NEW GUINEA PROTECTORATE.-SPECIAL COMMISSIONER.

HE accompanying despatch from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, notifying the appointment of Major-General Scratchley, R.E., C.M.G., as Her Majesty's Special Commissioner for the New Guinea Protectorate, and enclosing a copy of the instructions issued to Major-General Scratchley, is published for general information.

In my despatch of the 15th ultimo I informed you that Her Majesty's Government had decided to take certain steps for the establishment of The Queen's Protectorate over the South-East Coast of New Guinea and sundry adjacent islands.

I have now the honor to acquaint you that Her Majesty has approved the appointment of Major-General Scratchley, K.E., C.M.G., as Special Commissioner to exercise Her authority within the protected area; and I enclose herewith, for your information and for communication to your Government, a copy of the instructions which have been given to this officer.

I have requested General Scratchley to communicate, on his arrival in Australia, with the Governments of as many of the Colonies as he may be able to visit before his departure for New Guinea, which of course cannot be long delayed; and it is desirable that he should ascertain, at as early a date as possible, what provision the Colonies are disposed to make for carrying on the Protectorate after June next.

You are aware that steps have been taken to proclaim Her Majesty's Protectorate and Jurisdiction over the Southern Shore of New Guinea and the country adjacent thereto, from the 141st meridian of east longitude castwards as far as East Cape, including any islands adjacent to the main land in Goschen Straits, and to the southward of the said straits as far south and east as to include Kosman Island.

2. I am now directed by the Earl of Derby to inform you that Her Majesty has been pleased to appoint you to be Her Special Commissioner to exercise Her authority within this Protectorate, and that the necessary Commission will shortly be transmitted to you.

3. Until Her Majesty shall be pleased to make further provision for administering law in the Protectorate, that territory, as well as all other parts of New Guinea up to the 143° east longitude, remain under the operation of the Western Pacific Orders in Council; it is therefore necessary that you should be enabled to exercise the authority which is vested by those Orders in the No. 11.-January 30, 1885,-1.

Deputies of the High Commissioner, and Sir William Dos Vœux has been instructed to forward to the care of the Governor of New South Wales an instrument appointing you to be a Deputy Commissioner. As it is proposed to place a steamer at your disposal for the duties of the Protectorate, you will have more ready means of access to the islands near New Guinea than are at the command of the High Commissioner, and it has accordingly been decided that your powers as Deputy Commissioner shall extend to the islands lying to the north of latitude 15 south and to the west of longitude 160 cast, and for so much of the Solomon Islands as lies beyond those limits. Copies of the Western Pacific Orders in Council of 1877, 1879, and 1880 are forwarded herewith.

4. You will, however, be independent of the High Commissioner in respect to the Protectorate, and will correspond direct with the Secretary of State for the Colonies. As regards matters occurring beyond the Protectorate but within the limits assigned to you as Deputy Commissioner, you will act on your own discretion, without referring to the High Commissioner for instructions; but you should, as far as practicable, inform him of your proceedings.

5. The Australian Colonies have agreed to provide £15,000 during the year ending — June 1885 for the expenses of the Protectorate, and upon your arrival in Australia you will ascertain, by communication with the several Governments, whether the Colonies will provide in subsequent years a sum adequate to the due maintenance of the Protectorate, as it is clearly understood that the Protectorate is established at the desire of the Colonies, and is not to be a source of expense to this country. You will therefore fully understand that you are not to contemplate or to incur any expense in New Guinea for providing buildings for yourself or your officers until the wishes of the Colonies as to the continuance of the Protectorate have been ascertained, and the necessary funds provided.

6. Upon your arrival in New Guinea you will place yourself in

6. Upon your arrival in New Guinea you will place yourself in communication with Mr. Romilly, a Deputy Commissioner of the Western Pacific, who has been placed in temporary charge of the Protectorate, pending your arrival, and will take over the charge from him.

7. You will be supplied in Sydney with a copy of the instruc-tions given to him by the Commodore when leaving him in

S. It is not possible for Lord Derby, with the limited informa-tion which he possesses as to the circumstances of the country, to now give you instructions in detail respecting the duties which you will have to perform as Special Commissioner. You should proceed to make yourself acquainted with the country, its har-bours, and general features; and you should lose no time in entering into friendly relations with the natives, and in endea-vouring, by all means in your power, to inspire their confidence and acquire their good will.

and acquire their good will.

