WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the twenty-seventh year of Her Majesty's reign, intitled *The Weights and Measures Statute 1864*, it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, at the request of, and pursuant to any agreement made by, the councils or boards of any two or more of any adjoining boroughs, shires, and road districts, might proclaim such boroughs, shires, and districts to be an "Union" for the purposes of the said Act, and by such Proclamation fix the proportion in which the expenses devolving upon such Union under the said Act should be borne by the several bodies corporate of such boroughs, shires, or districts: And whereas the Councils of the Shires of Bairnsdale, Maffra, Rosedale, Avon, and Traralgon, and the Council of the Borough of Sale, have requested that the shires and borough named may be proclaimed an Union, and that the expenses devolving upon such Union may be borne in the proportion of eight-thirtieths by the Shire of Bairnsdale, six-thirtieths by the Shire of Maffra, six-thirtieths by the Shire of Rosedale, four-thirtieths by the Shire of Avon, three-thirtieths by the Shire of Traralgon, and three-thirtieths by the Borough of Sale: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do proclaim the Shires of Bairnsdale, Maffra, Rosedale, Avon, and Traralgon, and the Borough of Sale, to be an Union for the purposes of the said Act, and do fix the proportion in which the expenses devolving upon such Union under the said Act shall be borne, viz. :—Eight-thirtieths by the Shire of Bairnsdale, six-thirtieths by the Shire of Maffra, six-thirtieths by the Shire of Rosedale, four-thirtieths by the Shire of Avon, three-thirtieths by the Shire of Traralgon, and three-thirtieths by the Borough of Sale.

REGULATIONS FOR THE OPEN COMPETITION OF JUNE 1886.

N.B.—The Regulations are liable to be altered in future years.

1. On the 1st June 1886, and following days, an examination, open to all qualified persons, will be held in London.¹ Not fewer than persons will be selected, if so many shall be found duly qualified, viz.:—
for the Lower Provinces of Bengal (including Assam);
for the Upper Provinces of Bengal (including the Punjab and Oudh);
for Burma;
for Madras; and for Bombay.²

2. No person will be deemed qualified who shall not satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners:—

(i.) That he is a natural-born subject of Her Majesty.

(ii.) That his age will be above seventeen years and under nineteen years on the 1st January 1886. [N.B.—In the case of natives of India this must be certified by the Government of India or of the Presidency or Province in which the candidate may have resided.]

(iii.) That he has no disease, constitutional affection, or bodily infirmity unfitting him, or likely to unfit him, for the Civil Service of India.

(iv.) That he is of good moral character.

3. Should the evidence upon the above points be *prima facie* satisfactory to the Civil Service Commissioners, the candidate, on payment of the prescribed fee,³ will be admitted to the examination. The Commissioners may, however, in their discretion, at any time prior to the grant of the certificate of qualification hereinafter referred to, institute such further inquiries as they may deem necessary; and if the result of such inquiries, in the case of any candidate, should be unsatisfactory to them in any of the above respects, he will be ineligible for admission to the Civil Service of India; and if already selected will be removed from the position of a Probationer.

4. The examination will take place only in the following branches of knowledge:—

Candidates are at liberty to name any or all of these branches of knowledge. No subjects are obligatory.

5. The merit of the persons examined will be estimated by marks; and the number set opposite to each branch in the preceding regulation denotes the greatest number of marks that can be obtained in respect of it.

¹ An order for admission to the examination will be sent to each candidate on the 18th of May.

² The numbers will be announced hereafter.

³ The fee (£5) will be payable by means of a special stamp, according to instructions which will be communicated to candidates.

⁴ A considerable portion of the marks for English History and Literature will be allotted to the work selected by the candidate. (See notice respecting the examination in the History of England and English Literature.) In awarding marks for this, regard will be had partly to the extent and importance of the periods or books selected, but chiefly to the thoroughness with which they have been studied.

⁵ The examination will range from Arithmetic, Algebra, and Elementary Geometry, up to the elements of the differential and integral calculus, including the lower portions of applied Mathematics.

