4. Messages will be delivered free of charge within one mile and a half of the office at which they are received by telegraph; over that distance cab or omnibus fare will be charged, when incurred; and for messages to be delivered on shipboard an extra charge to cover the disbursement for boat hire will be made. No receipts from the addressees will be taken upon delivery of telegrams, except those from Europe, India, &c. Should it be necessary to obtain evidence of the delivery of a message, a receipt therefor, by telegram, can be ordered at the time such message is lodged for transmission, and will be telegraphed back to sender upon payment of Sixpence, or, if desired, by post card on prepayment of One penny.

The Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of the cancellation of the above regulation (No. 4), and of the substitution of the following therefor, from the 1st December 1885, viz.:

4. Messages will be delivered free of charge within one mile and a half, by road, of the office at which they are received by telegraph, but if natural obstacles or other difficulties intervene, the Department will not undertake delivery; over that distance the expense incurred for delivery will be charged; and for messages to be delivered on shipboard an extra charge, to cover the disbursement for boat hire, will be made. No receipts from the addressees will be taken upon delivery of telegrams, except for those received by the Port Darwin Submarine Cable, or from New Zealand. Should it be necessary to obtain evidence of the delivery of a message, a receipt therefor, by telegram, can be ordered at the time such message is lodged for transmission, and will be telegraphed back to sender upon payment of Sixpence, or, if desired, sent by post card upon prepayment of One penny.

"THE PUBLIC SERVICE ACT 1883."

AMENDED REGULATIONS.—SALARIES.—NON-CLERICAL DIVISION, POST OFFICE AND TELEGRAPH DEPARTMENT.  
(Act No. 773, sec. 41, sub-sec. VIII.)

WHEREAS by *The Public Service Act 1883*, sec. 15, it is enacted that the Non-Clerical Division shall include all persons whose appointment has been determined by priority of registration, in accordance with Regulations to be made as hereinafter provided, and also all persons permanently employed in the Public Service before the passing of this Act who are not included under the other divisions of the Public Service: And whereas by section 17 of the said Act it is enacted that in the Non-Clerical Division the officers shall be paid such emoluments, salaries, allowances, and wages in accordance with a fixed amount or scale, to be determined by Regulation and as may be provided in the annual Appropriation Act: And whereas by section 41 of the said Act it is enacted that the Public Service Board shall make Regulations, which shall have full force and effect as soon as approved by the Governor in Council, and may, subject to such approval, from time to time repeal, alter, and amend the same—For determining a scale or amount to be paid to the persons employed in the different departments included in the Non-Clerical Division, which, in the opinion of the Board, will be a fair equivalent for the work to be performed by such persons: Now we, the undersigned, being the members constituting the Public Service Board, in pursuance of the said powers, do alter and amend the said Regulations as follow, and declare that the same shall commence and come into operation when approved and published as aforesaid:—

## DRAWBACK REGULATIONS.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the following addition being made to Schedule I, attached to Drawback Regulations of the 22nd January 1880, viz. :—

| Live Stock.  | Rate.    |

It has also been approved that, in order to entitle the exporter to claim drawback on live stock, he shall comply with the following Regulations, viz. :—

1. The import entry passed when the live stock is imported must bear on its face the statement that the importer intends to export the stock for drawback within six months, and also show brands, marks, or other description of the stock, for purposes of identification when so exported.

2. The stock must be exported within six months of the date of importation, unless special permission in writing be obtained from the Secretary for Trade and Customs; extension of time shall not, under any circumstances, exceed six months.

3. The export entry must bear on its face the following declaration :—

"I, \_\_\_\_\_, do hereby declare that this live stock, upon which I claim drawback, was imported by me at \_\_\_\_\_, and that duty was paid thereon by warrant No. \_\_\_\_\_ of \_\_\_\_\_"

WHEREAS by *The Discipline Act 1870* it was provided that the Governor in Council might make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government of persons engaged by virtue of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out the said Act, and from time to time annul, alter, or amend the same and substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order make the following addition to the Regulations for the Victorian Military Forces, that is to say :—

Part 2, section 10, after the paragraph commencing with "Great Coats," the following is ordered to be inserted :—

"An undress uniform, special pattern, of Karki serge or drill may be adopted by any corps on the application of the commanding officer, for wear during the summer months."

And the Honorable Frederick Thomas Sargood, Her Majesty's Minister of Defence for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by *The Discipline Act 1870* it is provided that the Governor in Council may make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government of persons engaged by virtue of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out the said Act, and from time to time annul, alter, or amend the same and substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say :—

REGULATIONS FOR ENTRY TO THE VICTORIAN NAVY OF BOYS AS  
NAVAL APPRENTICES.

1. Boys selected to undergo a course of training in the Victorian navy shall be called "Naval Apprentices."

2. Naval apprentices may be entered between the ages of 15 and 17 years.

3. Naval apprentices may be selected for good conduct and ability to fill vacancies on the permanent list, either as boys or (if 18 years of age) as training seamen. Should they not be selected they will be discharged on attaining the age of 18 years, or at any time if guilty of misconduct.

4. Naval apprentices shall be sworn in for one year under *The Discipline Act 1870*, &c.

5. Naval apprentices shall undergo a medical examination by the medical officers of the Naval Forces before being accepted.

6. No boy shall be received as a naval apprentice who has at any time been convicted before a magistrate of any offence.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1884* (No. 812, sec. 73) it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor might from time to time, by a notice in the *Government Gazette*, proclaim as a street or road or as a township any portion or portions of Crown lands, and the lands in such township, or within any city, town, or borough proclaimed before the passing of the said Act, should be sold by auction in the manner therein provided for the sale of Crown lands by public auction, and the lands upon which such street or road should have been proclaimed should be and be deemed to be thenceforward dedicated to the public: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice proclaim as a Road the portion of Crown land hereinafter described, that is to say:—

Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge of police at any station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Telegrams will not be entertained.

Tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed, except when otherwise directed by the police; the straw to be wheaten or oat, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (Victorian grown) and bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oat hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality. The hay tenders must specify whether they are for oat or wheaten hay.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be endorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station, for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

4. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

5. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

6. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

7. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 5.

8. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 5.

9. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of the delay in delivering or replacing it when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the colony for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

10. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

11. It will be competent for the Secretary of the Tender Board, on behalf of the Government, or for the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving, in writing, a notice of three full calendar months to that effect, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the 1st day of a month, and provided that no such notice can be given before the 30th September 1886, and in the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Borough of Geelong West, in the colony of Victoria, being the municipal council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and every other power enabling the said local board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said local board, doth hereby make the bye-law following, being bye-law No. 11 of the said local board of health, that is to say—

1. All former bye-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.
2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*, and shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the place or places within the jurisdiction of the local board of health.
3. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, shall, on or before the first day of December in every year, register himself with the local board of health in manner following, that is to say:—By signing and forwarding to the secretary of the local board of health an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of two shillings and sixpence.

All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated, and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.
6. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept and be kept perfectly clean; and shall within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances, be fumigated, disinfected, or lime washed, as may be in any such order so directed.
7. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.
8. If any person or any member of the family of any person registered as aforesaid, or not so registered but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor, or member of the family of any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease the occupier of any house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the local board or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the local board of health, and thereupon it

shall and may be lawful for the said local board or the officer of health, by order as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk until danger, in the opinion of such local board or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until in either case all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

9. If at any time disease exists in the dairy, or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy, or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor, or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the local board, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force; and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

10. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep, or permit or suffer to be kept, any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yard in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

11. In the interpretation of this bye-law words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

12. Every person guilty of any breach of this bye-law, or of any of its provisions, shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings; or, in the like discretion, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

The foregoing bye-law was duly made, ordered, and passed by the local board of health (being the municipal council in and for the borough of Geelong West) this first day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.

CITY OF BALLAARAT.

BYE LAW No. 66.

A Bye Law of the City of Ballarat, made under section 213 of "The Local Government Act 1874," and numbered 66, for keeping order upon and preventing obstructions of the carriage and footways of the said city; and for any breach whereof the offender will be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Local Government Act 1874," the mayor, councillors, and citizens of the City of Ballarat order as follow:—

1. "All persons standing or loitering upon any of the carriage-ways, footways, or other public places of the city shall discontinue to do so on requirement by any member of the police force."
  2. "All persons walking along the footways shall in passing each other keep on their respective right-hand side of the footway."
  3. "Any street musician or vocalist shall, when requested by any householder or his servant, or by any member of the police force, depart from the neighbourhood of the premises of such householder."
  4. "The driver of any vehicle shall give way, if he conveniently can, to any other vehicle during the taking up or setting down of any person into or from such other vehicle."
  5. "The driver of any hackney carriage or omnibus shall not stop the same for the purpose of taking up or setting down any passenger at any part of the street, except as near as may be to the left or near side thereof."
  6. "No driver of an omnibus or hackney carriage shall drive the same so as to immediately and closely precede or follow and intentionally conform to the progress of any other omnibus or hackney carriage in competition against or to the annoyance of any other person."
  7. "Between the hours of eight o'clock in the morning and six o'clock in the evening of any day no person shall cause interruption or annoyance to passengers along the public roadways or footways by raising or discharging dust upon or across any such roadway or footway, whether from buildings in process of demolition or otherwise."
- AS TO PROCESSIONS, &c.
8. "No procession of persons or of vehicles, or both, for other than funeral purposes shall parade or pass through any of the streets, unless with the previous consent in writing of the Mayor, or in his absence, the Town Clerk of the city, and only by the route specified by such consent, nor unless and until the recipient of such consent shall have given, at the least, 24 hour notice, with particulars of such consent and route, to the officer in charge of the city police."
  9. "Whenever, for the prevention of accident or the maintenance of order, and for such time as by notice in writing under the hand or by the direction of the Mayor, or in his absence or in case of sudden emergency, under the hand of the Town Clerk, or the officer in charge of the city police, any carriageway, footway, street or other public place shall be declared to be closed against traffic of vehicles or persons, or both, the drivers of vehicles and

all persons contemplated by such notice shall, when so required by any member of the police force, obey and conform to such notice by abstaining from going or travelling on or by withdrawing and removing from the carriageway, footway, street or other public place where mentioned therein. And the drivers of all vehicles, whether private or public, which may be in any street or place mentioned in such notice, whether plying for hire on any duly appointed stand or otherwise, shall, when so required by any member of the police force, remove their horses and vehicles thence, and if desiring to remain in the vicinity, shall proceed to any other carriageway, street, or public place which may be indicated by the police for that purpose, and there arrange and order their vehicles in manner directed by any member of the police force."

10. "Upon any occasion when any number exceeding ten vehicles shall be assembled and waiting at any one and the same place, the driver of every such vehicle shall as to the placing and ordering thereof comply with the directions given by any member of the police force placed on duty there for the preservation of safety and order."

All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are in the opinion of the inspector likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed

from such dairy, if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the said local board may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

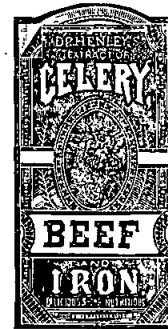
