BYE-LAW No. 25.

THE Victorian Railways Commissioners, in pursuance of the powers conferred by *The Victorian Railways-Commissioners Act 1883*, do hereby repeal Bye-laws of the 31st January 1884 as follows:—

Part 1, except the clause forbidding employes to take part in Parliamentary Elections, and the clause exempting employes from Jury service.

Parts 2, 3, 4, and 5, except under the following heads in Part 3:—

“Instructions to Station Staff respecting Passengers.”

“Regulations as to Passengers on Country Lines.”

“Regulations as to Passengers on Suburban Lines.”

“Regulations as to Parcels by Passenger Trains, &c., &c.”

ALTERATION OF AND ADDITIONAL TRAINS.

On and after 1st July the following alterations, &c., will take effect:—

Ballarat Line.—The train now leaving Melbourne for Ballarat at 4.25 p.m. will leave at 4.15 p.m.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, called *The Weights and Measures Statute 1864*, it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might at any time, if he think fit, and should at the request of not less than half the councils or boards constituting any union proclaimed under the said Act, dissolve the same by Proclamation: And whereas the Shires of Shepparton, Yarrowonga and Waranga were proclaimed an Union on the twenty-fifth day of July One thousand eight hundred and eighty-one: And whereas the councils of the shires mentioned have requested that the said Union may be dissolved: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby dissolve the Union of the Shires of Shepparton, Yarrowonga, and Waranga, for the purposes of the said Act.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO MINING LEASES ON RESERVED LANDS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-sixth day of May 1885.

WHEREAS by the 30th section of the Act No. 446, intitled *An Act to amend the Mining Statute 1865*, it is enacted that the Governor in Council, in the name or on behalf of Her Majesty, upon application made to him for that purpose, may grant leases to any person of mines on, under, or upon lands granted or reserved for railways, waterworks, public parks, places of recreation, or other public purposes, subject to such regulations as may be from time to time passed by the Governor in Council for that purpose, and with the consent of the Board of Land and Works, in whom the said lands are vested: And whereas in pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act regulations were made and passed by the Governor in Council on the 10th March 1873: And whereas it is now deemed expedient to make other regulations in lieu of those above-mentioned: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, cancel the order of the 10th March 1873, published in the *Government Gazette* of the 21st March 1873, pages 490 and 491, making regulations relating to Gold Mining Leases on Reserved Lands, and in lieu thereof do make the regulations following, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS RELATING TO MINING LEASES ON RESERVED LANDS.

INTERPRETATION CLAUSE.

1. In construing these regulations the following words and expressions shall have the meanings hereafter assigned to them, except where inconsistent with the context:—

"The Minister" shall mean the responsible Minister of the Crown administering the Act aforesaid.

"The Warden" shall mean a Warden of the Gold-fields in and for the colony, or any district thereof, in which the mines or some portion thereof are situated.

"The Clerk" shall mean a Warden's Clerk or a Clerk of Petty Sessions.

"The mines" shall mean the mines the lease of which is applied for.

The singular number shall include the plural and the plural the singular.

MANNER IN WHICH LEASES SHALL BE APPLIED FOR.

2. Any person desiring to obtain a lease of mines in, under, or upon any lands, vested in the Board of Land and Works, which have been granted or reserved for waterworks, public parks, places of recreation, or other public purposes, shall address to the Governor, and leave with the warden, an application, in duplicate, in the form in the schedule hereto, marked A, having attached thereto a plan of the lands in which the mines are situate, showing the situation of the mines and the position and direction of the shafts, drives, and other works proposed to be executed by the applicant for the purpose of mining, and shall, on the day of his leaving such application with the warden, de-

posit with the clerk the sum of £5, which shall be appropriated in such manner as the Minister may direct, and shall, within three days after such day, or in the first issue of any such newspaper after the expiration of three days from such day, insert as an advertisement, in a newspaper circulating in the neighborhood of the mines, a copy of such application.

3. On receipt of any such application, the warden shall cause to be entered in a book, kept for the purpose, a note of the application, numbered in order, and the day and hour when the same was left with him, and shall cause to be endorsed a similar note on both such duplicate applications.

4. In cases where more than one application is made for the same land, the first in order of receipt shall be first dealt with.

OBJECTIONS.

5. Any person objecting to any application made under these regulations shall, previous to the time appointed for the inquiry by the warden hereinafter provided for, lodge with the warden and leave for the applicant, or, if more than one, for each applicant, at his or their address stated in the said application, a statement in writing of the grounds of his objections, and at the time of leaving his statement with the warden, deposit with the clerk of the warden, or with any other clerk in his office authorized to receive deposits, the sum of £5, which shall be dealt with and appropriated in such manner as the Minister may direct.

INQUIRY INTO APPLICATIONS AND OBJECTIONS.

