Mr. H. Moon, master of the English schooner Irry, reports a depth of 12 fathoms to the northward of Soembawa, lat. 7° 38′ 30″ S., long. 118° 14′ 55″ E., whilst the bottom was visible.

SOENDA STRAIT.

The commander of H.N.M. surveying vessel Blommendal reports a small patch of 4½ fathoms, stone and coral, at low-water in the position, marked with ripplings on the chart "Reede van Nieuw Anjer."

On the east side of the reef from 6 to 9 fathoms gradually are obtained for a distance of 110 yards; the other sides are steep-to. When the current runs from 1 to 2 miles an hour, the reef is marked by very strong ripplings, and sometimes by discolored water.

The 3-fathom reef, marked on the chart "Straat Soenda en Z. W. gedie, Java zee," W.S.W. ½ W. (true), distant about 1 mile of P. Tampozo, has been unsuccessfully searched for. It is removed from the chart.

WHEREAS by The Discipline Act 1870 it was provided that the Governor in Council might make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government of persons engaged by virtue of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out the said Act, and from time to time annul. alter, or amend the same and substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order make the following additions to the Regulations for the Victorian Military Forces, that is to say:—

Part 3, section 1, subsection "Conditions of Syntiae", after

Part 3, section 1, sub-section "Conditions of Service"—after the paragraph ending with "above conditions," the following is ordered to be inserted:—

Boys may be engaged in the Victorian Artillery for the purpose of being trained as trumpeters, but not more than two to be on the establishment at the same time. The boys to be included in the establishment of gunners, and to receive pay at the rate of 2s. per diem.

Part 3, section 1, sub-section "Working Pay"—after the words "Working pay shall not be issued to soldiers employed on fatigue duty," the following paragraph is ordered to be inserted:—Keeping the terreplein of a battery in military charge neat and in ordinary repair (mowing the grass excepted) will be considered as fatigue duty, and working pay will not be allowed.

And the Honorable Frederick Thomas Sargood, Her Majesty's Minister of Defence for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by The Local Government Act Amendment Act 1883 (47 Vict. No. 786) it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might make orders altering, for the purpose of adjustment, the boundaries of conterminous municipal districts or subdivisions without any petition: And whereas it has been deemed expedient to adjust the conterminous boundaries of the Shires of Kowree, Lowan, and Winmera: Now therefore the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby alter and adjust the boundaries of the said Shires of Kowree, Lowan, and Winmera, and doth re-define the boundaries of the said shires in manner following, that is to say:—

#### THE KOWREE SHIRE RE-DEFINED.

Commencing at a point on the western boundary of the colony, being the north-western corner of the parish of Neuarpur; thence east along the northern boundary lines of that parish and the parishes of Booroopki and Morea to the north-west corner of the parishes of Booroopki and Morea to the north-west corner of the parish of Dopewarra; thence south along the western boundary of that parish to the north boundary of the Ozenkadnook premptive; thence east to and by the road on the southern boundary of same parish to a point where that road intersects the western boundary of the parish of Charam; thence north along the western boundary of that parish to its north-western corner, a distance of about fifty chains twenty-five links, and thence still further north in same straight line about four miles four chains seventy-one links to a point which intersects the one-chain road on the northern boundary line of a public reserve and allotments Nos. 1, 5, 7, 7A, and 9A, in the parish of Karnak; thence east along that road to a point where it intersects the eastern boundary of the parish of Karnak and the western boundary of the parish of Karnak and the western boundary of the parish to the north boundary of the parish of Turandurey; thence east by the north and south by the east boundaries

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given or before the ground or earth is opened.

- 2. Orders for interment must be given at the office of the trustees during the day previous to that on which it is intended to take place.
- 3. All persons making a vault or erecting a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees and upon payment of the proper charges, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, tomostone, or monument, according to the terms of such permisson, to and for the sole use of such person and his or her representatives for ever.
- 4. Application for such permission to be made at the office of the trustees, a certificate of such permission will be granted on payment of proper charges.
- 5. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery upon an order signed by a justice of the peace or a certificate of a minister of religion, or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the justices that such person was a

pauper or that the friends or relatives of the deceased are unable to pay the charges.

6. The name, age, place of residence, and the probable cause of death of the deceased must be stated at the time of giving the order.

7. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

8. The time fixed will be from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. in the months from September to April, and from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. the remaining part of the year.

 All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owner.

10. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab or stone or iron.

11. A plan of the cemetery showing the situation of the purchased land and other graves and register of all grants will be kept at the office of the secretary, where they may be inspected.

12. The trustees reserve to themselves the right to make any alterations, from time to time, in the regulations. No fencing to be erected until approved of by the trustees. No drays, 'busses, or conveyances will be allowed to enter the cemetery.

