TRESPASSING ON VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

THE Body Corporate of the Victorian Railways Commissioners doth hereby authorize and appoint each and every of the persons named and described in the schedule hereto annexed as its agent and officer for the purposes hereinafter mentioned, that is to say :-

Under the 128th section of *The Public Works Statute 1865*, to seize and detain any person trespassing on any line of State Railway or on any State Railway premises, whose name and residence shall be unknown to such agent, and to give such person in charge to a police constable, whose duty it is to bring the offender before a justice, and also to lay any information or complaint before any justice against such offender, and charge him with an offence against the 155th section of *The Public Works Statute 1865*.

Also to lay any information or complaint before any justice against any person for any offence against the 155th section of *The Public Works Statute 1865*, and to summons such person before a justice and charge him with such offence, and to impound all "cattle" (which word shall here bear the same interpretation as given to it by the Act No. 478), and also to destroy all goats, pigs, and geese found trespassing on any railway now vested or hereafter to be vested in the Commissioners.

This authority is not to supersede any authority for the like purpose heretofore made and given by the Commissioners.

The births of 997 children, viz., 520 boys and 477 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of May. In the month of April 881 births were registered, or 116 fewer than in the month under review. The births were 212 above the average of the previous nine years, but only 109 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in May numbered 547, viz., 276 of males, and 271 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 450. The deaths outnumbered those in April by 29, and exceeded the average of May during the previous ten years by 96. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded the average of those ten years by 31 only.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was 3.27, and of deaths registered 1.80.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 77.0° on the 9th, and the lowest was 38.0° on the 21st. The mean temperature of the month (52.8°) was a tenth of a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (32.3°) took place on the 2nd, viz., from a maximum of 73.9° to a minimum of 41.6°. The least range (3.6°) was on the 11th, viz., from a maximum of 56.0° to a minimum of 52.4°. The mean daily range was 16.2°. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.066 inches) was a fraction above the average.

Males contributed 50 per cent., and females 50 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 36 per cent. to that mortality as against 31 per cent. in May 1883; 30 per cent. in May 1882; 31 per cent. in May 1881 and May 1880; 39 per cent. in May 1879; 26 per cent. in May 1878; 34 per cent. in May 1877; 38 per cent. in May 1876; 37 per cent. in May 1875; and 39 per cent. in May 1874.

The deaths of 22 persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these:—A dealer, aged 76, died of apoplexy; a female, aged 76, of disease of the liver; a female, aged 78, of tumor; a female, aged 78, of pneumonia; 2 females, aged 78 and 83 respectively, of dropsy; a laborer, aged 81, of cancer of the cheek; a stonemason, aged 81, of bronchitis; an engineer, aged 75, a female, aged 78, a government pensioner, aged 83, and a female, aged 89, of disease of the heart; a female, aged 84, of disease of the brain; a bootmaker, aged 83, of typhoid fever; a female, aged 88, of hemiplegia; a bootmaker, aged 94, of congestion of the lungs; a printer, aged 79, a female, aged 81, a gentleman, aged 83, a laborer, aged 85, a female, aged 88, and a female, aged 89, of old age.

Twenty deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which 17 were set down to accident, 1 to homicide, and 2 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A boy, aged 6, died of injuries received from the kick of a horse; a boy, aged 10, of fracture of the leg, caused by the limb being caught in the cog-wheel of a whim; a boy, aged 14, of

concussion of the brain sustained whilst playing football; a carter, aged 38, of injuries caused by the lorry he was driving passing over him; a laborer, aged 42, of injuries occasioned by the fall of a case which was being hoisted; a contractor, aged 44, of the effects of a fall from a horse; a law stationer, aged 74, of fracture of the skull, the result of a fall down stairs; a female, aged 39, of burns received whilst drunk. A boy, aged 7, a gardener, aged 20, a carter, aged 23, a bootmaker, aged 30, and a female, aged 47, were drowned; a laborer, aged 32, was drowned whilst in a fit of apoplexy; a ship's steward, aged 26, and a female servant, aged 21, were found drowned. A boy, aged 3, was suffocated, a piece of a whistle having become impacted in the air passages. The homicidal death was that of a female, aged 30, who was wilfully murdered by her husband. The suicidal deaths were those of a female, aged 31, who cut her throat whilst of unsound mind, and of a publican, aged 63, who allowed himself to be passed over by a train.

One hundred and eighteen deaths, or 22 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—55 in the Melbourne Hospital, 10 in the Alfred Hospital, 1 in the Homoeopathic Hospital, 2 in the Children's Hospital, 18 in the Lying-in Hospital, 6 in the Immigrants' Home, 9 in the Benevolent Asylum, 5 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 5 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 1 in the Austin Hospital, 3 in the Melbourne Gaol, 2 in the Protestant Refuge, and 1 in the Infant Asylum.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 198, of which 103, or 52 per cent., were of males, and 95, or 48 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 143 were under one year of age, 27 were between one and two, 16 were between two and three, 7 were between three and four, and 5 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 349. Of these, 173, or 50 per cent., were males, and 176, or 50 per cent., were females; 13 were between five and ten, 6 were between ten and fifteen, 13 were between fifteen and twenty, 27 were between twenty and twenty-five, 33 were between twenty-five and thirty, 27 were between thirty and thirty-five, 20 were between thirty-five and forty, 32 were between forty and forty-five, 22 were between forty-five and fifty, 30 were between fifty and fifty-five, 27 were between fifty-five and sixty, 29 were between sixty and sixty-five, 25 were between sixty-five and seventy, 17 were between seventy and seventy-five, 8 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 14 were upwards of eighty.

