IMPORTANT NOTICE TO MARINERS.-VICTORIA.

PORT PHILLIP HEADS AND CHANNELS.

Extinguishing of Lights and Removal of Buoys, also Exhibition of Electric Lights.

MASTERS of vessels and others are hereby informed that it may be necessary for the safety of the Port and the protection of life and property to, at any moment, remove the facilities now afforded for the safe navigation of Port Phillip.

As a warning that such steps have been taken, and that no vessel will permitted to enter Port Phillip Heads between sunset and sunrise, the Point Lonsdate and Queenselife high and low lights will be extinquished.

The master or pilot of any vessel entering Port Phillip Heads between sunset and sunrise and sunrise the private of the following the continuation of the piloted by a duly licensed pilot, specially instructed.

Immediately after the foregoing lights have been extinguished the following action will be taken:—

The lights in the South and West Channels will also be extinguished.

The present system of buoyage in the South, West, and Cole's Channels will be either entirely removed or displaced, rendering the navigation therein dangerous, excepting to duly licensed pilots, specially instructed, who alone will be advised of existing dangers, and of the guiding marks which will, from time to time, be established for the purpose of facilitating the safe navigation of such channels during day light.

PILOTAGE.

PILOTAGE.

Vessels prohibited from entering Port Phillip Heads between sunset and sunrise.

No vessel will be permitted to enter Port Phillip Heads between sunset and sunrise. The pilot schooner will be withdrawn from the ontaide station from sunset to sunrise, but provision will be made for cruising outside and piloting vessels between sunrise and sunset only.

Caution .- Electric Lights.

At the present juncture the Defence Department may at any time exhibit one or more Electric Lights from the vicinities of Queenscliffe and Point Nepean. Such lights will be at least 60 feet below any of the present lights, and must not be taken as guiding lights, as they will be dangerously misleading for navigating purposes, their object being a means of guarding the entrance to Port Phillip.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir Henry Broughan Loch, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Licensing Act 1876 (No. 566, section 14) it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time upon the application in writing of the council of any municipality to preclaim any part of the municipal district of such municipality, to be defined by such Council, not being a borough having a population of five hundred persons liable to be rated, as shown by the rate-book, a special area; and it was further enacted that the fee which should be paid for a publican's license in respect of premises situated within a special area should be Ten pounds only; and the Governor in Council might from time to time revoke any proclamation made under the authority of the above recited section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim as a special area under the provisions of the fourteenth section of the above in part recited Act, the locality hereinafter mentioned, within which the fee to be paid for a publican's license shall be Ten pounds only, that is to say:—

All that area, comprising part of portion 4 of section 15, parish

shall be Ten pounds only, that is to say:—
All that area, comprising part of portion 4 of section 15, parish of Irrowarra, commencing at the north-cast corner of said section, and bounded on the north by the Government main Geelong road, being a line bearing westerly to a Government road dividing the said area from portion 3 of said section 15; on the west and south by said road, and on the east by a Government road known as the Cemetery road, being a line bearing north to the commencing point, within the Shire of Colac.

The births of 1,047 children, viz., 556 boys and 491 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of March. In the month of February 856 births were registered, or 191 less than in the month under review. The births were 260 above the average of the previous ten years, but only 132 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in March numbered 630, viz., 354 of males, and 276 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 417. The deaths outnumbered those in February by 12, and exceeded the average of March during the previous ten years by 83. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been below the average in those ten years by 13.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was 3.24, and of deaths registered 1.95.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 95.2° on the 18th, and the lowest was 42.5° on the 21st. The mean temperature of the month (61.5°) was 2½ degrees below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (39.9°) took place on the 10th, viz., from a maximum of 87.0° to a minimum of 47.1°. The least range (9.1°) was on the 26th and 27th, viz., on the former, from a maximum of 67.1° to a minimum of 58.0°, and on the latter from a maximum of 67.1° to a minimum of 58.0°. The mean daily range was 20.4°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.925 inches) was a fraction below the average.

Rain fell on 11 days, the amount of rainfall being 2.39 inches.