9. You will especially make it your duty to explain to them that Her Majesty, in taking them under Her protection, has their welfare in view, and that you are sent to secure to them the safety of their persons, the enjoyment of their property, and particularly to protect them from being deprived of their lands by force or fraud. At the same time, you will make it known to them that, if it shall be decided to allow Her Majesty's subjects or others to purchase land, such transactions must, in every case, be conducted through you; that their wishes in these matters will be respected, and that the purchase money will be paid through you to them, unless in any case it shall appear desirable to apply it in their behalf for some object in which they are directly interested. You will also explain carefully, and satisfy yourself that they comprehend, that by the sale of land they deprive themselves of all further claim to it, and that it becomes the absolute property of the purchasers. In the event of any such purchases

being made, it will be your duty to see that both parties agree as to the boundaries of the land, and that these boundaries are defined by beacons or other easily recognisable marks. All such transfers should be carefully recorded in a register, and all subsequent transactions must be similarly recorded, or they will not be recognised by Her Majesty's Government.

10. You should give all proper encouragement to peaceful and legitimate trade between the natives and persons who may visit the Protectorato, and in this and in other matters you will doubtless receive willing and efficient aid from the missionaries who have settled in New Guinea, and established a friendly intercourse with the natives.

11. It will, however, be your duty to prohibit all dealings with the natives in arms, anmunition, explosive substances, or spirituous liquors, and to enforce by all menus in your power the Regulation issued by the High Commissioner on the 5th of April 1884 to prohibit the supply of arms, ammunition, and explosive substances to natives of the Western Pacific Islands. A copy of this Regulation is enclosed.

12. It is probable that attempts may be made to engage laborers for Queensland, and possibly other places, from among the natives in the Protectorate, and, should such attempts be made, it will be your duty to place every lawful obstacle in the way. Natives from New Britain and other islands near the Equator have proved not to possess the physique required for continuous labor, and heavy mortality followed their introduction into Queensland. The Government of that colony have in consequence prohibited their further engagement by vessels sailing from Queensland ports. It will be your duty to second these praiseworthy efforts of the Colonial Governments, and to prevent the recruiting of natives of the Protectorate for employment away from their own country.

13. Power is given to you by your Commission to appoint such

13. Power is given to you by your Commission to appoint such necessary officers as you may think expedient, but at present you should make no other appointments than of an officer to give you general assistance, and of a Private Secretary. You are at liberty to appoint Mr. Romilly to the former of the two positions; the experience he already possesses of affairs in New Guinea and its neighbourhood should prove of value to you, and as he is a Deputy Commissioner for the Western Pacific, you will be able to utilise his services within the Protectorate, or beyond it, should you find it advisable to detach him for services to which you cannot personally attend; it being intended that in both capacities he should act under your immediate instructions.

14. After your arrival in Australia you should report to me

14. After your arrival in Australia you should report to me whether you find other officers indispensable, and you will be at liberty to engage such as appear to you absolutely necessary, hearing in mind that the funds provided by the Colonies must not in any event be exceeded.

15. It is also desirable that you should, as soon as possible after arrival, report what arrangements you will be able to make for locomotion, and for keeping up communication with the Colonies and with England. You are doubtless aware that mail steamers run regularly through Torres Straits, calling both ways at Thursday Island Thursday Island.

Referring to my letter of this day's date, respecting your duties as Special Commissioner in New Guinea, and as Deputy Commissioner under the Western Pacific Orders in Council, I am directed by the Earl of Derby to inform you that the salary of the combined appointments has been fixed at £2500 a year, to be defrayed from the moneys provided by the Colonies.

Mr. Romilly is now in receipt of a salary of £500 a year from Imperial funds as Deputy Commissioner, and you are authorized to pay him a further sum at the rate of £200 a year so long as the continues to serve under you in the Protectorate, to be defrayed from the funds provided by the Colonies.

It will be essential that you should keep careful and accurate accounts of your financial transactions, and submit them for audit to such audit as shall hereafter be directed.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir Henry Brougham Loch, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

W HEREAS by The Fishcries Act 1873 it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, from time to time, by proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, might define the limits of, and what waters should be deemed to be, and what should be deemed the mouth or other boundary of any river, creek, stream, bay, estuary, or lake, and might fix a distance from the mouth of any or every river, creek, or stream within which nets and fixed engines were not to be used: And whereas it expedient to repeal the portion of a proclamation dated the eleventh day of December One thousand eight hundred and seventy-six relating to the River Barwon: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of

the Executive Council, do hereby repeal so much of the proclamation mentioned as relates to the River Barwon, and do, with the advice aforesaid, declare and define the mouth of the River Barwon within which nets and fixed engines are not to be used to be as follows, viz. —"A line drawn from a post on Kissing Point in a south-westerly direction to a stake on the opposite shore."

