WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506, § 19, 21, 38, and 39), it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, exercising the powers set forth in subdivision 2 of Part I. of the said Act. And it was also enacted that every Order constituting any new municipality should constitute the same as either a borough or a shire, and should—1. Assign a name to such borough or shire. 2. Describe the boundaries thereof. 3. Determine of how many members the council should consist. 4. Determine whether the municipal district constituted should be subdivided or not; and, in case it should be subdivided, name and describe the subdivisions. And every such Order should take effect according to the tenor of the same; and every such Order constituting any new municipality, having for its municipal district portion of a previously existing municipal district, should operate to sever such portion from such previously existing municipal district. And every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor by the said Act are now exercised upon a petition of the ratepayers of the Shire of Lowan, praying that the area described therein might be constituted a separate municipality (notices of which said petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the same Act): Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order sever the East and part of the Centre Riding from the Shire of Lowan, and doth direct that the portion so severed from such shire shall be constituted a separate municipality under the designation of The Shire of Dimboola: the boundaries of which said shire of Dimboola and also those of the Shire of Lowan, as hereby reduced and re-defined, are as follow, that is to say:—

SHIRE OF LOWAN REDUCED AND RE-DEFINED.

Commencing at a point on the western boundary of the colony sixty-six miles south of the River Murray; thence east by the south boundary of the Shire of Swan Hill to a point true north of the north-east angle of the parish of Yanac-a-Yanac; thence due south towards that angle until the boundary between the counties of Weeah and Lowan is intersected; thence due east by that boundary, being the north boundaries of Mallee allotments 70, 71, 72, 73, 74, and 75, to the north-east angle of the allotment last named; thence south by the east boundary of said allotment to the north-west angle of allotment 81; thence east by the north, and south by the east boundary of said allotment to the north-west angle of the parish of Ni Ni; thence further south by the east boundary of that parish to the north boundary of the parish of Kiata; thence west by part of the north, south by the west, and east by part of the south boundaries of the parish of Kiata to the north-west angle of the parish of Woraigworm; thence south by the west boundaries of that parish and of Mallee allotment 21 to the south-west angle of that allotment; thence east by the south boundary of allotments 21, 24, and part of 124 to the intersection with the north-west boundary of the Wyn Wyn Run; thence south-westerly and southerly by the north-western and western boundaries of the Wyn Wyn Run to the south-east angle of Spring Hill Run; thence south-westerly by the south-eastern boundaries of the Spring Hill and Spring

The births of 856 children, viz., 457 boys and 399 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of February. In the month of January 987 births were registered, or 131 more than in the month under review. The births were 198 above the average of the previous ten years, but only 82 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in February numbered 618, viz., 345 of males, and 273 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 238. The deaths outnumbered those in January by 26, and exceeded the average of February during the previous ten years by 121. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been lower than the average in those ten years by 31.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was 2.65, and of deaths registered 1.91.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 101.6° on the 5th, and the lowest was 46.1° on the 3rd. The mean temperature of the month (64.3°) was nearly 2 degrees below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (45.4°) took place on the 3rd, viz., from a maximum of 91.5° to a minimum of 46.1°. The least range (9.7°) was on the 13th, viz., from a maximum of 61.0° to a minimum of 51.3°. The mean daily range was 21.6°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.841 inches) was a fraction lower than the average.

Males contributed 56 per cent., and females 44 per cent., to the total mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 43 per cent. to that mortality, as against 40 per cent. in February 1884; 42 per cent. in February 1883; 46 per cent. in February 1882; 45 per cent. in February 1881; 52 per cent. in February 1880; 45 per cent. in February 1879; 52 per cent. in February 1878; 51 per cent. in February 1877; 53 per cent. in February 1876; and 63 per cent. in February 1875.

Twenty-one deaths of persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these:—A ham curer, aged 75, died of bronchitis; a male, of no occupation, aged 75, a carpenter, aged 75, a lanker, aged 78, and a master mariner, aged 83, of heart disease; a wool sorter, aged 76, of gastritis; a female, aged 76, of injury to the hip; a female, aged 76, of a fracture; a female, aged 77, and a laborer, aged 81, of paralysis; a female, aged 80, of brain disease; a female, aged 82, of diarrhoea; a farmer, aged 85, of cancer; a female, aged 78, a female, aged 79, a gentleman and a female, each aged 82, 3 females, each aged 85, and a blacksmith, aged 86, of old age.

