The births of 881 children, viz., 485 boys and 396 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of April. In the month of March 882 births were registered, or 1 more than in the month under review. The births were 169 above the average of the previous nine years, but only 76 above that average, if all wance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in April numbered 518, viz., 283 of males, and 23 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 363. The deaths were fewer than those in March by 6, but exceeded the Average of April during the previous ten years by 46. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been below the average of those ten years by 22.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was 2.89, and of deaths registered 1.70.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 88°29 on the 2nd, and the lowest was 40°7° on the 30th. The mean temperature of the month (59°0°) was two-lifths of a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (36°9°) took place on the 9th, viz., from a maximum of 77°9° to a minimum of 41°0°. The least range (7.4°) was on the 5th, viz., from a maximum of 52°9° to a minimum of 51°9°. The mean daily range was 19°0°. The mean atmospheric pressure (30°075 inches) was a fraction above the average.

Males contributed 55 per cent., and females 45 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 40 per cent. to that mortality as against 33 per cent. in April 1883; 41 per cent. in April 1882; 36 per cent. in April 1881; 40 per cent. in April 1880; 43 per cent. in April 1879; 38 per cent. in April 1878; 40 per cent. in April 1876; 47 per cent. in April 1875; and 32½ per cent. in April 1876;

Nincteen of the deaths recorded during the month were of persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years, viz.:—
Those of a male cook, aged 75, and a lady, aged 78, who died of heart disease; a carpenter, aged 78, of cancer; a shepherd, aged 79, of kidney disease; a female, aged 79, of typhoid fever; a female, aged 79, of possesses; a female, aged 80, of diarrhora; a female, aged 77, a butler, aged 82, and a female, aged 87, of paralysis; a messenger, aged 83, of congestion of the lungs; a female, aged 85, of enteritis; an accountant, aged 75, a carter, aged 76, a shoemaker and a laborer, each aged 78, a female, aged 81, a laborer, aged 86, and a female, aged 87, of old age.

Twenty deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which 19 were set down to accident, and 1 to homicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—An apprentice, aged 16, died of peritonitis, resulting from being crushed whilst moving slabs of marble: a laborer, aged 29, of fracture of the skull, occasioned by the fall of a saw; an engine-driver, aged 47, of fracture of the thigh, caused by a collision on the Victorian railways: a carter, aged 32, of the effects of a dray wheel passing over him; a carpenter, aged 25, of injuries to the head, and a female servant, aged 40, of concussion of the brain—both the result of falls,

the latter being down stairs; a musician, aged 48, of injury to the kidneys, caused by a fall whilst walking; a laborer, aged 57, of injuries to the head, caused by a fall from a box whilst treading tobacce; a farmer, aged 60, of injury to the spine, caused by falling backwards from a carpenter, aged 63, of extravasation of blood on the brain, caused by a fall from a building. A male child, aged 3, and a girl, aged 13, died of burns, the clothes of the latter having caught fire; a male child, aged 3, of scalds, through falling into a pot of boiling water; a fireman, aged 30, was killed by a boiler explosion. A female, aged 32, was drowned whilst drunk; a draper, aged 39, and a clerk, aged 60, were found drowned; a fomale infant, aged 1 day, died of injuries received during birth. The homicidal death was that of a market gardener, aged 40, who died from the effects of a gun-shot wound, wilfully inflicted.

One hundred deaths, or 19 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—42 in the Melbourne Hospital, 15 in the Alfred Hospital, 5 in the Children's Hospital, 9 in the Lying-in Hospital, 7 in the Immigrants' Home, 10 in the Benevolent Asylum, 1 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 6 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Austin Hospital, 2 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 1 in the Protestant Refuge.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 208, of which 113, or 54 per cent., were of males, and 95, or 46 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 136 were under one year of age, 47 were between one and two, 10 were between two and three, 8 were between three and four, and 7 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 310. Of these, 170, or 55 per cent., were males, and 140, or 45 per cent., were females; 9 were between five and ten, 11 were between ten and fifteen, 20 were between fitten and twenty, 25 were between twenty and twenty-five, 27 were between twenty-five and thirty, 23 were between thirty-five, and thirty, five, 20 were between thirty-five and forty, 12 were between forty and forty-five and fity-five and fity-five and fity-five and sixty, 31 were between sixty and sixty-five, 20 were between sixty-five and soventy, 15 were between seventy-five, 11 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 8 were upwards of eighty.

As compared with the experience of the previous month, deaths from whooping-cough increased from 2 to 7, and those from typhoid fever from 27 to 36. On the other hand, deaths from dysentery and diarrhea decreased from 48 to 41. Seven deaths were due to the consequences of childbirth both in March and April, the proportion being 1 death of a mother to every 126 births received.

During the quarter the increase by excess of registered births ver registered deaths was 3319, viz., 1474 males and 1845

females; that by excess of recorded arrivals by sea over recorded departures by sea was 3828, viz., 2892 males and 936 females. The total increase of population was thus 7147, viz., 4366 males and 2781 females, as shown in the table. This increase is considerably in excess of that recorded in the corresponding quarter of the previous year, viz., 4150; or than in the corresponding quarter of 1882, viz., 4274. It should be stated that, whilst it is probable nearly all the deaths and arrivals by sea are noted, there is reason to believe that some births and departures by sea are not recorded; it should moreover be borne in mind that no account is or can be taken of persons who come and go overland.

A check upon the total figures is afforded by means of returns

land. A check upon the total figures is afforded by means of returns of the population of their respective districts furnished, once a year, by the municipal authorities throughout the colony. According to these returns—supplemented by an allowance for persons living outside local jurisdiction, and a correction so as to bring the figures on to date—the population of Victoria, on the 31st March 1884, was 938,812, or 125 less than that shown by the table.

- 10. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones to be kept in proper repair and proper condition, at the expense of the
- 11. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron.
- 12. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who are required by the 8th section of the Act to withhold permission and prevent the erection of any monument which shall appear to them inappropriate or unbecoming, and shall determine and fix the position of any monument which may be prepared to be erected according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner. In the erection of tablets, copper clamps must be used.

5. Every person driving, riding, or impelling a machine, who overtakes and passes any vehicle, or any horse, or any beast of burden, shall keep such machine to the right or off side of such vehicle or animal.
