TRESPASSING ON VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

**T**HE Body Corporate of the Victorian Railways Commissioners doth hereby authorize and appoint the person named and described in the schedule hereto annexed as its agent and officer for the purposes hereinafter mentioned, that is to say :—

Under the 128th section of *The Public Works Statute 1865*, to seize and detain any person trespassing on any line of State Railway or on any State Railway premises, whose name and residence shall be unknown to such agent, and to give such person in charge to a police constable, whose duty it is to bring the offender before a justice, and also to lay any information or complaint before any justice against such offender, and charge him with an offence against the 155th section of *The Public Works Statute 1865*.

Also to lay any information or complaint before any justice against any person for any offence against the 155th section of *The Public Works Statute 1865*, and to summons such person before a justice and charge him with such offence, and to impound all "cattle" (which word shall here bear the same interpretation as given to it by the Act No. 478), and also to destroy all goats, pigs, and geese found trespassing on any railway now vested or hereafter to be vested in the Commissioners.

This authority is not to supersede any authority for the like purpose heretofore made and given by the Commissioners.

MINING OPERATIONS ON CERTAIN CROWN LANDS, ETC., IN THE TOWNSHIP OF GRANT.

THE Governor in Council has cancelled the Order of the 13th November 1883, granting permission to Hans C. Jorgenson to mine on certain land in the township of Grant, county of Dargo, and has granted permission to F. A. Siedenburgh, of Grant, to prospect for a quartz reef by virtue of his miner's right on the unoccupied and unused road, the Police Reserve, and the unsold Crown lands particularly described in the Schedule hereto, subject to the following conditions:—

The Minister of Mines or any person authorized by him in writing shall have power at any time to order the immediate discontinuance of any mining or prospecting operations within the area referred to.

WHEREAS by the 108th section of *The Land Act 1869*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make and alter or rescind rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby rescind the Regulation made by such Board on the 2nd day of October 1880, in respect of the Dandenong and the Attenborough Parks.

## REGULATIONS FOR COMMONS.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations for the undermentioned Commons.

## SHIRE OF BUNINYONG.

Regulations for Management of the undermentioned Commons in the Shire of Buninyong:—

THE CLARENDON AND BUNINYONG UNITED TOWN AND FARMERS' COMMON,  
THE HARDIE'S HILL FARMERS' COMMON, and  
THE CARDIGAN FARMERS' COMMON.

In pursuance of the regulations relating to Commons, made by the Governor in Council on 1st April 1879, the Council of the Shire of Buninyong having drafted the following Regulations for management of the above-named commons, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the Regulations heretofore in force in respect of such Commons.

## Regulations.

- In the construction and for the purposes of these regulations the words "large cattle" shall mean cows, heifers, oxen, steers, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, and mules, and the words "small cattle" shall mean sheep and goats.
- Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, carriers' licenses, and farmers may respectively depasture on the common within a distance of five (5) miles from their places of residence, four (4) head of "large cattle," or the equivalent of the whole, or a portion thereof in "small cattle," on the basis that one head of "large cattle" be deemed equivalent to three (3) head of small cattle. A farmer, having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him, may depasture on such common one (1) additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten (10) acres of such land cultivated by him.
- The fees for depasturing stock on the commons shall be as follow, and shall be payable quarterly in advance, on the first day of January, the first day of April, the first day of July, and the first day of October in every year:—  
For every horse, Six shillings per annum.  
For every head of other large cattle, Four shillings per annum.  
For every head of small cattle, One shilling and sixpence per annum.  
Progeny under nine (9) months old, of stock legally depasturing on the commons, free.
- Stock placed on the commons at any intermediate date shall be paid for as if depasturing thereon at the commencement of the period.
- The herdsmen shall report immediately on the slightest indication of disease in any stock on the commons to the managers, and likewise to the owner, and the managers by the herdsmen shall at once take steps to remove them from the commons, the owner or owners of such stock to be allowed to substitute sound stock in their place, but no fees will be returned, and the managers will not be responsible for any loss the owners of such diseased stock may suffer.
- No stock shall be removed from the commons without in the first instance communicating with the herdsmen, except milking cows, or working bullocks, in which cases the herdsmen shall use every care, but shall not be held responsible for them.
- No entire horse, bull, ram, or he-goat shall be allowed to depasture on the commons, without the consent, in writing, of the managers first obtained.
- The herdsman shall assist the owners of stock, depasturing on the common under his charge, to separate any that they may require to remove, and shall use all vigilance and care to prevent or extinguish bush fires. In the event of cows calving on the commons, or of any beast being found thereon dead or injured the herdsmen shall give notice thereof to the owner, if known, as soon as practicable.
- The herdsmen shall register the permanent brands of, or brand with the common brand all stock depasturing on the commons, on payment of the prescribed fees. All stock not registered or branded with the common brand shall be deemed to be trespassing on the commons.

10. When the owners of stock depasturing on the commons refuse or neglect to pay the prescribed fees within twenty-one days from the date on which they may be due, and payment of which shall have been demanded, such stock shall be liable to be impounded.

11. The herdsman of any of the commons who through neglect or otherwise, permits any stock in his charge to stray therefrom must bring the same back, and if impounded release the same at his own expense; and if such stock be lost through the negligence or default of the herdsman, he shall be held responsible for the value thereof, such value not to exceed three (£3) pounds for horned cattle, and five (£5) pounds for horses.

12. Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained the managers shall not be responsible for any loss of or injury to any stock depasturing on the commons.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty (£20) pounds for each offence.

## DANDENONG AND ATTENBOROUGH PARKS.

Regulations for the care, protection, and management of Dandenong and Attenborough Parks, within the Shire of Dandenong.

WE, the Council of the Shire of Dandenong, the duly appointed Committee of Management of Dandenong and Attenborough Parks, within the Shire of Dandenong, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*.

## REGULATIONS.

- The parks shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
- No person shall enter or remain in either of the parks who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- No person shall damage in any way the tree, trees, shrubs, or flowers in the parks.
- No fires shall be lit in either of the parks without the consent in writing of the committee of management.
- No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or otherwise damage same, or roll or throw stones, or leave bottles or broken glass in either of the parks.
- No person shall put into either of the parks any cattle, horses, goats, pigs, or other animals without the authority in writing of the committee of management.
- No person shall erect in either of the parks any booth or other structure for habitation, nor offer for sale therein any article without the consent in writing of the committee of management.
- No person shall take into Dandenong Park any vehicle, horse, or other animal without the consent in writing of the committee of management.
- No person shall displace or remove any of the soil in either of the parks.
- No person, except laborers or workmen employed in either of the parks, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
- No person shall discharge any firearms in either of the parks.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 (Five pounds) for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10 (Ten pounds.)

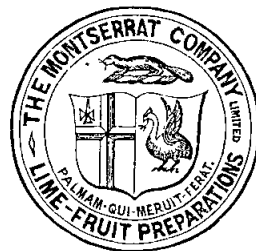
