BYE-LAW NO. 17.**LIVE STOCK RATES.**

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred by *The Victorian Railways Commissioners Act 1883*, do hereby make the following Bye-law for fixing the charges and conditions for Carriage of Animals, and all Bye-laws of 31st January, 1884, conflicting therewith are hereby repealed:—

SHEEP.

SHEEP TRUCKS.

1 to 101 miles	9d. per truck per mile.
Over 101 miles and up to 150 miles	3d. per truck per mile added to the 101 mile rate.	
Over 150 miles	7d. per truck per mile for the whole journey.	

GOODS TRUCKS.

1 to 101 miles	6d. per truck per mile.
Over 101 miles and up to 150 miles	3d. per truck per mile added to the 101 mile rate.	
Over 150 miles	5d. per truck per mile for the whole journey.	

In the event of the Commissioners not being able to supply sheep trucks, they do not undertake to provide goods trucks for the carriage of sheep.

The minimum charge for a sheep truck is 40s., and for a goods truck, or half a truck, 20s., exclusive of a terminal charge of 2s. per truck for sheep trucks, and 1s. per truck for goods trucks, to be added to the above rate in all cases. Over three and up to ten sheep or lambs, half sheep truck rate, whether sent in sheep or goods trucks; over ten, full sheep or goods truck rate, according to order.

CATTLE, ETC.

Cattle or pigs, 1 to 101 miles	9d. per truck per mile.
Over 101 miles and up to 150 miles	3d. per truck per mile added to the 101 mile rate.	
Over 150 miles	7d. per truck per mile for the whole journey.	

The minimum charge for a cattle truck is 20s., exclusive of a terminal charge of 2s. per truck to be added to the above rate in all cases.

Single cattle the same rate as horses, and one or more bulls the same rate as a truck load of cattle, or as entire horses if sent in horse-boxes, but no terminal for single animals. Over three goats or pigs, and up to ten not exceeding 100 lbs. each, half truck, and over ten, or over 100 lbs. each, full truck rate. Goats and calves at cattle rate.

Single pigs, sheep, calves, or goats, in crates or cases, by goods trains, to be charged and carried under fourth class goods rates, subject to a minimum charge as for 2½ cwt. per package. (*See Bye-law No. 14.*)

STORE SHEEP AND CATTLE.

Store sheep, in lots of not less than two truck loads, to be carried from Newmarket to country stations at two-thirds the published rates, and store cattle, in lots of not less than two truck loads, at one-half the published rates, but full terminal, provided always that the trucks are required to load again from the line to which such store sheep and cattle are consigned.

SINGLE ANIMALS BY PASSENGER TRAINS.

For every sheep, lamb, goat, pig, or yearling calf (not exceeding 100 lbs. each), in van of passenger or mixed trains ... 2d. per mile; minimum, 4s. each
Over 100 lbs. and not exceeding 150 lbs. each, rate and a half; over 150 lbs., double rate.

Any of the foregoing sent in vans of passenger or mixed trains must be in skeleton cases, and weight of skeleton cases to be included in the weight of the animals. All skeleton cases must be of a reasonable size, so as not to occupy too much room in the vans, and the Commissioners may refuse any case deemed too bulky, when the sender must supply one of the required dimensions.

Any animal over 200 lbs. will not be taken in van of passenger or mixed trains, but must be sent in ordinary truck by goods train, when the charge will be 6d. per mile each, or else full truck rate; minimum 20s., exclusive of terminal.

HORSES.

For each mare, gelding, or filly, or entire under 2 years ... 6d. per mile; minimum, 20s. each.
For each entire horse, 2 years and over ... 1s. per mile; minimum, 20s. each.

Horse-box, 1s. 3d. per mile; minimum, 40s. A horse-box carries three horses.

Two small ponies occupying one stall to be charged as one horse.

Horses, including entire, in goods trucks and by passenger trains, 1s. 6d. per truck per mile. By goods trains, at cattle rates.