Males contributed 56 per cent., and females 44 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 41 per cent. to that mortality, as against 42 per cent. in March 1884; 37 per cent. in March 1883; 43 per cent. in March 1882 and 1881; 47 per cent. in March 1880 and 1879; 49 per cent. in March 1878 and 1877; 50 per cent. in March 1876; and 58 per cent. in March 1875.

The deaths of persons of 75 years of age or upwards were above the average, and numbered 25, viz. —Those of a female, aged 76, and a male pensioner, aged 78, who died of apoplexy; a laundress, aged 76, of pneumonia; a carpenter, aged 78, of typhoid fever; a female, aged 83, of liver disease; a laborer, aged 82, and a gentleman, aged 83, of heart disease; a leaborer, aged 89, and a gentleman, aged 86, of heart disease; a female, aged 84, who drowned herself; a painter, aged 86, who died of dropsy, and a baker, aged 75, a male cook, aged 76, a laborer and a widow, each aged 77, a carpenter and 2 females, each aged 78, a male, of occupation unknown, aged 80, a female, aged 83, a dairyman, aged 84, a dentist, aged 85, and a gentleman, aged 92, of old age.

Twenty-eight deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which 17 were set down to accident, 3 to homicide, and 8 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A fireman, aged 31, died of fracture of the pelvis; a cabinet-maker, aged 50, and a laborer, aged 53, of fracture of the skull, a gardener, aged 50, of injuries to the head—all resulting from falls; a seaman, aged 25, died of injuries to the head, caused by a fall of stone; a stoker on board the Nelson, aged 28, was killed by a blow from a huge piece of metal; a laborer, aged 45, and a railway gate-keeper, aged 62, died of injuries received from being struck by railway engines; a laborer, aged 65, was passed over by a train; a draper, aged 74, died of fracture of the arm, cause not stated; a bootmaker, aged 27, was shot at the Williamstown Butts whils ractising fring, there being no evidence to show who fired the shot; an apprentice, aged 18, died of scalds, resulting from the explosion of a boiler; a law clerk, aged 27, was poisoned by taking chlorodyne inadvertently; a gardener, aged 70, was poisoned with carbolic acid, taken in mistake for porter; a male, aged 40, of occupation unstated, and a female, aged 60, were found drowned in the River Yarra; and a new-born female infant died of umbilical hemorrhage. The homicidal deaths were those of a male infant, which was suffocated at birth; and of 2 new-born female infants, one of which died from the effects of exposure, and the other was drowned in the Saltwater River. The suicidal deaths were those of a carpenter, aged 28, of a fisherman, aged 31, of a merchant, aged 35, and of a female, aged 40, who cut their throats; of a chemist, aged 28, who poisoned himself with opium; and of an ironmoulder, aged 33, and of 2 females, aged 39 and 84, who drowned themselves.

One hundred and ten deaths, or 17 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz. :—53 in the Melbourne Hospital, 9 in the Alfred Hospital, 1 in the Homeopathic Hospital, 5 in the Children's Hospital, 4 in the Lying-in Hospital, 7 in the Immigrants' Home, 12 in the Bencovlent Asylum, 5 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 5 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 3 in the Austin Hospital, 4 in the Melbourne Gaol, 2 in the Pentridge Stockade, and 2 in the Protestant Refuge.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 261, of which 148, or 57 per cent., were of males, and 113, or 43 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 206 were under one year of age, 38 were between one and two, 5 were between two and three, 6 were between three and four, and 6 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 369. Of these, 206, or 56 per cent., were males, and 163, or 44 per cent., were females; 14 were between five and ten, 7 were between ten and fifteen, 16 were between fifteen and twenty, 35 were between twenty and twenty-five, 31 were between twenty-five and thirty, 28 were between thirty and thirty-five, 24 were between forty-five, 28 were between forty-five, and forty, 24 were between forty-five, 26 were between fifty-five and fity-five and sixty-five and sixty-five and seventy-five and seve

In March, as compared with the previous month, a decrease took place in deaths from typhoid fever, which fell from 25 to 23; in those from dysentery and diarrhoa, which fell from 53 to 46; in those from want of breast-milk, which fell from 9 to 4; and in those from tabes mesenterica, which fell from 10 to 6. On the other hand, an increase took place in deaths from intemperance, which rose from 4 to 8; in those from pthisis, which rose from 70 to 89; and in those from old age, which rose from 11 to 21. Four deaths of child-bearing women occurred, which is a number below the average. Comparing these with the births (1047) a proportion is obtained of 1 death of a mother to every to 262 children born alive.

