THE Body Corporate of the Victorian Railways Commissioners doth hereby authorize and appoint each and every of the persons named and described in the schedule hereto annexed as its agent and officer for the purposes hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

In pursuance of the 128th section of The Public Works Statute 1865, to seize and detain any person who shall have committed an offence against the provisions of Part III. of the said Statute, and whose name or residence shall be unknown to such officer or agent, and to give such person in charge to a police constable, whose duty it is to bring the offender before a justice, and also at any time hereafter to lay any information or complaint before any justice against any person for any offence against the provisions of Part III. of The Public Works Statute 1865, or of any bye-law made or to be made under the authority of such Act, or of such Act and The Victorian Railways Commissioners Act 1883; and to summon such person before any justice or justices for such offence, or to charge him or her with such offence.

This authority is not to supersede any authority for the like purpose heretofore made and given by the Commissioners.

In cases where Effective Allowance is payable to Officers Commanding Detachments, Two-and-a-half per cent. will be deducted from the amount of such allowance and paid to the Officer Commanding the Brigade or Battalion, to enable him to meet the expenses incidental to the administration of his command. Officers Commanding Brigades or Rattalions will keep an account of all such money received by them, and at the close of each financial year any balance remaining unexpended will be divided among the several batteries or companies of their command in proportion to the amount received on account of each. WE, John Symonds, William Segrave, James Kennedy, Richard Larker, and Stanley Stowell Kennon, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Recreation, Racecourse, and affording Access to Water in the parish of Flinders, at Flinders, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of The Land Act 1869.

#### REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to

2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage, in any way, the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs, without first obtaining permission, in writing, from the committee of management.

6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the committee of management.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth, or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, nor shall offer for sale any article without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.

8. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of The Land Act 1809, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £15 for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

Joseph Stead, William John Mountain, Henry Dodds, Matthias Larkin, Samuel Row, Albert George Major, Edward Drinkall Heather, the duly appointed Committee of Management of that portion of Albert Park permissively occupied by the South Melbourne Cricket Club, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management of such portion of the said Park, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of The Land Act 1869.

#### REGULATIONS.

1. Such portion (hereinafter designated the South Melbourne Cricket Ground) of the Albert Park shall be divided as fol-

(1.) The grand stand, pavillion, members' and ladies'

(1.) The grand stand, pavillion, members' and ladies' reserves.

(2.) The playing ground.

(3.) The remainder of the ground.

2. All persons shall be admitted to the third division, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except on days whereon international, intercolonial, cup, and other important cricket or football matches shall be played, or on days on which sports shall be held in the South Melbourne Cricket Ground.

3. No person shall enter at any time into any part of the first division except on production of a ticket issued by the committee of management duly authorizing such person in that behalf.

4. All persons paying for admission to the third division, or any part of it, or to the grand stand, shall be supplied with a ticket of admission, which they shall, upon demand, produce; and, if required, surrender to any gatekeeper or other person having authority from the committee of management to demand the production or surrender of same; and no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the day for which it is issued.

5. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, crection, or

5. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure for the occasion of any cricket or football match, or other sports, may be required to deposit any sum, not exceeding Ten pounds, which the committee of management may determine, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such strud, building, crection, or enclosure; and the committee of management may make repairs or make good any damage or loss sustained by such stand, building, crection or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by any person by way of guarantee; and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the committee of management in reference to the reserves, buildings, erections, or enclosures for the time being thereon. the time being thereon.

11. No person shall erect any dwelling in the South Melbourne Cricket Ground, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management having been first obtained.

12. No person, except workmen employed in the South Melbourne Cricket Ground, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for the plantation of young trees or shrubs.

13. Any person committing in the South Melbourne Cricket Ground, or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences, may be removed therefrom, notwithstanding such person may have purchased, and shall or may be in possession of a ticket of admission to the South Melbourne Cricket Ground, or any part thereof:

(a) Being drupt, or using any profang indecent or obscene

(a) Being drunk, or using any profane, indecent, or obscene language.

(b) Assaulting any person, making use of any abusive, threatening or insulting expressions, or behaving in an improper or rictous manner.

(c) Crossing or trespassing upon the playing ground during a cricket or football match, or sports, or during practice at cricket or football match, or sports, or during practice at cricket or football match to respect to the ground would be injurious to it as a cricket ground.

(d) Being found in any part of the 1st, 2nd, or 3rd divisions of the South Melbourne Cricket Ground and not producing on demand, or surrendering, if required, to any gatekeeper or other person duly authorized to demand the production or surrender thereof, a ticket duly authorizing the admission of such person to the part wherein he or she may be found, unless such person shall forthwith satisfy the committee of management, or any person deputed by them, that he or she has paid the proper charge for admission to such part, and that the ticket of admission supplied to such person has been lost. has been lost.

(e) Obtaining admission to any part of the first, second, or third divisions when not entitled to such admission under these regulations.

14. The maximum scale of charges for admission to the third division and grand stand shall be as follows:—

(a) For admission of each person to the third division during any international, intercolonial, cup, or other important cricket or football match, or sports, such a sum as the committee of management may determine, not exceeding

(b) For admission of each person to the grand stand, such a sum as the committee of management may determine, not exceeding 5s.

Provided that the committee of management may exempt any person wholly or partially from the payment of all or any such

charges or fees.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of The Land Act 1809, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a baillift of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailliff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.
