THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL TO THE INTERNATIONAL HEALTH EXHIBITION TO THE EARL OF DERBY.

South Kensington, 13th March 1884.

My Lord,

I am desired by the Executive Council of the International Health Exhibition to intimate to Your Lordship that it is proposed to organize, in connection with the Exhibition, a Library and Reading Room, and that a wish has been expressed that the occasion should be made an opportunity for bringing together a collection of international works on sanitation and kindred topics. It will be the first time that an effort will have been made to bring together in one place such a collection of materials, the catalogue alone of which will prove of immense future value. Selected publishers and authors are being invited to send their works to this Department; but in order that it may be of a thoroughly international and intercolonial character, the Executive Council are anxious that some steps should be taken with a view to culist the sympathy and support of Colonial Governments. I am therefore desired to invoke the assistance of the Colonial Office, and to ask if your Lordship would do the Council the honor to cause application to be made to Colonial Governments to furnish lists of all official publications on vital statistics, and reports and regulations on public health issued by the Central Governments of such colonies. The Council do not ask that communications may be entured into with the municipalities of the colonies, as manifestly, even if it were possible to obtain them, the dealing with reports and regulations from local centres would be fare beyond their power. They do trust, however, that in the manner indicated it may not be impossible to obtain from the Central Governments of the Colonies, for use in the proposed library, a collection of works affecting the administration of general sanitary laws throughout the colonies.

I may add that, in response to a request which I recently addressed to Earl Granville, application has been made from the Foreign Office to Foreign Governments for contributions to the Library and Reading Room.

3. Except under special circumstances, purchases will be made between the 15th September and 28th February.

4. Horses and mares of all breeds will be received, but they must be within the prescribed age, 4 to 7 years, except as regards country-breds. It is to be distinctly understood that, in regard to Classes I. and III., remounts three years old and mares in foal will not be purchased.

5. Greys will not be purchased for horse or field artillery.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

BYE-LAW No. 6.

THE Victorian Railways Commissioners, in pursuance of the powers conferred by The Victorian Railways Commissioners Act 1833, do hereby repeal so much of the Bye-laws of the Board of Land and Works made on the 31st day of January 1884, which fix the charges upon, and regulations for the carriage of and with respect to, Sawn Timber; and the Victorian Railways Commissioners do hereby make the following Bye-law for the purpose of fixing the charges and conditions for conveyance of Sawn Timber as follows (that is to say):—

SAWN TIMBER.-GD. PER TRUCK LOAD OF 5 TONS PER MILE. Conditions.

SAWN TIMBER.—6D. PER TRUCK LOAD OF 5 TONS PER MILK.

Conditions.

1. All hardwood timber will be subject to a terminal charge of 2s. 6d. per truck if not loaded by owners, to be carried at owners' risk, and unloaded by owner. If not unloaded within four hours after arrival, a denurrage charge of 1s. per truck per working hour, or part of an hour will be strictly enforced. The Department may also unload at any time after the four hours, and charge 4s. per truck for bogie trucks, and 2s. for all other trucks for such unloading in addition to any demurrage incurred.

2. First-class rate to be charged for all excess weight, when the quantity is found to be in excess of that consigned.

3. Thirty feet sawn timber is allowed to the ton. All timber in lengths requiring 2 trucks to be charged 10 per cent. additional on the long lengths only. When each truck is loaded to its full carrying capacity these percentages are not charged on sawn timber, but they are charged in all cases on derrick cranes, piles, logs, telegraph and scaffolding poles, windmills, and wooden houses requiring two or more trucks.

4. Minimum, 20s. (including terminal). Less than truck load to be charged as a truck load, or first-class rates. For short distances, H, I, and K trucks may be loaded to their authorized carrying capacity for the minimum of 20s., so long as the rate per ton with terminal does not exceed that amount. For instance, 23 miles at 6d. per truck of 5 tons gives, say, 2s. 4d. per ton; 7 tons 10 cwt. @ 2s. 4d. = 17s. 6d. + with terminal 2s. 6d. = 20s. A 7½-ton truck can therefore be sent 23 miles for the minimum of 20s.

The Commissioners reserve the right to decline to either load or unload sawn timber, and the consignor and consignee respectively may thereupon be required to do all necessary labor in connexion with such loading or unloading, and will be responsible for any loss or damage, or demurage, or storage charges, which may accrue from detention of trucks through their default.

All timber consigned to Melbourne will be unloaded by the Department at the Lower-level Sidings, and will be subject to the charges per truck-load for unloading specified in clause 1.

REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE MEREDITH TOWN COMMON.

COMMON.

In pursuance of the regulations relating to Commons, made by the Governor in Council on the first April 1879, the Managers of the Meredith Town Common having dratted the following Regulations for the management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Administrator of the Government in Council, in lieu of the Regulations heretofore in force in respect of such Common.

Regulations.

- 1. In the construction and for the purpose of these regulations the words "large cattle" shall mean cows, heifers, oxen, steers, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, and mules, and the words "small cattle" shall mean sheep and goats.
- "small cattle" shall mean sheep and goats.

