## IMPORTANT NOTICE TO MARINERS.—VICTORIA.

PORT PHILLIP HEADS AND CHANNELS.

*Extinguishing of Lights and Removal of Buoys, also Exhibition of Electric Lights.*

**M**ASTERS of vessels and others are hereby informed that it may be necessary for the safety of the Port and the protection of life and property to, at any moment, remove the facilities now afforded for the safe navigation of Port Phillip.

As a warning that such steps have been taken, and that no vessel will be permitted to enter Port Phillip Heads between sunset and sunrise, the *Point Lonsdale* and *Queenscliffe* high and low lights will be *extinguished*.

The master or pilot of any vessel entering Port Phillip Heads between sunrise and sunset will be informed by the officer stationed at Queenscliffe whether he may proceed through the channel or whether he must be piloted by a duly licensed pilot, specially instructed.

Immediately after the foregoing lights have been extinguished the following action will be taken:—

The lights in the South and West Channels will also be *extinguished*.

### BOATS.

The present system of buoyage in the South, West, and Cole's Channels will be either entirely removed or displaced, rendering the navigation therein dangerous, excepting to duly licensed pilots, specially instructed, who alone will be advised of existing dangers, and of the guiding marks which will, from time to time, be established for the purpose of facilitating the safe navigation of such channels during day light.

### PILOTAGE.

*Vessels prohibited from entering Port Phillip Heads between sunset and sunrise.*

No vessel will be permitted to enter Port Phillip Heads between sunset and sunrise. The pilot schooner will be withdrawn from the outside station from sunset to sunrise, but provision will be made for cruising outside and piloting vessels between sunrise and sunset only.

### Caution.—Electric Lights.

At the present juncture the Defence Department may at any time exhibit one or more Electric Lights from the vicinities of Queenscliffe and Point Nepean. Such lights will be at least 60 feet below any of the present lights, and must not be taken as guiding lights, as they will be dangerously misleading for navigating purposes, their object being a means of guarding the entrance to Port Phillip.

Buoys painted red, and mounted with red flags, will be placed between certain points marked off by such buoys, and no vessels or boats will, under any circumstances, be permitted to pass within such points. From sunset to sunrise red lights will be exhibited at that opening of the channel.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Licensing Act 1876* (No. 566, section 14) it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time upon the application in writing of the council of any municipality to proclaim any part of the municipal district of such municipality, to be defined by such Council, not being a borough having a population of five hundred persons liable to be rated, as shown by the rate-book, a special area; and it was further enacted that the fee which should be paid for a publican's license in respect of premises situated within a special area should be Ten pounds only; and the Governor in Council might from time to time revoke any proclamation made under the authority of the above recited section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim as a special area under the provisions of the fourteenth section of the above in part recited Act, the locality hereinafter mentioned, within which the fee to be paid for a publican's license shall be Ten pounds only, that is to say:—

All that area, comprising part of portion 4 of section 15, parish of Irrewarra, commencing at the north-east corner of said section, and bounded on the north by the Government main Geelong road, being a line bearing westerly to a Government road dividing the said area from portion 3 of said section 15; on the west and south by said road, and on the east by a Government road known as the Cemetery road, being a line bearing north to the commencing point, within the Shire of Colac.

The births of 1,047 children, viz., 556 boys and 491 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of March. In the month of February 850 births were registered, or 191 less than in the month under review. The births were 269 above the average of the previous ten years, but only 132 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in March numbered 630, viz., 354 of males, and 276 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 417. The deaths outnumbered those in February by 12, and exceeded the average of March during the previous ten years by 83. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been below the average in those ten years by 13.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was 3.24, and of deaths registered 1.95.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 95.2° on the 18th, and the lowest was 42.5° on the 21st. The mean temperature of the month (61.5°) was 2½ degrees below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (39.9°) took place on the 10th, viz., from a maximum of 87.0° to a minimum of 47.1°. The least range (9.1°) was on the 26th and 27th, viz., on the former, from a maximum of 67.1° to a minimum of 58.0°, and on the latter from a maximum of 62.7° to a minimum of 53.6°. The mean daily range was 20.4°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.925 inches) was a fraction below the average.

