TRANSMISSION OF POSTAL PACKETS IN VICTORIA, 47 VICTORIA, No. 781, SEC. 10.

THE following Regulation, relating to the above, has been approved by the Governor in Council:—

"Packets containing articles of merchandise of any description may be transmitted by post within the colony of Victoria, provided.

1st. That such packets shall not exceed three pounds (3 lbs.) in weight, and that their dimensions shall not exceed two feet (2 ft.) in length, one foot (1 ft.) in breadth, and one foot (1 ft.) in depth.

2nd. That no packet containing fluids or articles of a similar nature shall be forwarded unless very securely packed, so as to prevent injury to the mails, and that no article of a dangerous or offensive character shall be transmitted through the post.
