PART OF THE SHIRE OF SHEPPARTON SEVERED THEREFROM AND CONSTITUTED THE SHIRE OF SOUTH SHEPPARTON.

At the Executive Council, Melbourne, the tenth day of April 1884.

WHEREAS by The Local Government Act 1874 (38 Vict. No. 506, § 15, 19, 21, 38, and 39), it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, exercising the powers set forth in subdivision 2 of Part I. of the said Act. And it was also enacted that every Order constituting any new municipality should constitute the same as either a borough or a shire, and should—1. Assign a name to such borough or shire. 2. Describe the boundaries thereof. 3. Determine of how many members the council should consist. 4. Determine whether the municipal district constituted should be subdivided or not; and, in case it should be subdivided, name and describe the subdivisions. And every such Order should take effect according to the tenor of the same; and every such Order constituting any new municipality, having for its municipal district portion of a previously existing municipal district, should operate to sever such portion from such previously existing municipal district. And every such Order should be published in the Government Gazette, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor by the said Act are now exercised upon a petition of the ratepayers of the Shire of Shepparton, praying that the said area might be severed from the said shire, and constituted a separate municipality (notices of which said petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the same Act): Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order sever from the Shire of Shepparton the portion of the shire described in such petition, and doth direct that the portion so severed from such shire shall be constituted a new municipality under the designation of the Shire of South Shepparton: the boundaries of which said Shire of Shepparton and its Central Riding, as hereby reduced and re-defined, and of the new Shire of South Shepparton, are as follow, that is to say:—

THE SHIRE OF SHEPPARTON REDUCED AND RE-DEFINED.—Commencing at the north-east angle of the parish of Strathmerton; thence south by the east boundary of the parishes of Strathmerton, Katunga, and Drumanaure to the south-east angle of the parish last named; thence west by the south boundary of the parishes of Drumanaure, Mundaona and Kaarimba to the Goulburn River; thence down the Goulburn River to the intersection of the west boundary of the parish of Kaarimba; thence north by the said west boundary to the south-east angle of the parish of Barwo; thence west to the south-west angle of the parish of Barwo; thence by the west boundaries of the parishes of Barwo and Yielma, north to the Murray River; thence easterly by the Murray River to the commencing point. Wherever the line so described as aforesaid runs beside or along a creek or road, whether such is specifically mentioned or not, the centre of such creek or road shall be taken to be the boundary-line.

THE CENTRAL RIDING REDUCED.—Commencing at the north-east angle of the parish of Drumanaure; thence south by the east boundary of that parish to the south-east angle thereof; thence west by the south boundary of the parishes of Drumanaure, Mundaona, and Kaarimba to the Goulburn River; thence north-westerly by the Goulburn River to the point of intersection thereof with the west boundary of the parish of Kaarimba; thence north by the west boundary of the last-named parish to the north-west angle thereof; thence east by the north boundaries of the parishes of Kaarimba, Mundaona, and Drumanaure to the commencing point.

THE SHIRE OF SOUTH SHEPPARTON CONSTITUTED AND DEFINED.—Commencing at the north-east angle of the parish of Congupna to the north-west angle of the parish of Pine Lodge; thence east by the north boundary of the parish of Pine Lodge to the north-east angle of same; thence south by the east boundary of the said parish of Pine Lodge to the Broken River; thence westerly by the Broken River to the junction thereof with the Goulburn River; thence northerly by the Goulburn River to a point where it intersects the southern boundary of the main road from Echuca to Bonalla; thence westerly by the southern boundary of the said road twenty-eight chains nine links to the intersection of the eastern boundary of Red Gum Flat Reserve; thence by a line bearing 23° 52' six chains ninety links to the centre of the Goulburn River; thence by the Goulburn River to the intersection thereof with the northern boundary of the parish of Tallygaroopna; and thence easterly by the northern boundaries of the parishes of Tallygaroopna and Congupna to the commencing point. Wherever the line so described as aforesaid runs beside or along a creek or road, whether such is specifically mentioned or not, the centre of such creek or road shall be taken to be the boundary-line.

