MEMORANDUM FOR THE HONORABLE THE PREMIER.

As the Imperial Government have decided to postpone until the approach of the autumn season the further consideration of the offer which has been made by the Government of this colony of a Military Contingent for Egypt, the Governor desires, on behalf and in the name of Her Majesty to express the Queen's thanks and acknowledgments for the manner in which the officers and men of the Victorian Naval and Military Defence Force volunteered for service in the Soudan.

Her Majesty's thanks are also given to those officers and men of the old Volunteer corps who placed their services at the disposal of the Government, and to the hundreds of all classes of citizens who have vied with each other in their proffers of aid in the event of the Victorian offer of a Military Contingent being accepted, while the thanks of Her Majesty are equally extended to those noble-hearted women who were willing and anxious to take their place in the hospitals by the side of the sick and wounded.

The spontaneous outburst of loyalty to the throne, regard for the preservation of the unity of the empire, and the attachment to the mother-country which their noble proffer of aid proves to be so strongly seated in the hearts of the people of this great colony, cannot fail to be deeply gratifying to Her Majesty.

SIR,—I have the honor to enclose herewith copy of a Despatch I have received from Admiral Tryon, commanding Her Majesty's squadron on the Australian station, reporting the proceedings in New Guinea extending the Protectorate of Her Majesty in New Guinea and to other islands.

My LORD,—I have the honor to acquaint Your Excellency that the Queen's Protectorate over New Guinea has been extended from East Cape to Huon Gulf inclusive, with the land adjacent thereto; also to the islands in the Louisiade Archipelago, and to the Woodlark Islands; also to Long Island and to Rook Island.

The Flag has been hoisted at various points.

Proclamations have been made bringing these regions under Her Majesty's protection and jurisdiction in the same manner as the southern coast and the adjacent land and islands with the islands in the Goschen Straits and those of the D'Entrecasteau Group were brought by Proclamation dated the sixth day of November 1884.

Copies of the several Proclamations and of the steps taken will be forwarded so soon as they have been received.

ADDITIONAL LIGHTS, KEPPEL BAY.

NOTICE is hereby given that, on and after this date, the following additional Lights will be exhibited in Keppel Bay:—

Two white lights on Balaklava Island, which, when in line on a S. by W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. bearing, will lead just to the westward of the Timandra Bank Buoy. These lights are catoptric, are 1763 yards apart, and stand at an elevation of 87 and 30 feet respectively.

Two catoptric lights, 54 and 25 feet high respectively, and 860 yards apart—the more northerly being red—will be exhibited from the western shore of Port Alma, south of Eupatoria Point, and when in line on a S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W. bearing, will lead through Sea Reach (with not less than 19 feet at low-water) and Port Alma, the line passing close to the position of the Lightship, and cutting the line of lights on Balaklava Island in 7 fathoms of water.

A third pair of lights will be exhibited from Cardigan Point. These lights are similar to those at Port Alma, being 52 and 25 feet high respectively, and 850 yards apart, and will lead on a "West" southerly bearing to the northward of the Lightship and into Rocky Point Reach abreast Flat Island.

Directions by Night.—After rounding the Timandra Buoy, open the two lights on Balaklava Island slightly to the westward, and keep them in that position until the obscured sector of the light on Little Sea Hill is passed, then open the lights slightly to the eastward and keep them in that position until the lights on Eupatoria Point are nearly in line, then steer for them and bring them into line, which direction will lead to a point just below the new Government wharf at Port Alma.

If going up the Fitzroy River, after getting the Eupatoria Point lights in line, keep them in that position until the red and white lights on Cardigan Point are getting into line, when haul up and steer with them in that position until the steep bank of the channel in Rocky Point Reach is neared, when that shore is to be kept on board and the channel followed as formerly.

