WHEREAS by *The Discipline Act 1870* it was provided that the Governor in Council might make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government of persons engaged by virtue of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out the said Act, and from time to time amend, alter, or amend the same and substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following alterations and additions to the Regulations for the Victorian Military Forces, that is to say:—

The births of 1,119 children, viz., 577 boys and 542 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of September. In the month of August 1,035 births were registered, or 84 fewer than in the month under review. The births were 327 above the average of the previous ten years, but only 188 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in September numbered 481, viz., 267 of males, and 214 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 638. The deaths were fewer than those in August by 176, but exceeded the average of September during the previous ten years by 88. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded that average by only 19.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was 3.47, and of deaths registered 1.49.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 75.0° on the 4th, and the lowest was 40.0° on the 6th. The mean temperature of the month (53.9°) was rather more than half a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (25.4°) took place on the 3rd, viz., from a maximum of 69.1° to a minimum of 43.7°. The least range (5.8°) was on the 27th, viz., from a maximum of 52.8° to a minimum of 47.0°. The mean daily range was 13.8°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.412 inches on the 15th, and the lowest was 29.290 inches on the 26th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.997) was slightly above the average.

Rain fell on 14 days, the amount of rainfall being 3.935 inches.

Males contributed 56 per cent., and females 44 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 27 per cent. to that mortality, as against 38 per cent. in September 1884; 32 per cent. in September 1883; 33 per cent. in September 1882; 28 per cent. in September 1881; 36 per cent. in September 1880; 31 per cent. in September 1879; 30 per cent. in September 1878; 38 per cent. in September 1877; 28 per cent. in September 1876; and 35 per cent. in September 1875.

The deaths of twenty-eight persons who had attained or passed the age of 75 years were recorded during the month, viz.:—Those of a carpenter, aged 75, who died of influenza; a bootmaker, aged 75, of cancer of the stomach; a cabinetmaker, aged 75, of dyspepsia; a female, aged 79, of diarrhoea; a female, aged 80 of paralysis; a ship's carpenter, aged 75, and a male, of occupation unknown, aged 83 (patients of the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum), also a dealer, aged 79, of brain disease; a laborer (an inmate of the Benevolent Asylum), aged 82, of heart disease; a gardener and a female, each aged 76, a gentleman, aged 79, a female (an inmate of the Blind Asylum), aged 82, a female (an inmate of the Benevolent Asylum), aged 83, and a female, aged 87, of bronchitis; a cheesemonger and a brewer, each aged 77, a laborer, aged 78, a farmer, aged 82, of pneumonia; a painter (an inmate of the Benevolent Asylum), aged 83, of congestion of the lungs; a female, aged 87, of fracture of the femur; a laborer (an inmate of the Immigrants' Home), aged 77, a gentleman, aged 81, a carpenter, aged 82, a female, aged 85, and a shepherd, aged 89 (the last two being inmates of the Benevolent Asylum), two females, each aged 84, and a female, aged 86, of old age.



Twenty-one deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which 15 were set down to accident, 1 to homicide, and 5 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A boy, aged 5, was killed by a fall down a shaft; a commission agent, aged 34, by a fall down a lift; a farmer, aged 65, died of dislocation of the spine, caused by a fall from a horse; a drill-instructor, aged 29, of internal injuries, received whilst riding a bucking horse; a female, aged 32, was passed over by a train; a female, aged 87, died of intracapsular fracture of femur (cause not stated); a female infant, aged 4 months, of tetanus following vaccination; a baker, aged 14, of tetanus resulting from an injury to the knee received whilst alighting from a cart; 2 females, aged 21 and 54 respectively, of burns; a male infant, aged 21 days, of the poisonous effects of croton oil administered by mistake; a boy, aged 4, was drowned in a quarry hole; a male infant was suffocated at birth; a male and a female infant, each aged 1 month, were overlain. The homicidal death was that of a male infant, who was suffocated at birth—verdict, wilful murder. Of the suicidal deaths, a barber, aged 24, and a farmer, aged 47, drowned themselves; 2 laborers, aged 23 and 52 respectively, and a farmer, aged 57, hanged themselves.

