WHEREAS the Governor in Council, in accordance with the provisions and requirements of *The Local Government Act 1874*, did, by Order of the twenty-fifth day of August One thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, published in the *Government Gazette* on the twenty-ninth day of August One thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, appoint William Downing, of 58 Caucery lane, in the City of Melbourne, and William Cook, of 82 Chaucery lane aforesaid, special auditors under the said Statute, to hold a special audit of the accounts of the municipality of the Shire of Cranbourne, in the colony of Victoria, for a period commencing on the first day of January One thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, and terminating on the nineteenth day of August One thousand eight hundred and eighty-four. And whereas the said William Downing and William Cook, as such special auditors, at the time required, and after the notices and other things necessary to be done in compliance with the provisions of the said Act, proceeded to make the special audit as directed in the said Act, and, having for the purpose of the said audit examined evidence upon oath and summoned all necessary persons before them, duly completed the said special audit, and did forthwith after such special audit, namely, on the seventeenth day of February One thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, report the result of such special audit to the Minister, in compliance with the terms of the said Act. And the said William Downing and William Cook, as such special auditors, having first by due notice, as required by the said Act, appointed a time and place for hearing such explanations as might be offered by or on behalf of the said council, or the municipality, or any member thereof, and having duly held such enquiry, and it appearing to the satisfaction of the said special auditors that certain moneys referred to by them in their certificate, and forming part of the municipal fund and of other funds and accounts under the control of the council of the said municipality, had been wilfully or through culpable negligence misapplied to purposes not authorized by law; and that certain councillors named by them in their certificate, and hereafter mentioned, had wilfully or by culpable negligence misapplied, or connived at, or concurred in the misapplication of such money, did, in the terms of the said Act, by writing under their hands, certify such to be the case, in the words following:—

"We certify, under our hands, that the following sums of money, forming part of the municipal fund and of other funds and accounts under the control of the Council of the Shire of Cranbourne, have been wilfully or through culpable negligence misapplied to purposes not authorized by law; and we further certify that the several councillors of the said shire hereinafter named have wilfully or by culpable negligence, misapplied, or connived at, or concurred in the misapplication of such sums of money as are hereinafter set against their respective names:—

"First. A sum of £36 15s. (Thirty-six pounds fifteen shillings), being money improperly drawn from the municipal fund of the said Shire of Cranbourne, and purporting to be paid to George Gates; and we certify that Councillor James Lecky, junior, wilfully or by culpable negligence misapplied, or connived at, or concurred in the misapplication of the said money.

"Second. A sum of £58 5s. (Fifty-eight pounds five shillings), being money improperly drawn from the municipal fund of the said Shire of Cranbourne, and paid to George Gates in excess of the amount for which his tender for contract No. 8 was let by resolution of the council; and we certify that Councillors John Sime, James Lecky, junior, and Charles Rossiter wilfully or by culpable negligence connived at, or concurred in the misapplication of the said money.

"Third. A sum of £128 12s. 3d. (One hundred and twenty-eight pounds twelve shillings and threepence), being the excess of Willis Brothers' contract over that of Ramage, improperly drawn from the municipal fund of the said shire, and paid to the said Willis Brothers; and we certify that Councillors George Poole, Walter Duff, and James Lecky, junior, wilfully or by culpable negligence misapplied, or connived at, or concurred in the misapplication of the said sum of money.

"Fourth. A sum of £720 (Seven hundred and twenty pounds), being the amount of liquidated damages reserved under the contract of Willis Brothers for non-completion of same, such amount being money forming part of the municipal fund of the said shire, and improperly paid to the said Willis Brothers; and we certify that Councillors George Poole, Walter Duff, James Lecky, junior, and Charles Rossiter wilfully or by culpable negligence misapplied, or connived at, or concurred in the misapplication of the said money.

"Fifth. A sum of £1278 6s. 3d. (A sum of Twelve hundred and seventy-eight pounds six shillings and threepence) being part of the proceeds of a municipal loan which was on the twentieth day of July One thousand eight hundred and eighty-two misapplied to the liquidation of an illegal overdraft of the shire bank account, and we certify that Councillors James Lecky, junior, George Poole, Walter Duff, Paul Fahey, Charles Rossiter, Alexander Cameron, George Howard, Patrick Gilbert Gill, and William Greaves wilfully or by culpable negligence, misapplied, or connived at, or concurred in the misapplication of the said money."

And whereas by the said *Local Government Act 1874* it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Order to be published in the *Government Gazette* within three months from the date of such certificate by such special auditors, wholly or in part confirm or disallow the same.