It is also hereby further ordered that the Council of the Shire of South Shepparton hereby constituted shall consist of six members, and that the said shire shall not be subdivided at present.

And the Honorable Alfred Deakin, Her Majesty's Acting Commissioner of Public Works for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The stacks are to be two feet wide by five feet high, with space between each stack for measuring; and the billets are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack, and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply. In case the firewood for Yarra Bend is required to be supplied at per ton weight, the contractor will be bound to weigh the wood upon the Anyum weigh-bridge. Each load to be tared separately. SHIRE OF COBURG.

BYE-LAW No. 12.

A Bye-law of the Shire of Coburg, made under the 213th section of The Local Government Act 1874, and numbered 12, for the suppression of cattle wandering in the streets of the shire.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1874, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Coburg order as follows:—

Sections 41 and 42 of subdivision 9, part one of the 13th schedule of the Local Government Act 1874 is hereby adopted in and for the Shire of Coburg.

41. If any cattle shall be found upon any land not being a common, and such that there is no fence whether upon the same land or any other dividing such first-mentioned land from any street or road, whether public or private, without any person having charge of such cattle, the owner of such cattle shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings for every head of such cattle, and the proper officer of the council may seize such cattle and place the same at some neighboring place of safe custody, and any justice, if such owner be not known, upon proof of the issue of a summons in the usual form addressed to such owner as "owner" only, without otherwise naming or describing him, such cattle and the place of seizure being duly described therein, and of the publication of such summons in some newspaper commonly circulating in the neighborhood, may, after the expiration of twenty-four hours from such publication, proceed with respect to such owner not appearing as if personal service of a summons stating his name had been effected, or if such owner appear then as in other cases; and the justice may order the cattle to be sold, and the money arising from the sale, after deducting the said penalty, and the costs awarded, and the reasonable expenses to be estimated and assessed by the justice of seizing, keeping, and selling the said cattle, shall be paid, if demanded, within one month to the owner of the cattle, and if not so demanded then to the municipal fund; and if the said money shall not be sufficient for all the purposes aforesaid, the amount whereby the same falls short, or if no such sale be ordered the whole of the said amount, may be recovered from the said owner if and when known in like manner as other penalties and sums adjudged or ordered to be paid by justices are to be recovered.

42. If any cattle be at any time found in any street without any person having the charge thereof, the owner of such cattle shall forfeit for every head of such cattle a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings, and if such cattle shall by reason of having been so found at large have been impounded by the council, the amount of such penalty and costs if adjudged respectively before the release or sale of such cattle shall be added to the pound fees and charges payable in respect of such cattle; and the amount thereof or such lesser amount (if any) as after the sale of the cattle may remain in the hands of the poundkeeper shall be paid over by him accordingly; and if the proceeds of any sale of such cattle shall not be sufficient, after paying the lawful fees and charges aforesaid, to satisfy such penalty and costs, or if such penalty and costs shall have been adjudged after the release or sale of the cattle, the same, or so much thereof as remains unpaid, shall and may be recovered from the owner of the cattle in like manner as other penalties and costs adjudged by justices are by law to be recovered; and if in the case of any information under this section the owner be not known, then the provisions of the last preceding section, so far as necessary to give the adjudicating justice jurisdiction, shall apply.

CITY OF PRAHRAN.—BYE-LAW 88.

NIGHTMENS' LICENSES.

A Bye-law for the licensing and government of Nightmen within the city of Prahran, and numbered 88.

WHEREAS by "The Police Offences Statute 1865" (Act 265) it is provided that any person emptying any privy or cesspool, or carting away any nightsoil or any other offensive matter, without a license from, and without having given such security as is required by, the local authority (being so far as relates to the said city council thereof), shall on conviction pay a fine not exceeding Twenty pounds.

