BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS.-BYE-LAW.

GEELONG WATER SUPPLY.

THE Board of Land and Works, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on the said Board by The Public Works Statute 1865, doth hereby repeal Bye-law 1, made on the 11th December 1873, fixing the rates and charges to be paid by owners and occupiers of lands and tenements in respect of water supplied by the Board, and in lieu thereof, doth make the Bye-law following, that is to say:—

1. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Board, that is to say:—

occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect or raupplied by the Board, that is to say:

I. On every house or tenement of £10 annual value and under, Ten shillings per annum.

II. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £10, a rate of Five pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation up to £100 inclusive; Four pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation up to £300; Three pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of £300 up to £300; and Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of £300 up to £500; and Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of £300.

III. Warehouses and stores, not being domiciles, shall be subject to a rate of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation.

IV. Water-troughs will be charged at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each.

V. For water supplied by the Board by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Board, the rate shall be One shilling per thousand gallons.

VI. The rate to be charged for water supplied from standpipes shall be Two pence per hundred gallons.

VII. Horses will be charged for at the rate of Seven shillings and sixpence each per annum.

VIII. Water for steam-boilers will be charged at the rate of Fifteen shillings per horse-power per annum.

The foregoing Bye-law was made and passed by the Board of Land and Works, and the Seal of the said Board of Land and Works was hereunto affixed, the eleventh day of May One thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, in the presence of—

Within the period of one month from the felling of any tree, the portion thereof not required for slabs, palings, shingles, posts, rails, props, or manufacturing purposes shall be so disposed of by the licensee as not to encumber the ground.

- 1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.

 2. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cometery on a certificate of a minister of religion or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relations and friends of the doceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.
- 3. Orders for interment to be given either to the sexton or at the office of the trustees. Such notice to be given before Four o'clock p.m. on the previous day; if not, an extra charge will be made.

Until otherwise ordered, the time fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. in the other four months, except on Sundays, when the usual and only hours for funerals will be from Two to Five o'clock throughout the year.
- 8. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones to be kept in proper repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

 9. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron.

 10. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitapli or inscription, to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who are required by the Act to withhold permission and prevent the erection of any monument which shall appear to them inappropriate or unbecoming, and shall determine and fix the position of any monument which may be prepared to be erected according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetory in an appropriare manner. In the erection of tablets, copper cramps must be used.