As many as 32 deaths from external causes were recorded during the month, of which 28 were ascribed to accident, 2 to homicide, and 2 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A boy, aged 9, was killed by a roller, and a shunter, aged 21, by a train passing over him; a baker, aged 32, died of internal injuries, caused by the falling of a loft which had been overloaded with flour; a bricklayer, aged 55, of concussion of the brain, how received not stated; a furniture dealer, aged 47, of fracture of the knee-joint, and a female, aged 76, of fracture of the neck; a laborer, aged 49, and a gardener, aged 59, were killed by falling from a height; a male, of occupation unknown, aged 60, died of fracture of the skull and other injuries, and a female, aged 76, of injury to the hip—both resulting from a fall whilst drunk; a laborer, aged 44, and a groom, aged 63, were killed, the former by a lorry-wheel and the latter by a cart-wheel passing over him; a female servant, aged 16, and 2 dressmakers, aged respectively 18 and 25, died of burns, occasioned by their dresses catching fire; and a draper, aged 40, was poisoned by an overdose of morphia. A boy, aged 10, was drowned whilst fishing; a milk-cart driver, aged 19, whilst bathing at St. Kilda; a seaman, aged 20, in the River Yarra; and a master-at-arms, aged 44, in Hobson's Bay. A storeman, aged 24, an artist, aged 27, a male, of occupation unknown, aged 40, a laborer, aged 45, and a coast-pilot aged 52, were found drowned in the River Yarra; 2 female children, aged 1 and 2 months respectively, were overlain; and a female, aged 38, died of inhalation of methylene, prior to undergoing an operation. The homicidal deaths were those of a female infant whose skull was fractured at birth, and of a nightman, aged 31, who was passed over by a vehicle—verdict of manslaughter against the driver. The suicidal deaths were those of a bootmaker, aged 20, who shot himself in the head, and of a male, occupation unknown, aged 49, who cut his throat. Both these men were set down as temporarily insane.

One hundred and four deaths, or 17 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—53 in the Melbourne Hospital, 12 in the Alfred Hospital, 1 in the Homoeopathic Hospital, 2 in the Children's Hospital, 11 in the Lying-in Hospital, 7 in the Immigrants' Home, 6 in the Benevolent Asylum, 1 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 7 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 1 in the Austin Hospital, and 3 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 297, of which 150, or 50 per cent., were of males, and 147, or 50 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 234 were under one year of age, 38 were between one and two, 13 were between two and three, 6 were between three and four, and 6 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 321. Of these, 195, or 61 per cent., were males, and 126, or 39 per cent., were females; 10 were between five and ten, 4 were between ten and fifteen, 13 were between fifteen and twenty, 31 were between twenty and twenty-five, 29 were between twenty-five and thirty, 21 were between thirty and thirty-five, 20 were between thirty-five and forty, 28 were between forty and forty-five, 24 were between forty-five and fifty, 38 were between fifty and fifty-five, 25 were between fifty-five and sixty, 22 were between sixty and sixty-five, 17 were between sixty-five and seventy, 15 were between seventy and seventy-five, 10 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 11 were upwards of eighty.

As compared with the previous month, deaths from zymotic diseases decreased from 129 to 115. Under this head, deaths from measles fell from 3 to 1, those from whooping-cough from 9 to 2, those from dysentery and diarrhoea from 64 to 53, those from pyæmia, &c., from 4 to nil, and those from want of breast milk from 14 to 9. On the other hand, deaths from diphtheria rose from nil to 5, and those from typhoid fever from 12 to 25. Deaths from constitutional diseases increased from 109 in January to 120 in February, the increase being confined chiefly to deaths from cancer, which rose from 18 to 21, and those from phthisis, which rose from 64 to 70.

DISTRICTS WHERE PUBLICANS' LICENSES MAY BE SPECIALLY GRANTED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Licensing Act 1876* (No. 566, section 44) it was amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding the provisions thereinbefore contained, it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim any place or district a place or district where, owing to a sudden increase of population or otherwise, the necessity for the immediate grant of publicans' licenses exists to be a place or district wherein publicans' licenses might be specially granted, and from time to time to revoke any such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the districts hereinafter mentioned to be districts where publicans' licenses may be specially granted under the provisions of the 44th section of the said Act, that is to say:—

1. A quarter of a mile radius from a point situate at the junction of Sunbury, Oaklands, and Essendon main roads, in the shire of Broadmeadows.

2. That portion of the Howqua subdivision of the shire of Howqua between the Jamieson subdivision and the Mansfield boundary.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this thirty-first day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, and in the forty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign.