By His Excellency Sir Henry Brougham Loch, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

W HEREAS by The Licensing Act 1876 (No. 566; section 44) it was amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding the provisions thereinbefore contained, it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim any place or district a place or district where, owing to a sudden increase of population or otherwise, the necessity for the immediate grant of publicans' licenses exists to be a place or district wherein publicans' licenses inght be specially granted, and from time to time to revoke any such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the locality hereinafter mentioned to be a District wherein publicans' licenses may be specially granted under the provisions of the 44th section of the said Act, that is to say:—

The births of 961 children, viz., 508 boys and 453 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of December. In the month of November 779 births were registered, or 182 less than in the month under review. The births were 289 above the average of the previous ten years, but 193 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in December numbered 676, viz., 356 of males, and 320 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 285. The deaths outnumbered those in November by 90, and exceeded the average of December during the previous ten years by 139. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded the average in those ten years by 62 only.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was 3.16, and of deaths registered 2.22.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 89°3° on the 31st, and the lowest was 43°3° on the 1st. The mean temperature of the month (61°2′) was nearly 1½ degrees below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (40°2′) took place on the 25th, viz., from a maximum of 87°4′ to a minimum of 47°2″. The least range (9°6″) was on the 16th, viz., from a maximum of 62°1′ to a minimum of 52°5″. The mean daily range was 20°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29°684 inches) was one-tenth of an inch below the average. Rain fell on 14 days, the amount of rainfall being 3°0′ inches.

Males contributed 53 per cent., and females 47 per cent., to the mortality of the month. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A boy, aged 9, was killed by a collision between two street vehicles; a boy, aged 13, by an omnibus passing over him; a market gardener, aged 17, by being thrown from a horse in front of a train which passed over him; a laborer, aged 22, by a case falling on him; a boy, aged 6, by falling into the Alfred Graving Dock; and a bank clerk, aged 33, by a fall; a dealer, aged 46, and a corn merchant, aged 55, were killed by being thrown from carts; a female child, aged 1 year, died of scadis; a boy, aged 14, and a laborer, aged 25, were drowned whilst bathing; a seaman, aged 24, and 2 males of occupation unstated, aged 45 and 46 respectively, were drowned in the Yarra; 2 carpenters, aged 16 and 22 respectively, were drowned in water-holes; a clerk, aged 18, a ship's steward, aged 50, and a female, aged 33, were found drowned, the two first in Hobson's Bay; two male infants, aged 9 days and 3 weeks respectively, and a female infant, aged 2 months, were overlain in bed; and a plumber, aged 28, was suffocated whilst in a fit. The homicidal death was that of a male infant, which was strangled at birth. Of the suicidal deaths, a female, aged 20, poisoned herself with corrosive sublimate whilst laboring under temporary insanity; a medical student, aged 28, and a blacksmith, aged 53, drowned themselves in the Yarra; and a dairyman, aged 60, hanged himself.

One hundred and thirty deaths, or 19 per cent, of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—53 in the Melbourne.

In the month under notice deaths from zymotic diseases numbered 153, as against 132 in the previous one. The chief increases under this head were in deaths from dysentery and diarrhoa, which rose from 52 to 74, and in those from typhoid fever, which rose from 3 to 9. On the other hand, deaths from measles fell from 34 to 19. Since the first appearance of measles in June hast as many as 175 deaths have been set down to it. Eleven deaths were attributed to the consequences of childbirth, and, as the births numbered 961, it follows that one death of a mother occured to every 87 infants born alive.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE SUPREME COURT IN THE DIVORCE AND MATRIMONIAL JURISDICTION.

NOTE.—The reference E. R. in the margin of these Rules is to the English Rules and Regulations in Dirorce and Matrimonial

In the Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria.

By Divorce and Matrimonial Causes Jurisdiction.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

Dated the 9th day of December 1884.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the 25th year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria (No. 125) it is provided that "the Court shall have power to make such rules and regulations concerning the practice and procedure under this Act, and from time to time to revoke or alter such rules and regulations as it may from time to time consider expedient":

And whereas it is expedient to revoke all rules and regulations heretofore made thereunder, and to make the Rules and Regulations hereinafter contained, it is ordered as follows:-

REPEAL AND COMMENCEMENT.

1. All rules and regulations of the Supreme Court in its Divorce and Matrimonial Causes Repeal of rules. Jurisdiction heretofore made shall be revoked on the 31st day of December, 1885, except as to anything done or suffered or any duty or liability imposed or incurred before the passing of these

rules under any rules hereby repealed.

The following rules and regulations shall take effect in the said Court in its Divorce and commencement Matrimonial Jurisdiction on the 1st day of January, 1885, and shall apply, so far as is practicable, to all proceedings taken on or after that day in all causes and matters then pending, unless the Court or a Judge shall otherwise order, and may be cited as "The Dicorce and Matrimonial Rules 1885."

PETITION.

2. Proceedings before the Court shall be commenced by presenting to a Judge for accept-commencement by petition. ance by him a petition according to the Form No. 1.

