VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

REGULATIONS OF THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS. No. 3.

UNDER and by virtue of The Victorian Railways Commissioners Act 1883, the Victorian Railways Commissioners make the following Regulations for the earrying out of the thirty-third section of the said Act, and for the hearing of appeals under section tirty-five of the same:—

- 1. The head of each branch may suspend, or may fine in a sum not exceeding Five pounds, or may reduce in rank, position, or grade, or in pay, any employé in his branch for misconduct, or for any breach of the rules, or of any regulation of the Railway Service, or of any railway bye-law.
- 2. Every such employé shall have the right of appeal to the commissioners.
- 3. Every such appeal shall be heard within thirty days of the appeal being lodged with the commissioners.
- 4. At the hearing of every such appeal the three commissioners shall be present. The advice or decision of the officer at the head of the branch shall be made known to the employé, who shall be heard in support of his appeal; and who will be protected by the commissioners in any defence, orderly and to the purpose, which he may set up.
- $5,\ {\rm Successful}\ {\rm appellants}\ {\rm will}\ {\rm be}\ {\rm allowed}\ {\rm travelling}\ {\rm expenses}\ {\rm at}$ the ordinary rates.
- 6. The commissioners will determine upon the appeal, and may confirm or modify the decision of the officer at the head of the branch, or may make such order as they may think fit; and their decision shall be final.


