## FIFTH EXAMINATION.—NOTICE TO CANDIDATES FOR EMPLOYMENT.

THE Services of the following Persons will be required during the period to 30th June, 1886, in the several Branches hereunder mentioned:—

## ENGINEER-IN-CHIEF'S BRANCH.

12 Students for Engineering and Architecture. Rate of pay to be determined after one month's trial.

Candidates must not be under 15 nor more than 18 years of age; and must pass an Examination by the Examiners appointed in that behalf in the following subjects, viz.:—English, geography, arithmetic (including mensuration), euclid (first three books), algebra (to simple equations), trigonometry (as far as the solution of plain triangles), and drawing.

2 Lithographic printers, at 13s. per day.

Candidates must not be under 21 nor over 25 years of age. They must prove to the Examiners that they have served apprenticeship of 7 years to their trade, or if they have served for 5 years they must have worked as journeymen the additional time required to complete the term of 7 years. They must read and write with facility.

40 Permanent-way Repairers, at 6s. 6d. per diem.

Must not be under 21 nor over 35 years of age, and be at least 5 feet 6 inches in height. They must read and write with facility.

## TRAFFIC BRANCH.

70 men for employment as Porters, Pointsmen, or Shunters, at 5s. per day.

Candidates must not be under 18 nor over 25 years of age, and be at least 5 feet 6 inches in height. They must read and write with facility.

10 Youths for Block Signal Boxes, at 3s. per day.

Must not be under 15 nor over 21 years of age. They must produce the State-school certificate that they can read, write, and have a knowledge of arithmetic; or must pass an Examination up to the standard of such certificate by the Examiners appointed in that behalf in the following subjects, viz.:—Reading, writing, and arithmetic.

## LOCOMOTIVE BRANCH.

50 Engine-cleaners, commencing at 5s. per day.

Candidates must not be under 20 nor over 23 years of age, and be at least 5 feet 6 inches in height. They must read and write with facility.

Candidates must not be under 18 nor over 35 years of age, and be at least 5 feet 6 inches in height. They must read and write with facility.

## TELEGRAPH BRANCH.

2 Apprentices to Instrument Making and Fitting. No pay for 12 months.

Candidates must not be under 14 nor over 16 years of age. They must produce the State-school certificate that they can read, write, and have a knowledge of arithmetic; or must pass an Examination up to the standard of such certificate by the Examiners appointed in that behalf in the following subjects, viz.:—Reading, writing, and arithmetic.

## VARIOUS BRANCHES.

50 Junior Clerks,

Of which 6 are required for Telegraph Branch. 15 and 16 years of age, £45 per annum; 17 years, £55 per annum; 18 years and upwards, £65 per annum. Successful candidates will be allocated according to the requirements of the service.

Candidates must not be under 15 nor over 21 years of age; and must produce a certificate of having passed an Examination by the Examiners appointed in that behalf in the following subjects, viz.:—Reading and explanation, dictation, writing, arithmetic, grammar, geography, as taught in the Sixth class of State schools.

Candidates must be strong, healthy, and active, and must prepare their applications in their own hand-writing, and must, where a standard is fixed, state their exact height, without boots, also their age, otherwise their names will not be registered. They must produce to the Examiners satisfactory written testimony that they are of respectable character, and must furnish names of any persons or firms with whom they may have been employed during the previous two years. They must also produce to the said Examiners a certified extract from the register of their birth, or, in default, a statutory declaration as to their age last birthday, giving the date thereof; and before being finally approved they must pass the examination of a Railway Medical Inspector as being up to the standard height, where required, and free from bodily ailments, defects, and colour-blindness, or defective sight of any kind. For such examination they are to pay 10s. 6d. into the hands of the Secretary.

In case the number of Candidates be more than three times the number of persons required, such Candidates will be reduced by lot to such number.

If a greater number of Candidates obtain certificates from the Examiners than are required, such successful Candidates shall, in the presence of the Secretary, draw lots for the determination of the order of precedence for appointment in which their names shall be placed, and their appointments—subject to medical approval—will be made accordingly.

The persons in excess of the number required will be eligible for appointment in like order for a period of twelve months from the date of such determination without further examination.

All appointments will be made to the lowest grade in each of the various branches of the Railway Service, and on probation only, for a period of six months. After such probation, and upon production of a certificate of fitness from the head of the Branch in which the probationer was employed, and of evidence that his life is insured in Victoria as prescribed by Regulations, such appointment may be confirmed.

All applications must contain the correct postal address and the name of the nearest railway station thereto, and must be posted, duly stamped, so as to reach the Office of the Secretary, Victorian Railways, Spencer-street, Melbourne, not later than noon, on the 5th day of January, 1886, such day and hour having been fixed by the Commissioners for opening and dealing with the applications received.