Rain fell on 11 days, the amount of rainfall being 2.39 inches.

Males contributed 56 per cent., and females 44 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 41 per cent. to that mortality, as against 42 per cent. in March 1884; 37 per cent. in March 1883; 43 per cent. in March 1882 and 1881; 47 per cent. in March 1880 and 1879; 49 per cent. in March 1878 and 1877; 50 per cent. in March 1876; and 58 per cent. in March 1875.

The deaths of persons of 75 years of age or upwards were above the average, and numbered 25, viz.:—Those of a female, aged 76, and a male pensioner, aged 78, who died of apoplexy; a laundress, aged 76, of pneumonia; a carpenter, aged 78, of typhoid fever; a female, aged 78, of bronchitis; a gentleman, aged 77, of gastritis; a miner, aged 83, of paralysis; a laborer, aged 79, and a female, aged 93, of liver disease; a laborer, aged 82, and a gentleman, aged 86, of heart disease; a female, aged 84, who drowned herself; a painter, aged 86, who died of dropsy, and a baker, aged 75, a male cook, aged 76, a laborer and a widow, each aged 77, a carpenter and 2 females, each aged 78, a male, of occupation unknown, aged 80, a female, aged 83, a dairyman, aged 84, a dentist, aged 85, and a gentleman, aged 92, of old age.

Twenty-eight deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which 17 were set down to accident, 3 to homicide, and 8 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A fireman, aged 31, died of fracture of the pelvis; a cabinet-maker, aged 50, and a laborer, aged 53, of fracture of the skull, a gardener, aged 50, of injuries to the head—all resulting from falls; a seaman, aged 25, died of injuries to the head, caused by a fall of stone; a stoker on board the *Nelson*, aged 28, was killed by a blow from a huge piece of metal; a laborer, aged 45, and a railway gate-keeper, aged 62, died of injuries received from being struck by railway engines; a laborer, aged 56, was passed over by a train; a draper, aged 74, died of fracture of the arm, cause not stated; a bootmaker, aged 27, was shot at the Williamstown Butts whilst practising firing, there being no evidence to show who fired the shot; an apprentice, aged 18, died of scalds, resulting from the explosion of a boiler; a law clerk, aged 27, was poisoned by taking chlorodyne inadvertently; a gardener, aged 70, was poisoned with carbolic acid, taken in mistake for porter; a male, aged 40, of occupation unstated, and a female, aged 60, were found drowned in the River Yarra; and a new-born female infant died of umbilical hemorrhage. The homicidal deaths were those of a male infant, which was suffocated at birth; and of 2 new-born female infants, one of which died from the effects of exposure, and the other was drowned in the Saltwater River. The suicidal deaths were those of a carpenter, aged 28, of a fisherman, aged 31, of a merchant, aged 35, and of a female, aged 40, who cut their throats; of a chemist, aged 23, who poisoned himself with opium; and of an ironmoulder, aged 33, and of 2 females, aged 39 and 84, who drowned themselves.

One hundred and ten deaths, or 17 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—53 in the Melbourne Hospital, 9 in the Alfred Hospital, 1 in the Homeopathic Hospital, 5 in the Children's Hospital, 4 in the Lying-in Hospital, 7 in the Immigrants' Home, 12 in the Benevolent Asylum, 5 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 3 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 3 in the Austin Hospital, 4 in the Melbourne Gaol, 2 in the Pentridge Stockade, and 2 in the Protestant Refuge.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 261, of which 148, or 57 per cent., were of males, and 113, or 43 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 206 were under one year of age, 38 were between one and two, 5 were between two and three, 6 were between three and four, and 6 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 369. Of these, 206, or 56 per cent., were males, and 163, or 44 per cent., were females; 14 were between five and ten, 7 were between ten and fifteen, 16 were between fifteen and twenty, 35 were between twenty and twenty-five, 31 were between twenty-five and thirty, 28 were between thirty and thirty-five, 24 were between thirty-five and forty, 24 were between forty and forty-five, 28 were between forty-five and fifty, 34 were between fifty and fifty-five, 18 were between fifty-five and sixty, 33 were between sixty and sixty-five, 26 were between sixty-five and seventy, 26 were between seventy and seventy-five, 14 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 11 were upwards of eighty.

