(1) Middle Channel subject to change.

The Government of Queensland has given notice, dated 7th February 1885, that in consequence of recent changes in East and Venus banks, approach to Moreton Bay from the northward, vessels should not use Middle Channel until further notice.

(2) Fittroy River Entrance—Additional leading lights.

Also, that on the 17th February 1885, the following additional leading lights would be exhibited at Fittroy River entrance, Keppel Bay:—

1. Two fixed white lights on Balaklava Island, placed 1763 yards apart, elevated 30 and 87 feet above the sea respectively, and which kept in line bearing S. by W. ½ W. lead just westward of Timandra Bank buoy.

Approximate position of northern light, lat. 23° 33½ S., long. 150° 57° E.

2. Two fixed lights—the northern red the southern white—on the western shore of Port Alma, southward of Eupatoria Point; these lights, elevated 25 and 54 feet above the sea respectively, and 860 yards apart, kept in line bearing S.W. § W. lead through Sea Reach, in not less than 19 feet at low-

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water; and to Port Alma, the line passing close to the position of Elbow Light-vessel and cutting the line of the leading lights on Balakklava Island in 7 fathoms water.

3. Two fixed lights—the western red and eastern rehite—on Cardigan Point, Balaklava Island. These sights, elevated 25 and 52 feet above the sea respectively, and 850 yards apart, lead on a west (southerly) course northward of Elbow Light-vessel, and into Rocky Point Reach abreast Flat Island.

The illuminating apparatus of these lights is catoptric, or by lenses.

by lenses.

Directions by night.—After rounding Timandra Bank buoy, open the upper light on Isalaklava Island slightly westward of the lower light, and keep them so until the obscured sector of the light on Little Sea Hill is passed; then open the upper light slightly eastward of the lower light, and keep them in that position until the lights on Eupatoria Point are nearly in line, then steer for them and bring them in line, this course then leads to a position just below the new Government Wharf at Port Alma.

Proceeding up Fitzroy River—after bringing Eupatoria Point lights in line, keep them so until the red and white lights on Cardigan Point are coming in line, then alter course and proceed with them in that position until the steep bank of the channel in Rocky Point Reach is neared, when that shore is to kept aboard and the channel followed.



COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT OF A RESERVE FOR A PUBLIC GARDEN IN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF WILLIAMSTOWN.

WHEREAS by the 133rd section of The Land Act 1884 power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make and alter or rescind rules and regulations, or to rescind any rules and regulations heretofore made for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering in or upon such public parks and reserves: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforceaid, doth hereby make the Regulation following to be observed and enforced in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order of 20th June 1885 as a site for a Public Garden in the municipal district of Williamstown.

The said reserve shall be under the control of the Council of the Borough of Williamstown, as a Committee of Management

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE BOTANICAL GARDENS, MELBOURNE.

MELBOURNE.

WHEREAS by section 133 of The Land Act 1884 power is given to the Board of Land and Works, from time to time, to make and alter or rescind rules and regulations, or to rescind any rules and regulations heretofore made for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vosted in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in exercise of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby rescind the Rules and Regulations made by it on the 1st day of August 1876, in respect of the Botanical Gardens, in the city of Melbourne, and doth hereby make the Regulations following for the care, protection, and management of such gardens.

Regulations. Regulations.

- 1. No person shall interfere with the trees, shrubs, flowers, statuary, vases, labels, fountains, fish, or birds in the gardens, or step on the beds, borders, edgings, or seats, or engage in any sport or game, or throw stones or other missiles, or commit any nuisance, or leave any bottles, orange-peel, paper, cast off clothing, or litter, or light fires therein, or smoke, annoy visitors, or carry flowers into the gardens.
- carry nowers into the gardens.

   No person shall climb or jump over the seats or fences in or around the gardens, or stick bills on such fences or on the gates, or cut names, letters, or marks on the summer-houses, trees, seats, gates, posts, or fences or other property, or write thereon, or otherwise deface the same.

(L.S.)

- No person shall bring into the gardens any dog unless held by a chain or cord, and all goats or poultry found therein shall be liable to be destroyed by any bailiff of Crown lands or con-stable.
- Children under ten (10) years of age shall not be allowed within the gardens unless accompanied by and in the care or charge of adult friends or nurses whom they shall not leave while therein.
- 5. No person, unless authorized in writing by the Minister of Lands, shall offer for sale in the gardens any article.
- 6. Unless the Minister of Lands shall otherwise direct, the gates of the gardens shall be opened daily at seven o'clock a.m. during the months of October, November, December, January, February, and March, and at 7.30 o'clock a.m. during April, May, June, July. August, and September, and shall be closed at sunset. A bell shall be rung five minutes before the locking of the gates, and any person found in the gardens during unauthorized hours, shall be liable to prosecution.
- 7. Any person found removing, taking from, or injuring plants, flowers, seeds, or fruits in the gardens shall be liable to be summarily removed therefrom and to be prosecuted.
- 8. No person shall enter into plots of ground specially enclosed for plantations and for other purposes in the gardens, and no assemblies for fêtes, picnics, or concerts, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, or meetings of a like character shall take place in the gardens, without the permission, in writing, of the Minister of Lands first obtained.
- No person in a state of intoxication, or who is disorderly, or not decorously dressed, shall enter or remain within the gardens, and no person shall commit therein any act of indecency.

and no person shall commit therein any act of indecency.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of The Land Act 1884, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR A COMMON.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations.

REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE SOUTH SHEPPARTON COMMON.

In pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons, made by the Governor in Council on 17th March 1885, the Council of the Shire of South Shepparton, having drafted the following Regulations for management of the South Shepparton Common,

submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works, and approval by the Governor in Council.

#### Regulations.

- 1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, o carriers' licenses, and farmers residing within a distance of five miles from the common, may respectively depasture thereon four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole, or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle.
- A farmer, having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him, may depasture on such common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten (10) acres of such land cultivated by him.
- 2. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follow, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the first day of April and the first day of October in every year:—

For every horse, 6s. per annum. For every head of other large cattle, 5s. per annum. For every sheep or goat, 5s. per annum.

- No person shall be allowed to depasture on the common stock of which he is not the bond fide owner.
- 4. All licenses applied for and issued during the currency of a term shall be subject to the full rate; but in case of removal of any stock already licensed an equivalent number may be placed in their stead for the unexpired term of the license, provided that the licensee deliver to the herdsman, in writing, an account of such number, and the description of the same.
- Before any stock are placed on the common they shall be duly registered and delivered to the herdsman, who shall be in attendance at the mustering yards.
- 6. No stock shall be allowed to depasture on the common unless the same are marked with the proper brands of the person registering, and with the common brand in pitch or tar.
- 7. All persons depasturing stock on the common shall assist at the bi-annual mustering, or in default pay 6d. for every head they may have depasturing thereon.
- 8. No entire horse or bull over the age of six (6) months shall be allowed on the common without the consent, in writing, of the managers.
- No person shall remove horses, cattle sheep or goats from the common without first notifying the herdsman.
- 10. All stock affected with any contagious disease shall be removed from the common by the owners within twenty-four (24) hours after notice to do so has been served upon them by the herdsman, and in default of compliance therewith the managers may destroy such stock at the cost of the owner or owners thereof.
- 11. The managers shall not be responsible for any neglect or irregularity on the part of the herdsman, or for the loss of or injury to any stock depasturing on the common.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

A Bye-law of the Shire of Heidelbery, made under the 213th section of "The Local Government Act 1874," and numbered 3, for the suppression of the nuisance occasioned by cattle wandering in the streets of this shire.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Local Government Act Amendment 1883." the president, councillors, and ratepayers of the Shire of Heidelberg order as follows:—

Sections 41, 42, and 43 of subdivision 9, Part 1, of the 13th schedule of "The Local Government Act 1874," are hereby adopted in and for the Shire of Heidelberg order as follows:—

41. If any cattle shall be found upon any land not being a common, and such that there is no fence, whether upon the same land or any other, dividing such first mentioned land from any street or road, whether public or private, without any person having charge of such cattle, the owner of such cattle shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings for every head of such cattle, and the proper officer of the Council may seize such cattle and place the same at some neighbouring place of safe custody, and any justice, if such owner be not known, upon proof of the issue of a summons in the usual form, addressed to such owner as "owner" only, without otherwise maming or describing him, such cattle and the place of seizure being duly described therein, and of the publication of such summons in some newspaper commonly circulating in the neighbourhood, may, after the expiration of twenty-four hours from such publication, proceed with respect to such owner not appearing as if personal service of a summons stating his name had been effected, or if such owner appear, then as in other cases; and the justice may order the cattle to be sold, and the money arising from the sale, after deducting the said penalty, and the costs awarded,

demanded within one month, to the owner of the cattle, and if not so demanded, then to the municipal fund; and if the said money shall not be sufficient for all the purposes aforesaid, the amount whereby the same falls short, or if no such sale be ordered, the whole of the said amount may be recovered from the said owner if and when known in like manner as other penalties and sums adjudged or ordered to be paid by justices are to be recovered.

42. If any cattle be at any time found in any street without any person having, the charge thereof, the owner of such cattle shall forfeit for every head of such cattle a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings, and if such cattle shall by reason of having been so found at large have been impounded by the Council, the amount of such penalty and costs, if adjudged respectively before the release or sale of such cattle, shall be added to the pound fees and charges payable in respect of such cattle, and the amount thereof, or such lesser amount (if any) as after the sale of the cattle may remain in the hands of the poundkeeper, shall be paid over by him accordingly; and if the proceeds of any sale of such cattle shall not be sufficient, after paying the lawful fees and charges aforesaid, to satisfy such penalty and costs, or if such penalty and costs shall have been adjudged after the release or sale of the cattle, the same, or so much thereof as remains unpaid, shall and may be recovered from the owner of the cattle in like manner as other penalties and costs adjudged by justices are by last the section, the owner be not known, then the provisions of the last preceding section, so far as necessary to give the adjudicating justice jurisdiction, shall apply.