Candidates who pass the preliminary registration will be communicated with as to the time and place when and where they shall attend for examination, and subsequently for medical inspection.

"THE MINING ON PRIVATE PROPERTY ACT 1884."  
REGULATIONS.

THE Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 30 of *The Mining on Private Property Act 1884*, has repealed, altered, and amended so much of the Regulations under the said Act comprised and set forth in the Second Schedule of the said Act, and to such extent and in such particulars as are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

Clauses 3 and 6 of the said Regulations are repealed, excepting as to any applications heretofore granted or as to any applications commenced and pending at the date hereof.

The following clauses are substituted in the place of clauses 3 and 6 so repealed, that is to say:—

Clause 3. The extent of the area to be granted and demised under any lease shall be such as the Governor in Council may in each case, upon the recommendation of the Minister, think fit to be comprised in such lease, but if the area applied for in any case be less than one acre or more than thirty acres, the warden shall not proceed to take the steps prescribed by these Regulations before he shall receive the direction of the Minister of Mines to that effect. Such direction shall be applied for by the applicant to the Minister of Mines before the expiration of the third day after the application for lease shall have been lodged with the warden. The Minister shall be at liberty to refuse or grant such direction as he shall see proper, and if he shall refuse to grant such direction the application shall be deemed to be abandoned, but if he shall grant the same he shall direct the warden to proceed, and the application shall thereupon be proceeded with as by these Regulations directed.

Clause 6. Within ten days after any application received by the warden has been duly entered, or in case the area applied for be less than one acre or more than thirty acres, then within ten days after having received the direction of the Minister, as provided by clause 3 of these Regulations, the warden shall give a notice to the owner and occupier of the lands to be entered upon, in the form of Appendix E in the Second Schedule of the said Act, and at the expiration of the time mentioned in such

notice as the time within which particulars shall be lodged with him, he shall authorize a mining surveyor to enter into and upon such land on behalf of Her Majesty and to mark out and survey and make a plan of the land, and to report in writing on the following matters, that is to say:—

- (a.) The physical character of the land proposed to be mined.
- (b.) Whether it is cultivated or not, and whether any improvements have been effected thereon.
- (c.) Whether it is intersected by auriferous or argentiferous veins, or contains alluvium, and if it contains alluvium, the probable depth of the auriferous stratum in the same.
- (d.) Whether the areas applied for on and under the surface are necessary for the proper working of the mine.
- (e.) What rights and easements are necessary for effectual mining in and upon the land.
- (f.) Whether the land is occupied or unoccupied; and, if occupied, who is in occupation thereof.
- (g.) And on all other matters affecting the application or the land proposed to be mined.
- (h.) Whether posts defining the position of the area have been properly erected.

If, however, a mining surveyor after entry find that the land applied for forms portion of any allotment of land surveyed on behalf of the Crown Lands Department, a copy of the plan of such allotment shall be made without any further survey. When a lease is applied for by the owner or occupier under any agreement, the warden shall under this rule only authorize the mining surveyor to make a survey and plan of the land, and to report on the matters mentioned in sub-sections (f) and (g) of this Regulation.

The said Regulations are also hereby further altered and amended by the addition of the following clause, that is to say:—

Clause 39A. All notices required by these Regulations to be served upon the owner shall either be served personally on such owner or left at his or her usual place of abode (if any such can, after diligent inquiry, be found), and in case any such owner shall be absent from the colony, or if he or his place of abode cannot be found after diligent inquiry, shall be left with the occupier of the land, or if there be no such occupier, shall be affixed upon some conspicuous part of such land.

## CHRISTMAS AND NEW YEAR'S AND SEASIDE EXCURSIONS.

Holiday excursion tickets will be issued to and from all stations (Suburban lines excepted) from the 18th December 1885 to the 5th January 1886, both days inclusive (Sundays excepted), available for return for one calendar month from date of issue. **W**HEREAS by the Local Government Act 1874 (38 Vict. No. 506, § 19, 38, 39, and 49) it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, amongst other things, to sever any portion of Victoria forming part of a municipal district from such municipal district, and annex the same to any other municipal district with which the portion so severed forms one continuous area, and from time to time make any apportionment of property rights and liabilities, and give any directions as to any matters and things that might be necessary to do justice as between the municipalities concerned; and every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor in the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition signed by the requisite number of the ratepayers of the Shire of Newham therein described (notices of which said petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the same Act): Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order sever from the Central Riding of the said Shire of Newham the portion of the shire described in such petition (the residue of the said riding to be henceforth the Central Riding of the said Shire of Newham), and doth direct that the portion so severed from such shire shall be annexed to the Monegeetta Riding of the Shire of Romsey: And with the advice aforesaid doth hereby re-define the boundaries of the said Shire of Newham as hereby reduced, and of the said Shire of Romsey and the Monegeetta Riding thereof as hereby enlarged in manner following, that is to say:—

THE SHIRE OF NEWHAM REDUCED AND REDEFINED.

