PROCLAMATIONS OF SPECIAL LICENSING DISTRICTS REVOKED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Licensing Act 1876* (No. 566, section 44) it was amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding the provisions thereinbefore contained, it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim any place or district a place or district where, owing to a sudden increase of population or otherwise, the necessity for the immediate grant of publicans' licenses exists to be a place or district wherein publicans' licenses might be specially granted, and from time to time to revoke any such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke all and every proclamation issued under the authority of the 44th section of the said Act, in relation to the places or districts named or specified in the subjoined Schedule, that is to say :-

10th March 1885 ...	An area within half a mile radius of the State School reserve on the Samaria road from Benalla to Mansfield

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

BYE-LAW No. 32.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, by virtue of the authority vested in them by *The Victorian Railways Commissioners Act 1883*, do hereby make the following Bye-law, that is to say:—

Communication between passengers and the Commissioners' servants. Any passenger by any train provided with means of communication between the passengers and the servants of the said Commissioners in charge of such train who makes use of the said means of communication without reasonable and sufficient cause shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding £20.

ANSER ISLANDS, BASS' STRAITS.—SENKEN ROCK.

ADVERTING to notice dated the 23rd September, it is now notified that the rock upon which the *Gulf of Carpentaria* struck is situated due north from Cleft Island, and distant therefrom six and a half (6½) cables; the north end of South Anser Island bears E. by S. ¼ S., and the south end bears S.E. ¼ E. (magnetic) from the rock.

This rock, which is not shown on the latest Admiralty charts, is a circular patch about 100 feet in extent, with about 10 feet of water on the shallowest part.

Mariners are hereby cautioned against navigating the passages between either the North and South Anser Islands, or between Cleft Island and Citadel Island.

THE EXPLOSIVES ACT 1877.

THE Governor in Council has exempted the safety blasting powder manufactured by Mr. James Cahill, whose factory is situated at Back Creek, parish of Strathfieldsaye, in the county of Bendigo, from the operation of the following portions of the Regulations framed under *The Explosives Act 1877*, and published in the *Government Gazette* of 13th December 1879, No. 127, viz.:

- That portion of clause 4 commencing with the word "other" in the fourth line of the second paragraph and ending with the word "building" in the eighth line thereof;

 to apply only to the safety blasting powder above-mentioned in lieu of the ninth paragraph of clause 11 aforesaid, viz.:

All carriages used for the conveyance of safety blasting powder shall be of good and substantial make, and shall be so constructed that the explosive contained therein shall be properly protected from the weather by fireproof tarpaulins; and such carriages shall have the name of the explosive conveyed therein in plain and conspicuous letters on both sides thereof; and no such carriage shall at any time be used for the conveyance along a public road of a quantity of such explosive exceeding fifteen hundred-weight (15 cwt.).

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT.—REGULATIONS FOR PUPILS IN ARCHITECTURE AND ENGINEERING.

Conditions.

An applicant for appointment must be not more than 20 years, or less than 16 years of age. He will be required to produce a medical certificate that he is of sound constitution, and not affected with any physical infirmity which could interfere with the proper discharge of his profession.

Qualifications.

1. The candidate must have passed in Algebra, Euclid, and Arithmetic in a Matriculation Examination in the Melbourne or other recognized University; or
2. Passed such other recognized examination, or produce such certificates from the Education Department or other authority as shall satisfy the Inspector-General of Public Works as to his competency in those three subjects, and as to his general educational proficiency.
3. He shall also, with such certificates, submit satisfactory proof of his aptitude for drawing.

Probation.

Each candidate approved by the Minister shall enter the office as a probationer for a period of one month without pay; and at the end of that time, if reported by the Inspector-General to have displayed aptitude for the work, he shall be enrolled as a pupil, and shall be subject to the General Regulations for the Public Service so far as they can fairly apply.

No more pupils will be received than are needed for the requirements of the Department.

Term of Service.

The term of service shall be two years, and at the end of each year the pupil will be required to pass an examination on the subjects mentioned in the attached schedule.

The Minister reserves the power to dispense at any time with the services of any pupil who may in the opinion of the Inspector-General be wanting in application, or in the careful performance of his work, or whose conduct may be considered by him to be unsatisfactory.

Remuneration.