3. Petitions to obtain decrees of nullity of marriage, dissolution of marriage, judicial statements in separation, restitution of conjugal rights, or declarations as to jactitation of marriage, shall state so petition. many of the following facts and circumstances, with dates and all other particulars, fully and distinctly, as are applicable to each case, or assign explicit reasons for omitting so to do:—

 Age, place of birth, and domicil of husband and wife respectively.
 Condition of life and means of livelihood of husband and wife respectively, and both before and after marriage.

4. Names, sexes, ages, and places of birth of living children, if any.

- 5. Cohabitation, tracing it clearly from marriage to last determination, showing fully when, why, and under what circumstances it ceased.
- 6. Separation or separations, if any, and causes thereof, and substance of deed of separation, if executed.
- 7. Origin of the acquaintance with the adulterer or adulteress.8. Fact and time of adultery.

- 9. All the occasions on which, within petitioner's knowledge, adultery has been committed.
- 10. The precise occasion when petitioner first suspected any improper or adulterous intércourse.

11. Reasons, if any, for not having sooner instituted proceedings.

12. Any other facts or circumstances within petitioner's knowledge bearing on the

13. Distinct and unequivocal denial of all collusion or connivance, past or present, directly

- or indirectly, with the respondent, or any person liable to be made respondent.

 14. That a written demand for cohabitation and restitution of conjugal rights has been E.R. 175. made and refused after a reasonable time for compliance therewith.
- 4. Every such petition shall be accompanied by an affidavit made by the petitioner, and, if retition to be necessary, some other person or persons, verifying, paragraph by paragraph, the facts stated in the verified, petition, distinguishing those within the personal knowledge of the deponent and those which the deponent can verify only from belief.
- 5. All such petitions and affidavits shall be laid before a Judge, who shall, if they are in Acceptance of compliance with these rules and regulations, or contain satisfactory excuses for non-compliance, petition endorse upon every such petition his acceptance thereof, or, if they are not in compliance and do not contain satisfactory excuses, may require the attendance of the petitioner before him in chambers, and may examine him or her riva roce, on oath, as to the matter of such petition, and may No. 11.-January 30, 1885.-2.

thereupon either endorse such acceptance or refuse to accept such petition; and any person dissatisfied with such refusal may move in open Court upon the same or further or other materials that such petition may be accepted, and such petition shall thereupon accordingly be accepted or refused; and every petition when so accepted by the Court or a Judge shall, together with the affidavits verifying the same, be forthwith filed in the office of the Prothonotary.

8. Every petitioner who files a petition shall prepare a citation according to the Form No. 2, and shall take such citation, together with a praccipe, according to the Form No. 3, to the office of the Prothonotary, and shall file the praccipe, and the citation shall be then signed and scaled.

SERVICE OF CITATION.

Personal service of citation.

9. Every citation, within two months after acceptance of the petition upon which it is issued, shall, together with a copy of the petition sealed with the seal of the Court, be served personally on the person cited by leaving a copy with such person, and producing the original, if required so to do; and a similar citation and copy shall be in like manner served upon every person whom it is intended to make a co-respondent in the cause.

Substitution of service.

10. In cases where personal service cannot be effected, application may be made to the Court or a Judge to substitute some other mode of service, or to dispense with service altogether, and every such application shall be made upon affidavit or affidavits, stating when, where, and for what period the person to be served lived within the colony of Victoria, and whether as married or single, and where such person is and is domiciled at the time of the application, and also the means or mode of service expected to be effected.

Citation to be filed after service.

11. After personal service of citation has been effected, the citation, with the certificate of service endorsed thereon, shall be forthwith returned into and filed in the office of the Prothonotary.

ENDORSEMENT OF ADDRESS.

12. Where the petitioner proceeds by a proctor, every citation and petition shall have where petitioner endorsed thereon the address of the petitioner, and also the name or firm and place of business of his proctor, which shall be his address for service, if such place of business is not more than three miles s.c.r. 1884. from the General Post Office, and also, if his place of business shall be more than three miles from the General Post Office, another place, to be his address for service, which shall not be more than three miles from the General Post Office, where writs, notices, pleadings, petitions, orders, summonses, warrants, and other documents, proceedings, and written communications not by these rules requiring personal service may be left for him. And where any such process is only agent of another proctor, he shall add to his own name or firm and place of business the name or firm and place of business of the principal proctor.

13. Where the petitioner proceeds in person, he shall endorse upon the citation and petition his place of residence, his occupation, and a place, to be his address for service, which shall not be more than three miles from the General Post Office, where writs, notices, pleadings, petitions, orders, summonses, warrants, and other documents, proceedings, and written communications not by these rules requiring personal service may be left for him.

Change of address.

