WHEREAS by *The Discipline Act 1870* it was provided that the Governor in Council might make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government of persons engaged by virtue of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out the said Act, and from time to time amend, alter, or amend the same and substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations for the Ordnance, Commissariat, and Transport Corps of the Victorian Military Forces, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE ORDNANCE, COMMISSARIAT, AND TRANSPORT CORPS.

The formation of a Militia Ordnance, Commissariat, and Transport Corps is sanctioned.

The following will be the establishment of the Corps:—

- 1 Deputy Assistant Commissary-General
- 1 Sergeant-Major (to be an employé of the Ordnance Department)

The sergeant-major, sergeants, corporals, and privates shall be either volunteers from the Militia, specially approved, or men specially enlisted for the service, and will be borne in proportion on the rolls of batteries of Garrison Artillery, in which they will perform their drills, except at encampments, or when specially ordered by the Commandant.

During encampments, or when called out for active service, non-commissioned officers and men will be under the orders of the Assistant Commissary-General, and will receive an allowance of two shillings and sixpence per diem, in addition to the pay of their rank. The non-commissioned officers will be supernumerary of their ranks in their respective batteries, but will be borne on the establishment as gunners. When serving with their batteries, they will perform such duties as may be directed by the Officer Commanding, it being understood that their rank in the Ordnance, Commissariat, and Transport Corps does not necessitate their being employed in corresponding duties with their batteries.

Regulation for the making of a rate for the year 1886 on all the rateable property within the Echuca and Waranga Waterworks District.

The following rate for the year 1886, commencing on the first day of January, is made on the annual value of all the rateable property within the Echuca and Waranga Waterworks District, according to the valuation for the time being on such lands and tenements for the municipal rates of the shires of Echuca, Waranga, and Rodney respectively, that is to say, a rate of Twelve pence in the pound on such valuation.

Such rate is hereby made payable on the first day of September 1886.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rate.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Registration of Births, Deaths, and Marriages Statute 1865* (28 Vict. No. 246, sec. 5) it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, divide the colony of Victoria into districts and assign the said colony and districts to the Registrar-General and Deputy-Registrars respectively, or to so many of them as he might think fit, and might define the limits of such districts, and from time to time revoke, vary, and alter such division and the limits of such districts: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, do hereby define the limits and boundaries of the Prahran and South Yarra Registration Districts in manner following, that is to say:—

THE PRAHRAN REGISTRATION DISTRICT.

Commencing at the junction of St. Kilda and Commercial roads; thence east along Commercial and Malvern roads to Williams road; thence south along Williams road to Dandenong road; thence west along Dandenong road and Wellington street to Punt road; thence north along Punt road to High street; thence west along High street to St. Kilda road; and thence north-westerly along St. Kilda road to the point of commencement.

THE SOUTH YARRA REGISTRATION DISTRICT.

Commencing at Williams road on the south bank of the River Yarra; thence south along that road to Malvern road; thence west along Malvern and Commercial roads to St. Kilda road; thence north-westerly along St. Kilda road to a point opposite the Victoria Barracks; thence north-easterly to a point on the bank of the River Yarra opposite Jolimont road, East Melbourne; and thence along the River Yarra to the point of commencement.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the Colony, made in pursuance of *The Land Act 1869*, and bearing date the twenty-eighth day of August One thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, it was declared that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, should cut or remove bark from the wattle trees on certain unappropriated Crown lands therein specified: And whereas it is expedient to revoke the said proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the said proclamation, bearing date the twenty-eighth day of August One thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, prohibiting the cutting and removal of bark from the wattle trees on certain Crown lands in the counties of Dargo, Tambo, and Tanjil therein described.—(86.B.32350.)

BYE-LAWS OF THE COLAC DISTRICT HOSPITAL.

OBJECTS.

1. The objects of the institution are to afford medical aid to destitute persons requiring it, and for the necessary treatment of casualties; but no person who shall be found able to pay for surgical aid shall receive further than temporary assistance. Provided always that persons willing to pay shall be admitted to the institution at the discretion of and on such terms and conditions as the committee may deem fit.

GOVERNMENT.

2. The institution shall be governed by a committee of management consisting of a president, vice-president, treasurer, and nine ordinary members of committee, all of whom shall be contributors or benefactors, and shall be elected in accordance with the provisions of "The Hospital and Charitable Institutions Act," 27 Victoria, No. 220, sec. 12.