The salary for the first year shall be £40, and, subject to the passing of the required examinations, the salary for the second year shall be £50. On successfully passing the prescribed departmental examinations, a pupil will, at the end of the term of two years, receive a certificate of competency as an Engineering or

Architectural Draftsman; and on his further passing the examination under the Regulations of the Public Service Board for appointment to the Clerical division, such pupil will be eligible for appointment as Junior Draftsman of the 5th class in the Public Works Department, in the order of his merit, and in accordance with the provisions of the Regulations aforesaid.

Those pupils who have been appointed as Draftsmen in the Public Works Department, and who may have further qualified themselves for professional employment, will have an opportunity of presenting themselves for a further examination, by which they may obtain a certificate of qualification as Assistant Architects or Engineers, and be eligible for such appointment should a vacancy occur.

SCHEDULE OF SUBJECTS FOR EXAMINATION.

First Year.

Tracing, Coloring, Drawing to Scale, Neat Lettering, General Knowledge of Terms used in Building and Engineering Work, Mensuration, and Elementary Freehand Drawing.

Second Year.

Simple Geometrical and Freehand Drawing, Elementary Building Materials and Construction, Elementary Knowledge of the Styles of Architecture, Building Quantities, Ornamental Writing and Printing, For Engineering—Simple Practical Trigonometry and Field Work.

Tracings and Drawings connected with the subjects for examination for each year, and duly certified as being the work of the pupil, will be considered in connection with each examination.

WHEREAS by the Inebriates Act 1872 the Governor in Council is empowered, subject to any provisions or conditions he thinks fit, to grant to any person, or two or more persons jointly, a license for twelve months to keep a house for the treatment and cure of habitual inebriates, thereafter called a "Retreat," and from time to time to revoke or renew such license, and from time to time to make and alter regulations for the good government of retreats, and for the fees payable by residents therein, and for better carrying out the purposes of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said recited Act, doth hereby repeal Clause 1 of the Regulations made in pursuance thereof, and bearing date the fourth day of August 1883, so far as regards the words "he or they hold the same for a year or for some greater estate; and," such alteration in the clause to take effect from and inclusive of the second day of October 1885.

And the Honorable Graham Berry, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REGULATIONS IN CONNECTION WITH VOTE FOR FENCING AND IMPROVING PUBLIC PARKS AND GARDENS.

1. A sum of Thirty-three pounds seventeen shillings and three pence shall be paid to Edward Williams, for fencing erected by him in Ocean Park.
2. A sum of Twenty-five pounds shall be paid to J. F. Watts, as allowance for acting as Crown Lands Bailiff in Ocean Park from 1st July to 30th September 1885.

REGULATIONS UNDER "THE AGRICULTURAL COLLEGES ACT 1884" FOR REGULATING THE MANNER IN WHICH LANDS VESTED IN THE TRUSTEES MAY BE DEMISED BY THEM, ETC.

WHEREAS by section 25 of *The Agricultural Colleges Act 1884* it is enacted that the Council of Agricultural Education may from time to time, with the approval of the Governor in Council, make, alter, and repeal regulations for regulating the manner in which any of the lands vested in the trustees may be demised by them, and the forms of the leases and the terms, covenants, and conditions to be therein contained: Now therefore the said Council of Agricultural Education, hereinafter called the Council, doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the above-recited Act, make the following Regulations (that is to say):—

1. All lands vested in the trustees appointed, or to be appointed by the Governor in Council under the said Act, hereinafter designated the Trustees, shall be let by public auction or tender, as may from time to time be determined by the trustees, except in such cases as the council may otherwise direct.

2. Lands vested in the trustees shall not be let unless notice of intention so to do shall have been published in the *Government Gazette* and in one or more newspapers published in Victoria at least fourteen days previous to any such lands being so let.

3. Prior to any lands vested in the trustees being let, the council shall determine the purpose for which such lands may be used.

4. A sum equal to 10 per cent. of the amount offered per annum shall accompany each tender for land to be let by tender, and the trustees shall not be bound to accept the highest or any tender.

5. Within fourteen days after notice shall have been forwarded by the trustees to any tenderer of his tender having been accepted, such tenderer shall pay to the treasurer of the council such amount as survey fee as the trustees may have previously determined, together with a sum which, in addition to the money previously deposited, shall amount to rent for three months.

