AMENDED REGULATIONS.—SALARIES.—Non-CLERICAL DIVISION, POST OFFICE AND TELEGRAPH DEPARTMENT.

(Act No. 773, sec. 41, sub-sec. viii.)

WHEREAS by The Public Service Act 1833, sec. 15, it is enacted that the Non-Clerical Division shall include all persons whose appointment has been determined by priority of registration, in accordance with Regulations to be made as hereinafter provided, and also all persons permanently employed in the Public Service before the passing of this Act who are not included under the other divisions of the Public Service: And whereas by section 17 of the said Act it is enacted that in the Non-Clerical Division the officers shall be paid such emoluments, salaries, allowances, and wages in accordance with a fixed amount or scale, to be determined by Regulation and as may be provided in the annual Appropriation Act: And whereas by section 41 of the said Act it is enacted that the Public Service Board shall make Regulations, which shall have full force and effect as soon as approved by the Governor in Council, and may, subject to such approval, from time to time repeal, alter, and amend the same—For determining a scale or amount to be paid to the persons employed in the different departments included in the Non-Clerical Division, which, in the opinion of the Board, will be a fair equivalent for the work to be performed by such persons: Now we, the undersigned, being the members constituting the Public Service Board, in pursuance of the said powers, do alter and amend the said Regulations as follow, and declare that the same shall commence and come into operation when approved and published as aforesaid:—

WHEREAS by The Discipline Act 1870 it is provided that the Governor in Council may make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government of persons engaged by virtue of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise for carrying out the said Act, and from time to time annul, alter, or amend the same and substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS FOR ENTRY TO THE VICTORIAN NAVY OF BOYS AS NAVAL APPRENTICES.

- 1. Boys selected to undergo a course of training in the Victorian navy shall be called "Naval Apprentices."
- 2. Naval apprentices may be entered between the ages of 15
- 3. Naval apprentices may be selected for good conduct and ability to fill vacancies on the permanent list, either as boys or (if 18 years of age) as training seamen. Should they not be selected they will be discharged on attaining the age of 18 years, or at any time if guilty of misconduct.
- 4. Naval apprentices shall be sworn in for one year under The Discipline Act 1870, &c.
- 5. Naval apprentices shall undergo a medical examination by the medical officers of the Naval Forces before being accepted.
- 6. No boy shall be received as a naval apprentice who has at any time been convicted before a magistrate of any offence.
- 7. Naval apprentices shall receive pay at the rate of One shilling a day, and an allowance of Thirty shillings, on entrance, for outfit; the cost of all clothing issued beyond the sum allowed to be deducted from their pay.
- 8. The number of naval apprentices shipped is not to exceed

Shoal of 5½ fathoms E.N.E. of Sedari Reef and Three-fathom

Bank castward of Penudany Head.

DURING a survey made by H.N.M. surveying vessels Hydrograaf
and Melvill ran Carnbee for the 5½-fathom shoal, marked on the
chart E.N.E. distant 16 miles from Segali Reef, not less than 23
fathoms water were found.

Also a fruitless search has been made by the Melvill ran
(Carnbee for the 3-fathom bank, E.N.E. ½ E. distant 7 miles of
Pemalang Head; on the reported position 13 fathoms, mud,
were sounded, the depths gradually increasing.

In consideration of these searches the above-mentioned shoals

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Telegrams will not be entertained.

Tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

- 1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed, except when otherwise directed by the police; the straw to be wheaten or caten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; cats (Victorian grown) and bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from caten hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality. The hay tenders must specify whether they are for caten or wheaten hay.
- 2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.
- 3. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

8. If any person or any member of the family of any person registered as aforesaid, or not so registered but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor, or member of the family of any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease the occupier of any house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the local board or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the local board of health, and thereupon it

shall and may be lawful for the said local board or the officer of health, by order as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk until danger, in the opinion of such local board or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until in either case all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

9. If at any time disease exists in the dairy, or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy, or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor, or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the local board, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force; and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

10. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep, or permit or suffer to be kept, any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yard in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

11. In the interpretation of this bye-law words imputing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

12. Every person guilty of any breach of this bye-law, or of any of its provisions, shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justicess, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings; or, in the like discretion shall and may be lawful for the said local board or the officer of

1. "All persons standing or lottering upon any of the carriageways, footways, or other public places of the city shall discontinue to do so on requirement by any member of the police force."

2. "All persons walking along the footways shall in passing each other keep on their respective right-hand side of the footway."

"All persons walking along the tootways snan in passing each other keep on their respective right-hand side of the footway."
 "Any street musician or vocalist shall, when requested by any householder or his servant, or by any member of the police force, depart from the neighbourhood of the premises of such householder."
 "The driver of any vehicle shall give way, if he conveniently can, to any other vehicle during the taking up or setting down of any person into or from such other vehicle."
 "The driver of any hackney carriage or omnibus shall not stop the same for the purpose of taking up or setting down any passenger at any part of the street, except as near as may be to the left or near side thereof.
 "No driver of an omnibus or hackney carriage shall drive the same so as to immediately and closely precede or follow and intentionally conform to the progress of any other omnibus or hackney carriage in competition against or to the annoyance of any other person."
 "Estween the hours of eight o'clock in the morning and six o'clock in the evening of any day no person shall cause interruption or annoyance to passengers along the public roadways or footways by raising or discharging dust upon or across any such roadway or footway, whether from buildings in process of demolition or otherwise."
 "No nrocession of persons or of vehicles, or both, for other

8. "No procession of persons or of vehicles, or both, for other than funeral purposes shall parade or pass through any of the streets, unless with the previous consent in writing of the Mayor, or in his absence, the Town Clerk of the city, and only by the route specified by such consent, nor unless and until the recipient of such consent shall have given, at the least, 24 hour notice, with particulars of such consent and route, to the officer in charge of the city police."

9. "Whenever, for the prevention of accident or the maintenance of order, and for such time as by notice in writing under the hand or by the direction of the Mayor, or in his absence or in case of sudden emergency, under the hand of the Town Clerk, or the officer in charge of the city police, any carriageway, footway, street or other public place shall be declared to be closed against traffic of vehicles or persons, or both, the drivers of vehicles and

all persons contemplated by such notice shall, when so required by any member of the police force, obey and conform to such notice by abstaining from going or travelling on or by withdrawing and removing from the carriageway, footway, street or other public place where mentioned therein. And the drivers of all vehicles, whether private or public, which may be in any street or place mentioned in such notice, whether plying for hire on any duly appointed stand or otherwise, shall, when so required by any member of the police force, remove their horses and vehicles thence, and if desiring to remain in the vicinity, shall proceed to any other carriageway, street, or public place which may be indicated by the police for that purpose, and there arrange and order their vehicles in manner directed by any member of the police force."

"Upon any occasion when any number exceeding ten vehicles shall be assembled and waiting at any one and the same place, the driver of every such vehicle shall as to the placing and ordering thereof comply with the directions given by any member of the police force placed on duty there for the preservation of safety and order."