CONTRIBUTIONS.

3. Benefactors of £5 shall have the privilege of recommending two out-door patients annually, and shall be entitled to vote at all general meetings.

4. Benefactors of £10 or contributors of £1 shall be called annual subscribers, and shall have the privilege of recommending one in-door and one out-door patient annually; they shall also be entitled to vote at all general meetings.

5. Benefactors of £25 or contributors of £10 shall be called life subscribers, and shall have for life the same privileges as the annual subscribers.

6. Benefactors of £20 or annual contributors of £2 shall be called annual governors, and shall be entitled to recommend two in-door and two out-door patients annually; they shall also have two votes at all general meetings.

7. Benefactors of £50 or contributors of £20 shall be called life governors, and shall have for life the same privileges as the annual governors.

8. Any additional benefaction or contribution shall entitle to additional privileges, in accordance with the above scale, in respect to recommending patients only.

9. The current year shall, with respect to each benefaction or contribution, be reckoned from the day of payment.

10. The word "benefaction" shall mean a sum of money raised from the public by collectors or otherwise, and the word "contribution" a personal gift.

11. Every firm or partnership contributing shall exercise the privileges through some one of the firm only.

12. No person shall hold or be eligible for any honorary office (except that of honorary medical officer), nor have any vote, nor exercise any privilege connected with the institution, unless his subscription shall have been paid at least seven clear days previous.

GENERAL MEETINGS.

13. The annual meeting of contributors to the hospital shall be held on the last Thursday of the month of July in every year for the following purposes, viz.:-

- To receive the annual report.
- To elect a president, vice-president, and treasurer.
- To fill vacancies in the committee of management.
- To elect two honorary medical officers.
- To elect two auditors and fix remuneration (if any) to same.
- To transact any other business of which notice has been given, or that may arise at such meeting in connection with the institution.

14. No candidate shall be nominated as member of committee unless his consent has been obtained, in writing, and lodged with the secretary three clear days before the date of annual meeting.

15. All votes at the annual and other meetings of contributors shall be taken by a show of hands, unless a ballot shall have been previously demanded by three of the contributors present, in which case the vote or votes referred to shall be by ballot.

16. At all meetings of contributors ten shall constitute a quorum, and as soon as a quorum is present the chair shall be taken; but if no quorum be present within one hour of the time named such meeting shall stand adjourned to the following week at the same day and hour.

17. It shall be competent for a majority of the committee of management, or for ten or more contributors, by a writing under their hands, to require the secretary to summon a special meeting of contributors, the occasion of calling such meeting to be specified in the requisition; and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting but that so specified. And every such meeting shall be convened by the secretary, by advertisement in one or more local papers, at least one week before the day of meeting.

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT.

18. The committee of management shall direct the general business of the hospital, enter into all contracts connected therewith, and direct payment of the same; they shall appoint and discharge all paid officers and servants of the institution.

19. They shall meet on the second Friday in every month, at two o'clock p.m., and at such other times as may be necessary. Four members to constitute a quorum.

20. The chairman of committee (who shall be the president, if present, or the vice-president in his absence, or some other member in their absence) shall have a casting vote.

21. The president shall be empowered to convene a meeting of the committee at any time he may consider necessary; and the secretary shall on receiving a requisition from three members of committee convene a special meeting thereof; and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting but that so specified.

22. The committee of management shall, at the first committee meeting subsequent to the annual meeting of subscribers in each year, elect from among themselves a house committee of three, one of whom shall retire from office in rotation at each monthly meeting, but shall be eligible for re-election, at which meeting the vacancy shall be filled up. The duties of the house committee shall be to visit the hospital at least once a week, to examine buildings, inspect the wards, make inquiries respecting the quality and quantity of the rations, enforce rules, investigate accounts, and report upon the same and all matters connected with the management of the institution at the next monthly meeting of the general committee. The office of any member of the house committee shall cease by his ceasing to be a member of the general committee.

23. The house committee as above constituted shall also be a finance committee (two to form a quorum) for the purpose of examining all accounts for disbursements and certifying to their correctness, and also seeing that all moneys received have been paid into the bank to the credit of the hospital.