6. The highest bidder for any land offered by auction shall, immediately after being declared the highest bidder by the auctioneer, pay down a sum equal to three months' rent of the amount offered, together with such sum as the trustees may have fixed as charge for survey.

7. The form of the leases shall be the one described in the schedule hereunto annexed.

8. The covenants and conditions other than those in the form of lease described in the schedule shall in every case be prepared by the trustees and approved by the Governor in Council.

And also excepting to the trustees and their agents servants licensees and tenants the use of all such parts of the land as shall be required by the trustees for roads dams reservoirs basins aqueducts or drains the same to be set out by the trustees together with the right to construct the same.

To hold the said pieces of land unto the lessee his executors administrators and approved assigns from the _____ day of _____ in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and _____ for the term of _____ years the said piece of land colored yellow for grazing purposes only and the said piece of land colored pink for agricultural and grazing purposes only.

Yielding and paying for the same unto the trustees during the said term the rent of _____ per annum payable in four quarterly payments always in advance on the _____ day of _____ the _____ day of _____ the _____ day of _____ and the _____ day of _____ in each year the first payment to be made on the _____ day of _____ One thousand eight hundred and _____ and such payments shall be free and clear of all taxes rates or assessments.

And the lessee doth hereby covenant with the trustees that the lessee his executors administrators and approved assigns will during the said term pay the said rent hereinbefore reserved at the times and in manner hereinbefore appointed for payment thereof clear of all deductions. And also will during the said term pay all existing and future rates assessments and taxes for the time being payable in respect of the said premises.

And also that the said lessee his executors administrators or approved assigns will keep the said land free from noxious weeds and will preserve all live timber or other trees except those which the trustees shall permit to be destroyed felled or grubbed up. And also that he the said lessee his executors or administrators will during the said term cultivate and manage the said agricultural lands in a good and husbandlike manner and according to the most approved system of agriculture.

And also that should the said lessee his executors administrators or approved assigns with the consent of the trustees erect any buildings for the purpose of residence on the said land then and in such case the lessee his executors administrators or approved assigns at the end of the said term, or within one month therefrom shall have the privilege to remove the said buildings provided he or they shall not have committed any breach of the covenants conditions or provisions herein contained and on his or their part to be observed and performed and he or they shall remove them or forfeit all claim to them if not removed within the time hereby allowed.

And also will at once after the granting of this lease to the satisfaction of the trustees commence and continue to destroy and will within one year after the granting of this lease have destroyed to the satisfaction of the officer appointed in that behalf by the trustees upon the demised land all kangaroos, wallabies dingoes or native dogs dogs run wild dogs at large foxes rabbits and any of the animals and birds included in the term "vermin" in the Act in that behalf or which the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council may by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare to be vermin for the purposes of *The Land Act 1884* and will keep the same land free of such animals and birds to the satisfaction of the officer appointed in that behalf during the currency of this lease.

And also will observe perform and comply with the requirements of *The Rabbits Suppression Acts 1880-1884* or any further Act or Acts of the Parliament of Victoria relating to the suppression or destruction of rabbits.

And also will permit the trustees and their agents and servants and any person to whom they shall grant any license in respect hereof to enter into and upon such land with or without horses carts waggons and vehicles and to search for mine extract and remove all minerals stone gravel brick earth and deposits of guano and to cut down and carry away any live or dead timber thereon without any leave or license being required in that behalf from the lessee his executors administrators or approved assigns.

And also will permit the trustees and their agents servants and licensees to sink and make all such shafts pits levels adits tramways rails or roads and use and occupy such portions of the demised land for brick-making purposes as the trustees may direct or set out and use or divert all waters and erect all buildings and machinery on the demised land as may be requisite or necessary for making marketable the said live or dead timber minerals stone gravel brick earth and deposits of guano which may be found in on under or upon the said demised land.

And also will permit the trustees and their agents servants and all persons authorized by the trustees to set out make construct and use the said roads dams reservoirs basins aqueducts and drains.

And also will permit any person appointed in that behalf by the trustees at any time to enter upon the premises hereby demised to ascertain if the conditions and covenants of this lease

are being performed by the lessee his executors administrators or approved assigns.