14. Any petitioner or respondent may from time to time substitute another address for service within the like distance by filing the same in the Prothonotary's office and serving a notice thereof upon the opposite party.

APPEARANCE.

Entry of appearance.

15. After the service of citation, an appearance according to the Form No. 4 must be entered by or on behalf of the party cited, and no further proceedings shall be taken unless by the express leave of the Court, until such appearance shall have been entered, or an affidavit of personal service of the citation shall have been filed in the office of the Prothonotary.

16. An appearance to a citation, by or on behalf of the party cited, may, by leave of the Court,. be entered at any time pending the proceedings of the cause, subject nevertheless to such conditions as may be thought just.

17. Every entry of an appearance shall, where the respondent appears by a proctor, be accom-. Address for service of solicitor, panied by a memorandum of the place of business of such proctor, which shall be his address for service, if such place of business be not more than three miles from the General Post Office, and

- 20. No person shall be admitted to prosecute a suit in forma pauperis without the order of order. the Court; and to obtain such order, the case laid before counsel for his opinion, and his opinion thereon, with an affidavit of the party, or of his or her proctor, that the same case contains a full and true statement of all the material facts, to the best of his or her knowledge and belief, and an affidavit by the party applying that he or she is not worth £25 after payment of his or her just debts, save and except his or her wearing apparel, shall be produced at the time such application is made, and the case, opinion, and certificate shall be filed.
- 21. The affidavit required by the last preceding rule, if application is made by a wife to prose-Affidavit in apcute a suit against her husband in forma pauperis, shall state, to the best of her knowledge and wife. E. R. 200.
- 22. Persons of Unsound Mind.

25. A committee duly appointed of a person found by inquisition to be of unsound mind may proceedings by take out a citation and prosecute a suit on behalf of such person as a petitioner, or enter an appearance, intervene, or proceed with the defence on behalf of such person as a respondent; but if no ER 196 committee should have been appointed, application is to be made to a Judge of the Court, who will assign a guardian to the person of unsound mind, for the purpose of prosecuting, intervening in, or defending the suit on his or her behalf; provided that, if the opposite party is already before the Court when the application for the assignment of a guardian is made, he or she shall be served with notice by summons of such application.

ANSWER.

- 26. Within twenty-one days from the service of the citation and copy of the petition, the Form and filling respondent shall file his or her answer in the said office according to the Form No. 5, otherwise the petitioner, subject to the compliance with rule No. 15, shall be at liberty to proceed to proof of the petition.
- 27. Every answer shall have endorsed thereon the address for service as required by these Endorsement of address. rules.
- 28. Every answer shall be accompanied by an affidavit made by the respondent, and, if verification of necessary, some other person or persons, verifying fully, paragraph by paragraph, the facts stated in the answer, distinguishing those within the personal knowledge of the deponent and those which the deponent can verify only from belief: provided that in no case shall any respondent be compelled to confess or admit the commission of adultery.

GENERAL RULES AS TO PLEADING.

A copy of every pleading, showing the alterations and amendments made therein, shall be delivered to the opposite parties on the day such alterations and amendments are made in time for answer the pleadings filed with the Prothonotary; and the opposite parties, if they have already pleaded in to. answer thereto, shall be at liberty to amend such answer within four days, or such further time as may be allowed for the purpose.

36. If either party in the cause fail to file or deliver a copy of the answer, reply, or other pleading, or to alter or amend the same, or to deliver a copy of any altered or amended pleading, within the time allowed for the purpose, the party to whom the copy of such answer, reply, or other pleading, or altered or amended pleading, ought to have been delivered, shall not be bound to receive it, and such answer, reply, or other pleading shall not be filed, or be treated or considered as having been filed, or be altered or amended, unless by order of a Judge, to be obtained on summons. The expense of obtaining such order shall fall on the party applying for it, unless the Judge shall otherwise direct.

37. Applications for further particulars of matters pleaded are to be made by summons, and not by motion.

SERVICE.

- 38. Where personal service of any pleading, notice, proceeding, or document is required, the provisions of these rules, so far as they relate to the service of citations, shall apply.

When it is necessary to serve personally any order or decree of the Court, the original order or decree, or any office copy thereof, under seal of the Court, must be produced to the party served, and annexed to the affidavit of service marked as an exhibit by the Commissioner or other person before whom the affidavit is sworn.

It shall be sufficient to leave all pleadings, notices, proceedings, and documents, which by these rules and regulations are required to be given or delivered to the opposite parties in the cause, or to their proctors, and personal service of which is not expressly required, at the address furnished as aforesaid by the petitioner and respondent respectively.

41. If such address be not furnished as aforesaid, or if such address be illusory or fictitious, where no address or address the opposite party may proceed by filing all such pleadings, notices, proceedings, and documents in the Ord. xi. x. 12.