⁶ The standard of marking in Sanskrit and Arabic will be determined with reference to a high degree of proficiency, such as may be expected to be reached by a native of good education.

6. The marks assigned to candidates in each branch will be subject to such deduction as the Civil Service Commissioners may deem necessary,⁷ in order to secure that "a candidate be allowed no credit at all for taking up a subject in which he is a mere stammerer."

7. The examination will be conducted on paper and *visà voce*, as may be deemed necessary.

8. The marks obtained by each candidate, in respect of each of the subjects in which he shall have been examined, will be added up, and the names of the several candidates who shall have obtained, after the deduction above mentioned, a greater aggregate number of marks than any of the remaining candidates, will be set forth in order of merit, and such candidates shall be deemed to be selected candidates for the Civil Service of India, provided they appear to be in other respects duly qualified. Should any of the selected candidates become disqualified, the Secretary of State for India will determine whether the vacancy thus created shall be filled up or not. In the former case, the candidate next in order of merit, and in other respects duly qualified, shall be deemed to be a selected candidate. A selected candidate declining to accept the appointment which may be offered to him will be disqualified for any subsequent competition.

9. Selected candidates, before proceeding to India, will be on probation for two years, during which time they will be examined periodically, with a view of testing their progress in the following subjects:—

In these examinations, as in the open competition, the merit of the candidates examined will be estimated by marks, and the number set opposite to each subject denotes the greatest number of marks that can be obtained in respect of it at any one examination. The examination will be conducted on paper and *visà voce*, as may be deemed necessary. The last of these examinations will be held at the close of the second year of probation, and will be called the "Final Examination," at which it will be decided whether a selected candidate is qualified for the Civil Service of India. At this examination candidates will be permitted to take up any one of the following branches of Natural Science, viz.:—Agricultural Chemistry, Botany, Geology, or Zoology, for which 350 marks will be allowed.

10. Candidates will be tested during their probation as to their ability to perform journeys on horseback; and no candidate will be deemed qualified for the Civil Service of India who fails to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners of his competence in this respect.

11. Any candidate who, at any of the periodical examinations, shall appear to have wilfully neglected his studies, or to be physically incapacitated for pursuing the prescribed course of training, will be liable to have his name removed from the list of selected candidates.

12. The selected candidates who, at the final examination, shall be found to have a competent knowledge of the subjects specified in Regulation 9, and who shall have satisfied the Civil Service Commissioners of their eligibility in respect of nationality, age, health, character, and ability to ride, shall be certified by the said Commissioners to be entitled to be appointed to the Civil Service of India, provided they shall comply with the regulations in force at the time for that service.

13. Persons desirous to be admitted as candidates must apply on forms which may be obtained from "The Secretary, Civil Service Commission, London, S.W.," at any time after the 1st December 1885. The forms must be returned so as to be received at the office of the Civil Service Commissioners on or before 31st March 1886.⁸

The Civil Service Commissioners are authorized by the Secretary of State for India in Council to make the following announcements:—

1. Selected candidates will be permitted to choose, according to the order in which they stand in the list resulting from the open competition, so long as a choice remains, the Presidency (and in Bengal the Division of the Presidency) to which they shall be appointed; but this choice will be subject to a different arrangement should the Secretary of State, or the Government of India, deem it necessary.⁹

2. The probationers, having passed the necessary examinations, will be required to report their arrival in India within such period after the grant of their certificate of qualification as the Secretary of State may in each case direct.

3. The seniority in the Civil Service of India of the selected candidates shall be determined according to the order in which they stand on the list resulting from the final examination.

⁷ Marks assigned in English Composition and Mathematics will be subject to no deduction.

⁸ Full instructions as to the course of study to be pursued will be issued to the successful candidates as soon as possible after the result of the open competition is declared.