Now therefore I, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this Order, made in exercise of the power and authority conferred by the said Act, confirm such part of the said certificate of the said special auditors as relates to and certifies the misapplication, wilfully or through culpable negligence, to purposes not authorized by law, of the sum of £36 15s. (Thirty-six pounds fifteen shillings), mentioned as the first item of misapplication in the said certificate as being money improperly drawn from the municipal fund of the said Shire of Cranbourne, and purporting to be paid to George Gates, and as certifies that Councillor James Lecky, junior, wilfully or by culpable negligence misapplied, or connived at, or concurred in the misapplication of the said money. And also such part of the said certificate of the said special auditors as relates to and certifies the misapplication, wilfully or through culpable negligence, to purposes not authorized by law of the sum of £58 5s. (Fifty-eight pounds five shillings), mentioned as the second item of misapplication in the said certificate as being money improperly drawn from the municipal fund of the said Shire of Cranbourne, and paid to George Gates in excess of the amount for which his tender for contract No. 8 was let by resolution of the Council, and as certifies that Councillors John Sime, James Lecky, junior, and Charles Rossiter wilfully or by culpable negligence connived at, or concurred in the misapplication of the said money. And also such part of the said certificate of the said special auditors as relates to and certifies the misapplication, wilfully or through culpable negligence, to purposes not authorized by law of the sum of £128 12s. 3d. (One hundred and twenty-eight pounds twelve shillings and threepence) mentioned in the third item of misapplication in the said certificate as being the excess of Willis Brothers' contract over that of Ramage, improperly drawn from the municipal fund of the said shire, and paid to the said Willis Brothers, and as certifies that Councillors George Poole, Walter Duff, and James Lecky, junior, wilfully or by culpable negligence, misapplied, or connived at, or concurred in the misapplication of the said sum of money. And also such part of the said certificate of the said special auditors as relates to and certifies the misapplication, wilfully or through culpable negligence, to purposes not authorized by law of the sum of £720 (Seven hundred and twenty pounds) mentioned in the fourth item of misapplication in the said certificate as being the amount of liquidated damages reserved under the contract of Willis Brothers for non-completion of same, such amount being money forming part of the municipal fund of the said Shire of Cranbourne, and improperly paid to the said Willis Brothers, and as certifies that Councillors George Poole, James Lecky, junior, and Walter Duff, wilfully or by culpable negligence, misapplied, or connived at, or concurred in the misapplication of the said money. And as to such part of the said certificate of the said special auditors as relates to and certifies the misapplication of a sum of £1278 6s. 3d. (Twelve hundred and seventy-eight pounds six shillings and threepence), described in the fifth item of misapplication in the said certificate as being part of the proceeds of a municipal loan, which was, on the twentieth day of July One thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, misapplied to the liquidation of an illegal overdraft of the shire bank account, I, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this Order, made in exercise of the power and authority conferred by the said Act, disallow such last-mentioned part of such certificate of the said special auditors: And whereas it is by the said Act provided that the costs and expenses of and connected with every such special audit shall be paid either wholly or partly out of the money deposited as security as in the Act mentioned or wholly or partly out of the municipal fund as the Governor in Council shall by order direct, and further that the Governor in Council may direct the whole or any portion of the money so deposited as security to be returned to the persons depositing same: Now therefore I, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the powers and authorities in that behalf conferred by the said Act, do by this Order direct that the costs and expenses of and connected with such special audit, amounting to £736 7s. 7d. (Seven hundred and thirty-six pounds seven shillings and sevenpence) be paid to the said special auditors, William Downing and William Cook, by the said Council out of the municipal fund of the said Shire of Cranbourne; and furthermore direct that the sum of £50 (Fifty pounds), deposited as security by the ratepayers, upon whose request, in writing, under the said Act the said special auditors were appointed, be wholly returned to the persons by whom the same was deposited.

And the Honorable Albert Lee Tucker, for the Commissioner of Public Works for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Licensing Act 1876* (No. 566), it was amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding the provisions thereinbefore contained, it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim any place or district a place or district where, owing to a sudden increase of population or otherwise, the necessity for the immediate grant of publicans' licenses exists to be a place or district wherein publicans' licenses might be specially granted, and from time to time to revoke any such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the Proclamations issued under the authority of section 44 of the said Act in relation to the places or districts hereunder specified, that is to say:—

WHEREAS by the *Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881* it was amongst other things enacted that, at the expiration of two months after the notice of any application should have been first advertised in the *Government Gazette*, the Minister, if satisfied that the provisions of the now in part recited Act have been substantially complied with, should submit such application, and the general plan and description therein referred to, and all petitions which have been received in respect of such application, to the Governor in Council, together with any recommendations as to the granting of the application, or as to any alterations or additions he might think desirable in the proposed waterworks: and the Governor in Council might thereupon approve of the construction of such proposed waterworks, with or without any alterations of such proposed waterworks, with or without any alterations or additions in the general plan and description thereof, or might disapprove of the construction of such waterworks, and should make an Order in Council accordingly: And it was further enacted that, if the Governor in Council should approve of the construction of such waterworks, with or without alterations, or additions, or restrictions of any such general plan and description, a Waterworks Trust should be constituted to construct, maintain, and continue the whole or any part of the waterworks therein described, in accordance with the provisions of such Order and of

the now in part recited Act: and every Order approving the construction of any proposed waterworks, and of the constituting of a Waterworks Trust for the purpose, should state—

(a.) The amount of money which the Governor in Council would grant as a loan for the purpose of carrying out the same, and paying the cost and expense of the plans and application for the same; and also the rate of interest which would be charged for such loan, such rate being at least One-half per centum more than the rate payable by the Government on the Public Loan out of which such loan might be granted.