In March, as compared with the previous month, a decrease took place in deaths from typhoid fever, which fell from 25 to 23; in those from dysentery and diarrhoea, which fell from 53 to 46; in those from want of breast-milk, which fell from 9 to 4; and in those from tabes mesenterica, which fell from 10 to 6. On the other hand, an increase took place in deaths from intemperance, which rose from 4 to 8; in those from phthisis, which rose from 70 to 89; and in those from old age, which rose from 11 to 21. Four deaths of child-bearing women occurred, which is a number below the average. Comparing these with the births (1047) a proportion is obtained of 1 death of a mother to every to 262 children born alive.

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REGULATIONS UNDER "THE DISEASES IN STOCK  
ACT 1872."

INTRODUCTION OF CAMELS, DEER, ETC.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-eighth  
day of April 1885.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor.

WHEREAS by The Diseases in Stock Act 1872 among other things the Governor in Council is empowered from time to time to make orders and regulations for the purposes therein mentioned, and to rescind the same. And whereas from time to time, and in particular by an Order in Council, dated the 19th day of March 1880, the Governor in Council has made divers orders and regulations under the powers conferred by the said Act.

And whereas it is desirable to make regulations with regard to the introduction of camels, deer, antelopes, and goats.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the above recited Act, and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, order as follows, that is to say:—

1. *Extension of Act No. 451, and the regulations under it, to camels, deer, antelopes, and goats.*—Camels, deer, antelopes, and goats shall henceforth be deemed to be included in the third schedule of the said regulations of the 19th day of March 1880, and the said regulations shall henceforth be construed accordingly.

2. *Camels of burden.*—The 13th section of the said regulations shall extend to camels used for the purposes mentioned in such regulations.

3. *Landing of camels, deer, antelopes, and goats certified free from infection.*—Upon receiving the certificate mentioned in the 23rd section of the said regulations that any camel, deer, antelope, or goat is free from every infectious or contagious disease, whether mentioned in the Second Schedule to the said regulations or not, the Chief Inspector of Stock shall permit the same to be landed, and it shall not be necessary for the inspector of stock granting such certificate to cause a notice in the form in the Seventh Schedule to the said regulations to be delivered to the master of the vessel on board which the same may be.

4. *Camel, deer, antelope, or goat suffering from scab, scabies, or lice.*—Should any such camel, deer, antelope, or goat be free from all other infection, but suffering from scab or scabies or lice, the veterinary surgeon and inspector of stock inspecting the same shall certify accordingly; and as soon as conveniently may be after the granting of such certificate the inspector granting the same shall cause to be delivered to the master of the vessel on board which the same may be a notice in the form or to the effect in the First Schedule hereto.

5. *Application to inspector in case of camel, deer, antelope, or goat suffering from scab, scabies, or lice.*—At the time of depositing the sum mentioned in such notice with the inspector of stock, the owner or consignee of the stock or, if there is no owner or consignee in Victoria, the master of the vessel in which the stock arrived, shall sign and deliver to the inspector of stock an application in the form in the Second Schedule hereto.