One hundred and thirteen deaths, or 23 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—48 in the Melbourne Hospital, 12 in the Alfred Hospital, 1 in the Children's Hospital, 6 in the Lying-in Hospital, 7 in the Immigrants' Home, 10 in the Benevolent Asylum, 9 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 10 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 5 in the Austin Hospital, 2 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Blind Asylum, 1 in the Protestant Refuge, and 1 in the Infant Asylum.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 130, of which 84, or 65 per cent., were of males, and 46, or 35 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 97 were under one year of age, 12 were between one and two, 10 were between two and three, 3 were between three and four, and 8 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 351. Of these, 183, or 52 per cent., were males, and 168, or 48 per cent., were females; 19 were between five and ten, 5 were between ten and fifteen, 13 were between fifteen and twenty, 22 were between twenty and twenty-five, 28 were between twenty-five and thirty, 26 were between thirty and thirty-five, 22 were between thirty-five and forty, 23 were between forty and forty-five, 31 were between forty-five and fifty, 25 were between fifty and fifty-five, 33 were between fifty-five and sixty, 27 were between sixty and sixty-five, 30 were between sixty-five and seventy, 18 were between seventy and seventy-five, 13 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 16 were upwards of eighty.

As compared with the previous month a decrease of deaths took place under all classes of diseases, but principally under the constitutional and local classes, the falling off being from 111 to 79 and from 377 to 264 respectively. Under the former head deaths from cancer fell from 16 to 12, and deaths from phthisis from 73 to 52. Of deaths resulting from the local class of diseases, those from heart affections fell from 45 to 25, those from bronchitis from 59 to 23, those from pleurisy from 18 to 7, those from pneumonia from 95 to 60, and those from congestion of the lungs from 16 to 5. Only 1 death was set down to influenza, as against 3 deaths in August and 3 deaths in July. The mortality among childbearing women was very high in the month under notice, as many as 13 mothers having died during or shortly after parturition: although the number of births, viz., 1,119, was the highest ever yet recorded in any month, the large proportion took place of 1 death of a mother to every 86 children born alive.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act Amendment Act 1883* (47 Vict. No. 786) it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might make orders altering, for the purpose of adjustment, the boundaries of continuous municipal districts or subdivisions without any petition: And whereas it has been deemed expedient to adjust the continuous boundaries of the Shires of Kowree, Lowan, and Wimmera: Now therefore the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby alter and adjust the boundaries of the said Shires of Kowree, Lowan, and Wimmera, and doth re-define the boundaries of the said shires in manner following, that is to say:—

THE KOWREE SHIRE RE-DEFINED.

Commencing at a point on the western boundary of the colony, being the north-western corner of the parish of Neuarpur; thence east along the northern boundary lines of that parish and the parishes of Booroopki and Morea to the north-west corner of the parish of Dopewarra; thence south along the western boundary of that parish to the north boundary of the Ozenkadnook pre-emptive; thence east to and by the road on the southern boundary of same parish to a point where that road intersects the western boundary of the parish of Charam; thence north along the western boundary of that parish to its north-western corner, a distance of about fifty chains twenty-five links, and thence still further north in same straight line about four miles four chains seventy-one links to a point which intersects the one-chain road on the northern boundary line of a public reserve and allotments Nos. 1, 5, 7, 7A, and 9A, in the parish of Karnak; thence east along that road to a point where it intersects the eastern boundary of the parish of Karnak and the western boundary of the parish of Kalingur, being a point where the shires of Wimmera, Lowan, and Kowree meet; thence south along the western boundary of last-named parish to the north boundary of the parish of Turandurey; thence east by the north and south by the east boundaries of that parish to the south-east corner thereof; thence east by the northern boundaries of the parishes of Toolongrook and Toolondo to the north-east angle of the last-named parish; thence south by the eastern boundary of said parish to the south-east angle thereof; thence east by the north boundary of the parish of Daahl to the river Glenelg; thence southerly and westerly by that river and the boundaries between the counties of Lowan and Follet to the western boundary of the colony; and thence northerly by the boundary between Victoria and South Australia to the point of commencement.