(b.) Should proclaim the limits of the lands, whether within or without the municipal districts of the council or councils applying for the proposed waterworks within which such trust should have authority, to be called a Waterworks District:

(c.) Should state what are the principal works proposed to be constructed: and

(d.) Should contain such provisions (not inconsistent with the now in part recited Act) as according to the nature of the application and the facts and circumstances of each case the Governor in Council should think fit.

And it was further enacted by the said Act that whenever any Waterworks District was comprised wholly within one municipal district, although portion of the works might be outside same, the Governor in Council might appoint the municipal council thereof for the time being, together with one other commissioner, to be the Waterworks Trust of such Waterworks District: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, has approved of a general plan and description as set forth in a certain application of the Shire Council of Waranga for a Loan of Two thousand pounds, to carry out certain waterworks for the domestic supply of a Waterworks District under the said Act, embracing certain land within the Shire of Waranga, as shown on the general plan and description accompanying the said application deposited in the Department of Mines and Water Supply, and doth hereby order and appoint as follows:—

**BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS.—BYE-LAW.
GEELONG WATER SUPPLY.**

THE Board of Land and Works, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on the said Board by *The Public Works Statute 1865*, doth hereby repeal Bye-law 1, made on the 11th December 1873, fixing the rates and charges to be paid by owners and occupiers of lands and tenements in respect of water supplied by the Board, and in lieu thereof, doth make the Bye-law following, that is to say :—

1. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Board, that is to say :—

- i. On every house or tenement of £10 annual value and under, Ten shillings per annum.
- ii. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £10, a rate of Five pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation up to £100 inclusive; Four pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of £100 up to £300; Three pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of £300 up to £500; and Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of £500.
- iii. Warehouses and stores, not being domiciles, shall be subject to a rate of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation.
- iv. Water-troughs will be charged at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each.
- v. For water supplied by the Board by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Board, the rate shall be One shilling per thousand gallons.
- vi. The rate to be charged for water supplied from stand-pipes shall be Twopence per hundred gallons.
- vii. Horses will be charged for at the rate of Seven shillings and sixpence each per annum.
- viii. Water for steam-boilers will be charged at the rate of Fifteen shillings per horse-power per annum.

The foregoing Bye-law was made and passed by the Board of Land and Works, and the Seal of the said Board of Land and Works was hereunto affixed, the eleventh day of May One thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, in the presence of—

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

- All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.
- The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery on a certificate of a minister of religion or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relations and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.
- Orders for interment to be given either to the sexton or at the office of the trustees. Such notice to be given before Four o'clock p.m. on the previous day; if not, an extra charge will be made.
- The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the trustees or their surveyor; and, in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent, in writing, of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.

5. The name, age, place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased must be stated at the time of giving the order.

6. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

7. Until otherwise ordered, the time fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. in the other four months, except on Sundays, when the usual and only hours for funerals will be from Two to Five o'clock throughout the year.

8. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones to be kept in proper repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

9. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron.

10. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription, to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who are required by the Act to withhold permission and prevent the erection of any monument which shall appear to them inappropriate or unbecoming, and shall determine and fix the position of any monument which may be prepared to be erected according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner. In the erection of tablets, copper cramps must be used.

11. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

12. The ground will be open daily to the public from sunrise to sunset.

13. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is to be kept at the office, and may be inspected at the charge set out in the schedule, and registers of all grants are kept by the secretary.

14. The sexton has orders to turn out or take into custody, as the case may require, any person who shall behave indecorously, or commit any trespass or injury to the trees, flowers, or erections, or otherwise infringe the law relating to the cemetery or the regulations for the protection of the same; and such persons will be proceeded against according to law.

15. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations.

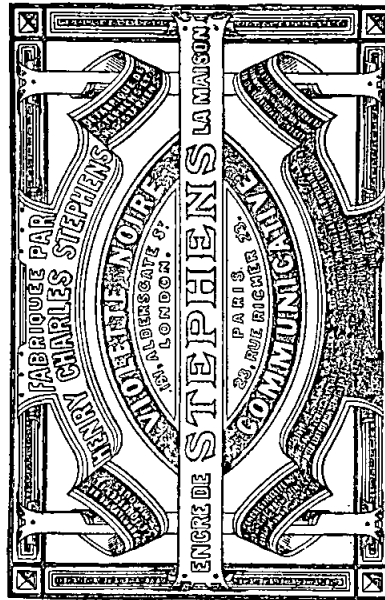

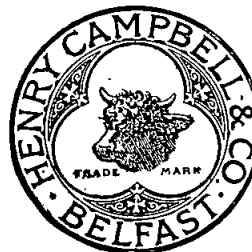

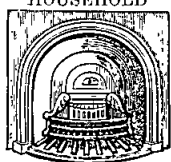