6. The warden shall proceed to hold an inquiry at a time and place to be notified by him to the applicant and all other persons who shall notify, in writing, to such warden that they are interested in the inquiry, and such time shall be not less than fourteen clear days after the publication of such advertisement, and every applicant shall receive not less than seven clear days' notice, and every such other person shall receive the same notice as an applicant, or such notice as the time of his notifying his interest to the warden will allow.

7. At such enquiry the warden shall take evidence in relation to the application and the objections thereto (if any); and shall within seven days after termination of the inquiry forward to the Minister the application, together with the objections thereto (if any) and the evidence taken by him and his opinion thereon.

8. The warden shall have power to adjourn the hearing to any other time or place.

9. Any applicant or objector shall be permitted to take a copy of the application and the evidence, and any other documents produced at the inquiry, at any time before the same shall have been forwarded to the Minister.

LEASES.

10. Upon receiving from the warden any such application the Minister shall, if he think fit, cause the same and the documents accompanying it to be submitted to the Governor in Council and the Board of Land and Works, who shall determine—

Whether to grant such application subject to any and what covenants, clauses, stipulations, restrictions, and conditions, or whether to refuse such application, and to determine what sum of money (if any) ought to be paid by the applicant as compensation for damage to the lands on which the mines are situate, and what security (if any) shall be given by the applicant to make good any damage that may result from his mining beyond that for which such sum to be paid as aforesaid shall be a sufficient compensation.

11. Whenever the Governor in Council shall order a lease to issue under these regulations, the Minister shall cause such lease to be prepared and submitted to the Board of Land and Works for their approval, and the rent reserved by every such lease shall be such as the Governor in Council shall determine.

MISCELLANEOUS RULES.

12. If any applicant shall make default in proceeding in accordance with these regulations, or if he neglect to execute and take delivery of the lease within sixty days after a notice properly addressed has been sent to him through the post office that the lease is ready for execution, the Minister may, by an order under his hand, declare the application abandoned, and cause to be published in the *Government Gazette* a notice to that effect, and after the publication of any such notice such applicant shall not be entitled to proceed with his application or to execute or accept delivery of any such lease: Provided that, in any case where an applicant appears at an inquiry by an agent, or gives sufficient reasons in writing on or before the day on which the inquiry is to be held why he cannot appear, his application shall be proceeded with at such times and places as the warden may think fit.

13. Before executing any lease the applicant shall pay to the Receiver and Paymaster of the district within which the mines lie the cost of the preparation of the lease; and also the first half-year's rent reserved in the lease, and any sum to be paid by him by way of compensation, and shall give any security that may be required of him, as hereinbefore provided, and he shall produce receipts for such payments and such other payments as under the provisions of the Act he may have been required to make before executing the lease; and he shall not be permitted to execute the lease and the same shall not be delivered to him until such receipts have been produced and such security has been given.

14. If the lease shall be refused a notice to that effect shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and all proceedings in relation to the application shall be stopped; but the applicant, or any other person, may make a fresh application for the same mine, and such application shall in all respects be dealt with as the Act and these regulations prescribe.

15. Any applicant may at any time withdraw his application by giving notice in writing to the Minister; and in like manner any objector may, before or during the inquiry held by the warden, withdraw his objections.

16. Any applicant or objector may proceed under these regulations by his attorney, provided that such attorney be constituted

by the execution of a power-of-attorney for that purpose in such form as shall be approved of by the Minister.

17. Any person or persons being the holder of a lease granted under these regulations, except any person who by operation of law shall be entitled to sell or dispose of such lease for the benefit of creditors, in which case no license shall be necessary, may apply to the Minister for a license under the hand and seal of the Governor to transfer, underlet, mortgage, or otherwise dispose of or encumber such lease, or the mines or premises comprised therein, or any part thereof, and it shall be lawful for the Governor to grant or refuse such license. Every such application must be accompanied with a remittance of £1, which will be returned if the license be not granted. The Minister shall determine the form of the license to be granted.

ANNEX TO CONTRACT NO. 408.

FITTINGS AND CONNEXIONS FOR THE DIAMOND DRILLS.

1. The contractor must provide all necessary tools and labor, and also all material where not otherwise specified in the Schedule, for fully completing all work which may be ordered, and he shall deliver such work at the nearest railway station, or at any other place not exceeding a distance of one mile from his workshop, which may be indicated by the officer in charge. Each delivery must be accompanied by an invoice or delivery note in duplicate. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods shall have been approved of by the officer in charge. The contractor shall, in every case, immediately after despatching any goods to the Department or to any of the drills, send or give notice to the officer in charge of the time of despatch, of the place where such goods have been forwarded, and the number of the order for the same; failing which being done, the contractor will be liable to a fine of not less than 10s. or more than £10 for each and every omission, at the discretion of the Minister of Mines. Such fines may be deducted from the moneys due to the contractor or from contractor's security.

2. The contractor will be required to furnish, in duplicate, any accounts he may have against the Mining Department in the prescribed form, accompanied by the orders for the goods, and receipts from the persons for whose use the same have been supplied.