THE SHIRE OF LOWAN RE-DEFINED.

Commencing at a point on the western boundary of the colony at the north-west angle of the parish of Neuarpur; thence east by the south boundary of the Shire of Swan Hill to a point true north of the north-east angle of the parish of Yanac-a-Yanac; thence due south towards that angle until the boundary between the counties of Weeah and Lowan is intersected; thence due east by that boundary, being the north boundaries of Mallee allotments 70, 71, 72, 73, 74, and 75, to the north-east angle of the allotment last named; thence south by the east boundary of said allotment to the north-west angle of allotment 81; thence east by the north and south by the east boundary of said allotment to the north-west angle of the parish of Ni Ni; thence further south by the east boundary of that parish to the north boundary of the parish of Kiata; thence west by part of the north, south by the west, and east by part of the south boundaries of the parish of Kiata to the north-west angle of the parish of Woraigworm; thence south by the west boundaries of that parish and of Mallee allotment 21 to the south-west angle of that allotment; thence east by the south boundary of allotments 21, 24, and part of 124 to the intersection with the north-west boundary of the Wyn Wyn Run; thence south-westerly and southerly by the north-western and western boundaries of the Wyn Wyn Run to the south-east angle of Spring Hill Run; thence south-westerly by the south-eastern boundaries of the Sprink Hill Run to the north-west angle of the parish of Toosan; thence south by the west boundary of that parish to the north-east angle of the parish of Kalingur; thence west by the north boundary to the north-west angle of said parish; thence south by the west boundary of said parish to a point on same, east of a road forming the north boundaries of allotments 1, 5, 7, 7A, and 9A, in the parish of Karnak; thence to and by said road and a line in continuation thereof to the western boundary of last named parish; thence southerly by the western boundary of said parish and part of the parish of Charam to the north-east angle of the parish of Awonga; thence westerly by

the northern boundary of that parish and a road and line due west to a point where the north boundary of the Ozenkadnook pre-emptive is intersected by the east boundary of the parish of Morea; thence north by the east boundary of the parish of Morea to the south boundary of the parish of Mortat; thence west by the northern boundaries of the parishes of Morea, Booroopki, and Neuarpur to the commencing point.

THE SHIRE OF WIMMERA RE-DEFINED.

Bounded by a line commencing at the most northern bend of the River Glenelg, county boundary of Lowan; thence south-westerly by said river to a point opposite the north-east angle of the parish of Daahl; thence by the north boundary of that parish to the east boundary of the parish of Toolondo; thence north by the east boundary of that parish and west by the north boundaries of said parish and the parish of Toolongrook to the east boundary of the parish of Turandurey; thence north by the east and west by the north boundaries of said parish to the north-west angle thereof; thence north by the west and east by the north boundaries of the parish of Kalingur to the west boundary of the parish of Toosan; thence north by part of the west boundary of the parish of Toosan to its north-west angle; thence north-easterly by part of the boundary of St. Mary's Lake Run to the Wyn Wyn Run and thence by the western and northern boundaries of Wyn Wyn Run to the Wimmera River; northerly by that river to the south boundary of the parish of Jimboola; east by the boundary of that parish and of the parish of Kewell West to the south-east angle of the latter parish; north by the east boundary of the parishes of Kewell West, Wallup, and Cannun to the north-west angle of the parish of Werrigar; thence east by the north boundary of that parish to the Yarrambiack Creek; thence southerly up that creek to the Wimmera River; thence continuing southerly up that river to a point east of the north boundary of the parish of Ledcourt; thence west by that boundary to the north-west angle of allotment 23; thence south by a one-chain road to its intersection with the two-chain road at the south angle of allotment 191; thence south-westerly by said road to the north-west angle of allotment 212; thence south-easterly by the south-west boundary of the said parish of Ledcourt to a point bearing north-east magnetic from Briggs' Bluff, Grampian Range; thence in a direct line to said bluff, and south along the watershed of the Grampians to the head of the Glenelg River; and thence north-westerly by that river to the commencing point. Excluding the Borough of Horsham.

