CHAPTER 49.

AN ACT TO CARRY INTO EFFECT AN INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION FOR THE PROTECTION OF SUBMARINE TELEGRAPH CABLES. [6th August 1885.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majest 1991. In adwith the advice and consent of the Lords Spritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- Short title.—This Act may be cited as the Submarine Telegraph Act, 1885.
- 2. Confirmation of Convention.—The Convention of the four-teenth of March One thousand eight hundred and eighty-four mentioned in the schedule to this Act as set forth in that schedule is hereby confirmed, and subject to the provisions of this Act the articles of such Convention (referred to in this Act as the Convention) shall be of the same force as if they were enacted in the body of this Act.
- 3. Punishment for violation of Article? of Convention.—(1.) A person shall not unlawfully and wilfully, or by culpable negligence, break or injure any submarine cable to which the Convention for the time being applies, in such manner as might interrupt or obstruct in whole or in part telegraphic communication.
- (2.) Any person who acts or attempts to act in contravention of this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and on convic-
 - (a.) If he acted wilfully, shall be liable to penal servitude for a term not exceeding five years, or to imprisonment, with or without hard labor, for a term not exceeding two years, and to a fine either in lieu of or in addition to such penal servitude or imprisonment; and
 (b.) If he acted by culpable negligence, shall be liable to imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months, without hard labor, and to a fine not exceeding one hundred pounds either in lieu of or in addition to such imprisonment.

(3.) Where a person does any act with the object of preserving the life or limb of himself or of any other person, or of preserving the vessel to which he belongs or any other vessel, and takes all No. 124,-December 24, 1885.-1.

reasonable precautions to avoid injury to a submarine cable, such person shall not be deemed to have acted unlawfully and wilfully within the meaning of this section.

(4.) A person shall not be deemed to have unlawfully and wilfully broken or injured any submarine cable where, in the bond fide attempt to repair another submarine cable, injury has been done to such first-mentioned cable, or the same has been broken; but this shall not apply so as to exempt such person from any liability under this Act or otherwise to pay the cost of repairing such breakage or injury.

(5.) Any person who within or (being a subject of Her Majesty) without Her Majesty's dominions in any manner procures, counsels, aids, abets, or is accessory to the commission of any offence under this section, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall be liable to be tried and punished for the offence as if he had been guilty as a principal.

4. Limitation of Article four of Convention.—Article four of

Limitation of Article four of Convention.—Article four of the schedule to this Act shall not apply to that part of a cable which is laid in a depth of water exceeding one hundred fathoms; but nothing in the Convention or this Act shall take away, prejudice, or affect any right or remedy to which by law any party is or may be entitled otherwise than under the provisions of the Convention or this Act.

5. Application of law as to lights and signals for carrying into effect Articles fire and six of Convention. 25 d. 20 Vict. a. 63.—

(1.) It is hereby declared that the enactments of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1862, and the enactments amending the same, touching regulations as to lights and to signals and for the avoiding of collisions, shall extend to authorize regulations for carrying into effect Articles five and six of the schedule to this Act, within as well as without the territorial waters of Her Majesty's dominions, and regulations may be made, applied, altered, and revoked, and the contravention thereof punished accordingly under the said enactments, and section six of the Sca Fisherics Act 1883 shall extend to the enforcement of the said regulations as regards sea fishing boats within the limits of that Act.

(2.) If any vessel engaged in the laying or repairing of a submarine cable to which the Convention for the time being applies interferes contrary to the said regulations or articles with any vessel engaged in fishing, or if the operations of any vessel in connexion with any such submarine cable are wilfully delayed so as to interfere with sea fishing, the master of the vessel, or the owner thereof, if it appear that he was in fault, shall be deemed guilty of a breach of the said regulation and may be punished accordingly.

6. Powers of British and foreign officers.—(1.) For the purpose of carrying into effect the Convention, a person commanding a ship of war of Her Majesty or of any foreign state for the time being bound by the Convention, or a ship specially commissioned for the purpose of the Convention by Her Majesty or by the government of such foreign state, may exercise and perform the powers and duties vested in and imposed on such officer by any article in the schedule to this Act.

(2.) If any person obstructs any such officer in such exercise or performance, or refuses or neglects to comply with any demand or direction lawfully made or given by him in pursuance of this Act, such person shall be liable, on summary conviction, to a fine not exceeding Fifty pounds, or to be imprisoned for a term not exceeding two mouths, with or without hard labor.