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The minimum distance for First, Second, Third, and Fourth Classes is 15 miles; less distances than 15 miles to be charged as 15 miles. Portions of a mile to be computed a mile. A truck load is computed 5 tons. When the rate is per truck load, and the carrying capacity of the truck exceeds 5 tons, the weight loaded over that quantity (if consigned) will be charged as if it were a separate load. Trucks for the Lower-level Sidings, Melbourne, will be subject to the Regulations for that traffic. Packages under 7 lbs. weight, and packages wrapped in paper, must be forwarded as Parcels by Passenger Train.

Weighing.—At dray weigh-bridges owned by the Department, the charges for weighing are 6d. for any load drawn by one horse, and 1s. for any load drawn by two horses.

Storage.—Charges for Warehousing Goods, to the extent to which the Department has storage accommodation, are as follow:—
All goods of the First, Second, Third, and Fourth Classes, Grain and other produce from up-country stations, discharged into the Melbourne Goods Shed for storage. For instance, Grain unloaded on a Monday, if removed on or before the following Thursday, will not be subject to any charge for a prescribed time, storage at the rate of 6d. per ton per week will be charged. Part of a ton to be charged as a ton, and part of a week as a week.

At Country Stations, Goods of the First, Second, Third, and Fourth, and of the Special, Agricultural, and Miscellaneous Classes, must be removed unloading. If not so removed, storage will be charged as follows, viz:—

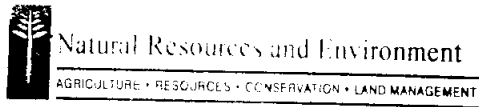

Demurrage.—In all cases where, according to the Goods Classification, the loading may have to be performed by the owner, two working hours will be allowed within that time demurrage at the rate of 1s. per truck per hour will be charged; and where, according to the Goods Classification, the unloading may have to be done by the consignee, and if not completed within that time, demurrage at the rate of 1s. per truck per hour will be charged. Part of an hour to be charged as an hour.

GEN

- The VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS will not be liable for loss of or injury to any articles, goods, or things in or about the receiving, forwarding, or delivery by the neglect or default of the Commissioners or their servants.
- Nor for loss of or injury to any articles, goods, or things put into returned wrappers, boxes, packages, cases, or baskets marked, described, delivered, or received by the Commissioners.
- Nor for non-delivery or mis-delivery of any articles, goods, or things in consequence of the same not being directed, or of the same being improperly or insufficiently packed, or so packed that the breakage or leakage of one or more of the articles has injured the rest; nor for loss by leakage occasioned by imperfect casks or cooperage by or in consequence of fermentation.

- Nor for injury to any marbles, musical instruments, furniture, toys, or other articles, which, from their brittleness, fragility, or delicacy of construction, are liable to be damaged in transit, unless they shall be declared in writing, and an appropriate rate or charge for the carriage thereof to be paid, or contracted to be paid.
- The Commissioners will consider themselves at liberty to deliver goods, and to charge for such delivery, in all cases in which the senders of the goods do not require that the goods are to be taken from the station by the consignees.
- No claim for deficiency, damage, or detention shall be allowed unless made within four days after delivery of the goods; nor for loss unless made within four days after the goods should have been delivered.

DISSOLUTION OF AN UNION UNDER "THE WEIGHTS AND MEASURES STATUTE 1864."

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, called *The Weights and Measures Statute 1864*, it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might at any time, if he think fit, and should at the request of not less than half the councils or boards constituting any Union proclaimed under the said Act, dissolve the same by Proclamation: And whereas the Shires of Shepparton, Yarrowonga, and Waranga were proclaimed an Union on the twenty-fifth day of July One thousand eight hundred and eighty-one: And whereas the councils of the shires mentioned have requested that the said Union may be dissolved: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby dissolve the Union of the Shires of Shepparton, Yarrowonga, and Waranga, for the purposes of the said Act.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this sixteenth day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, and in the forty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign.

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT OF A RESERVE FOR A PUBLIC GARDEN IN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF WILLIAMSTOWN.

WHEREAS by the 133rd section of *The Land Act 1884* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make and alter or rescind rules and regulations, or to rescind any rules and regulations heretofore made for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering in or upon such public parks and reserves: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the Regulation following to be observed and enforced in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order of 29th June 1885 as a site for a Public Garden in the municipal district of Williamstown.

REGULATION.