6. *Removal to quarantine ground of camel, &c., suffering from scab, &c.*—On receipt of the deposit and application hereinbefore mentioned, and the execution of the bond as hereinbefore required, and compliance with all the regulations in force in that behalf, the inspector of stock may allow such stock to be conveyed to some quarantine ground determined by the Governor in Council, or to some store or place of which the Chief Inspector of Stock may by writing under his hand approve for that purpose, and which shall be deemed a quarantine ground.

7. *Extension of certain regulations relating to cattle and sheep to camels, deer, antelopes, and goats.*—In sections 26 and 27 of the said regulations cattle and sheep shall be deemed to include camels, deer, antelopes, and goats certified under the regulations to be free from other infection, but to be suffering from scab, scabies, or lice.

No. 812, Sec. 136) power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein specified: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulation, that is to say:—

REGULATION.

Leases under section 91 of The Land Act 1884 shall be in the form of Schedule A hereto.

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shall and will during the same term bear pay and discharge all and all manner of taxes rates duties charges assessments and impositions whatsoever whether the same be payable by landlord or tenant or partly by each in respect of the land and premises hereby demised and shall and will use the said land and premises hereby demised for the purpose aforesaid and for no other purpose whatsoever And also shall and will furnish when required during the said term to the Governor of the said colony or the Registrar-General for the time being such returns particulars and statistics of the operations theretofore carried on or to be carried on upon the said land and the results thereof as such Governor or Registrar-General may from time to time in that behalf require accompanied by a statutory declaration of the truth and correctness thereof And also that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty her heirs successors and assigns or her or their servants and agents or the servants and officers of The Board of Land and Works of the Colony of Victoria at all proper and seasonable times during the said term without any interruption or disturbance from the lessee executors administrators or assigns agents workmen or servants to enter into and upon the said land works and premises hereby demised or any part thereof to view and examine the state and condition thereof And also shall and will make such arrangements for the prevention of nuisance and for the observance of decency and adopt such sanitary measures generally as the Governor in Council may from time to time approve of or require And also that if the lessee executors administrators or assigns shall fail at any time during the said term to use the said land and premises for the purpose aforesaid these presents shall be voidable and the said term may be determined as hereinafter provided And further that the lessee executors administrators or licensed assigns shall not nor will assign set over mortgage charge or otherwise part with or encumber this present Indenture of Lease or the premises hereby demised or any part or parts thereof unto any person or persons whomsoever without the consent in writing of the Governor of the said colony or other person or persons authorized for the time being to grant leases of Crown lands for the purpose for which to any valuation or compensation for any improvements effected on the said land and premises or to any renewal of this lease Provided also and it is hereby expressly declared and agreed and these presents are upon this express condition that if the lessee executors administrators or assigns shall at any time during the continuance of this demise fail to use the demised land and premises *bona fide* for the purpose aforesaid or shall use the same for any other purpose or if and whenever any part of the rent hereinbefore reserved shall be in arrears for one week whether the same shall have been demanded or not or if and whenever there shall be a breach of any of the covenants conditions and provisoes hereinbefore contained by the lessee executors administrators or assigns then and in such case it shall thereupon be lawful for the Governor in Council to declare this lease to be forfeited and then Her Majesty her heirs and successors or assigns by her or their agents or officers authorized by the Governor in Council for that purpose or any bailiff of Crown lands may enter forthwith into and upon the said demised premises and repossess and enjoy the same as fully and ## PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1884* it was amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding anything therein before contained, the Governor might by Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, should cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber or particular description of timber or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth, from such portions of Crown lands as were named in such Proclamation, or should exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of Part VIII. of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall dig or remove loam or other earth on or from such Crown lands in the parish of Corio, in the county of Grant, as have not been reserved or set apart for the purpose.—(84.G.20417.)