(3.) Any action, prosecution, or proceeding against any officer for any act done in pursuance or execution or intended execution of this Act, shall not lie or be instituted unless it is commenced within twelve months next after the act, neglect, or default complained of.

(4.) In any such action tender of amends before the action was commenced may, in lieu of or in addition to any other plea, be pleaded. If the action was commenced after such tender, or is

proceeded with after payment into court of any money in satisfaction of the plaintiff sclaim, and the plaintiff does not recover more than the sum tended or paid, he shall not recover any costs incurred after such tender or payment, and the defendants shall be entitled to costs, to be taxed as between solicitor and client, as from the time of such tender or payment.

(5.) Every such action shall be brought in one of Her Majesty's superior courts in the United Kingdom (which courts shall have jurisdiction to try the same wherever the matter complained of occurred), or in a supreme court in India, or in a court exercising in a British possession the like authority as the High Court of Justice in England, but in no other court whatsoever.

7. Incorporation of Part X. of 17 and 18 Vict. c. 104.—Part X. of the Merchant Shipping Act 1854 (which relates to legal procedure), and the enactments amending the same, so far as unrepealed, shall have effect as if enacted in this Act, and offences under this Act may be tried, and fines under this Act recovered accordingly, save that nothing in the said part shall authorize the award of any punishment not authorized by this Act, or the summary prosecution of any indictable offence under this Act.

8. Eridence.—(1.) Any document drawn up in pursuance of Article seven or Article ten of the schedule to this Act shall be admissible in any proceeding, eivil or criminal, as primá facie evidence of the facts or matters therein stated.

(2) If evidence contained in any such document was taken on eath in the presence of the person charged in such evidence, and such person had an opportunity of cross-examining the person giving such evidence and of making his reply to such evidence, the officer drawing up such document may certify the said facts, or any of them.

(3.) Any document or certificate in this section monitoned purporting to be signed by an officer authorized to act under the schedule to this Act for carrying into effect the Convention, shall be admissable in evidence without proof of such signature, and, if purporting to be signed by any other person, shall, if certified by any such officer to have been so signed, be deemed, until the contrary is proved, to have been signed by such other person.

(4.) If any person forges the signature of any such officer to any such document knowing the signature thereto to be forged, such person shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and liable, on summary conviction, to imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months, with or without hard labor, and on conviction on indictment to imprisonment with or without hard labor for a term not exceeding two years. ing two years.

9. Liability of masters of ressels.—Where any offence against this Act has been committed by means of a vessel, or of any boat belonging to a vessel, the master of such vessel shall, until some other person is shown to have been in charge of and navigating such vessel or boat, be deemed to have been in charge of and navigating the same, and be liable to be punished accordingly.

10. Sarings.—The provisions of this Act shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any other provisions existing at common law, or under Act of Parliament, or under the law of a British possession for the protection of submarine cables; and nothing in this Act shall prevent any person being liable under any Act of Parliament, law of a British possession, or otherwise to any indictment, proceeding, punishment, or penalty other than is provided for any offence by this Act, so that no person shall be punished twice for the same offence; and nothing in this Act, nor any proceedings with respect to any matter, shall exempt a person from any liability in any action or suit with reference to the same matter, so that no person shall be required to pay compensation twice in respect of the same injury.

11. Extent of Act.—This Act shall, so far as such extension is consistent with the tenor of this Act, extend to the whole of Her Majesty's dominions, and to all places within the jurisdiction of the Admiral of England, and to all places where Her Majesty has jurisdiction.

SUMMARINE TELEGRAPHS CONVENTION.

CONVENTION for the preservation of telegraphic communications by means of submarine telegraphs made on the 14th of March 1884, between Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, His Majesty the German Emperor, King of Prussia, His Excellency the President of the Argentine Confederation, His Majesty the Emperor, of Austria, King of Bohennia, &c., and Apostolic King of Hungary, His Majesty the King of the Belgians, His Majesty the Emperor of Brazil, His Excellency the President of the Republic of Coxta Rica, His Majesty the King of Demmark, His Excellency the President of the United States of America, His Excellency the President of the United States of Columbia, His Excellency the President of the United States of Columbia, His Excellency the President of the United States of Columbia, His Excellency the President of the French Republic,

His Excellency the President of the Republic of Guatemala, His Majesty the King of the Hellenes, His Majesty the King of Italy, His Majesty the Emperor of the Ottomans, His Majesty the King of the Notherlands, Grand Duke of Luxemburg, His Majesty the Kha of Persia, His Majesty the King of Portugal and the Algarves, His Majesty the King of Roumania, His Majesty the Emperor of all the Russias, His Excellency the President of the Republic of Salvador, His Majesty the King of Servia, His Majesty the King of Servia, His Majesty the King of Sweden and of Norway, and His Excellency the President of the Oriental Republic of the Uruguay.