⁹ These forms should be accompanied by evidence on the points mentioned in Regulation 2, and by a list of the subjects in which the candidate desires to be examined. Evidence of health and character must bear date not earlier than 1st March 1886. Applications for leave to alter or add to the list of subjects named will not be entertained unless received on or before the 4th of May.

¹⁰ This choice must be exercised immediately after the result of the open competition is announced, on such day as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.

4. An allowance amounting to £300 will be given to all candidates who pass their probation at one of the universities or colleges which have been approved by the Secretary of State, viz.:—The Universities of Oxford, Cambridge, Dublin, Glasgow, Edinburgh, St. Andrew's, and Aberdeen; University College, London; and King's College, London; provided such candidates shall have passed the required examinations to the satisfaction of the Civil Service Commissioners, and shall have complied with such rules as may be laid down for the guidance of selected candidates.

Candidates are not permitted to migrate from the university originally chosen by them to another university without first applying to the India Office for the permission and receiving the sanction of the Secretary of State, who will not entertain such applications unless good and sufficient reasons are assigned.

5. Selected candidates desiring to remain in this country an additional year after the completion of their two years' probation for the purpose of taking a degree at one of the universities above-mentioned should apply to the Secretary of State for India for permission to do so. Besides the allowances above-mentioned, a bonus of £150 will, as a temporary and experimental measure, be paid to any candidate who, having obtained permission to remain an additional year, passes an examination qualifying for a degree in honors at Oxford or Cambridge, or being a student of University College, London, passes with credit an honor examination of the University of London. This privilege will be hereafter extended to any other of the universities above referred to, at which an academical distinction is obtainable which, in the opinion of the Secretary of State, corresponds to a degree in honors at Oxford or Cambridge, and to obtain which the additional year's residence in this country is necessary.

6. All selected candidates will be required, after having passed the first periodical examination, and before receiving the first instalment of their allowance, to attend at the India Office, for the purpose of entering into an agreement binding themselves, amongst other things, to refund in certain cases the amount of their allowance in the event of their failing to proceed to India. A surety will be required.

7. After passing the final examination, each candidate will be required to attend again at the India Office, with the view of entering into covenants by which, amongst other things, they will bind themselves to agree to such regulations for the provision of pensions for their families as may be approved by the Secretary of State for India in Council. The stamps payable on these covenants amount to £1.

8. Candidates rejected at the final examination of 1888 will in no case be allowed to present themselves for re-examination.

*** EVIDENCE OF AGE TO BE REQUIRED FROM CANDIDATES FOR THE CIVIL SERVICE OF INDIA.**

I. Every candidate born in the United Kingdom should produce a certificate from the Registrar-General of Births, Marriages, and Deaths, or from one of his provincial officers. This certificate may be obtained from the Registrar-General in London, Dublin, or Edinburgh, or from the superintendent registrar of the district in which the birth took place.

II. A candidate born of European parents in India may produce a certificate of baptism from the district in which he was baptized. When such certificates are not in the possession of the candidates an extract from the registers kept at the India Office will probably be obtainable.

III. A candidate who is a native of India must have his age certified by the Government of India, or of the presidency or province in which he may have resided.

Except as noted in paragraphs II. and III., every candidate is expected to produce a certificate of birth. The Civil Service Commissioners will not in ordinary cases accept a certificate of baptism, or other testimony, unless they are first satisfied that a certificate of birth cannot be procured.

Official certificates of birth may generally be obtained as follows:—

(a.) *For persons born in England or Wales since 30th June 1837.*—From the Registrar-General, Somerset House, London, or from the superintendent registrar of the district in which the birth took place.

(b.) *For persons born in Scotland since 31st December 1854.*—From the General Register Office, Edinburgh; or from the registrar of the parish or district in which the birth took place.

(c.) *For persons born in Ireland since 31st December 1863.*—From the General Register Office, Dublin; or from the superintendent registrar of the district in which the birth took place.

(d.) *For persons of English, Scottish, or Irish parentage born on board British ships since the dates mentioned in (a), (b), and (c) respectively.*—From the General Register Office, London, Edinburgh, or Dublin, according to parentage.

