### ARMS REGULATION, 1884.

ARMS REGULATION, 1884.

IIIS Excellency the Administrator of the Government has directed the publication of the subjoined Regulation, passed by the High Commissioner for the Western Pacific under the provisions of the Order in Council of 1879.

The High Commissioner requests that it may be intimated that a knowledge of this Regulation will not be presumed against vessels until the 1st of September, unless they shall have left a port in any Australasian Colony more than one month after the publication of the Regulation in such Colony.

A REGULATION .

(Made in the name and on behalf of Her Britannic Majesty by Her Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific, under the provisions of the Western Pacific Order in Council

To prohibit the supply of Arms, Ammunition, and Explosive Sub-stances to Natires of the Western Pacific Islands.

In this regulation the expression "Western Pacific Islands' leans and includes any of the following islands or places.

ans and includes any of the following islands or places, mely:—

(1.) The part of the Island of New Guinea, eastward of the 143rd meridian of longitude.

(2.) The Islands or Archipelago of New Britain and New Ireland.

(3.) The Louisiada Archipelago.

(4.) The Groups of Islands known as—

The Friendly Islands,
The Navigators Islands.
The Union Islands,
The Union Islands,
The Ellice Islands,
The Ellice Islands,
The Gilbert Islands,
The Garbial Islands or Archipelago,
The Caroline Islands,
The Solomon Islands,
The South Wales, and not being within the limits of the Colonies of Fiji, Queensland,
or New South Wales, and not being within the jurisdiction of any civilized power.

The expression "the waters of the Western Pacific
Islands" means the waters within 3 miles of any of
the islands or places included in the Western Pacific
Islands.
The word "arms" means every kind of firearms and any

part or parts of firearms.

The word "ammunition" means every kind of ammunition for firearms and any material for the preparation

tion for firearms and any material for the preparation thereof.

The expression "explosive substance" means gunpowder, nitro-glycerine, dynamite, gun-cotton, blasting powder, and every other substance used or manufactured with a view to produce a practical effect by explosion.

2. British vessels within the waters of the Western Pacific Islands shall not earry arms or ammunition. But this prohibition shall not be held to prevent or forbid the carriage by any such vessel for the protection of the same and of the persons therein, and otherwise for the ordinary lawful purposes of such vessel, of arms and ammunition, in quantities not exceeding those herein specified, viz. —

One rifle or shot gun and one pistol for every member of the crew of such vessel, whose name shall be on the articles. One hundred rounds of ammunition for every such rifle, shot gun, or pistol on board.

Cannons or svivel guns forming part of the ordinary equipment of any such vessel, together with one hundred rounds of ammunition for every such gun.

3. British subjects within the Western Pacific Islands shall not give, sell, or otherwise supply any arms, ammunition, or explosive substance to any native of any island or place within the Western Pacific Islands.

4. Any British subject who shall carry or aid or abot the carriage of any arms or ammunition in any British vessel within the waters of the Western Pacific Islands, except as permitted by this regulation, shall be guilty of an offence against this regulation.

5. Any British subject within the Western Pacific Islands who shall give, sell, or otherwise supply, or aid or assist in supplying any arms, or any single firearm, or any ammunition or explosive substance to any native of any island or place within the Western Pacific Islands, shall be guilty of an offence against this regulation.

6. Any person guilty of an offence against this regulation shall, on conviction thereot, be liable to punishment as follows:

(1.) Imprisonment for any term not exceeding three months, with or without hard labor, and with or without a fine not exceeding £10; or

(2.) A fine alone, not exceeding £10, without any imprisonment.

7. This regulation shall come into force on the first day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, and may be cited as the "Arms Regulation, 1884."

DISCONTINUANCE OF LIGHT AT LIGHTSHIP, BRISBANE BAR, AND EXHIBITION OF LIGHT AND TIDAL SIGNALS FROM THE PILE

Notice is hereby given that, on or about the 31st instant, the Lightship will be removed from her present position off the bar of the Brisbane River, and that the light and the tidal signals will after that time be shown from the Pile Lighthouse.

The lighthouse stands in 16 feet at low water, and 450 feet eastward from the line of leading lights through the outer cutting.

eastward from the line of leading lights through the outer cutting. The light exhibited from the central lantern will be dioptric of the 4th order, occulting during the flood tide, and fixed during the ebb. It will be seen as a red light by vessels passing through the outer cutting, and between the bearings of N. by W. ½ W. and S. by E. ½ E. From S. by E. ½ E. to W.S.W. westerly it will appear as a white light. Between the bearings of W.S.W. esterly in W. by N. ½ N. northerly it will be seen as a red light. From a W. by N. ½ N. northerly to N.W. by W. ½ W. bearing it will be again seen as a white light, and from the southward of the latter bearing the light will be obscured.

In the direction of Cowan Cowan the white light will be intensified by a sector of 45° of light—not otherwise required—condensed into a beam of 10°.

The red sector facing to the eastward covers Mud Island and the reefs and the shoal ground to the northward, so that when passing in the white sectors north or south of the island vessels will be in deep water.

While within the white sector to the southward of the red light, vessels will be in the fairway between St. Helena and Mud Islands, and clear of the foul ground on either hand.

The occulting light will be obscured for 2 seconds at intervals of ten seconds.

The tidal signals by day will be made from the W.N.W. and E.S.E. corners of the lighthouse, and at night by lights from 6th order dioptric apparatus shown from similar positions, the code used being as follows:—

During the flood tide a red flag will be kept flying from a staff

The depths given represent the draught at which a vessel may safely enter the river.

Vessels entering the river are to bring into line the leading lighthouses for crossing the bar before reaching the Pile Lighthouse, and vessels outward bound are not to leave the line until the Pile Lighthouse is passed.

### CAPE NELSON LIGHTHOUSE.

REFERRING to Notice to Mariners dated the 25th May 1883, it is now notified that on and after the 7th July 1884, a light will be exhibited from the Lighthouse at Cape Nelson.

The light, which is a first order fixed light with dioptric illuminating apparatus, is elevated 250 feet above the level of the sea, and should be visible in clear weather at a distance of 10 nautical

A white light will be seen from seaward over an arc of 189 degrees; a ray of red light will be shown to the eastward over the Lawrence Rock, and a ray of red light also to the westward over the southernmost point of Cape Bridgewater, and one mile to seaward of such point.

The bearings (magnetic) on which the light will be seen from seaward, are as follow:—

Red, from W.S.W. to W. ½ S.

White, from W. ½ S. round northerly to E. ½ S.

1st. Application to dig a grave, make a vault, or erect a monument in the cometery to be made to the trustees, who will grant a certificate to persons applying for the same on all fees and charges being paid to the treasurer.

2nd. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, and where a brick grave or vault is required it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees or some person appointed by

3rd. All vaults, graves, monuments, gravestones, and fences to be kept in proper repair and condition at the owner's expense.

4th. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave must be bricked in, covered, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, granite, slate, or iron.