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and seal of the said Colony, bearing date the thirteenth day of July One thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, and made in pursuance of *The Land Act 1869*, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, did declare that no person, although duly licensed or otherwise authorized, should cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick or other earth from such portions of Crown lands as were permanently reserved around any lakes, lagoons, rivers, creeks, bays, or fronting the Southern Ocean, or Bass Straits: And whereas by another Proclamation, under the hand of the Governor and seal of the Colony aforesaid, bearing date the twenty-third day of July One thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, made in pursuance of the said Act, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, did declare that no person, although duly licensed or otherwise authorized, should remove stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth from the foreshore of Port Phillip Bay or from any Crown land situate within a distance of one chain from high-water mark in the said bay: And whereas it is expedient to revoke in part the said Proclamations: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the said Proclamations, bearing date respectively the thirteenth day of July One thousand eight hundred and seventy-four and the twenty-third day of July One thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, so far as they severally affect the removal of shells from the foreshore of Swan Bay.

5. Potatoes to be dry and free from dirt. Contractors to supply 105 lbs. of potatoes for each cental credited to them, and, in addition, to take back all rejected before being cooked.

6. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of department concerned.

7. The order issued by the head of department must accompany the goods, and the account is to be rendered simultaneously with the delivery of the supplies. For the supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts, the account is to be rendered monthly for such quantities only as are issued, the difference between the supply and issue to be kept at the contractor's credit. Supplies not issued at the termination of the contract to be removed by the contractor. The rates or quantities quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.

8. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the time mentioned in the order, they will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account.

9. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a board of survey composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final. In the event of the decision being against the contractor, the survey fees and expenses (if any) will be deducted as in clause 8.

10. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which it will be procured by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 8.

11. In the case of supplies for lunatic asylums, it will be competent for a board of survey, consisting of the medical superintendent (or, in his absence, of the deputy medical superintendent) and any two officers named by him, to examine and reject any supplies that may be objected to. It must be distinctly understood, however, that the contractor will have a right of appeal to the Treasurer; but pending such appeal, he must take back the rejected articles and at once supply others of approved quality; failing which the supplies required may be obtained by the officer concerned, and the expense charged to the contractor.

12. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the persons to whom the rations are due or to the contractor in waiting for a board to survey, the head of the department, or officer in charge of the station, will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 8.

13. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivery or replacing them when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government to terminate the contract forthwith.

15. 16. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts made by the Imperial Commissariat, or on account of other Governments; or by the consumption of the produce or surplus stock of any Government establishment; or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment.

17. In the event of any alteration in the tariff affecting any of the items included in these contracts, the Government, or the contractor, as may be the case, will make a proportionate allowance by way of deduction from or increase of the price of the item so affected.

#### SHIRE OF BRAYBROOK.

By-law No. 1 under "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883."

**IN** pursuance of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and of every other power enabling them in that behalf, the Local Board of Health for the Shire of Braybrook for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within its jurisdiction, doth hereby make the by-law following, that is to say:—

##### Interpretation of Terms.

1. In the construction and for the purposes of this by-law, the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them.

"House" shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed public-houses, factories, work-rooms, common or other lodging-houses, or other buildings or premises.

"Cesspool" shall mean any receptacle for night-soil or for noxious or offensive matter below or above the ground.

"Street" shall mean and include any highway and any public bridge, and any road, lane, footway, square, court, alley, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not.

##### Premises to be kept so as not to be a Nuisance.

2. Every occupier or person having the management or control of any house or premises shall cause the same to be kept in such a state as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

##### Removal of Refuse from Houses.

3. Every occupier of a house or premises shall remove therefrom all dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, or such other refuse matter produced or accumulated thereon once every week, and in case of the default of such occupier the Local Board of Health may remove the same.

##### Receptacles for House Refuse.

4. Every occupier of a house or premises shall provide and keep thereon a box or some other covered receptacle for the temporary deposit of house refuse, which box or receptacle shall be of such dimensions as that the same may, with the contents thereof, when full, be readily and conveniently movable by one man, or so many such boxes or receptacles as may be necessary to contain all the house refuse produced or accumulated on such premises during one week; and shall cause all house refuse to be deposited as soon as conveniently may be in some such box or receptacle.