(e.) *For persons born in India of European parents.*—From the India Office, London.

Any candidate who cannot produce a certificate of birth from one of the authorities named should, if possible, procure a certificate of baptism, and should then apply to the Secretary, Civil Service Commission, for further instructions.

No. 506, secs. 19-20) it was enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might make orders exercising certain powers therein set forth, amongst others to sever any portion of Victoria forming part of a municipal district from such municipal district, and annex the same to any other municipal district with which the portion so severed forms one continuous area, and from time to time make any appointment of property, rights, and liabilities, and give any directions as to any matters and things that might be necessary to do justice as between the municipalities concerned: And it was further enacted that, where, in consequence of the exercise of any of the powers contained in the above in part recited section, any rights, liabilities, or matters require to be adjusted, the Governor in Council might by any Order settle and adjust the same: And whereas the Governor in Council, by an Order made on the fourteenth day of May 1884, severed a certain area from the Shire of Portland and annexed the same to the Shire of Glenelg, and in consequence of such severance it has become necessary to adjust the accounts between the said shires: And whereas such adjustment has been made, and the matters have been duly considered: Now therefore I, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby order and direct the Council of the said Shire of Glenelg to pay to the said Council of the Shire of Portland the sum of One hundred pounds sterling in full settlement of all demands as and between the said Shires of Portland and Glenelg consequent upon making the Order of the fourteenth day of May 1884 aforesaid.

And the Honorable Alfred Deakin, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH OF THE CITY OF RICHMOND.

BYE-LAW No. 12.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883" and of every other power enabling them in that behalf, the Local Board of Health for the city of Richmond, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within its jurisdiction, doth hereby make the bye-law following, that is to say:—

1. *Repeal of former bye-laws.*—The bye-laws numbered 1 to 11 inclusive made by the Local Board of Health for the borough of Richmond, on the 14th day of July 1870, under the "Amending Public Health Statute 1867," are hereby repealed.

2. *Interpretation of terms.*—In the construction and for the purposes of this bye-law, the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them:—

"*House*" shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed public-houses, factories, work-rooms, common or other lodging houses, or other buildings or premises.

"*Street*" shall mean and include any highway and any public bridge, and any road, lane, footway, square, court, alley, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not.

"*Local board*" shall mean the Local Board of Health for the city of Richmond.

3. *Premises to be kept so as not to be a nuisance.*—The occupier or person having the management or control of any house or premises within the city of Richmond, shall cause the same to be kept in such a state as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

4. *Receptacles for house refuse.*—The occupier of any house or premises within the city of Richmond shall provide and keep thereon a box or some other covered receptacle for the temporary deposit of house refuse, or so many of such boxes or receptacles as may be necessary to contain such refuse during one week, and shall cause such refuse to be placed in such box or receptacle as soon as reasonably can be. Every such box or receptacle shall be of such dimensions as that the same and the contents thereof, when full, shall not exceed 56 pounds in weight,

and can be readily and conveniently moved and emptied by one man. In order that the contents of every such box or receptacle may be conveniently removed by the public scavengers or other person or persons authorized or appointed by the Local Board to remove the same, the occupier of such house or premises shall cause every such box or receptacle to be placed in the yard of such house or premises, and close to the entrance thereof, or in the street, lane, or right-of-way contiguous to such house or premises, on such days and at such hours as shall be specified in any notice to that effect to be given by the Local Board or the contractors for the work.

5. *Refuse where animals are kept.*—The occupier of any land or premises within the city of Richmond, on which is erected any stable, shed, yard, or other place whatsoever for the keeping of animals, shall from time to time remove from such premises all dung, soil, or other manure produced or accumulated thereon as often as the same shall amount to two cubic yards.

