Petitioners state that the area proposed to be severed is a little over 3000 square miles; that the population is between 2000 and 3000, and there must be, very shortly, an increase in the population, in consequence of all the mallee allotments within the area having been taken up under the provisions of *The Mallee Pastoral Leases Act 1883*; that the number of ratepayers in the area last year was 838, and that it has increased during the present year to 915; that the rateable value of land and property within the area is £30,065, which sum does not include the mallee allotments above-mentioned; that the revenue of the area for the present year is computed at £3,500, and it is estimated that the revenue for next year will exceed £4,000; that the other portions of the shire are indebted to the above area in a considerable sum; that the Lowan Shire has ceased to be workable as a whole in a satisfactory manner in consequence of its size and increase of population, and the shire officers admit their inability to perform their heavy duties satisfactorily; that the annual salaries paid by the Lowan Shire Council to their officers amount to £698, and if the prayer of the petition is granted, it is believed that the duties of the officers of the new municipality can be performed far more satisfactorily to the district for a sum not exceeding one-half the above amount.

They therefore pray that the area above described may be constituted a separate municipality, and that the number of the councillors be six (6), and that it be not subdivided.

MEREDITH RACECOURSE AND RECREATION RESERVE.—REGULATIONS.

WE, Frederick Harvey, James Macpherson, John Stow, Henry O'Brien, and Andrew Walsh, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Meredith Racecourse and Recreation Reserve having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*.

Regulations.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
5. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.
6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.
7. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.