REGULATIONS UNDER "THE DISEASES IN STOCK ACT 1872."

INTRODUCTION OF CAMELS, DEER, ETC.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-eighth day of April 1885.

WHEREAS by The Discusses in Stock Act 1878 among other things the Governor in Council is empowered from time to make orders and regulations for the purposes therein mentioned, and to rescind the same. And whereas from time to time, and in particular by an Order in Council, dated the 19th day of March 1880, the Governor in Council has made divers orders and regulations under the powers conferred by the said Act. Act.

And whereas it is desirable to make regulations with regard to the introduction of camels, deer, antelopes, and goats.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Exceutive Council, doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the above recited Act, and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, order as as follows, that is to say:—

- 1. Extension of Act No. 451, and the regulations under it, to camels, deer, antelopes, and youts.—Camels, deer, antelopes, and goats shall henceforth be deemed to be included in the third schedule of the said regulations of the 19th day of March 1880, and the said regulations shall henceforth be construed accordingly.
- Cancle of burden.—The 13th section of the said regulations shall extend to camels used for the purposes mentioned in such regulations.
- 3. Landing of camels, deer, antelopes, and goats certified free from infection.—Upon receiving the certificate mentioned in the 23rd section of the said regulations that any camel, deer, antelope, or goat is free from every infections or contagious disease, whether mentioned in the Second Schedule to the said regulations or not, the Chief Inspector of Stock shall permit the same to be landed, and it shall not be necessary for the inspector of stock granting such certificate to cause a notice in the form in the Seventh Schedule to the said regulations to be delivered to the master of the vessel on board which the same may be.
- 4. Camel, deer, antelope, or yout suffering from seab, scables, or lice.—Should any such camel, deer, antelope, or goat be free from all other infection, but suffering from seab or scables or lice, the veterinary surgeon and inspector of stock inspecting the same shall certify accordingly; and as soon as conveniently may be after the granting of such certificate the inspector granting the same shall cause to be delivered to the master of the vessel on board which the same may be a notice in the form or to the effect in the First Schedule hereto.
- 5. Application to inspector in case of camel, deer, antelope, or goat suffering from scab, scabies, or lice.—At the time of depositing the sum mentioned in such notice with the inspector of stock, the owner or consignee of the stock or, if there is no owner or consignee in Victoria, the master of the vessel in which the stock arrived, shall sign and deliver to the inspector of stock an application in the form in the Second Schedule hereto.
- 6. Removal to quarantine ground of camel, &c., suffering from scab, &c.—On receipt of the deposit and application hereinbefore mentioned, and the execution of the bond as hereinbefore required, and compliance with all the regulations in force in that behalf, the inspector of stock may allow such stock to be conveyed to some quarantine ground determined by the Governor in Council, or to some store or place of which the Chief Inspector of Stock may by writing under his hand approve for that purpose, and which shall be deemed a quarantine ground.
- 7. Extension of certain regulations relating to cattle and sheep to camels, deer, antelopes, and goats.—In sections 26 and 27 of the said regulations cattle and sheep shall be deemed to include camels, deer, antelopes, and goats certified under the regulations to be free from other infection, but to be suffering from scab, scabies, or lice.
- 8. Quarantine of cancle, deer, antelopes, and yoats suffering from scabs, scabies, or lice.—Camels, deer, antelopes, or goats certified to be free from other infection, but to be suffering from scab, scabies, or lice, and removed to a quarantine ground, shall remain in quarantine until the Chief Inspector of Stock is satisfied that they are free from scab, scabies, or lice, and all other infection, and shall certify in writing under his hand accordingly, and in the meantime they shall be dressed in such manner, and with such medicaments, and so often as the Chief Inspector of Stock may direct; and no person shall remove or drive away such camel, deer, antelope, or goat to escape from the quarantine ground, or suffer any such camel, deer, antelope, or goat to escape from the quarantine ground until an inspector of stock, by writing under his hand, authorize the removal thereof.