Commencing at a point on the Campaspe River at the north-east angle of allotment 113, parish of Tylden; thence by the

centre line of that river northwardly to the north-west angle of the parish of Woodend; thence by the north boundary of same parish east to the west boundary of the parish of Newham; thence north by that boundary to the boundary between the counties of Dalhousie and Bourke; thence easterly by that boundary to a point on same true north of the junction of the Saltwater River and Deep Creek, parish of Rochford; thence south to that junction and southerly by the Deep Creek and Monument Creek to the intersection of the latter with the centre of a road forming the north boundary of allotment 120, parish of Rochford; thence following the centre of that road westerly and south-westerly along the western boundaries of allotments 120, 119, 118, and 117 to the boundary between the parishes of Rochford and Kerrie; thence west by the north boundary of allotment 56, parish of Kerrie, to the county boundary between Bourke and Dalhousie; thence by that boundary south-westerly to a point due south of the south-west angle of allotment X, parish of Trentham; thence north to that angle; thence north by a road to the north-west angle of allotment X; thence north-easterly to the south-east angle of allotment 67c; thence north to the north-west angle of allotment 78; thence north-westerly and north to the north-west angle of allotment 120a, parish of Tylden; thence north-east to the south-east angle of allotment 120; thence north to the north-east angle of allotment 115; and thence north-easterly along the three-chain Tylden main road to the point of commencement.

#### THE ROMSEY SHIRE ENLARGED AND REDEFINED.

Commencing at a point on the north boundary of the county of Bourke north of the north-east angle of suburban allotment 18, in the parish of Lancefield; thence southerly by the eastern boundaries of the parishes of Lancefield and Monegeetta to the south-east angle of the parish of Monegeetta; thence west by the south boundary of the said parish to a point in the centre of the Lancefield road west of the north-west angle of the parish of Havelock; thence southerly by the centre of the said road to the northern boundary of the parish of Bolinda; thence west to the north-west angle of that parish to the centre of the western branch of the Saltwater River; thence by the said river westerly to a point in the centre of a one-and-a-half chain road leading from Riddell's Creek to Sunbury; thence by the centre of the said road north-westerly and north to the northern boundary of the Mount Alexander and Murray River Railway; thence by that railway south-westerly and westerly to the centre of a road forming the western boundaries of allotments 7, 8, and 5 of section 35, parish of Gisborne; thence north and north-easterly by that road to the Macedon River; thence crossing that river to the south-west angle of block 6A, parish of Kerrie; thence by the south-western boundary of that allotment to the north-west angle of same; thence west by a one-chain road to the south-west angle of allotment 36, same parish; thence by the west and north boundary of said allotment to the south-east angle of allotment 41; thence northerly by the one-chain road forming the eastern boundary of allotments 41, 53, and 50 to the north-east angle of the allotment last named; thence west by the north boundary of allotments 50 and 51 and a line to the centre of the Barringo Creek; thence northerly by that creek to the south boundary of allotment 58; thence westerly by that boundary and north by the west boundary of said allotment and allotments 57 and 56 to the north-west angle of allotment last named; thence easterly by the north boundary of same allotment to the south-western boundary of the parish of Rochford; thence north-easterly and easterly by the centre of a road forming the western boundaries of allotments 117, 118, 119, and 120, said parish, to its intersection with the centre of Monument Creek; thence northerly by that creek and Deep Creek to the junction of the latter with the Saltwater River; thence by a line true north to the Dividing Range, being the boundary between the counties of Bourke and Dalhousie; thence easterly by that boundary to the commencing point.

#### THE MONEGETTA RIDING OF THE SHIRE OF ROMSEY ENLARGED AND REDEFINED.

Commencing at a point on the shire boundary in the centre of Monument Creek at the south-west angle of allotment 10, parish of Rochford; thence east by the south boundary of allotments 10 and 9 to the north-west angle of allotment 5; thence south by the west boundaries of allotments 5 and 1 to the south-west angle of last-named allotment; thence east by the south boundaries of allotments 1 and 2, said parish; thence to and by the centre of a road forming the north boundaries of allotments 38, 39, 40, 36, and 28, parish of Monegeetta, to the north-east angle of the last-named allotment; thence south by part of the east boundary of said allotment 28, and east by the north boundary of allotment 26 to the east boundary of the shire; thence following said boundary southerly to the north boundary of the Riddell's Creek Riding at the Mount Alexander and Murray River Railway; thence north-westerly by that railway to a point due south of the south-west angle of Brock's pre-emptive section; thence north to that angle at the Bolinda Creek; thence north-westerly by Bolinda Creek to the south-west angle of allotment 115, parish of Rochford; thence north-easterly by the north-western boundary of that allotment to the south-east angle of allotment 116, same parish; thence north-westerly by the south-west boundaries of allotments 116 and 117 to the road forming the shire boundary on the west of allotments 117, 118, 119, and 120; and thence by the shire boundary northerly to the commencing point.

