WHEREAS His Excellency the Governor in Council, by an Order in Council bearing date the seventh day of September 1885, hath approved of the construction of certain works without alterations or additions or restrictions of the plans and specifications thereof proposed to be carried out in the irrigation area hereinafter limited by an Irrigation Trust, to be constituted under the provisions of *The Victoria Water Conservation Act*

1883: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order order and appoint as follows:—

1. That an Irrigation Trust be constituted to construct, maintain and continue the whole or any part of the works described in the plans and descriptions thereof in accordance with the provisions of this Order and of the said Act.

2. That the limits of the lands to be called an Irrigation Area within which such Trust shall have authority to act shall be as follow:—

Commencing at the south-east angle of allotment 1A, parish of Leaghur; thence easterly by the southern boundary of the said allotment and a line in the same direction to a point in the eastern boundary of allotment 37; thence southerly by the eastern boundary of said allotment 37 to the south-east angle thereof; thence westerly by the south boundary of said allotment to the south-west angle thereof; thence northerly by the western boundary of said allotment and allotment 37A to the north-west angle of last-named allotment; thence easterly by a portion of of the north boundary of allotment 37A to a point in a line with the western boundary of allotment 38; thence by a line and the western boundary of allotments 38, 39, 40, 65, and 66, all in the parish of Leaghur, to the north-west angle of the last-named allotment; thence easterly by a portion of the northern boundary of said allotment 66 to the south-west angle of allotment 67; thence by the western boundary of allotment 67 parish of Leaghur, allotments 10 and 11 parish of Meering, and a line in the same direction to a point in the southern boundary of allotment 11B of the last-named parish; thence westerly by the southern boundary of said allotment 11B to the south-west angle of same; thence northerly by the east side of a road bounding allotments 11B, 12, and 13 to the north-west angle of the last-named allotment; thence easterly by the northern boundary and southerly by the eastern boundary of said allotment 13 to a point in line with the northern boundary of allotment 5B; thence by a line and the northern boundaries of allotments 5B and 5A to the north-east angle of last-named allotment; thence in a general direction southerly by the eastern boundaries of allotments 5A, 6, 6A, 7, 8, 9, and reserve under 110 section of *The Land Act 1869*, to the south-east angle of said reserve, all in the parish of Meering; thence in a general direction southerly by the eastern boundaries of allotments 2B, 2C, 3A, 4, 5, 5A, 6A, 6, 7, 7A, 1B, and 1A, all in the parish of Leaghur, to the south-east angle of the last-named allotment the commencing point aforesaid.

3. The scheme for the irrigation of the said irrigation area shall be the diversion of water from the Sheepwash Creek and the distribution of such water upon the lands of the said area by means of channels and gravitation, and the principal works shall be main and branch irrigation channels and head sluices.

4. That the name of the said Irrigation Area shall be "The Leaghur and Meering Irrigation Area," and the corporate name of the said Irrigation Trust shall be "The Leaghur and Meering Irrigation Trust."

5. That the amount of money proposed to be expended on the scheme being Six hundred and fifty pounds sterling, the sum which may be raised for the purpose of carrying out such scheme, and of paying the preliminary costs and expenses of the applications for this order, shall not exceed Six hundred and fifty pounds sterling.

6. The number of persons to be elected as Commissioners of the said Leaghur and Meering Irrigation Trust shall be six, and the period for which such Commissioners shall hold office shall be three years.

REGULATION No. 1.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881* the Chairman and Commissioners of the United Echuca and Waranga Waterworks Trust make the Regulation following, that is to say:—

1. *Place and hour of meeting.*—The place of meeting shall be at the office of the commissioners, and meetings shall be held on the second Tuesday in each month, at the hour of Eleven o'clock a.m. The Trust may hold special meetings, and the Chairman of the Trust or any two or more commissioners may call a special meeting. But no such meeting shall be held unless four clear days' notice thereof, at least, be given.

2. *General conduct of business.*—In all cases not herein provided for, resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Trust.

3. *Minutes of meeting to be read at next subsequent meeting.*—At every meeting of the Trust the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the

minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any committee presented at any such preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed by the chairman; and the rough minutes of the proceedings of the Trust at any meeting shall be read, at the close of such meeting, if required by any commissioner present at such meeting.

4. *Order of business at meetings.*—After the signing of the minutes, as aforesaid, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but, for the greater convenience of the Trust, at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (i.) Reading of copies of letters sent by the authority of the Trust.
- (ii.) Reading letters received and considering and ordering thereon.
- (iii.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (iv.) Presentation of reports of committees.
- (v.) Payments.
- (vi.) Ordinary business.
- (vii.) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from the proceedings of former meetings.
- (viii.) Extraordinary business and new rules and regulations.
- (ix.) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (x.) Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

5. *Divisions.*—Whenever a division shall be demanded by any commissioner, the commissioners voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result be declared by the chairman.