The said reserve shall be under the control of the Council of the Borough of Williamstown, as a Committee of Management thereof.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE BOTANICAL GARDENS, MELBOURNE.

WHEREAS by section 133 of *The Land Act 1884* power is given to the Board of Land and Works, from time to time, to make and alter or rescind rules and regulations, or to rescind any rules and regulations heretofore made for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in exercise of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby rescind the Rules and Regulations made by it on the 1st day of August 1876, in respect of the Botanical Gardens, in the city of Melbourne, and doth hereby make the Regulations following for the care, protection, and management of such gardens.

Regulations.

1. No person shall interfere with the trees, shrubs, flowers, statuary, vases, labels, fountains, fish, or birds in the gardens, or step on the beds, borders, edgings, or seats, or engage in any sport or game, or throw stones or other missiles, or commit any nuisance, or leave any bottles, orange-peel, paper, cast off clothing, or litter, or light fires therein, or smoke, annoy visitors, or carry flowers into the gardens.
2. No person shall climb or jump over the seats or fences in or around the gardens, or stick bills on such fences or on the gates, or cut names, letters, or marks on the summer-houses, trees, seats, gates, posts, or fences or other property, or write thereon, or otherwise deface the same.

3. No person shall bring into the gardens any dog unless held by a chain or cord, and all goats or poultry found therein shall be liable to be destroyed by any bailiff of Crown lands or constable.

4. Children under ten (10) years of age shall not be allowed within the gardens unless accompanied by and in the care or charge of adult friends or nurses whom they shall not leave while therein.

5. No person, unless authorized in writing by the Minister of Lands, shall offer for sale in the gardens any article.

6. Unless the Minister of Lands shall otherwise direct, the gates of the gardens shall be opened daily at seven o'clock a.m. during the months of October, November, December, January, February, and March, and at 7.30 o'clock a.m. during April, May, June, July, August, and September, and shall be closed at sunset. A bell shall be rung five minutes before the locking of the gates, and any person found in the gardens during unauthorized hours, shall be liable to prosecution.

7. Any person found removing, taking from, or injuring plants, flowers, seeds, or fruits in the gardens shall be liable to be summarily removed therefrom and to be prosecuted.

8. No person shall enter into plots of ground specially enclosed for plantations and for other purposes in the gardens, and no assemblies for fêtes, picnics, or concerts, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, or meetings of a like character shall take place in the gardens, without the permission, in writing, of the Minister of Lands first obtained.

9. No person in a state of intoxication, or who is disorderly, or not decorously dressed, shall enter or remain within the gardens, and no person shall commit therein any act of indecency.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of *The Land Act 1834*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE SOUTH SHEPPARTON COMMON.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons, made by the Governor in Council on 17th March 1885, the Council of the Shire of South Shepparton, having drafted the following Regulations for management of the South Shepparton Common,

submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works, and approval by the Governor in Council.

Regulations.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, o carriers' licenses, and farmers residing within a distance of five miles from the common, may respectively depasture thereon four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole, or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle.

A farmer, having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him, may depasture on such common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten (10) acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follow, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the first day of April and the first day of October in every year :—

For every horse, 6s. per annum.
For every head of other large cattle, 5s. per annum.
For every sheep or goat, 5s. per annum.

3. No person shall be allowed to depasture on the common stock of which he is not the *bona fide* owner.

4. All licenses applied for and issued during the currency of a term shall be subject to the full rate; but in case of removal of any stock already licensed an equivalent number may be placed in their stead for the unexpired term of the license, provided that the licensee deliver to the herdsman, in writing, an account of such number, and the description of the same.

5. Before any stock are placed on the common they shall be duly registered and delivered to the herdsman, who shall be in attendance at the mustering yards.

6. No stock shall be allowed to depasture on the common unless the same are marked with the proper brands of the person registering, and with the common brand in pitch or tar.

7. All persons depasturing stock on the common shall assist at the bi-annual mustering, or in default pay 6d. for every head they may have depasturing thereon.

8. No entire horse or bull over the age of six (6) months shall be allowed on the common without the consent, in writing, of the managers.