Whenever the line so described as aforesaid runs beside or along a river, creek, or road, whether specifically mentioned or not, the centre of such river, creek, or road shall be taken to be the boundary line.

And the Honorable Alfred Deakin, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

PUBLIC WATER RESERVE HEREBY PLACED UNDER THE TEMPORARY MANAGEMENT AND CONTROL OF THE LOWAN SHIRE WATERWORKS TRUST.

DINYARRAK.—Fourteen acres two roods seventeen perches, county of Lowan, parish of Dinyarrak, being the land temporarily reserved, by Order of the 31st August 1885, as a site for Water Supply purposes, and described in the *Government Gazette* of the 4th September 1885, page 2548.—(85.C.42055.)

#### ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS UNDER LAND ACT 1884.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the ninth day of December 1885.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor.

Mr. Service | Mr. Levien.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1884* power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for various purposes therein specified: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby rescind the following portions of the general Regulations under *The Land Act 1884*, dated 17th March 1885, and published in the *Gazette* of 20th March 1885, namely, clauses 7 and 9 of the second part of chapter 2, referring to survey fees, and so much of the first part of the said chapter 2 referring to the mode of conducting surveys as may be inconsistent with the following special Regulations now made for the survey of leaseholds under Parts II. and III. of the Act.

##### SPECIAL REGULATIONS.

1. When the grazing area or pastoral allotment exceeds three hundred and twenty acres in extent, or if less, when it is intended to occupy the land for the full term as a leasehold, the survey of such leasehold may be made in the manner following. The boundaries must be marked on the ground by substantial stakes, trenches, blazed or marked trees, in the usual way, but a good prismatic compass or circumferenter may be used by the surveyor in setting out and running the lines, and a limit of error corresponding with the kind of instrument used will be allowed in the dimensions.
2. The surveyor shall supply a plan on good drawing-paper of the area or allotment, plotted to a suitable scale, and showing on the face of it the following particulars:—  
The lengths and bearings of the boundary lines.  
The position and nature of the bound-marks.  
The area. And  
The numbers of the adjoining holdings or the names of Crown lessees or owners thereof.
3. The fees payable for such surveys shall be in accordance with the following schedule; the 1st class fees to apply only to the densely-timbered or scrubby portions of the Cape Otway, Western Port, and Gippsland districts, the limits of which shall be defined by the Surveyor-General. The 2nd class to the rest of the colony, excepting the territory dealt with under the Mallee Pastoral Act of 1883.

4. When the cost of surveying a grazing area exceeds the sum of Ten pounds, if the sum of Five pounds be paid by the applicant towards the cost of the survey in the usual way, on the approval of his application, the Minister shall arrange for the payment of the *balance* of the cost of such survey by equal yearly instalments extending over the term of years payable with the rent of such grazing area.
5. Immediately on the approval of the application for a lease or license the Land Officer shall, if a survey be required, notify to the applicant that on his depositing with a Receiver of Revenue the amount chargeable to him for survey, and producing or forwarding the receipt therefor to the Land Officer, an authorized surveyor will be instructed to survey the land for and on account of the applicant. Should the said charge not be paid within twenty-eight days from the date of such notification, the application shall be deemed to be abandoned.
6. These Regulations shall not apply to the survey of lands for sale or permanent appropriation, nor to the survey of an agricultural allotment under the 42nd section of the Act; and nothing herein shall affect the Regulations of 1st June 1885 for the employment of authorized surveyors.

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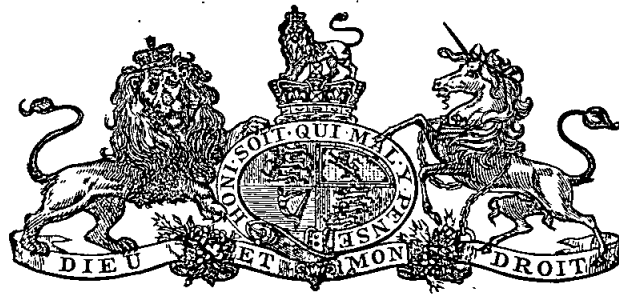