6. *Addresses to the Governor.*—All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the Chairman and the Secretary of the Trust, unless otherwise ordered by the Trust.

7. *Motions.*—All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered, and given by the intending mover to the secretary at the close of the meeting of the Trust, or, if not required by law to be given at a meeting, then three clear days prior to the next meeting of the Trust; and such secretary shall enter the same in the Notice of Motion Book in the order in which they may be received.

8. *Notice of motion to be given.*—No commissioner shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion but in pursuance of notice given, as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

9. *Petitions.*—No motion, except that for receiving the same, shall, unless under the most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application, until the next ordinary meeting of the Trust after that at which it has been presented.

10. *Motions to be moved in order in the Motion Book.*—Except by leave of the Trust, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received, and if not so moved or postponed, shall be struck out.

11. *Motion to be proceeded with by commissioner giving same except with consent.*—No motion shall be proceeded with in the absence of the commissioner who gave notice of same, unless by some other commissioner producing written authority from him to that effect.

12. *Mover of motion to be member of committee.*—The mover of any motion appointing a committee shall be a member of such committee.

13. *Draft of address or petition to be submitted at previous meeting.*—No motion for an address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall, at some previous meeting, have submitted a draft of same.

14. *Order, &c., of debate.*—Any commissioner desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in a discussion thereon, shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the commissioner (if any) calling to order shall have been heard thereon and the question of order disposed of, when the commissioner in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

15. *Nature of motion to be stated.*—Any commissioner desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Trust thereon.

16. *Motion not to be withdrawn without leave.*—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the Trust.

17. *Motion to be seconded.*—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Trust unless it be seconded; but a commissioner may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the Trust by directing the chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

18. *Mover of motion.*—A commissioner moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon; but a commissioner merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

19. *Designation of commissioners.*—The commissioners, in meeting of Trust, shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of chairman or commissioner as the case may require.

20. *Priority of commissioners.*—If two or more commissioners rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

21. *Commissioners to rise in addressing Trust.*—Every commissioner, including the chairman, shall stand up while addressing the Trust.

22. *Commissioner not to speak a second time on same question.*—No commissioner shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply, or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

23. *Points of order.*—The chairman when called upon to decide on points of order or practice shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussing or commenting on the same; and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

24. *Commissioners not to digress.*—No commissioner shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other commissioner in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives, and all personal reflections on commissioners shall be deemed highly disorderly.

25. *Commissioner to apologize for disorderly expressions.*—Whenever any commissioner shall make use of any expression disorderly or capable of being applied offensively to any other commissioner, the commissioner so offending shall be required by the chairman to withdraw the expression, and to make a satisfactory apology to the Trust.

26. *Commissioner called to order to sit down.*—A commissioner called to order shall sit down, unless permitted to explain.

27. *Commissioner twice offending guilty of an offence.*—Any commissioner using offensive or disorderly language, and having been twice called to order, or to withdraw and to apologize for such conduct, and refusing so to do, shall be liable to a penalty for a breach of this regulation.

28. *Strangers.*—Any person, not being a commissioner, who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the Trust, be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when lawfully requested by the chairman so to do, may be forthwith removed by him, and shall be liable to a penalty for a breach of this regulation.

29. *Commissioners not attending order for call.*—Any commissioner not attending, in compliance with an order for a call of the whole Trust, without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof, shall be liable to a penalty for a breach of this regulation.

30. *Commissioner may demand documents.*—Any commissioner may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the Trust applying to the question under discussion.

31. *Voting.*—The Trust shall vote by show of hands, and the chairman shall, in taking the sense of the Trust, put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative, and the result thereof declared by him shall be entered in the minutes by the secretary.

32. *Divisions.*—Whenever a division shall be demanded by any commissioner the commissioners voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result thereof declared by the chairman; and when such division takes place the names of the commissioners voting in the division shall be recorded in the minutes of the said meeting; and any commissioner present not voting, not being disabled by law, shall be liable to a penalty for a breach of this regulation.

33. *Motions, &c., to be in writing.*—At every meeting of the Trust all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall be reduced into writing, signed by the mover and seconder.

34. *Amendments.*—One amendment only shall be discussed at a time, but, if lost, another may be moved before the original question is put to the vote; but upon any amendment being carried it shall be competent for any commissioner to move another amendment thereon.

35. *Mover of motion to have right of reply.*—The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair; but no commissioner shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question, unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

36. *Motion for adjournment.*—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for the adjournment of the Trust, but if on the question being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next on the notice-paper shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made; but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the debate on the motion moved and seconded or any order of the day may be resumed at the next adjourned meeting of the Trust, at the point at which it was so interrupted.

37. *Protests.*—Any commissioner may protest against any resolution of the Trust, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against, and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the Trust, by the protesting commissioner in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the secretary, and signed by such commissioner, and shall also be entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the Trust to be not in accordance with truth or in its terms disrespectful to the Trust.

