and management of the Reserve for Municipal purposes and Public Garden in the municipal district of Inglewood.

THE Council of the Borough of Inglewood, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Municipal purposes and Public Garden in the municipal district of Inglewood, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of The Land Act 1869.

Regulations.

I. The reserves shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.

II. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

III. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve; nor shall fires be lighted therein.

IV. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

V. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.

VI. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

VII. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

VIII. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees and shrubs.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of The Land Act 1869, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

10. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which it will be procured by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 8.

11. In the case of supplies for lunatic asylums, it will also be competent for two or more of the official visitors, in conjunction with the medical superintendent, to reject any supplies that they may consider not in accordance with contract; and in such cases the reference to a Board of Survey will not be deemed to be necessary on the part of the contractor.

12. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the persons to whom the rations are due or to the contractor in waiting for a board to survey, the head of the department, or officer in charge of the station, will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 8.

13. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivery or replacing them when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mult, not exceeding £50, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government to terminate the contract forthwith.

15. - Every tender must be accompanied by cash, bank draft, or a bank deposit-receipt to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the annual amount for which the tenderer is willing to undertake the service; and to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government within ten days of being notified that the documents are ready for execution. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient. CHEQUES ON ACCOUNT OF DEPOSITS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.

6. The money or other security deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being completed.

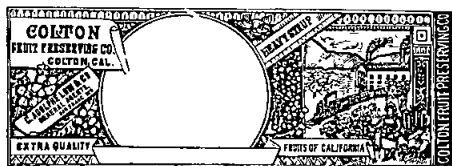