##### Removal of Refuse from Places where Animals are kept.

5. Every occupier of land on which is erected any stable, shed, sty, yard, or other place for the keeping of animals shall from time to time remove from such premises all dung, soil, or other manure produced or accumulated thereon as often as the same shall amount to two cubic yards or once at least every week; and in case of the default of such occupier the Local Board may remove the same.

##### Power to use Refuse as Manure.

6. Nothing contained in the foregoing by-laws shall be taken to prevent the occupier of any premises from causing any dung, soil, or other refuse matter produced or accumulated on any premises to be at any time removed, or to be used as manure on any garden or land, or to be kept for the purpose of being used on any garden or land contiguous to such premises as manure, so that the same be not so removed, kept, or used as to contravene any by-law of the Local Board of Health, or so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

##### Removal of Refuse from Places where Noxious or Offensive Trades are carried on.

7. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of premises used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, or manufactory whatsoever shall cause all rubbish, filth, offal, soil, or other offensive matters, and all waste products of such manufacture from which effluvia may arise, to be removed from such premises once at least in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and so that no noxious or offensive effluvia arise therefrom; and if any such occupier or

person shall neglect or fail to have removed any such offensive matter or waste products as aforesaid, the same may be removed by the Local Board of Health.

##### Removal of Blood from Places where Animals are Slaughtered.

8. Every occupier, licensee, or person having the management or control of an abattoir, slaughter-house, or place where any cattle or other animals are killed, shall cause all the blood from the animals killed therein, as soon as conveniently may be, to be collected in a fit receptacle to be provided for that purpose, and to be effectually deodorized by mixing therewith commercial sulphate of iron or chloride of lime in the proportion of 1lb. to the gallon, or some other efficient deodorizer sufficient to effectually deodorize the same, and to be removed from the premises within twenty-four hours after such blood is shed.

##### Removal of Offal.

9. Every occupier of any premises on which may be any offal shall forthwith effectually deodorize the same, and remove the same from the premises within twenty-four hours.

##### Construction of Privies.

10. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than three inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be provided with a suitable pan or other movable receptacle for night-soil, the content whereof does not exceed six cubic feet, and with the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptacle and the contents thereof, and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, work-room, or common lodging-house, and every public privy, shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material having a fall or inclination towards the door or other opening of at least half-an-inch to the foot.

##### Supply of Deodorizing Material to Earth-closets.

11. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth-closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

##### Emptying Receptacles for Night-soil.

12. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises once at least in every week shall empty or cleanse, or cause to be emptied or cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.

##### Removal of Night-soil to be by properly constructed Conveyances.

13. No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents or of any portion thereof, or of effluvia therefrom.

##### Hours within which Night-soil may be removed.

14. No person shall empty, assist in emptying, or cause or permit to be emptied, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, except between the hours of 11 p.m. and 5 a.m., or until the contents thereof have been properly deodorized; and every person emptying, or causing to be emptied, any earth-closets, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, shall cause the night-soil taken therefrom to be removed so soon as the same is emptied.

##### Construction of Cesspools.

15. Every cesspool shall be furnished with a water-tight cover or roof, and every cesspool which shall be formed or made below the surface of the ground shall be constructed with water-tight walls or sides which project on all sides at least 6 inches above the surface of the ground.

##### Emptying of Cesspools.

16. Every occupier of premises, and every person having the management or control of premises, on which there shall be any cesspool shall cause the same to be emptied once at least in every week.

##### Times within which Cesspools may be emptied.

17. No person shall empty or assist in emptying, or cause or permit to be emptied, any cesspool or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse and offensive matter, except between the hours of 11 p.m. and 5 a.m. or until such contents have been properly deodorized; and every person emptying, or causing to be emptied, any cesspool, shall remove, or cause to be removed, the contents thereof so soon as the same is emptied.