QUESTIONS OF FACT FOR THE JURY.

Issue for trial.

46. Whenever a cause is to be tried before a jury, the Court shall direct the question at issue to be stated according to the Form No. 6, and the terms in which such question shall be stated shall, on the application of either party, be settled by the Court.

COPY OF PLEADINGS TO BE FILED.

47. Within twenty days after the cause is at issue and all affidavits, if any, have been filed, copy of pleadings to be filed. the petitioner or, on his default, any respondent, within ten days after such default, shall engross the citation, petition, and subsequent proceedings, if any, and shall file the same in the office of the Prothonotary.

SETTING DOWN THE CAUSE FOR TRIAL OR HEARING.

- 48. In cases to be tried by a jury, the petitioner shall, within twenty days after the questions questions of fact to be filled and and at the same time set cause set down. of fact have been settled, file such questions in the Prothonotary's office, and at the same time set down the cause as ready for trial, and on the same day give notice of his having done so to each E. In cases to be heard without a jury, the petitioner shall, after obtaining directions as where cause to to the mode of hearing, set the cause down for hearing, and, on the same day, give notice of his without jury. having done so to each party in the cause for whom an appearance has been entered.

SUMMONSES.

- 61. A summons to attend before a Judge at chambers may be taken out by any person in Practice on any matter pending in the Court, and the practice and procedure thereon in all respects shall, summons to be unless otherwise provided for by these rules and regulations, be, as nearly as may be, according to the practice and procedure in Chambers of the Supreme Court in civil proceedings, but all orders made on such summonses shall be filed in the office of the Prothonotary within three days after the pronouncing thereof, or in default thereof shall be deemed to have lapsed.
- 62. - 70. Application for leave to intervene by the Attorney-General in any cause must be made to the Court or a Judge by motion supported by affidavit.
- 71. The Attorney-General shall, within fourteen days after he has obtained leave to intervene in any cause, enter an appearance and plead to the petition; and on the day he files his plea in the Prothonotary's office shall deliver a copy thereof to the petitioner or to his proctor.

Subsequent pleadings, E. R. 69.

72. All subsequent pleadings and proceedings in respect to the Attorney-General's intervention in a cause shall be filed and carried on in the same manner as before directed in respect of the pleadings and proceedings of the original parties to the cause.

73. When the Attorney-General desires to show cause against making absolute a decree nisi for dissolution or nullity of marriage, he shall enter an appearance in the cause in which such decree nisi has been pronounced, and shall within fourteen days after entering appearance file his plea in the Prothonotary's office, setting forth the grounds upon which he desires to show cause as aforesaid; and on the day he files his plea shall deliver a copy thereof to the person in whose favour such decree has been pronounced or to his or her solicitor; and all subsequent pleadings and proceedings in respect to such plea shall be filed and carried on in the same manner as directed by the two last preceding rules and regulations.

SHOWING CAUSE AGAINST A DECREE.

74. Any person other than the Attorney-General wishing to show cause against making absolute a decree nisi for dissolution of a marriage shall enter an appearance in the cause in which such decree nisi has been pronounced.

Affidavits to be filed. E. R. 71.

75. Every such person shall at the time of entering an appearance, or within four days thereafter, file affidavits setting forth the facts upon which he relies.

Copy to be delivered. E. R. 72.

76. Upon the same day on which such person files his affidavits he shall deliver a copy of the same to the party in the cause in whose favour the decree nisi has been pronounced.

Answering affidavits. E. R. 73.

77. The party in the cause in whose favour the decree nisi has been pronounced may, within eight days after the delivery of the affidavits, file affidavits in answer, and shall, upon the day such affidavits are filed, deliver thereof a copy to the person showing cause against the decree being made absolute.

Affidavits in reply, E. R. 74,

78. The person showing cause against the decree nisi being made absolute may, within eight days file affidavits in reply, and shall upon the same day deliver copies thereof to the party supporting the decree nisi

79. No affidavits are to be filed in rejoinder to the affidavits in reply without permission of rejoinder ithout leave. R. 75, a Judge.

80. The questions raised on such affidavits shall be argued in such manner and at such questions how time as the Judge may on application by motion direct; and if he thinks fit to direct any Ericd. controverted questions of fact to be tried by a jury, the same shall be settled and tried in the same manner and subject to the same rules as any other issue tried in the Court.

DECREE ABSOLUTE.

81. All applications to make absolute a decree nisi for divorce must be made to the Court Motion for by motion. In support of such applications it must be shown by affidavit duly filed that search has affidavit been made in the proper books at the Prothonotary's office up to within one day of the affidavit E. 80. being filed, and that at such time no person had obtained leave to intervene in the cause, and that no appearance had been entered nor any affidavits filed on behalf of any person wishing to show cause against the decree nisi being made absolute; and in case leave to intervene had been obtained or appearance entered or affidavits filed on behalf of such person, it must be shown by affidavit what proceedings, if any, had been taken thereon; but it shall not be necessary to file a copy of the decree nisi. A form of the affidavit is given in Form No. 8.