Bye-law No. 1 under "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883." IN pursuance of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and of every other power enabling them in that behalf, the Local Board of Health for the Borough

of Clines, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within its jurisdiction, doth hereby make the bye-law following, that is to say:—

1. Interpretation of terms.—All former bye-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed. In the construction and for the purposes of this bye-law, the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned

"House" shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed public-houses, factories, work-rooms, common or other lodging-houses, or other buildings or

- common or other lodging-houses, or other buildings or premises.

  "Cesspool" shall mean any receptacle for night-soil or for noxious or offensive matter below or above the ground.

  "Street" shall mean and include any highway, and any public bridge, and any road, lane, footway, square, court, afley, or pussage, whether a thorough fare or not.

  2. Premises to be kept so as not to be a nuisance.—Every occupier or person having the management or control of any house or premises shall cause the same to be kept in such a state as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

  3. Remard of refuse from house.—Every occupier of a house
- 3. Removal of refuse from houses.—Every occupier of a house or premises shall remove therefrom all dust, mud, aslies, rubbish, filth, or such other refuse matter produced or accumulated thereon once every week; and in case of the default of such occupier, the Local Board of Health may remove the

- such occupier, the Local Board of Health may remove the same.

  4. Receptacles for house refuse.—Every occupier of a house or premises shall provide and keep thereon a box or some other covered receptacle for the temporary deposit of house refuse, which box or receptacle shall be of such dimensions as that the same may, with the contents thereof, when full, he readily and conveniently removable by one man, or so many such boxes or receptacles as may be necessary to contain all the house refuse produced or accumulated on such premises during one week; and shall cause all house refuse to be deposited as soon as conveniently may be in some such box or receptacle.

  5. Removal of refuse from places where animals are kept.—Every occupier of land on which is erected any stable, shed, sty, yard, or other place for the keeping of animals shall from time to time remove from such premises all dung, soil, or other manure produced or accumulated thereon as often as the same shall amount to two cubic yards; and in case of the default of such occupier, the Local Board may remove the same.

  6. Power to use refuse as manure.—Nothing contained in the fotegoing section of this bye-law shall be taken to prevent the occupier of any premises from causing any dung, soil, or other refuse matter produced or accumulated on any premises to be at any time removed, or to be used as manure on any garden or land, or to be kept for the purpose of being used on any garden or land, or to be kept for the purpose of being used on any garden or land contiguous to such premises as manure, so that the same be not so removed, kept, or used as to contravene my bye-law of the Local Board of Health, or so as to be a musance or injurious to health.

- 7. Remoral of refuse from places where noxious or offensive trades are carried on.—Every occupier and every person having the management or control of premises used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, or manufactory whatsoever shall cause all rubbish, filth, offal, soil, or other offensive matters, and all waste products of such manufacture from which effluvia may arise, to be removed from such premises once at least in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and so that no noxious or offensive effluvia arise therefrom; and if any such occupier or person shall neglect or fail to have removed any such offensive matter or waste products as aforesaid, the same may be removed by the Local Board of Health.
- 8. Remoral of blood from places where animals are sloughtered.—
  Every occupier, licensec, or person having the management or control of an abattoir, slaughter-house, or place where any cattle or other animals are killed, shall cause all the blood from the animals killed therein, as soon as conveniently may be, to be collected in a fit receptacle to be provided for that purpose, and to be effectually deodorized by mixing therewith commercial sulphate of iron or chloride of lime in the proportion of 1 lb. to the gallon, or some other efficient deodorizer sufficient to effectually deodorize the same, and to be removed from the premises within twenty-four hours after such blood is shed.
- 9. Removal of offal.—Every occupier of any premises on which may be any offal shall forthwith effectually deodorize the same, and remove the same from the premises within
- twenty-four hours.

  10. Construction of primies.—No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy, except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than 3 inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be provided with a suitable pan or other movable receptacle for night-soil, the contents whereof does not exceed two cubic feet, and with the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptacle and the contents thereof, and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, workroom, or common lodging-house, and every public privy, shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material, having a fall or inclination towards the door or other opening of at least half-an-inch to the foot.

  11. Supply of deodorizing material to earth-closets.—Every

Supply of deodorizing material to earth-closets.—Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth-closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.
- 12. Emptying receptacles for night-toil.—Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises once at least in every week shall empty or cleanse, or cause to be emptied or cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.
- 18. Removal of night-soil to be by properly constructed conveyances.

  —No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, for the purpose, except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents or of any portion thereof, or of cfluvia therefrom.
- 14. Howes within which night-soil may be removed.—No person shall cupty, assist in emptying, or cause or permit to be emptied any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, except between the hours of eleven p.m. and five a.m., or until the contents thereof have been properly deodorized; and every person emptying or causing to be emptied any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil shall cause the night-soil taken therefrom to be removed so soon as the same is emptied.
- 15. Disposal of refuse and offensive matter.—No person shall place or deposit any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil, or any night-soil or other offensive matter, in any place so as to be a nuisance to any person or injurious to health.