In the month of May as compared with the previous month, deaths from diphtheria increased from 3 to 7, those from croup from 5 to 7, and those from whooping-cough from 7 to 13. On the other hand, deaths from typhoid fever decreased from 36 to 30, and those from dysentery and diarrhoea from 41 to 28. Deaths of childbearing women were unusually frequent during the month, no fewer than 10 having been set down, viz.:—4 from metria or puerperal fever, and 6 from other circumstances attendant on childbirth. As the registered births numbered 997, 1 death of a mother occurred to every 100 children born alive.

SHIRE OF ST. ARNAUD.

PROPOSED SEVERANCE OF AREA AND CONSTITUTION OF NEW SHIRE.

IN pursuance of the provisions of *The Local Government Act 1874* (No. 506, sec. 46), the substance and prayer of a Petition, in accordance with the 44th section of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, are published, viz. :—

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the rate-payers in the portion of the Shire of St. Arnaud, which is described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the Shire of St. Arnaud and constituted a new shire, under the name or title of "The Shire of St. Arnaud South, and that such shire be subdivided into three ridings, namely the East, West, and South Riding.

Area described in the petition :—Commencing at a point on the western bank of the Avoca River, which point is identical with the north-east angle of a 102nd section reserve east of and separated by a road from allotment 66, parish of Coonoor West; thence west three hundred and thirty-eight chains twelve links, more or less; thence south eight chains eighty-five links, more or less; thence south 89° 57' west eighty-five chains twenty-eight links, more or less; thence north 0° 02' east four chains fifty-two links; thence north 82° 20' west one hundred and seventy-six chains sixty-nine links, more or less, to the north-west angle of the parish of Coonoor West; thence by the western boundary of said parish bearing south 7° 39' west three hundred and sixty-two chains sixteen links, more or less; thence by the northern boundary of the parish of Swanwater bearing north 89° 28' west two hundred and seventy-four chains forty-eight links, more or less; thence north 0° 38' east twenty-six chains fifty links, more or less; thence north 89° 24' west one hundred and fifty-seven chains forty-three links, more or less; thence crossing the St. Arnaud and Donald Railway line to the north-east angle of allotment 3, parish of Swanwater; thence north 89° 56' west forty-five chains nineteen links; thence west one hundred and ninety-nine chains sixty-five links, more or less; to the east bank of the Avon River; thence by said bank of river to the south-west angle of allotment 1, parish of Banyenns; thence east three hundred and forty-two chains thirty-nine links; thence south one chain; thence east three chains; to the north-west angle of Korokubal township reserve; thence south by the western boundary of that reserve sixty-eight chains fifteen links; thence south twenty chains to the south-west angle of allotment 33A, parish of Marnoo; thence east one hundred and two chains fifty-five links, more or less; thence east one chain; thence south to the intersection of road from Wallaloo pre-emptive section to the township of Navarre; thence by said road to the north-west angle of allotment 191A, parish of Navarre; thence south nineteen chains, more or less; thence two hundred and forty chains, more or less, to the south-east angle of allotment 179, parish of Navarre; thence by a line bearing magnetic east to the Avoca River; thence by the western bank of said river north to point of commencement.

Petitioners state that the meetings of the Council are held at Donald to their great disadvantage, entailing upon them great expense and inconvenience in having to travel long distances to attend the meetings in supporting applications that arise from time to time; and for the same reason they are not locally represented; that in August the Council intend to ask for a re-sub-division of the shire, and that such subdivision will be an additional disadvantage to them; that the proposed new shire has an area of 2,305,280 acres of the rateable value of £114,447.

They therefore pray that the area above described may be constituted a separate municipality of three ridings, and that the number of the councillors be nine (9).

ANNEX TO CONTRACT NO. 193.

FITTINGS AND CONNEXIONS FOR THE DIAMOND DRILLS.

1. The contractor must provide all necessary tools and labor, and also all material where so specified in the Schedule, for fully completing all work which may be ordered, and he shall deliver such work at the nearest railway station, or at any other place not exceeding a distance of one mile from his workshop, which may be indicated by the officer in charge. Each delivery must be accompanied by an invoice or delivery note in duplicate. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods shall have been approved of by the officer in charge.

2. The contractor will be required to furnish in duplicate any accounts he may have against the Mining Department in the prescribed form, monthly, accompanied by the orders for the goods, and receipts from the persons for whose use the same have been supplied.