82. In case application by motion to make absolute a decree nisi for divorce should from Affidavit of scarch where any cause be deferred beyond six days from the time when the affidavit required by the last preceding time enlarged. rule is filed, it must be shown by further affidavit that search has been made in the proper books up to within two clear days of the motion for decree absolute being heard, and that at such time no person had obtained leave to intervene, and that no appearance had been entered nor any affidavits filed on behalf of any person wishing to show cause against the decree nisi being made absolute; and in case leave to intervene had been obtained, or appearance entered or affidavits filed on behalf of any such person, it must also be shown by such further affidavit what proceedings, if any, have been taken thereon.

DISMISSAL OF PETITION.

83. When an order has been made for the dismissal of a petition on payment of costs, the Removal from cause will not be removed from the list of causes in the Court books without an order of the E.R. 193. proper officer, to obtain which it must be shown to his satisfaction that the costs have been paid.

APPEALS TO THE FULL COURT.

- 84. The provisions contained in Order LVIII. (except Rules 9 and 15 thereof) of the Practice on "Rules of the Supreme Court 1884" shall, subject to the provisions of section 17 of "The Marriage The Amendment and Matrimonial Causes Statute Amendment Act 1883," apply to appeals from the decision of a Act. single Judge so far as the same are applicable.
- 85. All appeals to the Full Court shall be heard at such times during any sitting of the Time tor hearing. Full Court as the Court may direct.

ALIMONY.

- 86. The wife being petitioner in a cause may apply for alimony at any time after personal Application by service of the citation on the husband, or after service in some other mode substituted by order of citation. the Court, or after service on the husband has been dispensed with, provided that the fact of marriage between the parties is established by affidavit filed in the cause.
- 87. The wife being the respondent in a cause after having entered an appearance to the Appearance. citation may also apply for alimony.
- 88. Upon any such application any party may require the production of documents and the Evidence. attendance of the husband or wife or of any witnesses for the purpose of being examined or crossexamined upon the hearing thereof.
- 89. A wife who has obtained a decree of judicial separation, on such decree being affirmed Permanent on appeal, or after the expiration of the time for appealing against the decree if no appeal be E. R. 10 2190. on appear, or after the expiration of the time for appearing against the detect if no appear of then pending, may apply for an allotment of permanent alimony though no alimony shall have been allotted to her pending suit, provided that she shall, eight days at least before making any such application, give notice to the husband or to his proctor of her intention so to do; and the preceding rules relating to applications for alimony pendente lite shall, so far as the same are applicable, be observed in respect to the proceedings upon such applications for permanent alimony.
- 90. A wife may at any time after alimony has been allotted to her, whether alimony pendente application for lite or permanent alimony, apply for an increase of the alimony allotted by reason of the increase faculties of the husband, or the husband may apply for a diminution of the alimony allotted by reason of reduced faculties; and the course of proceeding in such cases shall be the same as required by these rules and regulations in respect to the original application for alimony and the allotment thereof, so far as the same are applicable.
- 91. Permanent alimony shall, unless otherwise ordered, commence and be computed from time for commence the date of the final decree of the Judge, or of the full Court on appeal, as the case may be.
- 92. Alimony pendente lite, and also permanent alimony, shall be paid to the wife, or to E. R. 33. some person or persons to be nominated in writing by her, and approved by the Court, as trustee or trustees on her behalf.

PROTECTION ORDERS.

How applied for.

93. Application on the part of a wife deserted by her husband for an order to protect her earnings and property acquired since the commencement of such desertion shall be made according to Form No. 9, and shall be supported by affidavit.

Affidavit in support of. E. R. 197. 94. In the affidavit in support of an application on the part of a wife deserted by her husband for an order to protect her earnings and property acquired since the commencement of such desertion, the applicant must state whether she has any knowledge of the residence of her husband, and if he is known to be residing within the jurisdiction of the Court, he must be served personally with a summons to show cause why such order should not be made.

Discharge of orders. E. R. 125. 95. Application for the discharge of any order made to protect the earnings and property of the wife shall be made to a Judge, and shall be supported by affidavit. Notice of such application, and copies of any affidavit or other document to be read or used in support thereof, must be personally served on the wife eight clear days before the application is heard.

MAINTENANCE AND SETTLEMENTS.

96. Applications to the Court to exercise the authority given by sections 71, 81, and 82 of the Act shall be made by summons.

CUSTODY, MAINTENANCE, AND EDUCATION OF CHILDREN.