24. If any member of committee shall die, or resign by letter under his hand addressed to the president of the committee, or become insolvent or compound with his creditors, or be convicted of any treason, felony, or misdemeanour, or be absent from four consecutive ordinary meetings of committee, his office shall become vacant, and the remaining members of the committee may temporarily appoint thereto some contributor until the next annual meeting for the election of the committee, when the person thus temporarily appointed shall retire as one of those who, by the provision of Act 27 No. 220, are required to go out of office.

25. The general committee shall present a report of the affairs of the hospital at each annual meeting, which report shall be presented at a special meeting of the committee for revision and approval at least one week before the annual meeting.

26. The president, vice-president, and treasurer shall be *ex-officio* members of all sub-committees.

27. The committee shall be empowered to frame such bye-laws and regulations as they may deem necessary for the proper internal government of the institution in its different departments, provided such bye-laws are not repugnant to the laws of the institution or an Act of Parliament.

TREASURER.

28. All moneys received on account of the hospital shall be paid to the treasurer (or his account at the bank) and appropriated by him to the purposes of the institution on the authority of the committee of management.

29. All moneys received by the treasurer on account of the hospital shall be paid to the credit of the institution at the bank within forty-eight hours after such moneys shall amount to five pounds (£5), and receipt of same made known to the secretary as early as possible. All payments shall be made by cheques, which shall be signed by the president or vice-president (or, in the event of their both being absent, by the chairman of the meeting) and the treasurer, and be countersigned by the secretary.

30. The treasurer shall close his accounts on the 30th June in every year.

SECRETARY.

31. The secretary shall attend all meetings, take minutes of the same, conduct all correspondence, and carry out the directions of such meetings in the particulars incident to his duties. He shall submit a balance-sheet at every ordinary meeting of the committee of management, showing the receipts and expenditure since the previous meeting, and keep any books of accounts connected with the institution the committee may direct.

AUDITORS.

32. The auditors shall, in the second week of July in every year, or as soon as conveniently may be prior to the annual meeting of contributors, examine the treasurer's, secretary's, and collector's books, cash-book, and balance-sheet, with all accounts, vouchers, and documents relating thereto, and shall report thereon to the general committee at the meeting appointed by them. In the event of the office of auditor becoming vacant between the annual meetings of subscribers the committee of management shall be empowered to fill up such vacancy or vacancies.

HONORARY MEDICAL OFFICERS.

33. The honorary medical officers, who shall also be duly-qualified medical practitioners, shall attend at the hospital for consultation or co-operation whenever requested by the medical officer, and shall have access to the institution at all times.

MEDICAL OFFICER.

34. The medical officer shall be a duly-qualified medical practitioner. He shall hold office under the direction of the committee, and will be allowed private practice.

35. He shall receive the certificates from applicants for admission, examine the nature of each case, and decide on its fitness for admission, and discharge such patients as he considers fit to be discharged.

36. He shall have charge of all patients in the hospital, and of their treatment.

37. He shall conduct and be present at all surgical operations and *post mortem* examinations.

38. He shall superintend and control all servants in the hospital, and have power in case of insubordination or neglect of duty to suspend any of them until the decision of the general committee, and, if necessary, to hire temporary substitutes for servants thus suspended.

39. He shall visit the hospital daily. He shall admit or exclude patients every Tuesday and Friday between the hours of ten a.m. and twelve noon, and on such days and between such hours shall afford relief to out-patients holding a ticket of recommendation.

40. In all cases of emergency he shall cause immediate notice to be given to the honorary medical officers, and pending their arrival, shall act to the best of his judgment.

41. The results of all consultations and operations to be noted in a book kept for the purpose by the medical officer, to be signed by all present, a space to be set apart after each case for those who dissent from the course of treatment proposed to be adopted, who shall state their reasons for such dissent previously to any operations being performed, or any course of treatment carried out; the name of the operator to be set out in a column of the said book.

42. He shall give due notice to the honorary medical officers when a consultation is to be held, or an operation to be performed.

43. He shall carry out all regulations made by the committee for the internal management of the hospital.

44. He shall have no power to decide as to the paying capabilities of patients.

STEWARD AND MATRON.