6. *Use of refuse as manure.*—Nothing contained in this bye-law shall be taken to prevent the occupier or person having the management or control of any premises from causing any dung, soil, or other refuse matter produced or accumulated on any premises to be at any time removed, or to be used as manure on any garden or land, or to be kept for the purpose of being so used, so that the same be not so removed, kept, or used as to contravene any bye-law of the Local Board, or to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

7. *Refuse where noxious or offensive trades are carried on.*—The occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, or manufactory whatsoever shall cause all rubbish, filth, offal, bones, liquids, soil, or other offensive matter, and all waste products of such manufacture from which effluvia may arise, to be removed from such premises once at least in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and so that no noxious or offensive effluvia shall arise therefrom.

8. *Deodorizing and removal of offal.*—The occupier or person having the management or control of any premises on which may be any offal, blood, or other refuse matter shall forthwith effectually deodorize the same, and remove the same from the premises within twenty-four hours.

9. *Privies, earth-closets, cesspools, &c.*—No person shall construct or erect, or cause to be constructed or erected, any privy, except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than three inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be provided with a suitable pan or other removable receptacle for night-soil, the content whereof does not exceed two cubic feet, and shall be so constructed and placed as to be watertight and easy of access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptacle and the emptying and cleansing thereof. Every privy attached to any house, and every public privy, shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material having a fall or inclination towards the door or other opening of at least an inch to the foot. No privy, earth-closet, or cesspool shall hereafter be erected or placed in front of any dwelling-house, or at a less distance than four feet from any public highway which has been kerbed and the footpaths thereof formed, or from the door or window of any dwelling, nor at a less distance than two feet from any dividing fence.

10. The occupier and every person having the management or control of any house or premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or receptacle in such earth-closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or receptacle.

11. The occupier and every person having the management or control of any house or premises whereon or belonging to which there is any cesspool below the surface of the ground for the reception of night-soil shall cause the same to be emptied, from time to time, as soon as any portion of the contents thereof shall have accumulated therein to within the distance of one foot from the top of the walls, sides, or lining of such cesspool.

12. The occupier and every person having the management or control of any house or premises shall once at least in every week empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied and cleansed, every privy, earth-closet, pan, or receptacle for night-soil (other than a cesspool below the surface of the ground) on or belonging to such house or premises.

13. No person shall for hire or reward empty any privy, earth-closet, cesspool, pan, or receptacle for night-soil, unless duly licensed.

14. No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any privy, earth-closet, cesspool, pan, or receptacle for night-soil, except by means of a cart, carriage, or other conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents, or any portion thereof, or any effluvia therefrom.

15. No person shall empty, assist in emptying, or cause or permit to be emptied, any privy, earth-closet, cesspool, pan, or receptacle for night-soil, except between the hours of eleven o'clock post-meridian on any day and six o'clock ante-meridian of the next day, nor until the contents thereof shall have been properly deodorized with some efficient deodorizer; and every person emptying, or causing to be emptied, any privy, earth-closet, cesspool, pan, or receptacle for night-soil, shall remove, or cause to be removed, the night-soil taken therefrom so soon as the same is emptied.

16. Every cesspool or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse or offensive matter, shall be furnished with a watertight cover or roof, and every cesspool which shall be formed or made below the surface of the ground shall be constructed with water-tight walls or sides which project on all sides at least six inches above the surface of the ground.

17. The occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises on which there shall be any cesspool or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse or offensive matter, shall cause the same to be emptied once at least in every week.

18. No person shall empty or assist in emptying, or cause or permit to be emptied, any cesspool or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse or offensive matter, except between the hours of eleven o'clock p.m. on any day and six o'clock a.m. of the next day, nor until the contents thereof shall have been properly deodorized with some efficient deodorizer; and every person emptying, or causing to be emptied, any such cesspool or place shall remove, or cause to be removed, the contents thereof so soon as the same is emptied.

19. No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any cesspool, or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse or offensive matter, except by means of a cart, carriage, or other conveyance, properly constructed, and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents, or any portion thereof, or of any effluvia therefrom.