OFFICE COPIES, EXTRACTS, ETC.

112. Office copies of documents furnished from the office of the Prothonotary will not be How made. collated with the originals from which the same are copied unless specially required. Every copy so required to be examined shall be certified under the hand of the Prothonotary or other officer to be an examined copy.

TIME.

- 113. The time fixed by these rules and regulations for bringing in petitions, answers, and How computed. pleadings, or for any other proceeding in a cause depending in the Court, shall be exclusive of the first day and inclusive of the last, and shall in all cases be exclusive of Sundays, general public holidays, and of the long vacation.
- 114. The Court shall, in every case in which a time is fixed by these rules for the performance Extension of. of any act, or for any proceeding in default, have power to extend the same to such time, and with such qualifications and restrictions, and on such terms as to it may seem fit.

AMENDMENT.

115. It shall be lawful for the Court or a Judge sitting in chambers or at the hearing or trial General powers of any cause or issue, if such Court or Judge shall see fit so to do, on notice to the opposite party if he or she is not then present either in person or by his or her proctor, to amend all defects and errors in any proceeding in any cause whether there is anything in writing to amend by or not and whether the defect or error be that of the party applying to amend or not; and all such amendments may be made with or without costs and upon such terms as to the Court or Judge may seem fit, and all such amendments as may be necessary for the purpose of determining in the existing suit the real question of controversy between the parties shall be so made.

After directions given as to the mode of hearing or trial of a cause, or in an earlier stage of a cause by order of the Judge, to be obtained on summons, a wife who is petitioner, or has entered an appearance as respondent in a cause, may file her bill or bills of costs for taxation as against her husband, and the taxing officer shall, when directions as to the mode of hearing or trial have been given, ascertain what is a sufficient sum of money to be paid to the Prothonotary or what is a sufficient security to be given by the husband to cover the costs of the wife of and incidental to the hearing of the cause; and the Judge shall thereupon issue an order upon the husband to pay or secure the said sum within a time to be fixed by him; provided that in case the husband should by reason of his wife having separate property, or for other reasons, dispute her right to recover any costs pending suit against him, the Judge may suspend the order to pay the wife's taxed costs, or to pay or secure the sum ascertained to be sufficient to cover her costs of and incidental to the hearing of the cause, for such length of time as shall seem to him necessary to enable the husband to obtain the decision of the Court as to his liability.

130. When on the hearing or trial of a cause, the decision of the Judge or the verdict of the jury is against the wife, no costs of the wife of and incidental to such hearing or trial shall be allowed as against the husband, except such as shall be applied for, and ordered to be allowed by the Judge, at the time of such hearing or trial.

In case a husband or wife shall apply for or obtain an order or commission for the examination of witnesses, the Court or a Judge may order what is a sufficient sum of money to be paid or secured to the wife to cover her expenses in attending at the examination of such witnesses in pursuance of such order or by virtue of such commission, and such sum of money shall be paid or secured before such order or commission shall be issued unless the Court or a Judge shall otherwise order.

CUSTODY OF DOCUMENTS.

Registrar.

133. The Prothonotary, shall except where these rules and regulations otherwise provide, have the custody of all pleadings and other documents now or hereafter to be brought in and filed in any matter or suit depending in the said Court in its Divorce and Matrimonial Causes Jurisdiction, and all orders and fees payable in respect of searches for, an inspection or copies of and extracts from and attendances with documents filed in the office of the Prothonotary shall extend to such pleadings and other documents filed in the said Court in its Divorce and Matrimonial Causes Jurisdiction.

Officers.

134. The Prothonotary and the clerks and other officers of the Supreme Court shall discharge similar duties in the said Court in its Divorce and Matrimonial Causes Jurisdiction, and in the registry thereof, as they discharge in the other jurisdictions of the said Court.

SETTLING AND PASSING DECREES AND ORDERS.

135. All decrees and orders of the Court shall be settled and passed and entered as nearly as may be in the same manner as is provided by Order LXII. of " The Rules of the Supreme Court 1884" as to judgments and orders.

Supplementary.

136. The rules, regulations, practice, and mode of procedure now or hereafter in force in the Practice where none provided. Supreme Court under the Judicature Act 1883, shall, so far as applicable, and where no provision is made by these rules and regulations, be adopted, and be in force in the said Court in its Divorce and Matrimonial Causes Jurisdiction.

INTERPRETATION.

137. In the construction of these rules, unless there is something in the subject or context repugnant thereto, the several words hereinafter mentioned shall have or include the meanings following :-

"The Act" shall mean "The Marriage and Matrimonial Causes Statute 1864."
"The Amending Act" shall mean "The Marriage and Matrimonial Causes Statute Amendment Act 1883."

"Respondent" shall include all co-respondents so far as the same is applicable to them.