9. No person shall remove horses, cattle sheep or goats from the common without first notifying the herdsman.

10. All stock affected with any contagious disease shall be removed from the common by the owners within twenty-four (24) hours after notice to do so has been served upon them by the herdsman, and in default of compliance therewith the managers may destroy such stock at the cost of the owner or owners thereof.

11. The managers shall not be responsible for any neglect or irregularity on the part of the herdsman, or for the loss of or injury to any stock depasturing on the common.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

If any cattle shall be found upon any land not being a common, and such that there is no fence, whether upon the same land or any other, dividing such first mentioned land from any street or road, whether public or private, without any person having charge of such cattle, the owner of such cattle shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings for every head of such cattle, and the proper officer of the Council may seize such cattle and place the same at some neighbouring place of safe custody, and any justice, if such owner be not known, upon proof of the issue of a summons in the usual form, addressed to such owner as "owner" only, without otherwise naming or describing him, such cattle and the place of seizure being duly described therein, and of the publication of such summons in some newspaper commonly circulating in the neighbourhood, may, after the expiration of twenty-four hours from such publication, proceed with respect to such owner not appearing as if personal service of a summons stating his name had been effected, or if such owner appear, then as in other cases; and the justice may order the cattle to be sold, and the money arising from the sale, after deducting the said penalty, and the costs awarded, and the reasonable expenses, to be estimated and assessed by the justice, of seizing, keeping, and selling the said cattle shall be paid, if

demanded within one month, to the owner of the cattle, and if not so demanded, then to the municipal fund; and if the said money shall not be sufficient for all the purposes aforesaid, the amount whereby the same falls short, or if no such sale be ordered, the whole of the said amount may be recovered from the said owner if and when known in like manner as other penalties and sums adjudged or ordered to be paid by justices are to be recovered.

42. If any cattle be at any time found in any street without any person having the charge thereof, the owner of such cattle shall forfeit for every head of such cattle a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings, and if such cattle shall by reason of having been so found at large have been impounded by the Council, the amount of such penalty and costs, if adjudged respectively before the release or sale of such cattle, shall be added to the pound fees and charges payable in respect of such cattle, and the amount thereof, or such lesser amount (if any) as after the sale of the cattle may remain in the hands of the poundkeeper, shall be paid over by him accordingly; and if the proceeds of any sale of such cattle shall not be sufficient, after paying the lawful fees and charges aforesaid, to satisfy such penalty and costs, or if such penalty and costs shall have been adjudged after the release or sale of the cattle, the same, or so much thereof as remains unpaid, shall and may be recovered from the owner of the cattle in like manner as other penalties and costs adjudged by justices are by law to be recovered; and if, in the case of any information under this section, the owner be not known, then the provisions of the last preceding section, so far as necessary to give the adjudicating justice jurisdiction, shall apply.

43. If any goat shall have been impounded under the provisions of either the two last preceding sections, or under the provisions of this bye-law relating to the impounding of cattle for trespass in the streets, and shall not after the expiration of twenty-four hours be released, and the penalty, costs, fees, and charges be paid by the owner thereof, any justice may by warrant under his hand directed to any constable authorise the destruction of such goat, and the same may be destroyed accordingly.

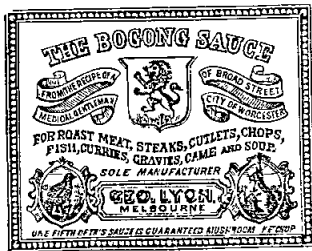

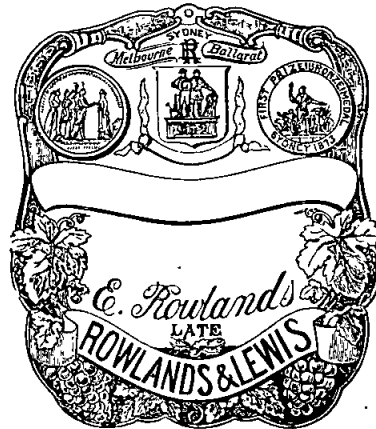

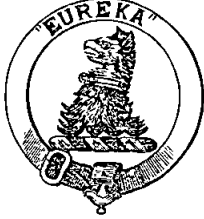