Wherever the line so described runs beside or along a river, creek, or road, whether such is specifically mentioned or not, the centre of such river, creek, or road shall be the boundary line.

And the Honorable Alfred Deakin, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

“THE EXPLOSIVES ACT 1877.”

EXEMPTION FROM CERTAIN PORTIONS OF THE REGULATIONS FRAMED UNDER “THE EXPLOSIVES ACT 1877.”

THE Governor in Council has exempted the safety powder manufactured by Messrs. William Walker and George Mitchell, Stawell West, from the operation of the following portions of the Regulations framed under *The Explosives Act 1877*, published in the *Government Gazette* of 13th December 1878, No. 127, viz.:—

That portion of clause 4 commencing with the word “other” in the fourth line of the second paragraph and ending with the word “building” in the eighth line thereof;

That portion of clause 8 commencing with the word “and” in the fourth line of the first paragraph and ending with the word “thereof” in the seventh line thereof;

The whole of the first and ninth paragraphs of clause 11; and has made the following

Regulation

to apply only to the safety blasting powder above-mentioned, in lieu of the ninth paragraph of clause 11 aforesaid:—

All carriages used for the conveyance of safety blasting powder shall be of good and substantial make, and shall be so constructed that the explosive conveyed therein shall be properly protected from the weather by fireproof tarpaulins; and such carriages shall have the name of the explosive conveyed therein in plain and conspicuous letters on both sides thereof; and no such carriage shall at any time be used for the conveyance along a public road of a quantity of such explosive exceeding fifteen hundred-weight (15 cwt.).

ORDER.

THE EASTERN RIDING OF THE SHIRE OF WARANGA WATERWORKS TRUST.—LOAN.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-sixth day of October 1885.

WHEREAS by the *Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881* it was amongst other things enacted that, at the expiration of two months after the notice of any application should have been first advertised in the *Government Gazette*, the Minister, if satisfied that the provisions of the now in part recited Act

have been substantially complied with, should submit such application, and the general plan and description therein referred to, and all petitions which have been received in respect of such application, to the Governor in Council, together with any recommendations as to the granting of the application, or as to any alterations or additions he might think desirable in the proposed waterworks: And the Governor in Council might thereupon approve of the construction of such proposed waterworks, with or without any alterations or additions in the general plan and description thereof, or might disapprove of the construction of such waterworks, and should make an Order in Council accordingly: And it was further enacted that, if the Governor in Council should approve of the construction of such waterworks, with or without alterations, or additions, or restrictions of any such general plan and description, a Waterworks Trust should be constituted to construct, maintain, and continue the whole or any part of the waterworks therein described, in accordance with the provisions of such Order and of the now in part recited Act: And every Order approving the construction of any proposed waterworks, and of the constituting of a Waterworks Trust for the purpose, should state—

(a.) The amount of money which the Governor in Council would grant as a loan for the purpose of carrying out the same, and paying the cost and expense of the plans and application for the same; and also the rate of interest which would be charged for such loan, such rate being at least One-half per centum more than the rate payable by the Government on the Public Loan out of which such loan might be granted.

(b.) Should proclaim the limits of the lands, whether within or without the municipal districts of the council or councils applying for the proposed waterworks, within which such trust should have authority, to be called a Waterworks District.

(c.) Should state what are the principal works proposed to be constructed; and

(d.) Should contain such provisions (not inconsistent with the now in part recited Act) as according to the nature of the application and the facts and circumstances of each case the Governor in Council should think fit.