And the lessee for himself his executors administrators and approved assigns doth hereby further covenant with the trustees that he will not do or permit or suffer to be done any act whereby the water in any dams reservoirs basins or aqueducts may be polluted or contaminated or whereby any such dams reservoirs basins or aqueducts works of the trustees may be injured but will at all times use his and their best endeavours to conserve the purity of the water and to prevent injury and damage to the property of the trustees.

And also will not assign sublet mortgage subdivide or part with the possession of the land hereby demised or any portion thereof without the previous consent of the trustees signified in writing.

And the lessee in manner and form aforesaid doth hereby further covenant and declare that the lessee his executors administrators and approved assigns will not during the continuance of the term hereby granted fell ring injure destroy grub up or cut down any live timber or other trees in or upon the land hereby demised unless with the sanction of the trustees signified in writing.

Provided always and it is hereby agreed and declared between the parties hereto that the lessee his executors administrators or approved assigns at the termination of this demise shall not be entitled to any compensation whatever for any improvements made by him or them upon the land hereby demised or any part thereof.

Provided also and it is further agreed and declared that if the lessee his executors administrators or approved assigns shall at any time during the said term become bankrupt or insolvent or shall assign his or their estate for the benefit of his or their creditors or if he or they shall fail to use the premises hereby demised *bona fide* for the purposes for which the same has been demised respectively or use the same for any other purpose or if and whenever any part of the said rent hereinbefore reserved shall be in arrear for one week whether the same shall have been demanded or not if and whenever there shall be a breach of any of the covenants conditions and provisos by the lessee his executors administrators or assigns herein contained and on his or their part to be observed and performed then and in such case it shall thereupon be lawful for the trustees to declare this lease to be forfeited and then the trustees by their officers or agents may without any demand enter forthwith into and upon any part of the said demised premises in the name of the whole and the same to repossess and enjoy as fully and effectually as if these presents had not been made and executed.

And it is hereby agreed and declared that in any such case it shall be lawful for the trustees their agents or officers authorized in that behalf without any demand whatsoever to enter upon the land hereby demised and the lessee his executors or administrators and all persons claiming under him or them for ever to expel and remove therefrom without any legal process whatsoever and as effectually as any sheriff might do in case the trustees had obtained judgment in ejectment for recovery of possession of the said land and a writ of *habere facias possessionem* or other process had issued on such judgment directed to such sheriff in due form of law And then and in case of such entry and any action being brought or other proceedings taken for the same by any person whomsoever the defendants to such action may plead leave or license in bar thereof and these presents shall be conclusive evidence of the leave and license of the lessee his executors or administrators and all persons claiming under him or them to the trustees and all persons acting on their behalf for the entry or trespass or other matters to be complained of in such action or other proceedings.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF YARRA, PRINCE'S, FLINDERS, AND FAWKNER PARKS.

WHEREAS by the Crown grants issued in favor of the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Melbourne, and their successors, in respect of Yarra, Prince's, Flinders, and Fawkner Parks, it is provided and declared in each case that the land thereby granted, and the buildings for the time being thereon, shall be maintained and used as and for a Public Park, and offices and conveniences connected therewith, under and in accordance with such Regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Governor or other officer for the time being administering the government of the colony of Victoria, with the consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in the meantime under and in accordance with such Regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Citizens of the said City of Melbourne, and for no other purpose whatsoever: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works and the Council of the City of Melbourne do hereby make the Regulations following for the care, protection, and management of the said Parks and for the preservation of good order and decency therein:—

Regulations.

1. No person shall interfere with the trees, shrubs, flowers, birds, fish, or any property in any of the parks, or throw stones or other missiles, or commit any nuisance therein, or leave therein any bottles, orange peel, paper, cast-off clothing, or any litter.
2. No person shall climb on or jump over the seats or fences in and around any of the parks, or stick bills on the fences or gates, or cut names, letters, or marks on the trees, seats, gates, posts, or fences, or otherwise deface the same or write thereon.
3. Any person found in a state of intoxication, or behaving in a disorderly manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or committing in any of the parks any act of indecency shall be liable to be forthwith removed by the curator or other authorized officer or servant of the trustees or by a constable, and shall be liable to prosecution for an offence against these regulations.
4. No person, except those in the employ of or authorized by the trustees, shall bring into any of the parks any horse or vehicle, or enter plots of ground therein enclosed for plantations or for other purposes.
5. No person shall bring into any of the parks any dog for coursing or other purposes of sport, and all dogs so brought in, and all goats and poultry found within any of the parks, shall be liable to be destroyed.
6. No person shall hawk or offer for sale in any of the parks any goods or articles of any description without having previously obtained written permission from the trustees.
7. No person shall light any fires within any of the parks.
8. Cricket, football, or other athletic sports shall not be played or take place in any of the parks except in such portions thereof as may be set apart for the purpose and under such conditions as the trustees may direct.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of *The Land Act 1834*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by the curator or other authorized officer or servant of the trustees, or by any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by the curator or other authorized officer or servant of the trustees or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