The following is an English translation of the Convention, with the omission of the formal beginning and end:—

ARTICLE I.

The present Convention applies outside territorial waters to all legally established submarine cables landed on the territories, colonies, or possessions of one or more of the High Contracting

ARTICLE II.

ARTICLE II.

It is a punishable offence to break or injure a submarine cable, wilfully or by culpable negligence, in such manner as might interrupt or obstruct telegraphic communication, either wholly or partially, such punishment being without prejudice to any civil action for damages.

This provision does not apply to cases where those who break or injure a cable do so with the lawful object of saving their lives or their ship, after they have taken every necessary precaution to avoid so breaking or injuring the cable.

ARTICLE III.

The High Contracting Parties undertake that, on granting a concession for landing a submarine cable, they will insist, so far as possible, upon proper measures of safety being taken, both as regards the track of the cable and its dimensions.

ARTICLE IV.

The owner of a cable who, on laying or repairing his own cable, breaks or injures another cable, must bear the cost of repairing the breakage or injury, without prejudice to the application, if need be, of Article II. of the present Convention.

ARTICLE V.

Vessels engaged in laying or repairing submarine cables shall conform to the regulations as to signals which have been, or may be, adopted by mutual agreement among the High Contracting Parties, with the view of preventing collisions at sea.

When a ship engaged in repairing a cable exhibits the said signals, other vessels which see them, or are able to see them, shall withdraw to or keep beyond a distance of one nantical mile at least from the ship in question, so as not to interfere with her operations.

Fishing gear and nets shall be kept at the same distance.

Nevertheless, fishing vessels which see, or are able to see, a telegraph ship exhibiting the said signals shall be allowed a period of twenty-four hours at most within which to obey the notice so given, during which time they shall not be interfered with in any

way.

The operations of the telegraph ships shall be completed as quickly as possible.

ARTICLE VI.

Vessels which see, or are able to see, the buoys showing the position of a cable when the latter is being laid, is out of order, or is broken, shall keep beyond a distance of one-quarter of a nautical mile at least from the said buoys.

Fishing nets and gear shall be kept at the same distance.

. ARTICLE VII.

Owners of ships or vessels who can prove that they have sacrificed an anchor, a net, or other fishing gear in order to avoid injuring a submarine cable, shall receive compensation from the owner of the cable.

In order to establish a claim to such compensation, a statement, supported by the evidence of the crew, should, whenever possible, be drawn up immediately after the occurrence; and the master must, within twenty-four hours after his return to or next putting into port, make a declaration to the proper authorities.

The latter shall communicate the information to the consular authorities of the country to which the owner of the cable belongs.

ARTICLE VIII.

The tribunals competent to take cognizance of infractions of the present Convention are those of the country to which the vessel on board of which the offence was committed belongs. It is, moreover, understood that, in cases where the provisions in the previous paragraph cannot apply, offences against the present Convention will be dealt with in each of the Contracting States in accordance, so far as the subjects and citizens of those States respectively are concerned, with the general rules of criminal jurisdiction prescribed by the laws of that particular State, or by international treaties.

ARTICLE IX.

Prosecutions for infractions provided against by Articles II., V., and VI. of the present Convention shall be instituted by the State, or in its name.

ARTICLE X.

ARTICLE X.

Offences against the present Convention may be verified by all means of proof allowed by the legislation of the country of the court. When the officers commanding the ships of war, or ships specially commissioned for the purpose by one of the High Contracting Parties, have reason to believe that an infraction of the measures provided for in the present Convention has been committed by a vessel other than a vessel of war, they may demand from the captain or master the production of the official documents proving the nationality of the said vessel. The fact of such document having been exhibited shall then be endorsed upon it immediately. Further, formal statements of the facts may be prepared by the said officers, whatever may be the nationality of

the vessel incriminated. These formal statements shall be drawn up in the form and in the language used in the country to which the officer making them belongs; they may be considered, in the country where they are adduced, as evidence in accordance with the laws of that country. The accused and the witnesses shall have the right to add, or to have added thereto, in their own language, any explanations they may consider useful. These declarations shall be duly signed.