And it was further enacted by the *Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883* that the Governor in Council might, where a Waterworks District is either wholly or with the exception of the waterworks or proposed waterworks thereof within one or more ridings of any municipal district, appoint the councillors for such riding or ridings, together with any other person or persons not exceeding three in number, to be the Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust of such district: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Acts, has approved of a general plan and description as set forth in a certain application of the councillors of the Eastern Riding of the Shire of Waranga for a Loan of Two thousand pounds, to carry out certain waterworks for the domestic supply of a Waterworks District under the said Act, embracing certain land within the said riding as shown on the general plan and description accompanying the said application deposited in the Department of Mines and Water Supply, and doth hereby order and appoint as follows:—

(1.) The construction of the said waterworks as are herein-after described.

(2.) The councillors of the Eastern Riding of the Shire of Waranga, for the time being, and Samuel A. Edmonds, John Buckley, and Frederick I. Young, to be the Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust of such district.

(3.) That the amount of the loan hereby granted shall be Two thousand pounds sterling, for the purpose of carrying out approved works, and paying the cost and expense of the plans and application for the same; and that the interest to be charged for such loan shall be at the rate of Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum, payment of which interest shall be made half-yearly.

(4.) That the limits of the land within which the said Waterworks Trust shall have authority shall be the lands included within the Eastern Riding of the Shire of Waranga, hereinafter described, that is to say: Commencing at the centre of the River Goulburn at a point in a line with the southern boundary of allotment ten, parish of Toolamba; thence west to and along the said boundary of allotment ten and a line produced in the same direction crossing a one and a half-chain road to a point in allotment twenty-five, parish of Toolamba, five hundred links at right angles to the west side of the said road; thence by a line bearing north twenty-four degrees thirty-seven minutes east, passing through the said allotment twenty-five and parallel with the said road to the centre of a three-chain road from Corop to Shepparton; thence by a line bearing north twenty-three minutes west passing through allotments six and seven A, parish of Mooropna, being five hundred links from and parallel to the eastern boundary of the said allotment six to its intersection with the centre line produced of a road between allotments nine, eight, and fifty-nine A, of the same parish; thence by a line bearing north forty-seven degrees nine minutes east to and across a three-chain road and along the centre line of the aforesaid road between allotments nine, eight, and fifty-nine A, to a point in a line with the north-eastern boundary of allotment eight; thence by a line, the eastern boundary of said allotment eight, and a line bearing south forty-two degrees fifty-one minutes east to the centre of the River Goulburn, in the parish of Mooropna; and thence by the centre of the River Goulburn in a general direction south-westerly to a point in a line with the southern boundary of allotment ten, parish of Toolamba, the commencing point aforesaid.

(5.) That the principal works to be constructed shall consist of the following, viz. :-

1. Purchasing plant at present supplying the town of Mooroonpa, including boiler, pump, tank, pipes, &c., complete.
2. Repairs to present plant and overhauling present pipes, &c.
3. New storage tank and connections to same for say 20,000 gallons.
4. Four and a half chains 4-inch cast-iron pipe and laying, including valves, &c., and taking up and relaying same length of 3-inch pipes.
5. One and three-quarter miles 2-inch galvanized-iron pipe, including laying, stop-valves, fire-plugs, and covers for old and new pipes, and all connections.
6. Service connections to main and pipes to building line.

And the Honorable Frederick Thomas Sargood, Her Majesty's Minister of Water Supply for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The deepest water found on the bar was 2½ fathoms, low tide, deepening quickly to 3 and 4 fathoms on each side of the bar, with the following magnetic bearings:—Ninepin Rock N.W. by W, South Head Lighthouse N.E. by N. ¼ N.; and the South Head beacons in line now lead clear of the south part of the Tramer Shoal and the north-west end of the Treachery Shoal, and a full cable clear of the Heron Spit, at which place there were 5 fathoms water, deepening on the same line of bearings, N.E. by N. ¼ N., to 6 and 7 fathoms clear of the outer break on the Middle Bank.

