LAND PLACED UNDER THE TEMPORARY MANAGEMENT AND CONTROL OF THE SHEPPARTON WATERWORKS TRUST.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir WILLIAM FOSTER STAWELL, Knight, the Chief Justice of the Colony of Victoria, and Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the forty-sixth section of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881* and the eighty-ninth section of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883*, I, the Administrator of the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby place under the temporary management and control of the undermentioned Waterworks Trust the portion of land hereinafter described, that is to say:—

PORTION OF LAND HEREBY PLACED UNDER THE TEMPORARY CONTROL OF THE MEMBERS OF THE SHEPPARTON WATERWORKS TRUST.

NUMURKAH.—Five acres, more or less, county of Moira, town of Numurkah, being that portion of the land permanently reserved for Public purposes, by Order of the 23rd May 1881, indicated

by blue color on plan marked B, attached to correspondence 83.L.20340, deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this seventh day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, and in the forty-seventh year of Her Majesty's reign.