38. *Lapsed questions.*—If a debate on any motion, moved and seconded, be interrupted by the number of the commissioners present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted, on motion upon notice.

39. *Lapsed Orders of the Day may be restored.*—If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of numbers as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the Notice Book for a future day, on motion, upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

40. *Meetings of the Committee.*—The secretary shall convene every committee within ten days of its first appointment, or at

any other time thereafter by order of the Trust, or on the written order of the chairman of the committee, or of any two members of the committee.

41. *No petition shall be presented after the Trust shall have proceeded to the Orders of the Day, and it shall be incumbent on every commissioner presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Trust, and that the contents do not violate any bye-law or any provision hereof, and shall write his name at the beginning of the said petition.*

42. *Petitions to be in writing.*—Every petition shall be in writing, and not printed or lithographed, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioners at the end thereof, and be signed by at least one person on every skin or sheet on which it is written.

43. *To be signed by Petitioners.*—Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto, by their names or marks, and by no one else, except in cases of incapacity by sickness.

44. *No letters, &c., to be attached.*—No letters, affidavits, or other documents shall be attached to any petition.

45. *Commissioners confined to statement of certain facts.*—Every commissioner presenting a petition to the Trust, shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and the reading of the prayer thereof.

46. *Appointment, &c., of officers.*—No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the Trust shall take place until seven clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement, in one or more newspapers circulating in the water district, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same.

47. *Salaries of officers, &c.*—The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the Trust shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same before the advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement.

48. *Trust to take security from officers entrusted with money.*—Before any officer entrusted by the Trust with the custody or control of money by virtue of his office enters thereon, the Trust shall take sufficient security from some association or incorporated company, carrying on in Victoria the business of a guarantee society, for the faithful execution of such office by such officer.

49. *Expense of preparing security.*—In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any duty or contract, the expense of preparing such security shall be borne by the person providing the same.

50. *Duties of secretary.*—The secretary shall, under the direction of the chairman or of his substitute, at any meeting of the commissioners, keep and record the minutes of all meetings of the commissioners, or of any committee of the commissioners. He shall conduct all correspondence by and in behalf of the Trust, and he shall, under the direction of the commissioners, conduct all the ordinary business of the Trust. And should any urgent business transpire during the interval elapsing between meetings of the commissioners, he shall, under the direction of the chairman, transact such business.

51. *Duties of treasurer.*—The treasurer shall receive all moneys on behalf of the Trust, and shall pay all such into the bank appointed by the commissioners within forty-eight hours after they shall come into his hands. And he shall, to the extent of the funds then in his hands or under his control, pay all cheques lawfully drawn by the commissioners in accordance with this regulation, or with any regulation at any time in force relating to the drawing of cheques for payment by the Trust.

52. *Payments.*—All payments by the Trust shall be made by cheque on the order of the commissioners, and all such cheques shall be signed by two commissioners, and be countersigned by the treasurer.

53. *Common seal.*—The secretary of the Trust shall have the custody of its common seal, and shall be responsible for same; and impressions only to be made by order of the Trust, verified by the signatures of the chairman and secretary.

54. *Officers of the Trust.*—The offices of the Trust shall be open daily, Saturdays excepted, from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m., during which time the secretary shall attend to transact the business of the Trust; and he shall also attend during the hours of every Trust meeting, and at such committee meetings as may be required. Any other officer of the Trust shall attend such meetings of the Trust as they may direct, upon receiving notice, in writing, from the secretary to that effect.

55. *Suspension of regulations.*—Any one or more of the rules or regulations contained herein may be suspended *pro tem.* in cases of emergency, and with the consent of two-thirds of the commissioners present at any meeting.

56. *Penalty.*—Any person guilty of a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding for any offence the sum of Five pounds.

REPEAL OF ADDITIONAL PORT AND HARBOR REGULATIONS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Passengers Harbors and Navigation Statute 1865* it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might, by proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time, define the limits and boundaries of ports in Victoria, and frame rules and regulations for the governance and preservation of such ports, and for the regulation of shipping in the same; and might appoint officers to carry out and enforce such rules and regulations; and from time to time in like manner might alter, amend, or repeal any such limits, boundaries, rules, and regulations, and substitute others in their stead: And whereas by a proclamation dated the thirteenth day of May, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, made by His Excellency Sir John Henry Thomas Manners-Sutton, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the said Colony of Victoria, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the said colony on the twenty-first day of May, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, the limits and boundaries of the Port of Port Phillip were defined to consist of all inlets, rivers, bays, and harbors within a line drawn from Point Lonsdale to Point Nepean, and not included in the Ports of Melbourne and Geelong respectively: And whereas it is expedient to repeal the additional Port and Harbor Regulations proclaimed on the twenty-eighth day of March, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-five: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Brougham Loch, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the same, do hereby repeal the said additional Port and Harbor Regulations proclaimed on the twenty-eighth day of March, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.