ARTICLE XI.

The proceedings and trial in cases of infraction of the provisions of the present Convention shall always take place as summarily as the laws and regulations in force will permit.

ARTICLE XII.

The High Contracting Parties engage to take or to propose to their respective Legislatures the necessary measures for insuring the execution of the present Convention, and especially for punishing, by either fine or imprisonment, or both, those who contravene the provisions of Articles II., V., and VI.

ARTICLE XIII.

The High Contracting Parties will communicate to each other laws already made, or which may hereafter be made, in their respective countries relating to the object of the present Convention.

ARTICLE XIV.

States which have not signed the present Convention may adhere to it on making a request to that effect. This adhesion shall be notified through the diplomatic channel to the Government of the French Republic, and by the latter to the other Signatory Powers.

ARTICLE XV.

It is understood that the stipulations of the present Convention do not in any way restrict the freedom of action of beligerents.

ARTICLE XVI.

ARTICLE XVI.

The present Convention shall be brought into force on a day to be agreed upon by the High Contracting Powers.

It shall remain in force for five years from that day, and unless any of the High Contracting Parties have announced twelve months before the expiration of the said period of five years its intention to terminate its operation, it shall continue in force for a period of one year, and so on from year to year.

If one of the Signatory Powers denounce the Convention, such denunciation shall have effect only as regards that Power.

ARTICLE XVII.

The present Convention shall be ratified, and the ratifications exchanged at Paris, with as little delay as possible, and, at the latest, at the expiration of a year.

ADDITIONAL ARTICLE.

The stipulations of the Convention concluded under to-day's date for the protection of submarine cables shall be applicable, in conformity with Article I., to the colonies and possessions of Her Britannic Majesty, with the exception of those hereinafter mentioned, namely:—

Canada. Newfoundland. The Cape: Natal. New South Wales. Victoria.

Queensland. Tasmania. South Australia. Western Australia. New Zealand.

Provided always, that the stipulations of the said Convention shall be applicable to any of the above-named colonies or possessions on whose behalf notice to that effect shall have been given by Her Britannie Majesty's Representative at Paris to the French Minister for Foreign Affairs.

Each of the above-named colonies or possessions which may have acceded to the said Convention shall be at liberty to withdraw from it in the same manner as the Powers parties to it. In the event of any of the said colonies or possessions desiring to withdraw from the Convention, a natification to that effect shall be made by Her Britannic Majesty's Representative at Paris to the French Minister for Foreign Affairs.

The births of 957 children, viz., 525 boys and 432 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of November. In the month of October 1,063 births were registered, or 106 more than in the month under review. The births were 239 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, and 101 above that average even if allowance be made for the increase of templation. of population.

The deaths registered in November numbered 571, viz., 332 of males, and 239 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 386. The deaths exceeded those in October by 83, and were also in excess of the average of November during the previous ten years by 104. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded the average of those ten years by only 15.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was 2.93, and of deaths registered 1.75.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 90.5° on the 25th, and the lowest was 42.1° on the 11th. The mean temperature of the month (39.9°) was half a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (37.5°) took place on the 14th, viz., from a maximum of 84.0° to a minimum of 47.1°. The least range (7.1°) was on the 27th, viz., from a maximum of 61.1° to a minimum of 54.0°. The mean daily range was 17.9°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.978 inches) was, with one exception, the highest recorded for November during the last eleven years, being one-seventh of an inch above the average.

Rain fell on 11 days, the amount of rainfall being about $3\frac{1}{2}$ inches.

Males contributed 58 per cent., and females 42 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 48 per cent. to that mortality, as against 53 per cent. in 1884, 45 per cent. in November 1883, 49 per cent. in November 1882, 38 per cent. in November 1881, 41 per cent. in November 1889, 39 per cent. in November 1879, 35 per cent. in November 1878, 42 per cent. in November 1876, and 46 per cent. in November 1875.

Seventeen of the deaths recorded were of persons who had attained the age of 75 or upwards, viz.:—Those of a female, aged 75, of diarrhea: a "gentleman," aged 76, of softening of the brain; a farmer, aged 76, of bronchitis; a bottle-dealer, aged 76, of bronchitis; a bottle-dealer, aged 76, of bronchitis; a laborer, aged 77, of progressive paralysis; a "gentleman," aged 79, of malignant disease of the face; a dealer, aged 79, of disease of the brain; a "gentleman," aged 81, of acute enteritis; a female, aged 84, of fracture of the femur, caused by a fall from a box; a gentleman, aged 75, a gardener, aged 83, a laborer, aged 85, and a shoeblack, aged 88, of old age.