45. The steward shall reside on the premises, and have the charge, control, and management of the institution and the inmates thereof, subject to the regulations and orders of the general and house committee, and the paid medical officer. Neither steward nor matron shall be absent between the hours of nine p.m. and eight a.m., nor more than two hours at a time, without permission from the house committee or paid medical officer (except on Sundays for three hours.) The steward and matron are never to be absent from the institution at the same time without the special permission of the house committee.

46. The steward shall have the immediate superintendence of the matron and servants, and shall see that they do their duty; and he shall enforce order, sobriety, personal cleanliness, neatness, and obedience to orders. In case of any misbehaviour, disobedience, or neglect of duty by any of them, he shall have power to suspend the offender, and report to the medical officer.

47. The steward shall give security through an approved guarantee society to the amount of £100 for the faithful exercise of his duty.

48. He shall regularly visit every part of the institution, and see that the wards and other parts of the house and grounds are kept in a proper state of cleanliness and order; and that all inmates whom the doctor shall certify as able be employed in the grounds or otherwise.

49. He shall have the charge of, and be accountable for, the surgical instruments, furniture, bedding, linen, glass, cutlery, cooking and kitchen utensils, medicines and stores, and all other property of the institution; and he shall make an exact inventory of the same in a book to be kept for that purpose, in which he shall regularly enter the receipt, loss, or breakage of any article; and he shall, on the last days of June and December in each year, and at such other times as the general committee may require, prepare and submit such inventory to the committee.

50. He shall receive the stores and supplies furnished by the contractors and others, and he shall see that they correspond in description, quality, and quantity with the tenders and samples; and in case they do not, he shall report accordingly to the house committee at the next meeting. He shall enter the receipt and issue of such stores and supplies in the books provided for that purpose.

51. He shall keep an exact account of the admission and discharge of inmates, with their ages and religious denominations; and also of the out-door recipients, the nature of the relief given and its period of continuance, in the register book; also a discharge book in which each patient leaving may make any remark.

52. The matron shall be subject to the same regulations respecting living in the house and absence therefrom as the steward. She shall see that the female servants do their duty, and shall report any neglect or disobedience of orders on their part to the steward.

53. She shall visit each ward daily, and shall see that the beds, linen, and clothing of the patients are clean and in good order, and shall cause such of the bedding, &c., as require it to be replaced by others, and thoroughly cleaned and repaired where necessary; and furnish an inventory of goods belonging to her department to the steward.

54. She shall superintend the cooking of all food for the inmates, and shall generally discharge the duties of matron as shall be directed by the committee.

PATIENTS.

55. All applicants for admission must be provided with a recommendation ticket. The medical fitness of the applicant shall be determined by the medical officer.

56. All patients shall be required to pay the actual expenses of their maintenance as far as circumstances may enable them; and all property found on deceased patients shall be appropriated to the defraying of the expenses of their maintenance and burial, and the residue (if any) to be handed to their legal representatives.

57. Severe accidents and cases of decided emergency may be admitted at any time by the house committee, medical officer, or honorary medical officers.

58. No pregnant female for the purpose of confinement, no child under two years of age, no person insane or suffering from *dementia tremens* or infectious disorder, or subject to epilepsy, or any one who in the opinion of the examining physician or medical officer might receive equal benefit as an out-door patient, shall be admitted into the hospital.

59. Patients shall conduct themselves orderly, and shall strictly observe all the directions of the medical officer, honorary medical officers, steward, matron, and nurses.

60. They shall take their medicines at the times directed, and they shall not take any other medicines than those prescribed; and they shall not conceal or put away any portion of the medicine or diet administered to them.

61. No one shall leave his or her ward and go into another ward or department, nor leave the house, nor remain out for a longer time than is granted, nor shall introduce visitors, nor receive medicines, victuals, liquor, or tobacco, or anything, without the express leave of the medical officer.

62. They shall not gamble nor smoke, nor spit on the floor, nor deface or injure any part of the ward, nor any furniture, bedding, or clothing therein; nor sing, blaspheme, nor use any rude or indecent language, on pain of dismissal.

63. No patient shall give reward or gratuity to any of the wardsmen, nurses, or any of the other servants.

64. Any patient having any cause of complaint shall make the same known to the medical officer, whose duty it shall be to enter such complaint immediately in the presence of the nurse or wardman of the ward, in the book kept for that purpose, which book shall be laid before the house committee at each meeting.

65. Patients considered by the medical officer sufficiently convalescent to be able to assist in the work of the institution may, at the discretion of the medical officer, be so employed.