WHEREAS by the Crown grants issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works, and the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Melbourne, and their successors, in respect of Fitzroy, Carlton, and Flagstaff Gardens, and Lincoln, Argyle, Curtain, Macarthur, Murchison, Darling, and University Squares, it is provided and declared that the lands thereby granted and the buildings for the time being thereon shall be maintained and used as and for a public garden or a public square, as the case may be, and offices and conveniences connected therewith under and in accordance with such regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Governor,

or other officer for the time being administering the Government of the Colony of Victoria, with the consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in the meantime under and in accordance with such regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Board of Land and Works, and the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Citizens of the said City of Melbourne, and for no other purpose whatsoever: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works and the Council of the City of Melbourne do hereby make the Regulations following for the care, protection, and management of the said gardens and squares, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein.

Regulations.

1. No person shall interfere with the trees, shrubs, grass, flowers, statuary, fountains, fish, or any property in any of the gardens or squares, or throw stones or any missile, beat carpets, dry clothes, or commit any nuisance, or light fires therein, or leave therein any bottles, paper, orange-peel, cast off clothing, or any litter.
 2. No person shall climb on or jump over the seats or fences in or around any of the gardens or squares, or lie on the seats, or stick bills on the fences, gates, or trees, or cut names, letters, or marks on the trees, seats, gates, posts, or fences, or otherwise deface the same, or write thereon.
 3. No person, except those in the employ of or authorized by the trustees, shall bring into any of the gardens or squares any horse or vehicle, or enter plots of ground therein enclosed for plantations or other purposes.
 4. No person shall bring into any of the gardens or squares any dog, unless the same be held by a chain or cord.
 5. No children under five (5) years of age shall be allowed in any of the gardens or squares, unless in charge of adult friends or nurses.
 6. Preaching in any of the gardens or squares, or public harangues, whereby a crowd is collected, shall not be permitted.
 7. Any person found in a state of intoxication, or behaving in a disorderly or objectionable manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or committing in any of the gardens or squares any act of indecency, shall be liable to be forthwith removed by the curator or other authorized officer or servant of the trustees, or by a constable, and shall be liable to prosecution for an offence against these Regulations.
 8. All goats and poultry found within any of the gardens or squares shall be liable to be destroyed.
 9. Cricket, football, or other athletic sports, shall not be played or take place in any of the gardens or squares.

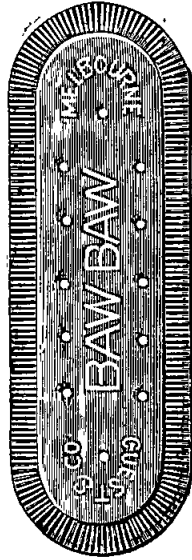

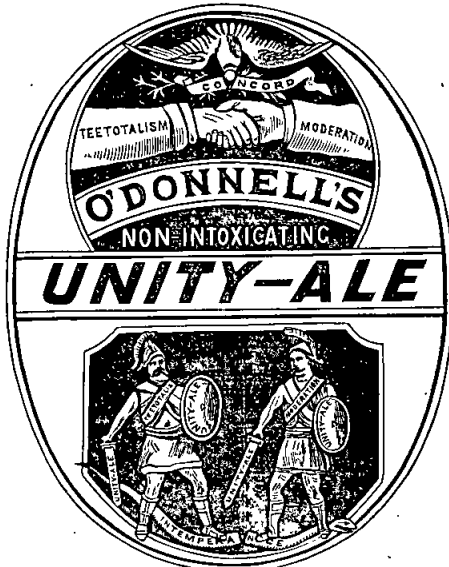
