TRESPASSING ON VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

THE Body Corporate of the Victorian Railways Commissioners doth hereby authorize and appoint the person named and described in the schedule hereto annexed as its agent and officer for the purposes hereinafter mentioned, that is to say :—

Under the 128th section of *The Public Works Statute 1865*, to seize and detain any person trespassing on any line of State Railway or on any State Railway premises, whose name and residence shall be unknown to such agent, and to give such person in charge to a police constable, whose duty it is to bring the offender before a justice, and also to lay any information or complaint before any justice against such offender, and charge him with an offence against the 155th section of *The Public Works Statute 1865*.

Also to lay any information or complaint before any justice against any person for any offence against the 155th section of *The Public Works Statute 1865*, and to summons such person before a justice and charge him with such offence, and to impound all "cattle" (which word shall here bear the same interpretation as given to it by the Act No. 478), and also to destroy all goats, pigs, and geese found trespassing on any railway now vested or hereafter to be vested in the Commissioners.

This authority is not to supersede any authority for the like purpose heretofore made and given by the Commissioners.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir WILLIAM FOSTER STAWELL, Knight, the Chief Justice of the Colony of Victoria, and Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Licensing Act 1876* (No. 566, section 44) it was amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding the provisions thereinbefore contained, it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim any place or district a place or district where, owing to a sudden increase of population or otherwise, the necessity for the immediate grant of publicans' licenses exists, to be a place or district wherein publicans' licenses might be specially granted, and from time to time to revoke any such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim

AN AREA OF HALF-A-MILE RADIUS AROUND THE RAILWAY STATION AT GLENLOTH to be a district wherein publicans' licenses may be specially granted under the provisions of the 44th Section of the said Act.

YARRAWONGA PUBLIC PARK.—REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE PUBLIC PARK IN THE TOWN OF YARRAWONGA.

WE, James Reilly, John Joseph Reilly, John Davis, John Murray Gorman, John Mitchell, Charles Joseph Wallace, and John Cornelius Caffin, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Public Park in the town of Yarrawonga having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*.

REGULATIONS.

- The park shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset.
- No person shall enter or remain in the park who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, flowers, fences, gates, or erections, or put offensive matter in the lagoons or waterholes in the park, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
- No person shall deposit rubbish, manure, or other offensive matter in any part of the park, except under the direction of the committee of management.
- No person shall clamber over the gates or fences, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or in any way damage the same, nor roll or throw stones in the park, nor discharge firearms therein.

6. No person shall put in the park any cattle, goats, or pigs without the permission in writing of the committee of management.

7. No person shall bring any dog into the park unless led by a chain or cord.

8. No person shall engage in any game or sport in the park on Sunday.

9. No person shall erect any building in the park, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent in writing of the committee of management; and any person who may have obtained such consent shall be bound by any order made by the committee of management in regard thereto.

10. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the park, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

11. The committee of management may allow any part of the park to be depastured by quiet cattle or horses.

12. Any person committing in the park, or in any buildings or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences shall be liable to be removed from the park:—

- Assaulting any other person.
- Being drunk.
- Using profane, indecent, or abusive language.
- Using threatening, abusive, or insulting words.
- Behaving improperly or riotously.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and

who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.
2. Order for interment must be given to the person in charge of the cemetery five hours previous to interment.
3. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased must be stated at the time of giving the order.
4. The procession to arrive at the cemetery punctually at the hour appointed for the funeral.
5. The charge will be remitted for the burial of any person on evidence being produced before two of the trustees that the relatives or friends of such person are unable to pay the cost and charges, except the cost of digging the grave.
6. Application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery to be made to the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to persons applying.
7. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but when a brick grave or vault is required, it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees or some person duly appointed by them; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault belonging to another person, the consent, in writing, of such person must be left with the order.
8. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences to be kept in repair and proper condition, at the expense of the owner.
9. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, or covered with a slab of freestone, granite, slate, or iron.
10. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and a plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who may withhold permission and prevent the erection of any monument which shall appear to them inappropriate or unbecoming, and shall determine and fix the position of any monument which may be proposed to be erected according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner. In the erection of tablets, copper cramps must be used.
11. Wooden fences allowed, but if not kept in proper repair, may be removed by order of the trustees, without notice to the owner.
12. A plan of the cemetery and a registry will be kept, and may be inspected at the office of the secretary.
13. It is notified that any person or persons wantonly or wilfully destroying or doing, or causing to be done, any damage to any monument, tombstone, vault, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree or plant in the cemetery is guilty of a misdemeanor, and being convicted thereof, is liable to be punished as prescribed by the Act in that case made and provided.
14. No grave to be of less depth than six feet, except in cases of still-born children, three feet.
15. Family vaults to be limited to ten feet frontage, by a depth of eight or sixteen feet.
16. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these Regulations.