3. The contract will be for such articles or repairs as may be ordered from the 1st July 1885 to 30th June 1886, whether such articles or repairs are set forth in this Schedule or not. All material and workmanship in connexion with this contract are to be of the very best description, and to be to the entire satisfaction of any officer who may be authorized by the Minister of Mines or Secretary for Mines and Water Supply to act on behalf of the Department of Mines in connexion with this contract, and such officer (herein designated the officer in charge) shall have full power to reject any articles he may deem to be not satisfactory or not in every way suitable.

4. When any order shall have been given to the contractor, he must use every despatch in getting the work done; if he do not, or if the work or material be not to the entire satisfaction of the officer in charge, it shall be optional with such officer in charge to cancel such order and get the work required done wherever he shall think fit, at the contractor's risk and expense; and any extra expense so incurred over the contract price will be deducted from any moneys due to the contractor. The officer in charge shall be the sole judge as to whether the contractor is using all necessary despatch in getting the work done, and as to whether the work or material is of the very best description. On the contractor receiving any machinery or tool for repairs or otherwise from any of the drills, or from any other source, he must, in every case, send a receipt for the same to the officer in charge.

5. When any work is ordered that is not enumerated in the Schedule, the contractor must give his price in writing for the same before commencing it, and if the price shall appear to be excessive to the officer in charge, such officer shall be at liberty to get prices from other persons, and get the work done by whomsoever he may think fit, without in any way infringing this contract.

6. The screw-threads exceeding one inch in diameter (except bolts and nuts) are most of them flat (not V) threads. The Department will lend the gauge-taps and nuts to the contractor for fourteen days, when the contractor must return them to the Department, having first made gauge-taps and dies for his own use. The Department will require the contractor to make standard gauges for all necessary work. These gauges must be properly stamped, and will be the property of the Government. They will be paid for at prices to be agreed on. The contractor must also make duplicate gauges for his own use and at his own expense.

7. When goods shall be ordered of a size not exceeding one-eighth of an inch over the sizes mentioned in the Schedule, the price for such goods shall not be more than that quoted in the Schedule. In cases, however, where the size required shall be more than one-eighth of an inch over the sizes mentioned in the Schedule, the price specified in the Schedule for the next larger size will be paid to the contractor.

8. It will be competent for the Secretary to the Tender Board on behalf of the Government, or the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving, in writing, a notice of two months.

9. It will also be competent for any company or companies renting, using, or employing any of the drills belonging to the Department of Mines, to exercise, on behalf of the Department of Mines, or on their own behalf, all the rights, powers, and privileges conferred by the foregoing clauses, save and except clause 8, which will only vest in the parties named therein. All orders for goods and repairs must be given by the officer in charge.

10. The Secretary for Mines shall from time to time communicate, in writing, to the contractor the name of the company or

companies authorized to exercise such rights, powers, and privileges, and the contractor will not be required to acknowledge any other company or companies than those so named by the Secretary for Mines.

11. Any company or companies having authority to order and receive supplies under this contract shall pay to the contractor the cost of such supplies before obtaining delivery thereof, and the accounts, in such cases, are not to be rendered to the Department of Mines, but to the company or companies direct.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE IN THE TOWN OF SHEPPARTON FOR SHOW-YARDS OF THE SHEPPARTON AND LOWER GOULBURN VALLEY AGRICULTURAL AND PASTORAL SOCIETY.

Regulations.

1. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
2. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, flowers, buildings, fixtures, or any property of the Shepparton and Lower Goulburn Valley Agricultural and Pastoral Society within the reserve, nor shall fire be lighted therein.
3. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, gates, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
4. No person shall put into the reserve any animal without the authority in writing of the committee of management.
5. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without first obtaining the authority, in writing, of the committee of management.
6. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on such days as may be set apart by the committee of management for the holding therein of fêtes, or for the use thereof for any other special purpose, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) may be charged and taken for admission to the reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein without the authority, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, or stick bills thereon, cut names on, or otherwise damage the fences, trees, seats, or other property, or roll or throw stones therein.
5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs without the authority, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained. Provided always that all moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and an account furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, or vend or dispose of in the reserve fruit, provisions, refreshments of any kind, or other article of any description, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.
8. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
9. No person shall make any holes in or in any way interfere with the surface of the reserve without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.
10. No person shall carry or discharge firearms in the reserve, except for military purposes.
11. Any person or society using the reserve for fêtes or other special purposes shall hand over to the committee of management such sum or sums as it may determine, the whole of which shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve.
12. Any person or society using the reserve for any purpose may be required to deposit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds (£10), which the committee of management may determine, by way of guarantee, that due care will be taken to prevent any damage to the gates, fences, walks, trees, shrubs, plants, or other property within the reserve, and the committee of management may make good any such damage, and deduct the cost from the sum of money deposited as aforesaid; and any person or society so using the reserve shall abide by these regulations, and by any order given by the committee of management in reference to the reserve.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