3. The contract will be for such articles or repairs as may be ordered from the 1st July 1884 to the 30th June 1885, whether such articles or repairs are set forth in this Schedule or not. All material and workmanship in connexion with this contract are to be of the very best description, and to be to the entire satisfaction of any officer who may be authorized by the Minister of Mines or Secretary for Mines and Water Supply to act on behalf of the Department of Mines in connexion with this contract, and such officer (herein designated the officer in charge) shall have full power to reject any articles he may deem to be not satisfactory or not in every way suitable.

4. When any order shall have been given to the contractor, he must use every despatch in getting the work done; if he do not, or if the work or material be not to the entire satisfaction of the officer in charge, it shall be optional with such officer in charge to cancel such order and get the work required done wherever he shall think fit at the contractor's risk and expense; and any extra expense so incurred over the contract price will be deducted from any moneys due to the contractor. The officer in charge shall be the sole judge as to whether the contractor is using all necessary despatch in getting the work done, and as to whether the work or material is of the very best description. On the contractor receiving any machinery or tool for repairs or otherwise from any of the drills, or from any other source, he must, in every case, send a receipt for the same to the officer in charge.

5. When any work is ordered that is not enumerated in the Schedule, the contractor must give his price in writing for the same before commencing it, and if the price shall appear to be excessive to the officer in charge, such officer shall be at liberty to get prices from other persons, and get the work done by whomsoever he may think fit, without in any way infringing this contract.

6. The screw-threads exceeding one inch in diameter (except bolts and nuts) are most of them flat (not V) threads. The Department will lend the gauge-taps and nuts to the contractor for fourteen days, when the contractor must return them to the Department, having first made gauge-taps and dies for his own use. The Department will require the contractor to make standard gauges for all necessary work. These gauges must be properly stamped, and will be the property of the Government. They will be paid for at prices to be agreed on. The contractor must also make duplicate gauges for his own use and at his own expense.

7. When goods shall be ordered of a size not exceeding one-eighth of an inch over the sizes mentioned in the Schedule, the price for such goods shall not be more than that quoted in the Schedule. In cases, however, where the size required shall be more than one-eighth of an inch over the sizes mentioned in the Schedule, the price specified in the Schedule for the next larger size will be paid to the contractor.

8. It will be competent for the Secretary to the Tender Board on behalf of the Government, or the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving, in writing, a notice of two months.

9. It will also be competent for any company or companies renting, using, or employing any of the drills belonging to the Department of Mines, to exercise, on behalf of the Department of Mines, or on their own behalf, all the rights, powers, and

privileges conferred by the foregoing clauses, save and except clause 8, which will only vest in the parties named therein. All orders for goods and repairs must be given by the officer in charge.

10. The Secretary for Mines shall from time to time communicate, in writing, to the contractor the name of the company or companies authorized to exercise such rights, powers, and privileges, and the contractor will not be required to acknowledge any other company or companies than those so named by the Secretary for Mines.

11. Any company or companies having authority to order and receive supplies under this contract shall pay to the contractor the cost of such supplies before obtaining delivery thereof, and the accounts, in such cases, are not to be rendered to the Department of Mines, but to the company or companies direct.

WHEREAS by *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881* power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make regulations and orders for prescribing the form of and the conditions and mode of applying for leases to be issued under the provisions thereof, and the conditions under which the same may be issued: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice of

the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations with reference to the granting of pumping leases, viz.:-

1. Every applicant shall publish in a newspaper circulating in the district or nearest to the district in which the land for which he desires to obtain a lease is situate a notice of his intention to make such application, and such notice shall contain full particulars with respect to the situation of the land for which the applicant desires a lease, and the term for which the lease is required; and such notice shall bear date the day of its first publication as aforesaid, and shall appear in six consecutive issues of such newspaper.

2. Within fourteen days from and inclusive of the date of such notice as aforesaid, the applicant shall forward to the Minister for the time being administering the Act his application in writing, with a copy of the advertisement referred to in the preceding clause, and a reference to the names and dates of each of the newspapers in which the said advertisement has appeared.

3. Every application shall be accompanied by a report of a mining or authorized surveyor, together with a plan showing by metes and bounds the land for which a lease is desired.

4. A notice that such application has been made shall be given by the applicant to the council of the municipal district within which the land applied for is situate.

5. The area to be granted under the lease shall in no case exceed in extent three acres.

6. Any person or persons desirous of objecting to the issue of any such lease shall send written notice of his or their objections and of the grounds thereof to the Minister within thirty days after the first publication in the local newspaper of the notice referred to in clause 1 of these regulations.

7. Every application for a lease, and all objections thereto (if any), shall be considered by the Minister, who may as he shall see fit recommend the Governor in Council either to grant or refuse a lease of the land applied for.

8. The lease to be granted in pursuance of the determination of the Governor in Council shall not be issued until after the expiration of one month from the time of a notice of the intention to grant the same shall have been published in the *Government Gazette* and in some newspaper circulating in the district within which the land sought to be leased shall be situate.

9. Every such lease shall be subject to such covenants and conditions, and to the payment of such yearly rent, not being less than £5, as the Governor in Council shall see fit to impose.

10. The applicant, before executing the lease, shall pay to the receiver of revenue for the district in which the land is situate the sum of £1 as a fee for the preparation of the lease.