##### Conveyances by which Cesspools may be emptied.

18. No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any cesspool or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse and offensive matter, except by means of a cart, carriage, or other conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents, or of any portion thereof, or of any effluvia therefrom.

##### Disposal of Refuse and Offensive Matter.

19. No person shall place or deposit any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil, or any night-soil or other offensive matter, in any place so as to be a nuisance to any person or injurious to health.

##### Night-soil, &c., removed from any Earth-closet, &c., and deposited anywhere to be covered with Earth.

20. Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited, or assisting in placing or depositing on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place of deposit, shall, immediately

on the deposit thereof, cover the same or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered with a layer of earth not less than 6 inches in thickness.

*Earth-closets, &c., not to be emptied into Drains or Sewers.*

21. No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter, into any drain or sewer, or so that the contents thereof may find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any drain or sewer.

*Prevention of Pollution of Water.*

22. No person shall place, assist in placing, or cause or permit to be placed, in or so that the same may, or may be likely, to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, any matter or thing likely to endanger the health of any persons using such water or drinks or milk or other produce of such dairy.

*Cesspools not to be emptied into Water used for Drinking or Domestic purposes.*

23. No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any cesspool or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse matter, into any water supplied, used or likely to be used, by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, or so that the contents or any portion of the contents thereof may find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any such water.

24. Every accumulation or deposit of offensive matter so situated as to find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or likely to be used in any dairy, shall be deodorized and removed by the owner of the property upon which such accumulation or deposit is situated within one week of notice given by the Local Board or by one of its officers.

*Keeping of Animals.*

25. No person shall keep any animal of any kind so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

*Animals not to be so kept as to pollute Water.*

26. No person shall keep any animal in such a manner as to pollute any water used, or likely to be used, by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used, or likely to be used, in any dairy, so as to endanger the health of any person using such water or drinks or milk or other produce of such dairy.

*Supply of Water to Slaughter-houses.*

27. Every occupier or licensee or person having the management or control of a slaughter-house or abattoir shall cause the same to be supplied with a sufficient quantity of water for all purposes.

*Drainage of New Buildings.*

28. Every person erecting, or causing to be erected, any new building shall cause the foundations thereof, and the ground over which such building is to be placed, to be rendered dry, sound, and well drained, so that no water soakage or damp shall lodge there.

*Drainage of Existing Buildings.*

29. Every owner of a building shall cause the same to be provided with proper and sufficient drains, so constructed as to prevent any nuisance arising therefrom, and to secure the healthfulness of the inmates of such building; and every tenant of a building under a lease of which fourteen years or upwards is unexpired shall be deemed an owner within the meaning of this section.

*Dairymen, &c., to report Disease to the Health Officer.*

30. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, and every person having the management of any such trade, shall forthwith report in writing to the health officer the occurrence of any disease in any of his milch cows, or of any contagious or infectious disease in man or animal upon the premises upon which such trade is carried on.

*The prevention of the use of Steam Whistles at factories or other establishments so as not to be a nuisance to any person.*

31. No person shall use, cause to be used, or assist in using any steam whistle at any factory or other establishment so as to be a nuisance to any person; and no person who occupies or has the management or control of any factory or other establishment shall suffer or permit any steam whistle to be used thereat so as to be a nuisance to any person.

*Penalties.*

32. If any person commit a breach of this by-law, he shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10, or to a penalty not exceeding £5 for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued. Provided the justices before whom any penalty imposed hereby is sought to be recovered may order the whole or part only not being less than five shillings of such penalty to be paid. And every person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the foregoing penalty, notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by this by-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such Local Board of Health have or have not taken advantage of such powers.

33. This by-law containing in the whole thirty-three sections shall apply to and have operation within the jurisdiction of the Local Board of Health for the whole of the Shire of Braybrook. Made and ordered by the Local Board of Health for the Shire of Braybrook this fifth day of January 1885.