All rules and regulations made before the seventeenth day of March, in the year One thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, under the authority of *The Discipline Act 1870*, which apply to the Victorian Naval Reserve, are, so far as the same apply to the said Victorian Naval Reserve, hereby repealed.

And the Honorable Frederick Thomas Sargood, Her Majesty's Minister of Defence for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

TOURISTS' TICKETS.

Tourists' tickets, not available for breaking journey between starting and first terminating station, but available for so doing at certain stations on the return journey, are still issued daily at Melbourne, Ballarat, Geelong, Sandhurst, Castlemaine, and Maryborough stations, available for return for 30 days. They will continue to be issued till the 30th April, and full particulars and fares may be obtained from the book time-table and posters at stations.

EASTER EXCURSIONS.

Holiday Excursion tickets will be issued to and from all stations, Deniliquin and Moama Line included (suburban lines excepted), from 30th March to 8th April, both dates inclusive (Sundays excepted), available for return for one calendar month from date of issue. Example.—An excursion ticket issued on the 30th March will be available till the 30th April. When the last day falls on a Sunday the ticket will be available till next day. The journey must be commenced on the day the ticket is issued, but after a distance of 15 miles has been travelled the journey may be broken at the discretion of the passenger.

Sydney Excursion Tickets.—From the 30th March to the 7th April, both dates inclusive, excursion tickets will be issued at Melbourne to Sydney at the following return fares:—1st class, £5 6s. 8d.; 2nd class, £4. These tickets will be available for two calendar months from date of issue, but will not be available for the express train on the New South Wales Line.

Luggage.—Excursion passengers will only be allowed to carry such luggage free as can be stowed under the seats without inconvenience to other passengers, and those who have luggage for the van must be at the station half-an-hour before the train starts, and pay excess luggage rate for it.

Horses and Vehicles.—From the 1st to the 15th April, both dates inclusive, the Department cannot engage to forward horses and vehicles by any particular train.

Commercial Travellers' Samples.—From the 2nd to the 8th April commercial travellers' samples will not be taken to or from roadside stations except by mixed or goods trains.

Parcels.—On the 2nd April parcels must be at Melbourne Parcels Office 30 minutes before the starting time of ordinary trains.

North Melbourne and Newmarket Stations.—From the 2nd to the 6th April tickets will not be issued at North Melbourne and Newmarket Stations for up-country stations, and down-country trains will not stop there. On the same dates the up North-Eastern trains will not stop at Newmarket. The 5.5 p.m. down and 6.43 a.m. up mixed trains are excepted from the foregoing arrangement.

Goods Shed Holidays.—The 3rd and 6th April will be observed as holidays in the Goods branch, and goods trains will not run. Perishable goods will, however, be delivered at all stations on application. Consignors and consignees of powder can ascertain from the Stationmaster at Footscray when explosives will be received, in lieu of these dates.

Northern System.—In addition to the ordinary trains running between Melbourne and Sandhurst, extra trains will be run from the 2nd to the 7th April, stopping at Sunbury, Woodend, Kyneton, and Castlemaine only. They will precede the ordinary trains and will arrive at the terminal from 20 to 35 minutes earlier. On the 2nd April the extra trains will leave Melbourne at 12.10, 3.10, 3.25, and 7.3 p.m. In addition a late train will leave Melbourne at 7.20 p.m. stopping at all stations to Sandhurst, and passengers for Daylesford and Lancefield lines may travel by it. The 3.10 and 3.25 p.m. specials on the 2nd April will start from the Essendon platform. Passengers for the Daylesford, Maryborough, Donald, Wychebrook, Kerang, and Echuca lines may travel by any of the extra trains which connect with the branches named. On the 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 6th and 7th April an extra train will leave Kyneton at 4.55 p.m., stopping at all stations thence to Melbourne. Day excursionists from Melbourne are recommended to return by this train. Daylesford line, on the 2nd, 4th, and 6th April, an extra train will run between Daylesford and Woodend in connection with the last main line passenger trains. It will leave Daylesford at 8 p.m. and return at 9.40 p.m.

Western System.—From the 2nd to the 7th April inclusive, all trains for Geelong and Ballarat will start from the Essendon platform. On the 2nd April an extra train will leave Melbourne at 4 p.m., stopping at Geelong, Ballarat East, and Ballarat only. Passengers for stations beyond Ballarat may travel by the 4 p.m. train. By the ordinary trains leaving Melbourne at 11.10 a.m. and 7 p.m. on 2nd April, 6.30 a.m. and 11.10 a.m. on 3rd, 4th, and 6th April, certain carriages will be set apart for Geelong and Ballarat passengers only, and will be denoted by placards. A Bye-law of the Borough of St. Kilda made under section 213 of "The Local Government Act 1874," and numbered 57, for regulating the traffic through and over the roads and streets of the borough and for preserving order therein.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Local Government Act 1874," the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of St. Kilda order as follows :—

1. All persons standing or loitering upon any of the carriage-ways, footways, or other public places of the borough, shall discontinue to do so on requirement by any member or the police force.