66. Patients shall not sit up after eight o'clock p.m. in the winter, nor after nine o'clock p.m. in the summer, and all patients considered by the medical officer able to do so shall rise at seven o'clock a.m. in the summer, and before eight o'clock a.m. in the winter.

OUT-PATIENTS.

67. Out-patients holding a ticket of recommendation will receive out-door relief on Tuesday and Friday mornings only, between the hours of ten and twelve o'clock, except in case of emergency.

68. Each out-door patient having a recommendation from a subscriber will be entitled to receive medical relief for eight weeks from the date of first advice, but should the disease from which the person is suffering require more than eight weeks' attendance, it will be necessary to obtain another ticket of recommendation.

69. Any person or persons imposing on the charity of the institution will render themselves liable to prosecution.

70. Ministers of religion shall have access to sick persons of their respective denominations at such times as shall be appointed by the house committee. Any minister may attend any patient at any time when requested by such patient; and in case of a death, notice shall be forwarded to the clergyman of the denomination to which the deceased patient belongs, stating the hour of burial.

VISITORS.

71. Visitors will be admitted on Sunday and Wednesday in each week, between the hours of two and five o'clock in the afternoon.

72. Visitors may be admitted on special occasions by permission of the medical officer.

73. Visitors will not be allowed to go into any ward without the leave of the steward or matron, and must retire when requested by either of them.

74. Visitors will not be permitted to give or leave with any patient, medicine, food, tobacco, or liquor of any kind, nor any other thing, without the express sanction of the medical officer.

75. Visitors shall not give to any servant of the institution any money or gratuity of any kind.

76. Visitors shall not interfere with the wardsmen or nurses, nor disturb the patients by loud talking or unnecessary noise.

77. Any visitor violating any of the regulations of the institution; or behaving with impropriety, will be compelled to retire, and will not be re-admitted without special leave from the medical officer or house committee.

VOLENTARY DEPARTURE.

78. Patients quitting the hospital at their own desire shall sign a declaration to that effect before leaving.

IMPOTORS.

79. In the event of any person in the position to pay for medical or surgical advice elsewhere being detected in receipt of the charity of the institution, such person, if an in-patient, shall be liable to be prosecuted, and shall be charged at a rate not exceeding ten shilling (10s.) per day for each day from the date of admission; or if an out-patient, he may also be prosecuted, and shall be charged a sum not exceeding ten shillings (10s.) for each occasion upon which he shall consult the medical officer; and the committee may order the removal of any such person from the hospital, provided the case is not one of emergency.

ENDOWMENT FUND.

80. (1). An endowment fund may be established consisting of—(a) all bequests not specially directed to be otherwise applied; (b) sums of money set aside by the committee from time to time from the proceeds of fetes, or other revenue locally raised; (c) special contributions; (d) interest accruing on the investment of the funds.

(2). All moneys to the credit of the fund from time to time shall be invested by the committee at their discretion in colonial Government securities or bank stock, fixed deposit in bank or in the purchase of freehold property, in the name of the corporation, and the treasurer shall receive the income therefrom, and appropriate the same for the purposes of the institution, on the authority of the committee of management.

(3). The principal moneys of the endowment fund shall not be transferred or applied to any purpose whatever, without the sanction of a majority of subscribers and governors at a special meeting called for the purpose.

(4). Contributors to this fund shall be entitled to all the privileges in respect of their contributions as if the same had been made to the ordinary annual revenue of the institution.

MEETINGS.

81. All meetings in connection with the hospital shall be open to subscribers and the representatives of the press, but no person present at committee meetings, who is not a member of committee, shall be permitted to interfere or take part in the proceedings.

PREVIOUS BYE-LAWS REPEALED.

82. All bye-laws previously made for the management of the institution are hereby repealed.

ALTERATION OR AMENDMENT OF BYE-LAWS.

83. No new bye-laws shall be made, nor any of the existing bye-laws rescinded, altered, or amended, except with the concurrence of a majority of the subscribers present at the annual general meeting; or a majority of subscribers present at a special meeting convened for the purpose, of which seven days' notice shall have been given by advertisement.

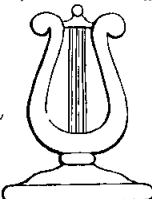