Of the deaths recorded during the month, 34 were set down to external causes, of which 26 were due to accident, 2 to homicide, and 6 to suicide. The particulars of the accidental deaths were as follow:—Two carters, aged 30 and 32 respectively, and a laborer, aged 45, were killed by railway trains; a shunter, aged 48, died of injuries received whilst shunting; a jockey, aged 25, was killed by a fall from his horse during a race; a carpenter, aged 64, died of fracture of the thigh, the result of a fall from a cart; a laborer, aged 47, was killed by being passed over by a cart; a carpenter, aged 16, a hawker, aged 37, and a female, aged 84, died of injuries resulting from falls; a scaman, aged 23, was crushed to death between two bales of woolpacks; a female child, aged 4, died of burns; as woman, aged 45, of heat apoplexy (sunstroke); a surveyor, aged 40, died of an overdose of chloroform, self administered; a watchmaker, aged 52, was found dead, and is supposed to have been poisoned by some narcotic; 2 laborers, aged 31 and 32 respectively, a seaman, aged 39, a male of occupation unknown, aged about 55, a blacksmith, aged 50, a shopman, aged 19, a boy, aged 4, and a laborer, aged 24, were accidentally drowned—the first four in the River Yarra, the next in the Saltwater River, and the two last in waterholes; a male infant died of asphyxia soon after birth; and a male and a female infant, aged 6 and 7 weeks respectively, were accidentally suffocated (so stated). The homicidal deaths were those of a female, aged 28, who was sufficated by soone person unknown; and a ship's officer, aged 38, who was wilfully murdered by a fellow seaman. The suicidal deaths were those of a seaman, aged 26, a carpenter, aged 33, a butcher, aged 42, and a bootmaker, aged 62, who cut their throats; also a printer, aged 33, and a messenger, aged 60, who drowned themselves.

Eighty-one deaths, or 14 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—36 in the Melbourne Hospital.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 271, of which 152, or 56 per cent., were of males, and 119, or 44 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 228 were under one year of age, 21 were between one and two, 6 were between two and three, 8 were between three and four, and 8 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 300. Of these, 180, or 60 per cent., were males, and 120, or 40 per cent, were females; 11 were between five and ten, 7 were between ten and fifteen, 13 were between fifteen and twenty, 24 were between twenty and twenty-five, 28 were between twenty-five and thirty, 26 were between thirty and thirty-five, 21 were between thirty-five and forty, 18 were between forty and forty-five, 26 were between forty-five and fifty-five, 27 were between fifty and sixty, 27 were between sixty and sixty-five, 25 were between sixty-five and seventy, 9 were between seventy and seventy-five, 11 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 6 were upwards of eighty.

Diarrhea, which is always so prevalent on the approach of summer, is mainly accountable for the increased mortality of the month under review, as compared with the previous month; this disease having caused as many as 75 deaths in November, as against only 9 in October. There was also an increase in the deaths from gastritis and enteritis, from 10 in October to 27 in the month under review; in those from atrophy and debility, from 25 to 47; and in those from suicide, from 1 to 6; but a falling-off occurred in deaths from "old age," from 18 to 8; and in those from bronchitis and pneumonia, from 61 to 40: It will be remembered that the last-named complaints were unusually prevalent about the middle of the year, commencing generally with a cold, accompanied with severe febrile symptoms, which received the name of "fog fever." These attained their maximum fatality in August, when 154 deaths were recorded from them, after which the number gradually decreased.

CHRISTMAS AND NEW YEAR'S AND SEASIDE EXCURSIONS

Christmas and New Year's and Seasine Excursions.

Holiday Excursion tickets will be issued to and from all stations (Suburban lines excepted) from the 18th December 1885 to the 5th January 1886, both days inclusive (Sundays excepted), available for return for one calendar month from date of issue. Example—An excursion ticket issued on the 22nd December will be available till the 22nd January. When the last day falls on a Sunday, the tickets will be available till next day. 8. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the park, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of The Lund Act 1884, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any balliff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such balliff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Wedderburne Public Gardens or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person except laborers and workmen employed in the Wedderburne Public Gardens shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of The Land Act 1834, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, dues not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