2. Any street musician or vocalist shall, when required by any householder or his servant, or by any member of the police force, depart from the neighborhood of the premises of such householder.

3. No procession of persons or of vehicles, or both, for other than funeral purposes, shall parade or pass through any of the streets, unless with the previous consent in writing of the mayor, or in his absence, the town clerk of the borough, and only by the route specified in such consent, nor unless and until the recipient of such consent shall have given at the least twenty-four hours' notice, with particulars of such consent and route to the officer in charge of the borough police.

4. Whenever for the prevention of accident or the maintenance of order, and for such time as by notice, in writing, under the hand or by the direction of the mayor, or in his absence or in case of sudden emergency under the hand of the town clerk or the officer in charge of police stationed at St. Kilda, any carriage-way, footway, street, or other public place shall be declared to be closed against traffic of vehicles or persons, or both, the drivers of vehicles and all persons contemplated by such notice shall, when so required by any member of the police force, obey and conform to such notice by abstaining from going or by withdrawing and removing from where mentioned therein. And the drivers of all vehicles, whether private or public, which may be there, whether plying for hire on any duly appointed stand or otherwise, shall, when so required by any member of police force, remove their vehicles thence, and if desiring to remain in the vicinity, shall proceed to any other carriage-way, street, or public place, which may be indicated by the police for that purpose, and there arrange and order their vehicles in manner directed by any member of the police force.

A Bye-law of the Borough of St. Kilda, made under section 213 of the "Local Government Act 1874," and numbered 60, for the suppression of cattle wandering in the streets and other places in the Borough.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the "Local Government Act 1874," the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of St. Kilda order as follows :—Sections 41 and 42 of subdivision 9, Part One, of the "Local Government Act 1874," is hereby adopted in and for the Borough of St. Kilda.

41. That from and after the date of this bye-law coming into operation if any cattle shall be found upon any land not being a common and such that there is no fence, whether upon the same land or any other dividing such first-mentioned land from any street or road, whether public or private, without any person having charge of such cattle, the owner of such cattle shall forfeit a sum not exceeding 20s. for every head of such cattle, and the proper officer of the council may seize such cattle and place the same at some neighboring place of safe custody; and any justice, if such owner be not known, upon proof of the issue of a summons, in the usual form addressed to such owner as "owner" only, without otherwise naming or describing him, such cattle and the place of seizure being duly described therein, and of the publication of such summons in some newspaper commonly circulating in the neighborhood, may, after the expiration of twenty-four hours from such publication, proceed with respect to such owner not appearing as if personal service of a summons stating his name had been effected, or if such owner appear, then as in other cases; and the justices may order the cattle to be sold and the money arising from the sale, after deducting the said penalty and the costs awarded, and the reasonable expenses, to be estimated and assessed by the justice, of seizing, keeping, and selling the said cattle, shall be paid if demanded within one month to the owner of the cattle, and if not so demanded then to the municipal fund; and if the said money shall not be sufficient for all the purposes aforesaid the amount whereby the same falls short, or if no such sale be ordered the whole of the said amount may be recovered from the said owner if and when known in like manner as other penalties and sums adjudged or ordered to be paid by justices are to be recovered.

42. If any cattle be at any time found in any street without any person having the charge thereof, the owner of such cattle shall forfeit for every head of such cattle a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings, and if such cattle shall, by reason of having been so found at large, have been impounded by the council, the amount of such penalty and costs, if adjudged respectively before the release or sale of such cattle, shall be added to the pound fees and charges payable in respect of such cattle; and the amount thereof, or such lesser amount (if any) as after the sale of the cattle may remain in the hands of the poundkeeper, shall be paid over by him accordingly; and if the proceeds of any sale of such cattle shall not be sufficient after paying the lawful fees and charges aforesaid to satisfy such penalty and costs, or if such penalty and costs shall have been adjudged after the release or sale of the cattle, the same, or so much thereof as remains unpaid, shall and may be recovered from the owner of the cattle in like manner as other penalties and costs adjudged by justices are by law to be recovered; and if in the case of any information under this section the owner be not known, then the provisions of the last preceding section, so far as necessary to give the adjudicating justice jurisdiction, shall apply.