20. *Disposal of refuse and offensive matter.*—No person shall place or deposit, or cause or permit to be placed or deposited, any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, soil, night-soil, or other offensive matter, in or on any street, nor in any place so as to be a nuisance to any person or injurious to health.

21. *Closets, cesspools, &c., not to be emptied into drains, sewers, or waters.*—No person shall empty, or cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter into any drain or sewer, or so that the contents thereof may find its way or be likely to find its way into any drain or sewer, nor into any water supplied, used or likely to be used, by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, or so that the contents, or any portion of the contents, thereof may find its way or be likely to find its way into any such water.

22. *Night-soil, &c., deposited anywhere to be covered with earth.*—Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited, or assisting in placing or depositing, on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter, removed from any privy, earth-closet, cesspool, or other place, shall immediately on the deposit thereof cover the same or cause the same to be covered and shall keep the same covered with a layer of earth not less than six inches in thickness.

23. *Keeping of animals.*—No person shall keep any animal of any kind so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

24. *Drainage of buildings.*—Every person erecting, or causing to be erected, any new building shall cause the foundations thereof, and the ground over which such building is to be placed, to be rendered dry, sound, and well drained, so that no water soakage or damp shall lodge there.

25. Every owner of a building shall cause the same to be provided with proper and sufficient drains, so constructed as to prevent any nuisance arising therefrom, and to secure the healthfulness of the inmates of such building; and every tenant of a building under a lease of which fourteen years or upwards is unexpired, shall be deemed an owner within the meaning of this section.

26. *Cowkeepers, dairymen, &c.*—Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, shall, on or before the first day of January in every year, register himself with the Local Board in manner following, that is to say:—By signing and forwarding to the secretary of the Local Board an application in the following form, and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of 20s.

Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the secretary for the Local Board shall endorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

27. Every person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman shall cause every dairy, milk store, or milk shop in his occupation, or under his management or control, to be properly lighted, ventilated, and drained, and every milk vessel used by him for containing milk for sale to be kept thoroughly clean. And no such person shall set up or keep, or permit to be set up or kept,

any milk for sale in any room used as a dwelling or sleeping-room. Every such person shall sweep and cleanse his premises daily, and shall cause all animal excreta and filthy matter therein to be collected and placed where least offensive, and removed from the premises weekly at furthest, and he shall in the months of April and October in every year specially cleanse, in the following manner, the premises wherein he shall keep any cow, that is to say:—All dung, litter, and other matter, shall be removed therefrom, and the doors, stalls, and woodwork thoroughly washed with water. Thereafter a coating of lime-wash, made up by mixing freshly-burned lime with water each gallon of lime-wash containing one-fifth of a pint of carbolic acid or four ounces of fresh dry chloride of lime, shall be applied to the walls, floors, ceilings, and every other part of the premises with which animals or their excreta have come in contact. Neither he nor any person under his direction or control, whilst suffering from any infectious or contagious disease or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, shall milk any cow or handle any vessel used in his business for containing milk, nor in any way take part or assist in the conduct of the business of dairymen, as far as regards the extraction, distribution, or storage of the milk, until all danger of the communication of infection to the milk or of contamination thereof shall have ceased and he shall have furnished satisfactory certificate to the health officer that such danger no longer exists; and he shall not mix the milk of a diseased cow with other milk, and shall not sell or use the same for human food or food for any other animal.

28. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, and every person having the management of any such trade, shall forthwith report in writing to the health officer the occurrence of any disease in any of his milk cows, or of any contagious or infectious disease in man or animal upon the premises upon which such trade is carried on.

29. *Penalties.*—Every person who shall commit any breach of any of this bye-law shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceed £10, or to a penalty not exceeding £5 for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued. Provided that the justices before whom any penalty imposed hereby is sought to be recovered may order the whole or part only (not being less than Five shillings) of such penalty to be paid. And every person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the foregoing penalty, notwithstanding that the Local Board may be empowered by this bye-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether the Local Board have or have not taken advantage of such powers.

30. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the City of Richmond.