By-law No. 1 under "The Public Health Amendment Statute
1883."

ISS3."

In pursuance of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and of every other power enabling them in that behalf, the Local Board of Health for the Shire of Braybrook for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within its jurisdiction, doth hereby make the by-law following, that is to say:—

Interpretation of Terms.

1. In the construction and for the purposes of this by-law, the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them.

the following terms shall, it not inconsistent when the content of subject matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them.

"House" shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed public-houses, factories, work-rooms, common or other lodging-houses, or other buildings or premises.

"Cesspool" shall mean any receptacle for night-soil or for noxious or offensive matter below or above the ground.

"Street" shall mean and include any highway and any public bridge, and any road, lane, footway, square, court, alley, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not.

Premises to be kept so as not to be a Nuisance.

2. Every occupier or person having the management or control of any house or premises shall cause the same to be kept in such a state as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

Removal of Refuse from Houses.

3. Every occupier of a house or premises shall remove therefrom all dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, or such other refuse matter produced or accumulated thereon once every week, and in case of the default of such occupier the Local Board of Health may remove the same.

Removal of the House Refuse.

from all dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, or such other refuse matter produced or accumulated thereon once every week, and in case of the default of such occupier the Local Board of Health may remove the same.

Receptacics for House Refuse.

4. Every occupier of a house or premises shall provide and keep thereon a box or some other covered receptacle for the temporary deposit of house refuse, which box or receptacles shall be of such dimensions as that the same may, with the contents thereof, when full, be readily and conveniently moveable by one man, or so many such boxes or receptacles as may be necessary to contain all the house refuse produced or accumulated on such premises during one week; and shall cause all house refuse to be deposited as soon as conveniently may be in some such box or receptacle.

Remoral of Refuse from Places where Animals are kept.

5. Every occupier of land on which is crected any stable, shed, sty, yard, or other place for the keeping of animals shall from time to time remove from such premises all dung, soil, or other manure produced or accumulated thereon as often as the same shall amount to two cubic yards or once at least every week; and in case of the default of such occupier the Local Board may remove the same.

Power to use Refuse as Manure.

Nothing contained in the foregoing by-laws shall be taken to prevent the cccupier of any premises from causing any dung, soil, or other refuse matter produced or accumulated on any premises to be at any time removed, or to be used as manure on any garden or land contiguous to such premises as manure, so that the same be not so removed, kept, or used as to contravene any by-law of the Local Board of Health, or so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

Removal of Refuse from Places where Noxious or Offensive Trades are carried on.

7. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of premises used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, or manufactory whatsoever shall cause

person shall neglect or fail to have removed any such offensive matter or waste products as aforesaid, the same may be removed by the Local Board of Health.

Removal of Blood from Places where Animals are Slaughtered.

8. Every occupier, licensee, or person having the management or control of an abattoir, slaughter-house, or place where any cattle or other animals are killed, shall cause all the blood from the animals killed therein, as soon as conveniently may be, to be collected in a fit receptacle to be provided for that purpose, and to be effectually deodorized by mixing therewith commercial sulphate of iron or chloride of lime in the proportion of 1lb. to the gallon, or some other efficient deodorizer sufficient to effectually deodorize the same, and to be removed from the premises within twenty-four hours after such blood is shed.

Removal of Offal.

9. Every occupier of any premises on which may be any offal shall forthwith effectually deodorize the same, and remove the same from the premises within twenty-four hours.

Construction of Privics.

10. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable pravy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than three inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be provided with a suitable pan or other movable receptacle for night-soil, the content whereof does not exceed six cubic feet, and with the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptacle and the contents thereof, and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, work-room, or common lodging-house, and every public privy, shall be flagged or

privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.