The Lightship at the Elbow will be shortly removed, the elbow of the bank being then marked by a red buoy carrying a cage.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

NOTE.—The apparent increase of population in 1884 (29,315) exceeded that in 1883 by 3750, and was also much above that in any year since 1864, when the apparent increase was 29,784. The next highest numbers since 1864 were 26,809 in 1870, and 26,157 in 1880, the latter being the Exhibition year. The exceptionally large increase in 1884 was mainly due to the large excess of arrivals by sea over departures by sea recorded in that year, viz., 14,141, which was 3111 above the similar excess in 1883, 2480 above that in the Exhibition year, and only 236 below that in 1864. The increase by excess of registered births over registered deaths (15,174) was higher than in 1883 by 639, and was also higher than any such increase recorded since 1873, which was the last year of a sixennial period during which the annual excess of births over deaths was much above that recorded in any subsequent year. It should be stated that, whilst it is probable nearly all the deaths and arrivals by sea are noted, there is reason to believe that some births and departures by sea are not recorded; it should also be borne in mind that no attempt is made to take an account of persons who come and go overland. The figures of births and deaths during 1884, and consequently those of population, will probably be slightly altered when the returns of the Deputy Registrars are finally examined. The estimated population of New South Wales at the end of 1884, just published, was 921,129; the increase during the year being 51,819, or about the same as in 1883. With similar increases, Victoria should contain a million inhabitants by the beginning of May 1886, and New South Wales should contain that number about two months later.

The Chairman and Commissioners of the Kyneton Shire Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, for the purposes of the *Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Victorian Water Conservation Acts, 1881, 1883*, make the Regulation following:—

SECTIONS 4, 5, 6, AND 8.

REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by *The Mining on Private Property Act 1884* it was amongst other things enacted that any lease or agreement existing on the 1st day of August 1884, and purporting to give the right to mine in or on private land, and made between the owner of such private land and any other person, might be registered by any of the parties thereto or the assignees thereof, and that upon registration of any such

Sec. 4. lease or agreement any of the parties thereto (other than the owner) or their assignees might make an application for a mining lease of the whole area of such private land the subject of such lease or agreement within four months from the passing of the said Act, or in default thereof the owner might make an application for a mining lease of such private land within a further period of two months next following such four months. And whereas by the said Act it was further enacted that if within six months after the passing of the said Act any such person as aforesaid has not so made application for a mining lease, then any other person claiming the right to mine in or on such private land under any such agreement as aforesaid as a tributer or sub-tributer or upon any other condition than that of paying tribute might, subject to

Sec. 5. regulations to be made as hereinafter provided, register such agreement, and make application for a mining lease in respect of such private land not later than two months after the expiration of six months from the passing of the said Act. And also that, where the person or persons claiming the right to mine in or on any private land under any agreement or agreements either as tributers or sub-tributers or upon any other condition than that of paying tribute

Sec. 6. severally claim a mining lease of such land, the time within which such agreements might be registered, the order of priority to be given to the applications of such persons for a lease of such private land, the conditions on which and the terms within which such mining lease might be granted, and generally with regard thereto, should be determined by Regulations in that behalf to be made by the Governor in Council, which Regulations he might from time to time alter and repeal. And whereas by the said Act it was also enacted that a register should be kept for the purposes of the said Act in accordance with Regulations to be made by the Governor in Council, and that registration of any lease purporting to give the right to mine in or on private land or of any agreement for mining in or on private land should

Sec. 8. consist in recording in such register particulars of such lease or agreement: Now therefore the Governor in Council, in pursuance of the said Act, doth hereby repeal the Regulations made under the provisions of the said Act bearing date the 30th January 1885, and published in the Second Supplement to the *Government Gazette* of the 30th day of January 1885, page 505, and which supplement is dated the 3rd day of February 1885, and, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

1. Every lease or agreement existing on the 1st day of August 1884, and purporting to give the right to mine in or on private land, and made between the owner of such private land and any other person, shall be registered within four months from the passing of *The Mining on Private Property Act 1884*, by leaving in the office of the Registrar-General a true copy thereof verified by statutory declaration, and the Registrar-General shall cause a book to be kept in which shall be entered the particulars set forth in the schedule hereto.