Note.—The south part of the Funna Shoal has grown southward, forming a narrow spit across the original Fanny Channel. The deepest water found there was only 9 feet, low tide. Yet there is less sea there in rough weather than in the South Channel, and can be crossed when the tide is well in. BYE-LAW No. 3.

*A Bye-law, making a rate for water supply purposes, and for regulating the supply and distribution of water from waterworks under the management of the Council.*

**T**HE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Huntly do hereby, pursuant to, and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by "The Local Governing Bodies Loan Act 1872" and "The Local Government Act 1874," Part X., make the following rate for ten years from the date hereof, upon all lands and tenements within the water supply district, that is to say:—

1. That the following rates and charges are those which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Council:—

2. On every house or tenement of the annual value of Twenty pounds or less, the sum of Twenty shillings per annum.

3. On every house or tenement above the annual value of Twenty pounds, in addition to the One pound named in the last clause, a rate of Ninepence per annum for every pound from Twenty pounds and upwards.

*Meters.*

4. The rate or charge for water supplied by meter shall be Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons (1000).

5. The charge for water supplied from the Council stand-pipes shall be Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons.

*General Conditions.*

6. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure, shall be—(1.) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.

7. Any person receiving water from the Council, who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence.

8. Any person, not having agreed to be supplied by the Council, who shall take or carry away from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every offence.

9. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Council, or alter or repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Council, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Council, he shall obtain from the Council a license in that behalf to execute such work; any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds for every offence.

10. Before any license shall be granted by the Council the person applying for same shall satisfy the Council that he is a competent plumber.

11. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall wilfully offend by opening any ground, so as to uncover any pipe or pipes, the property of the Council, without giving 24 hours' notice to the Council of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Council without the permission in writing of the Council being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine, the property of the Council, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

12. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Council without giving 24 hours' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Council, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of some officer of the Council, or who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipe of the Council of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Council, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Council. Iron piping of the following dimensions, namely:—

13. Three-quarter inch diameter or bore, black or galvanized, of approved quality, will only be allowed for external and internal services. Ordinary connections with sub-mains must be made with proper ferrules, to which a length of not less than three feet of pipe must be attached. One service-pipe only to each tenement, &c., will be permitted.

14. If any person shall neglect, after being notified to provide and affix a meter, or to repair any meter or any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Council into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Council that a meter is required to be affixed or repaired, or such service-pipe requires repairing, the Council may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise, as to the said Council may seem fit, or until an approved meter has been affixed or the necessary repairs have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupiers (if any), and, if none, the owner, shall in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair, or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Council.

15. Any person supplied with water by the Council who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Council.

16. The Council may, at any time, if it is thought expedient by the Council, decide that the supply of water to any person or persons shall be by meter; and may, by notice in writing, to be delivered to such person or persons either personally or left on the premises of such person or persons, or sent by the post addressed to the person at the premises, to require him or them within the space of fourteen days from the service of such notice, to provide and affix at his or their own expense, a proper and suitable meter to be approved of by the officer appointed for the carrying out of this Bye-law; and such meter shall be affixed by and kept in repair by such person or persons at his or their expense; and such notice may contain an intimation also that in case of default of compliance therewith the Council may cause the supply of water to be stopped from flowing into the premises of such person or persons, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the said Council may seem fit.

17. No meter shall be allowed to be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering one hundred thousand gallons, and except by special permission of the Council. And the officer appointed by the council shall hold the key of each meter, and are hereby empowered to enter upon the premises at all reasonable times to inspect the meter or meters for the purpose of viewing the state of repair, and of ascertaining the number of gallons of water registered by the meter as used by the consumer.

18. If any meter should cease registering, or be reported by the inspector as out of repair or registering inaccurately, the Council shall estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order, and until it is repaired and refixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter or during the corresponding period of the previous year, or the Council may insert a check-meter on the service-pipe.

19. Overflow-pipes to private baths or any other vessel will not be permitted.

20. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, connecting any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam-boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first fixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Council.

21. In the construction of this bye-law the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation whether aggregate or sole.