Now the council of the city of Prahran doth hereby order and direct as follows, that is to say:—

Every person desiring to be licensed as a nightman for the city of Prahran shall yearly lodge with the town clerk an application in writing setting forth his full name and address, with a certificate of his good character and fitness to be licensed signed by two respectable householders appended thereto. And shall deposit the sum of Ten pounds as security, and sign a defecance providing for forfeiture of such sum on any breach of conditions of such license.

Every license shall be numbered with a consecutive number, and the cart employed by any licensed nightman shall bear a corresponding number to that of his license, and such license shall continue and be in force from the date thereof until the 31st day of December then next.

All carts used by any licensed nightman shall be constructed in conformity with the bye-laws and regulations in force in the city of Prahran, and of like pattern and material to those belonging to and in use by the city council.

Every licensed nightman shall produce his license upon demand made by any officer or servant of the city council.

Every nightman's license shall be in the form and be issued subject to the general conditions of license to be endorsed upon such license respectively set forth in the schedule hereto.

Conditions of License.

Every person desirous of carrying on the business of a nightman within the city of Prahran shall make application in writing, stating his true residence, for a license so to do, addressed to the council of the said city, and deliver the same at the town clerk's office. Such application shall be accompanied by a certificate signed by two ratepayers certifying to the applicant's fitness to receive such license, and a declaration in writing by the applicant that he will comply with and fulfil in all respects all bye-laws or regulations made by the council of the said city under "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," as well as all municipal bye-laws or regulations, and also all regulations made by the said council or under the principal Police Offences Statute or any amendment thereof. Such license shall remain in force, at whatever period of the year the same shall be granted, until the 31st December next ensuing, unless in the meantime the holder of the same, or any of his workmen or servants while acting in the ordinary course of his business, shall have been convicted of any offence under any of the bye-laws of the city of Prahran, made under either "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," "The Local Government Act 1874," or any amendment thereof, or under the principal Police Offences Statute or any amendment thereof.

The council upon being satisfied of all the premises as to the applicant's fitness, and the fitness and efficiency of the cart proposed to be used, shall be at liberty to issue such license, and in the construction of these conditions "nightman" shall mean any person who for any monetary remuneration or for any other consideration shall remove any nightsoil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter, whether disinfected or deodorized or not, or any ammoniacal liquor or other offensive liquor.

Before any applicant for the issue of a nightman's license shall be entitled to the issue of the same, after approval by the council as aforesaid, he shall deposit with the town clerk of the said city the sum of £10, to be absolutely forfeited to the municipal fund if he or his workmen while acting as aforesaid be convicted of any offence as aforesaid, or on breach of those conditions, and such deposit shall be held by the town clerk during the existence of the license.

Every such licensed nightman shall endorse on his license, on the issue of the same, the true name and address of his workmen, and shall, as frequently as his workmen are changed, endorse such change of name, and register the same with the town clerk, and shall while he or any of his workmen are employed about his said business carry with him his said license, or a copy thereof, certified as such under the hand of the said town clerk, and produce the same respectively when required by any officer of the local board of health, any police constable, or any other municipal officer.

Every such nightman shall whilst using any cart have painted in white on a black ground on the right or off side, in a conspicuous place, his name and the number (of not less than two inches in length and of proportionate breadth) assigned to his license, together with the words "licensed nightman" in letters of not less than two inches in length and of proportionate breadth, and shall keep the same clear and distinguishable during the existence of his license.

He shall also, while such cart is being used in the course of his business, keep two lamps (on the front glass of which respectively

shall be painted the number of his license) properly lighted, and at all times legible and conspicuous, one affixed to his cart at the front and the other at the back thereof.

The license issued to such nightman shall not entitle him to carry through the city of Prahran or remove any nightsoil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter, ammoniacal or offensive liquor, produced within the limits of any municipality beyond the corporate limits of the city of Prahran.