2. Every agreement between any person and the owner of any private land purporting to give such person the right to mine on such land either as a tributer or sub-tributer, or upon any other condition than that of paying tribute, shall be registered in the office of the Registrar-General, and the particulars entered in a book in the manner provided by clause No. 1 of these Regulations within eight months from the passing of *The Mining on Private Property Act 1884*.

3. The order of priority to be given to the applications of such persons mentioned in clause No. 2 of these Regulations for a mining lease of such private land shall be according to the time at which each application for a mining lease shall have been received by the Minister of Mines; and if two or more applications for a mining lease of the same land shall have been received at the same time at the office of the Minister of Mines, then the order of priority shall be determined by the Minister of Mines for the time being, whose decision in that matter shall be final.

4. The conditions on which every such mining lease shall be granted shall be those provided in the twelfth section of *The Mining on Private Property Act 1884*.

PUPIL SURVEYORS AND DRAUGHTSMEN.—
REGULATIONS.

THE Governor in Council has, on the recommendation of the Public Service Board, approved of the subjoined Regulations for Pupil Surveyors and Draughtsmen.

CROWN LANDS DEPARTMENT.—SURVEY BRANCH.—REGULATIONS
FOR PUPIL SURVEYORS AND DRAUGHTSMEN.*Conditions.*

An applicant for appointment must be not more than twenty years or less than sixteen years of age. He will be required to produce a medical certificate to the effect that he is of sound constitution, and not affected with any physical infirmity which would interfere with the proper exercise of his profession. He will also be required to produce satisfactory evidence of having received a good general education, including a competent knowledge of Euclid, algebra, and arithmetic, also a specimen of his plan drawing.

Competitive Examination.

Having duly complied with the foregoing requirements, he will undergo a competitive examination in trigonometrical computation, plotting, and plan drawing, when the competitors to whom shall be awarded a sufficient number of points by the Board of Examiners will be recommended for appointment, subject to the regulations of the department as to probation.

Term of Service.

The pupil's service in the department shall be for a term of four years, the first two of which will be served in the office, where he will be engaged in drawing and computing. He will then (if thought necessary) be examined in trigonometry, including computation of areas and reduction of traverse surveys, also plotting from field-book and plan drawing. If his progress up to this time is not deemed satisfactory he will be liable to be dispensed with, but, if satisfactory, he will be placed under a departmental surveyor for two years for field practice.

Afterwards he will have the privilege of attending for two months at the Melbourne Observatory, where he will be instructed in such branches of practical astronomy as are necessary for the duties he may be called on to perform as a qualified surveyor.

He will be allowed to present himself at the next ensuing examination for land surveyors (without payment of fees), for the purpose of obtaining the formal certificate of the Board of Examiners as to his qualifications.

Remuneration.

He will receive the following remuneration during the term of his pupilage:—1st year, £52; 2nd year, £58; 3rd year, £66; 4th year, £72.

Subject to Regulations.

During the whole term of his pupilage and service in the department he shall be subject to the Regulations for the Public Service of Victoria dated 31st December 1884, or any subsequent substituted or additional regulations.

Bonds required.

Each successful candidate for appointment as pupil surveyor and draughtsman will be required to find two approved sureties, who shall enter into bonds for £150 each for the faithful performance of his duties.

SORRENTO PUBLIC PARK.

WE, Geo. B. Kerferd, W. H. Archer, James McKean, J. V. Günst, J. H. Clough, J. Bracebridge Wilson, a majority of the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Sorrento Public Park, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*.

Regulations.

1. No person shall be permitted to enter or to remain in the park who offends against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
2. No person shall be allowed to cut, stick bills upon, write upon, or otherwise disfigure or injure the gates, fences, seats, or buildings in the park.
3. No person shall in any way injure the trees or shrubs, whether native or exotic, throw stones, commit any nuisance, leave any bottles, orange-peel, paper, cast-off clothing, or other litter in the park, or light a fire therein.
4. No person shall erect any dwelling, booth, tent, or other structure in the park without the consent in writing of the committee of management.
5. No person shall put any horse, cattle, sheep, or goat into the park, or take horses therein without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.
