PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir WILLIAM FOSTER STAWELL, Knight, the Chief Justice of the Colony of Victoria, and Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Licensing Act 1876* (No. 566, section 44) it was amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding the provisions thereinbefore contained, it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim any place or district a place or district where, owing to a sudden increase of population or otherwise, the necessity for the immediate grant of publicans' licenses exists, to be a place or district wherein publicans' licenses might be specially granted, and from time to time to revoke any such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim

WAIMAKARIRI RIVER, EAST COAST, MIDDLE ISLAND.

THE Waimakariri Harbor Board report that there is 10 feet of water on the bar at high-water neap, and about 11 feet 6 inches at high-water spring tides; also that the flagstaff has been removed about three-quarters of a mile down the river, and now stands on the South Spit, at the mouth of the river, exactly opposite the entrance. On it are shown the bar and tidal signals, as provided in the New Zealand Harbor Regulations, attention to which while crossing the bar is necessary. The channel up the river is now marked by buoys instead of stakes; red to be kept on the starboard and black on the port hand.

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir WILLIAM FOSTER STAWELL, Knight, the Chief Justice of the Colony of Victoria, and Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

7. No person, except the officer or servant of the Trust duly authorized in that behalf, shall be allowed to shut off and turn on water in the main-pipes of the Trust when required for the purpose of affixing service-pipes thereto.

8. All water-troughs must be fitted with approved self-acting taps, to prevent overflow.

9. All boilers or hot-water apparatus must be supplied from cisterns, as in no case will they be permitted to be fed directly from the pipes.

10. In every bath the inlets must be distinct from and unconnected with the outlet, and the inlet-pipes must be visible and accessible, and be attached to the bath above the bottom thereof; and such bath shall be provided with a proper, well-fitted, and properly watertight ground outlet-plug or cock. Overflow-pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

11. Water-closets must not be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than two gallons can escape at each flush.

12. Any person supplied by water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

13. If any person shall waste water by neglecting to repair any pipe-service conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Council that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, in such manner as it may deem fit, until the necessary repairs have been effected.

14. The water supplied shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with the regulations and bye-laws of the Trust, and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, fixed, placed, and being under and in accordance with the same regulations and bye-laws, and not otherwise.

15. The fire-plugs shall not be used except for the purpose of extinguishing fires, unless any other use of them is allowed, in writing, by the Trust; and they shall at all times be under the control of the officers of the Trust.

16. In the foregoing regulations whenever the words "officer," "person," or "servant" occur, the same shall be deemed and be taken to be an officer or servant of the Trust duly authorized on that behalf.

The foregoing regulation, numbered four, was made by the Commissioners of the Romsey Shire Waterworks Trust, under and by virtue of section 44 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881*, this first day of February 1884.

REGULATION.

THE Commissioners of the Shire of Stawell Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 44 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881*, do make the following Regulation:—

No. 5.

Regulation for imposing charges, and for the prevention and remedying of the waste, undue consumption, fouling, or contamination of water contained in or supplied from the following works, that is to say:—

Tank on allotment 138, Marnoo; tank on allotment 39, Wallaloo; tank on allotment 63, Wallaloo; tank on allotment 88, Wallaloo; tank on allotment 101, Bolangum; tank near Batcock's selection, Morri Morri; and tank at Warngar.

I. Every person using or carrying away water from either of the said tanks shall pay therefor, to any person duly appointed by the Commissioners of the Shire of Stawell Waterworks Trust, and duly authorized to demand the same, the fees hereinafter specified:—

1. For one hogshead of water taken away in any one day, Sixpence.
2. For every hogshead of water after the first hogshead, taken away in any one day, One shilling.
3. For each head of cattle brought to water at any one time, Threepence.

II. No person shall permit, allow, or cause to enter within the fence enclosing the water in the said reserves any cattle, goats, pigs, geese, or other animals without the written authority of the Commissioners or their officer duly appointed.

III. No person shall climb or jump over or break or otherwise damage the fence or gates of the said reserves, or break or otherwise damage the pumps and troughs attached thereto.

IV. Every person committing a breach of this regulation shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

The foregoing regulation, numbered five, was made by the Commissioners of the Shire of Stawell Waterworks Trust, under and by virtue of section 44 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881*, this sixth day of May 1884.