 2. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers residing within five miles of the common, may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole, or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three (3) head of small cattle. A farmer, having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him, may depasture on such common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

 2. The Libering shall be the scale of fees navable half-yearly
- 3. The following shall be the scale of fees payable half-yearly in advance, on the first day of February and the first day of No. 62.-May 23, 1884.-2,

- August in every year :—For every horse, Six shillings per annum; for every head of other large cattle, Four shillings per annum; for every head of small cattle, One shilling and fourpence per annum.
- 4. No person shall depasture stock on the common unless such stock be his or her own property.
- 5. The managers shall not be responsible for stock placed on the common.
- 6. Persons desirous of removing stock from the common shall give twenty-four (24) hours' notice in writing to the herdsman before so doing.
- 7. All stock found trespassing on the common shall be liable to be impounded.
- 8. No animal affected with any contagious disease shall be allowed to depasture on the common, and if after due notice has been given to the owner to remove any animal so affected he fail to do so within a reasonable time to be stated in such notice, the managers may cause such animal to be destroyed at the owner's risk.
- 9. The managers shall attend at the yard on branding days to receive fees and give receipts in the prescribed form, and stock shall only be taken in charge by the herdsman on production of such receipts.
- 10. The herdsman shall brand all registered stock with the common brand, and the owners shall assist at branding time to muster their stock.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding (£20) Twenty pounds for each offence.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

- 1. That all fees and charges for graves, &c., shall be paid when applications are made or orders given.

 2. That any person desiring ground for a private grave or a vault, tomb, inonument, cenotaph, tombstone, or for any other purpose in the cemetery, under the above Act, shall apply to the trustees therefore. If approved, the trustees, on the payment of
- required fees, shall issue to such person so applying a certificate of right of burial in form specified in Schedule A.
- 3. That any person desiring to construct a brick grave, vault or tomb, or to erect a monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other erection in any part of the cemetery, shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit a plan, design, or drawing of such with full particulars for approval.
- 4. That any order for interment shall be given at the cemetery twelve working hours prior to the time fixed for burial, otherwise an extra charge shall be made. No free interment shall be allowed without said notice.

 5. That the name, age, late residence, probable cause of death of the deceased, and other particulars mentioned in Schedule B, shall be furnished at the time of giving the order.
- · 6. That the trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person wanting a brick grave or vault shall be permitted

to construct the same, under directions of the trustees, on payment of required fees, and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or

- 7. That every coffin shall have on the lid a lead or copper plate with the name of the deceased stamped thereon.
- 8. That every grave shall be at least six feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than three feet from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the ground after such interment.
- 9. That no interment shall be permitted in any private grave or vault without the production of the certificate of right of burial, or other satisfactory evidence that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so, except as provided for in the next rule.
- 10. That in the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault, to which during life the deceased person had no claim, the written consent of the owner shall be given in with the order.
- 11. That no burial shall be permitted to take place in said cemetery without a certificate from a deputy registrar of deaths or a coroner. Such certificate shall be delivered to the sexton before the funeral enters the cemetery.
- 12. That the hours fixed for burials be as follow:—On week days, September to April inclusive, from Eight a.m. to Five p.m.; May to August inclusive, from Eight a.m. to Four p.m. On Sundays throughout the year from Two to Five p.m.

 13. That no burial shall be allowed to take place between the hours of Saven p.m. and Seven a.m. except by the special permission of the trustees.
- 14. That the time fixed for any burial shall be the time when the funeral is to be at the cemetery, and the same shall be punctually observed.
- 15. That every grave, tomb, vault, monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other erection, shall be maintained and kept in thorough repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owner.
- 16. That any person desiring to place any inscription or epitaph in any part of the cemetery shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit a copy thereof.
- 17. That any person putting up any erection or placing any inscription or epitaph in any part of the cemetery without the permission of the trustees shall be liable to the penalties imposed by the above Act for so doing, and to be further dealt with as a
- 18. That the trustees shall not (unless in very exceptional cases) permit the removal of any corpse from any grave for re-interment either in said or any other cemetery.
- 19. That before any such exceptional case can be dealt with by the Trustees, a written application setting forth the reasons for the proposed removal, and verified by statutory declaration, shall be produced by the nearest available representative of the deceased, and in the event of said application being granted, the permission of the Minister administering The Coroners Statute 1855 and the Act numbered CCCXXXVIII in addition to that of the trustees shall be obtained. If found necessary, the coffin shall be enclosed in a second and air-tight coffin prior to removal.
- 20. That any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any erection, or otherwise infringting the above Act, or any rule, regulation, or bye-law made for protecting the cemetery, shall be prosecuted as the law directs.
- 21. That no person shall be allowed to take any flower or plant out of the cemetery.
- 22. That the sexton or other officer exercise a general supervision and control under the trustees over all matters pertaining to the cemetery.
- 23. That a plan of the cemetery showing the distribution of the land, compartments, situations, and numbers of the graves, and a registry of all certificates of right of burial shall be kept at the office.