Remoral of Night-soil to be by properly constructed Conveyances.

18. No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents or of any portion thereof, or of effluvia therefrom.

14. No person shall empty, assist in emptying, or cause or permit to be emptied, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, except between the hours of II p.m. and 5 a.m., or until the contents thereof have been properly deodorized; and every person emptying, or causing to be emptied, any earth-closets, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, shall cause the night-soil taken therefrom to be removed so soon as the same is emptied.

15. Every eesspool shall be furnished with a water-tight cover or roof, and every cesspool whall be formed or made below the surface of the ground shall be constructed with water-tight walls or sides which project on all sides at least 6 inches above the surface of the ground.

16. Every occupier of premises, and every person having the management or control of premises, on which there shall be any cesspool shall cause the same to be emptied once at least in every week.

17. No person shall empty or assist in emptying, or cause or permit to be emptied, any cesspool or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse and offensive matter, except between the hours of 11 p.m. and 5 a.m. or until such contents have been properly deodorized; and every person emptying, or causing to be emptied, any cesspool, shall romove, or cause to be romoved, the contents thereof so soon as the same is emptied.

Conveyances by which Cesspools may be emptied, or assist in emptying, any cesspool or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse and offensive matter, except by means of a cart, carriage, or other conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents, or of any portion thereof, or of any effluvia therefrom.

Disposal of Refuse and Offensive Matter.

19. No person shall place or deposit any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil, or any night-soil or other offensive matter, in any place so as to be a nuisance to any person or injurious to health.

Night-soil, de., removed from any Earth-closet, de., and deposited anywhere to be covered with Earth.

20. Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited, or assisting in placing or depositing on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any night-soil, offial, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place of deposit, shall, immediately

21. 22. No person shall place, assist in placing, or cause or permit to be placed, in or so that the same may, or may be likely, to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, any matter or thing likely to endanger the health of any persons using such water or drinks or milk or other produce of such dairy.

23. No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any cesspool or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse matter, into any water supplied, used or likely to be used, by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, or so that the contents or any portion of the contents thereof may find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any such water.

24. Every accumulation or deposit of offensive matter so situated as to find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any water used or likely to be used in any dairy, shall be deederized and removed by the owner of the property upon which such accumulation or deposit is situated within one week of notice given by the Local Board or by one of its officers.

Every owner of a building shall cause the same to be provided with proper and sufficient drains, so constructed as to prevent any nuisance arising therefrom, and to secure the healthfulness of the inmates of such building; and every tenant of a building under a lease of which fourteen years or upwards is unexpired shall be deemed an owner within the meaning of this section.

Dairymen, dc., to report Disease to the Health Officer.

30. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, and every person having the management of any such trade, shall forthwith report in writing to the health officer the occurrence of any disease in any of his milch cows, or of any contagious or infectious disease in nan or animal upon the premises upon which such trade is carried on.

The precention of the use of Steam Whistles at factories or other establishments so as not to be a nuisance to any person.

31. No person shall use, cause to be used, or assist in using any steam whistle at any factory or other establishment so as to be a nuisance to any person; and no person who occupies or has the management or control of any factory or other establishment shall suffer or permit any steam whistle to be used thereat so as to be a nuisance to any person. Dairymen, &c., to report Disease to the Health Officer

shall suffer or permit any steam whistle to be used thereat so as to be a muisance to any person.

Penaltics.

32. If any person commit a breach of this by-law, he shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10, or to a penalty not exceeding £5 for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued. Provided the justices before whom any penalty imposed hereby is sought to be recovered may order the whole or part only not being less than five shillings of such penalty to be paid. And every person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the foregoing penalty, notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by this by-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such Local Board of Health have or have not taken advantage of such powers.

33. This by-law containing in the whole thirty-three sections shall apply to and have operation within the jurisdiction of the Local Board of Health for the whole of the Shire of Braybrook. Made and ordered by the Local Board of Health for the Shire of Braybrook this fifth day of January 1885.
